





One of the challenges facing new Coach Bob Burton at Cal State Fullerton is rebuilding the attendance base in Titan Gym. But if everyone who recommended him for the vacant Titan job shows up on the same night, the problem will become finding an empty seat!

"I've never had, in all my years... and I've been doing this a long time... such an outpouring of support for any one candidate for any position for any sport," said Director of Athletics Brian Quinn on June 6, when Burton signed a four-year contract to take over the Titan program.

"From basketball coaches at all levels throughout California and from numerous collegiate head coaches from across the nation, everyone had basically the same comments -- what a great coach he is and what a perfect fit he is for Cal State Fullerton."

Burton served last season as an assistant coach at Fresno State and he also was an assistant to Lynn Archibald for one season (1986-87) at Utah. But where he made his many basketball connections was at West Valley Community College in Saratoga in Northern California, where he compiled a 488-158 record in 21 seasons, three times reaching the state championship game. He sent more than 80 players to Div. I programs and more than 100 to other four-year colleges.

"I can't tell you how thrilled I am to

receive this opportunity," said Burton, 58. "I've never been one of those guys who has moved around a lot. I've always been happy wherever I've been. I'm looking forward to building a winning program at Cal State Fullerton."

Burton replaced Donny Daniels, who resigned on Apr. 18 to become the lead assistant at UCLA. The Titans were 10-19 overall in 2002-03 and 8-10 in the Big West Conference and the nucleus of that team returns.

"I'm extremely excited to have such an outstanding coach join the Cal State Fullerton family," added Quinn. "Bob has been one of the most successful coaches in California. Not only is he one of the great teachers of the game, he also brings tremendous energy, intelligence and passion to this position.

"I don't believe we could have hired a finer coach, someone to lead us to the success that our community wants and looks forward to."

Burton sees obvious parallels in his situation at Fullerton and at Fresno State, where he came in with a new staff after the



departure of the Jerry Tarkanian regime.

"I told my players here about the things we went through at Fresno -- the plusses and the minuses -- and why we had a great year.

"All of them are really looking for a good senior year. Last season was kind of tough with the injuries and the suspension. At least from what they tell me, they're ready to put it behind them."

The summer appointment obviously put Burton behind the schedule of his peers.

"Make no mistake about it, he'll do a phenomenal job at Fullerton," said UC Santa Barbara's Bob Williams, who got a junior college job the same day Burton did in 1980 - Williams at Cabrillo and Burton at West Valley.

Both had coached in the same high school league in 1979.

"He was the veteran in the league and I was the rookie, and we've been great friends ever since," said Williams. "And now it's been turned around: I'm the veteran and he's the rookie."

"I've never been this busy in my life," said Burton during the summer. "It was crazy. We were trying to do what most schools already had done, plus we were trying to get ready for the upcoming season. It's unbelievable, guys commit so early. It's put us quite behind."

Still, Burton was able to bring in a pair of "overlooked" prospects in Yaphett King from Redlands CC in Oklahoma and Bobby Brown from Westchester High as well as lure walkons Danny Lambert, Jason Pettaway and Brian Pruitt. He also picked up 4-year



transfers Jermaine Harper from Virginia and Lloyd Walls from Wright State.

Burton left West Valley a year and a half ago to assist incoming Fresno State Coach Ray Lopes, a former player and assistant coach for him at West Valley. The Bulldogs went a surprising 20-8, won the Western Athletic Conference title and saw their team grade-point average improve from 2.31 to 2.68.

Burton won eight conference championships at West Valley and was selected conference coach of the year nine times. He was selected California Community College Coach of the Year four times.

In Burton's one season at Utah, the Utes went 19-10 and earned an NIT berth.

Burton graduated from Fresno State in 1968 with a degree in social sciences. He earned a masters degree a year later at Cal Poly SLO, where he began his coaching career as an assistant in 1969-70. He became a head coach in 1972 at Willow Glen High School in San Jose and compiled a 143-52 record.

Burton's wife, Toni, is a school teacher. They live in Fullerton.

### Coach **Andy Newman** 1st year, Azusa Pacific, 1998

Andy Newman has made a rapid advancement through the collegiate coaching ranks as he rejoins Coach Bob Burton at Cal State Fullerton for the 2003-04 season.

