EMERGENCY EVACUATION OF COLLEGE BUILDINGS

In order to clarify procedures for dealing with emergencies which require the evacuation of College buildings, the following techniques will be in force:

1. Evacuation Without Immediate Hazard

In instances where the circumstances requiring building evacuation do not suggest immediate danger, the evacuation order will be circulated verbally by a Security Officer or other authorized agent.

2. Evacuation With Immediate Hazard

In instances where the danger involved is known to be imminent, the evacuation signal will be provided via the College's emergency alarm system (bells and horns). Two types of warnings may be given:

- a. Fire Alarm - intermittent actuation of alarm system.
- b. Evacuation Alarm (other emergencies) - continuous actuation of alarm system.

Any signal for building evacuation will be given only as authorized by the College President or, in his absence, the Academic Vice President. Should any type of evacuation be signaled, personnel should immediately move to the campus parking lot areas according to the schedule indicated below:

1. Front (northerly) parking lot: Classroom Building, Fine Arts Building, Science Building, Lecture Building.
2. Rear (southerly) parking lot: Cafeteria, Faculty Building, Academic Administration, Administration, Student Services, Library, Plant Operations.

In no case should evacuation procedures involve occupation of the central courtyard area. After evacuation, all personnel should remain in the parking lots until an "all clear" indication by three prolonged activations of the alarm system.