Newman, 28, and Burton both worked under Coach Ray Lopes at

Fresno State last season, Burton as an assistant and Newman as basketball operations manager. After he was hired on July 1 at Fullerton, Newman turned down a lucrative offer from Lopes to return to Fresno State during the summer as a fulltime assistant.

At Fresno State, Newman was involved in game management, film breakdown, housing coordination, fundraising, travel, fi-

nancial aid, summer camps and was the team's academic advisor. He also organized team scheduling, assisted in recruiting and even tuaght a 3-unit theory class for the kinesiology department.


Newman previously assisted Burton for two years at West Valley College in Saratoga. There he was the recruiting coordinator, offensive coach and was in charge of perimeter skill development. He also worked one year at Vanguard University in Costa Mesa where he performed similar du-

Newman graduated from Azusa Pacific in 1998 with a

degree in business administration after playing one very successful season for the Cougars, who went 34-5 and advanced to the NAIA Final Four. Newman played previously at Southern Utah and West Valley.

At Southern Utah he led the team in minutes played at 36.1 per game. At West Valley his teams went 65-6 with a pair of conference championships and state championship game appearances. He was selected to the all-tournament team at the 1996 state championships.







### Coach **Jason Levy** 4th year, Cal St. Northridge, 1993

Jason Levy is in his fourth season as a Titan assistant coach, his first under the direction of Coach Bob Burton. He relied on his wealth and breadth of basketball experience to hold the team together between Donny Daniels'

Apr. 18 resignation and the June 6 hiring of Burton.

The 35-year-old native of New York City has worked on the West Coast, in the Midwest and on the East Coast in a variety of coaching positions. In two of the past three summers he has represented adidas at clinics in Beijing, China, where he worked directly with the national and junior national teams. He also worked with professional coaches there on drills and coaching concepts.

Levy helps coordinate the recruiting efforts for the Titans, as well as work with on-the-court development, conditioning,



scouting and planning. For his efforts, he was recognized by Rivals100Hoops.com with a 2002 selection to the Top 20 of "Top Assistants Not at a High-Major Program." He was one of only two selected from west of the Rockies.

Prior to coming to Fullerton, Levy spent three seasons as an assistant at the University of Portland of the West Coast Conference. He had three prior years of experience in the Big West Conference with two seasons (1994-95 and 1995-96) at Long Beach State under Seth

Greenberg and one (1996-97) at UC Irvine under Rod Baker. The 49ers went to the NCAA Tournament in 1994.

At Portland, Levy coordinated recruiting efforts for the Pilots while assisting in practice and game preparation. On the floor he worked primarily with post players and assisted with the strength and conditioning program.

Levy played high school ball for La Salle Academy in Manhattan before venturing west and playing two seasons at Cuesta College in San Luis Obispo. He transferred to Cal State Northridge, where he graduated in 1993. He served one season (1993-94) as an assistant to Rudy Washington at Drake in Des Moines, Iowa, before moving to Long Beach State. He began his coaching career at the Double Pump Camp at Cal State Dominguez Hills in 1992-93.

Levy was married on Oct. 6, 2002, to the former Anna Frost. They have an infant son, Kyle.



### Coach Mark Maki 4th year. Wyoming, 1997


Mark Maki is a youthful but well-traveled and diversely trained young man who brings a lot of enthusiasm and dedication to the Titans' third assistant coaching position under new Head Coach Bob Burton.

Maki, 29, now in his fourth year at Fullerton, supervises numerous aspects of the Titan basketball program including the youth camps and academic assistance. He was very instrumental in helping Jason Levy hold the program together during the transitional period (Apr.

18-June 6) between Coaches Donny Daniels and Burton.

Maki previously coached in Teaneck, New Jersey, at Fairleigh Dickinson University. The team went 17-11 overall and was 13-5 to gain second place in the Northeast Conference. Maki also has coached at Notre Dame Prep School in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, and Penn State-New Kensington after serving as a student assistant for four years at his alma mater, the University of Wyoming.

Cal State Fullerton's Titan Gymnasium has served as the home court advantage for the Titans' men's basketball team since the 1964-65 season. Historically one of the most difficult places to play because of the proximity of the bleachers to the playing floor, Titan Gym has been upgraded over the past few years to make it more fan friendly while still intimate.

Chairback seats have replaced most of the bleachers, portable basket supports have replaced the fold-down backboards, new paint and banners have been applied to the walls and the floor has been redesigned and resurfaced.

And this season, the court will feature a new look as a "drop-down" scoreboard was installed during the summer of 2003 along with new auxiliary scoreboards behind each basket.

Seating capacity currently is about 3,500 but will move up to around 4,000 when new upstairs bleachers are installed in the new south balcony.

Construction restricted seating on the south side the past two years but now the gymnasium is part of

an expanded physical education/kinesiology complex, featuring numerous classrooms, physical testing laboratories and a new practice facility on the south side. The facility also houses practice rooms for the Titan wrestling, gymnastics and fencing programs.

The record crowd for Titan Gym is 5,015 on Feb. 24, 1983, when the Titans beat unbeaten and No. 1-ranked UNLV with extra chairs behind the baskets and standing room everwhere.

The gym was featured in the recent feature film "Evolution" and was the site of team handball competition in the 1984 Olympic Games.



### DIV. I TITANS' **HOME-COURT** RECORD

The longest home-court winning streak in Titan Gym is 26 games, stretching from Jan. 23, 1982, through Jan. 21, 1984. A streak of 12 in a row was snapped Feb. 10, 1993, by Houston.

The most recent streak of length was an 8-gamer -the last three contests of the 1996-97 schedule and the first five of the 1997-98 slate. It was ended by Idaho on Jan. 15.

The Titans entered the 1999-2000 season with a streak of 14 consecutive nonconference home victories, lost to USD, but then won the next four to make it 18 out of the last 19.

Doubling its victory total from the previous season as it did last year might be asking too much of the Cal State Fullerton men's basketball team in 2003-04, but further improvement is a realistic expectation for new Coach Bob Burton, even with the

unexpected October loss of two regulars.

Seven lettermen including the equivalent of three starters return from last year's team that went 10-19 despite a rash of injuries and other problems. The Titans were 8-10 in Big West Conference play as they easily bettered the 5-22 and 2-14 marks of 2001-02 thanks to an influx of junior college talent.

Anthony Bolton (6-7, G-F, Vista, CA) made dramatic progress during his junior season to finish in double figures (10.8 ppg) topped by 49 points in the final two contests. Point guard Zakee Smith (6-0, Philadelphia, PA) led the Big West with 4.7 assists per game as a junior and now has a year's experience of running the offense under his belt.

But the second season picture for the other JC transfers isn't sorosy. Junior-to-be Ralphy Holmes (6-4, G, Philadelphia, PA) came

within one basket of leading the Big West in scoring last year with a 17.4 points per game average while earning first-team All-BWC. However, he will miss a year of school due to campus disciplinary problems. And Bron Groomes (6-7, F, Brooklyn, NY), who was a solid contributor off the bench averaging 5.9 points and 3.6 rebounds, may have seen his career ended by a freak off-campus accident that threatens the use of the little finger on his right hand.

Burton must build around athletic senior center Pape Sow (6-10, Dakar, Senegal), who averaged 13.8 points and a league-high 8.8 rebounds in a suspension-marred 18-game season; two-year letterman guard Derick Andrew (Rancho Cucamonga, CA, 9.6 ppg); and a 6-foot-11 senior (again) center in a healthy

Babacar Camara (Dakar, Senegal). They will be be augmented by veteran guards Denver Lopez (6-1, Sr., West Covina, CA) and Joe Nichols (6-5, Sr., Whittier, CA) and five new JC transfers. Newcomers on scholarship are 6-foot-5 forward


Hardy Asprilla from College of the Sequoias, 6foot-3 guard David Warsaw from El Camino JC and 6-foot-4 swing man Yaphett King from Redlands Community College in Oklahoma. Walking-on are all-state 6-foot-6 guard Danny Lambert from Irvine Valley College and 6-foot-6 forward Brian Pruitt from El Camino. Coach Burton and the Titans also picked up two promising freshmen in point guard Bobby Brown from Westchester High School and walk-on Jason Pettaway from Deer Valley High in Antioch.

Not available for games but able to provide quality opposition in practice will be fouryear college transfers Jermaine Harper, a guard from the University of Virginia, and Lloyd Walls, a 6-foot-9 forward from Wright State.

Coach Burton plans to play an up tempo game, something predecessor Donny Daniels

was precluded from doing due to a shortage of healthy bodies. The 2002-03 Titans played a run-down-the-clock "attack" which kept them close in low-scoring games and they found a knack for winning the tight ones, posting a 5-1 mark in overtime.

The schedule has two more home non-conference games than a year ago, but the Titans must tackle a pair of Pac-10 opponents this season -- facing Arizona State for the first time since 1984 while also returning to the Los Angeles Sports Arena to play USC for the second year in a row. The Titans play a non-conference home-and-home series with Northern Arizona and also host Eastern Washington, Sacramento State, Occidental and LMU. The Big West Conference schedule will be more important than ever with a new post-season tournament format.

His versatility was invaluable as he played both forward positions along with the off guard spot and even some at point guard, where defenders had difficulty matching up to his size... When he played less effectively, the team struggled... In Fullerton's 10 wins he averaged 13.3 points and made 45 percent from the 3-point line... In the 18 losses in which he played, he averaged 9.3 points and shot only 30 percent from behind the arc... Oddly, Bolton's game seemed to conflict with that of center Pape Sow... Bolton struggled early while Sow put up strong numbers... When Sow was suspended, Bolton began lighting up the court... When Sow returned, Bolton struggled with his shot... Only in the last few games did they perform in synchronization.

CSF IN 2002-03: Appeared in all but one game and started 23 times... One of three Titans (Holmes and Sow were the others) to average double figures in scoring at 10.8 points per game... At 4.1 rebounds per game he was No. 4 on the squad... Streaky shooter... In the first 7 games of the season, he shot only 26 percent (13 of 51) from the floor and 12 percent from

Rodney Anderson's freshman season (1999-2000) was cut short by a random street shooting that has left him paralyzed from the chest down... He was shot three times





# In Its 35th Season - 1969-2004

The Big West Conference enters its 35th season of sponsoring the sport of men's basketball. In addition, the Big West will celebrate the 29th anniversary of its post-season tournament in 2003-04. For the fourth straight year, the conference tournament will be held at the Anaheim Convention Center Arena. It will be the ninth time overall that the city of Anaheim has hosted the event.

During the past 34 years, six of the 10 current members have claimed or shared a regular season title. Five current members have won the tournament title led by Utah State's five titles. The Aggies have appeared in the last four straight championship games and have won three times.

The Big West has been home to one NCAA National Championship (UNLV in 1990) and one NIT crown (Fresno State in 1983). The conference also has had a team represented in the NCAA Tournament every year of its 34-year existence. Eight times the conference has had multiple representatives. Last year, the Big West sent two teams to postseason play, including the representative to the NCAA Tournament, Utah State. The Aggies nearly pulled off a monumental upset in the first round against Kansas.

On eight occasions, the Big West has sent two teams to the National Invitation Tournament. The 2001-02 season saw UC Irvine and Utah State advance to the NIT.

While Big West programs have excelled on a national level, several individual alumni also have gone on to enjoy successful NBA careers. In 1998, the number one pick in the NBA Draft came out of the Big West in Michael Olowokandi (Los Angeles Clippers) from Pacific. Other NBA stars that hailed from the Big West are Larry Johnson, Bryon Russell, Brian Shaw, Lucious Harris, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen.

Leon Wood, a first round pick in 1984 for Philadelphia, also has NBA affiliation as he is working as a referee.

The Big West hopes to have a banner 2003-04 season and the pieces appear to be in place to do just that. Six of the top 10 scorers and seven of the top 10 rebounders from last year are returning. The conference also returns three First Team All-Big West members in UC Santa Barbara's Branduinn Fullove, Cal State Fullerton's Ralphy Holmes and Cal Poly's Varnie Dennis. Four of the five All-Big West Second Team honorees also are back in uniform. Fullove earned Honorable Mention All-American accolades from the Associated Press last season.

# Big West Introduces New Tournament Format



The format for the 2004 Big West Tournament has changed.

Under the new format, the No. 5 through No. 8 seeds will compete in first round action on day one. The first round winners will face the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds in quarterfinal action the following day. The quarterfinal winners will advance to the semifinals to play the top two seeds in the tournament.

In each round, the highest remaining seeded team will play the lowest remaining seeded team.

Seedings will be determined by the final regular season standings.

### Big West To Have 11 Games Televised on ESPN & FOX

The Big West Conference will have 11 games televised this season between ESPN, ESPN2 and Fox Sports Net. Nine of the games are part of a Fox Sports Net conference package and two games are part of ESPN.

Eight regular season games will be broadcast on Saturday's on Fox Sports Net West 2 beginning on January 17 and lasting through the final week of the conference schedule.

Both conference championship games will be televised again this season. The Women's Tournament final will air on Fox Sports Net West 2 at 1:00 pm on Saturday, March 13. The Men's Tournament final will air later that day on ESPN at 9:00 pm.

ESPN2 will televise a matchup featuring two of the conference's 20-game winners from last season. Utah State, which went 24-9 and won the Big West Tournament, travels to UC Irvine on February 28 at 8:00 pm (PST). The Anteaters posted a 20-9 record in 2002-03. Four of the last five games between these two teams have been decided by two points or less.

Photo credentials must be worn in plain sight at all times. Photographers may shoot only from the designated areas behind both baselines.

a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Blvd. or Lot B off State College Blvd. and paying \$3 (Monday thru Thursday 7 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. and Friday 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., year round) upon entry for a daily permit (no charge after 5 p.m. or on weekends)

b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the corner of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

BROADCAST SPACE: One "table" is allocated to each team's designated commercial radio station. Each position handles three persons comfortably. Two complimentary lines are available in most cases.

TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 278-5700 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building. Please call if you have special telephone needs.

LOCKER ROOMS: Are located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. Coach Bob Burton will conduct his post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is CLOSED to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

# 2002-03 SEASON REVIEW

The bench was short and the games ran long.

That's a 9-word summary of Cal State Fullerton's 2002-03 men's basketball season, one that found frustration at lofty levels yet showed promise for continued improvement with a doubling of the prevous year's victory total from five to 10.

But it took a fortuitous 5-1 record in overtime games to get to a 10-19 won-lost mark due to a relentless series of problems.

"Everytime I said 'what else could go wrong?' I found out," said Coach Donny Daniels, who would resign on April 18 to take a higher-paying assistant's job at UCLA under incoming Coach Ben Howland.

The first weekend of practice in October set the tone as three players went down with injuries. Every team has them, but the young Titans got hit where they were most experienced.

Senior forward Brandon Campbell, the team's only three-year letterman, suffered a foot injury that would eliminate him for all but 38 minutes of the season. Two-year letterman center Babacar Camara didn't last much longer, playing only 23 minutes in five games because of an achilles problem before he went down for the season on Dec. 21 with a severe ankle sprain.

Another letterman, Derick Andrew, missed the final eight games of the season after waking up one morning with a rare preretinal hemorrhage in his right eye. Letterman center Pape Sow had to sit out 11 games for disciplinary reasons and letterman guard Denver Lopez was relegated to mopup duty after a couple of injuries.

Even first-team All-Big West Conference guard Ralphy Holmes couldn't avoid the inactive list. He suffered a shoulder injury which cost him three games and many practices.

The woes continued even after the season. Guard Fedi Holm-Hadulla, who sat out the first eight games because he had played against professionals in his native Germany but blossomed into a deadly 3-point shooter in the second half of the season, had to "retire." Doctors determined that his injured knee could not be repaired. And forward Jamal Forcheney, the only Titan to play in all

nights later when the Titans got an unexpected lift from Holmes. He got a doctor's clearance for his shoulder injury and drove up to Santa Barbara just in time for the game. He came off the bench to sink a 3-pointer at the regulation buzzer to force overtime, where the Titans handed the eventual conference regular-season champions their only home loss.

Coach Daniels had to scrap his up-tempo attack to "shorten" the game into fewer possessions. Point guard Zakee Smith had to learn a new style and he and all of his teammates had to learn how to count down from 35 to milk the shot-clock to the maximum.

The strategy worked as Fullerton managed to finish in sixth place in the Big West with a 8-10 record, its best conference mark in 10 years. The Titans qualified for the post-season tournament where they staged a

Utah State, only to taste their first overtime loss of the season. Ironically, one more win would have tied the NCAA record for OT wins in a single season. Earlier in the year, the Titans won three consecutive games in overtime to at least tie another NCAA mark.

The Titans began their 43rd season, their 29th at the Div. I level and their third under Coach Donny Daniels at the Hawaiian Airlines Tip-Off Tournament against a much younger program in Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, which was starting only its fourth season. But the Div. I experience on the respective rosters was just the opposite and the veteran Islanders took advantage of a Titan squad new to Div. I play and withstood a furious Fullerton rally. Compounding the Titans' situation was the fact that their two most experienced players -- 3-year letterman Brandon Campbell and 2-year letterman Babacar Camara -- were sidelined with injuries.

With junior point guard Brian Evans leading the way, the Islanders overcame Pape Sow's game-opening basket with an 8-0 run that gave them the lead for the entire game despite repeated CSF runs. The biggest lead of the first half was 13 points. In the second half the margin grew to 16 at 65-49 with 11:50 to go. Amir Bar-Netzer sparked the Titans on an 11-2 run to get within 7 points and the game became a one-possession difference at 1:41 after a jumper by Ralphy Holmes. It became a 2-point game at 78-76 when Sow scored on an inbounds play at 1:09, but that would be the final Titan scoring effort. Evans hit two free throws before Derick Andrew and Holmes missed shots at the other end and two more free throws by Travis Bailey preceded an errant Holmes 3point try. Evans hit one more free throw for the final score and then the Titans missed three more desperation treys in the final 21 seconds.

The Titans improved their defense dramatically from game one but their offensive performance left something to be desired -- like points. It wasn't until the 13:42 mark that the Fullerton side of the scoreboard was necessary when Jamal Forcheney put in a short shot. By then the Titans were down, 8-2, and by the 8:25 mark it had become a 17-4 deficit.

Good shots weren't the problem. Only once or twice in the first 12 minutes did Coach Donny Daniels wince at a shot selection. The ball simply wouldn't go in the basket. Nine first-half turnovers, mostly on passes coming out from the post, were another problem.

The outcome stayed in doubt well into the second half because the Titans were having good success with their fullcourt press, ultimately forcing 20 Trojan turnovers. They came out in the second half fired up, but forward Jibrahn Ike singlehandedly kept UALR out in front. He scored 9 of its first 11 points in the second half and the lead got as large as 20 points at 42-22 with 14:30 remaining. Fullerton never got the deficit down to a single digit, due in great part to a cold stretch midway through the half when they scored only 4 points between the 11:41 and 2:53 marks -- a span of almost nine minutes.

Fullerton was at least temporarily buoyed by the play of senior Brandon Campbell, who shook off the effects of minor foot surgery and the cobwebs of more than a week without practice, to contribute 4 points in 16 minutes.

Titan Gym was as lively as it had been in recent memory for the "Battle of the Blue & Orange," with vocal supporters for both sides caught up in the frenzy of a well-played game that went down to the wire even though the Waves were sizzling the nets.

Fullerton led only once and only by a point in the first half. It saw a 23-23 deadlock fade into a 50-39 halftime deficit, due primarily to the 3-point line, where Pepperdine hit 8 of 12 while Fullerton made only 1 of 11 tries.

The momentum of the near miss against Pepperdine seemed to carry over for the Titans in Gersten Pavilion. Fullerton hit its first nine shots and jumped out to an 18-9 lead. But they wouldn't make another field goal for more than six minutes and, in the meantime, the Lions warmed up and Pape Sow picked up his third personal foul. Brandon Campbell's layup at 8:40 gave Fullerton a 22-19 lead that disappeared for good at 30-29 LMU with 5:04 to go in the first half.

After intermission, the Lions stretched a 9-point halftime lead to double digits, thanks in great part to several offensive rebound baskets. It was 61-48 midway through the half when the Titans made a surge. With Sow wheeling inside and fouling out the tallest Lions, the Titans got within a point at 65-64 with 2:42 to go on a 3point play by Bron Groomes. But on the next seven possessions, the Titans did not execute well. They didn't have the patience to get the ball inside to Sow. Instead, turnovers, missed free throws and a couple of errant field goal tries wasted the rally efforts and the Lions made critical free throws down the stretch to pull away to a 7-point win. In fact, the margin of victory came at the foul line where the Lions outscored the visitors by 11 points.

Campbell, the Titans' most experienced player with three letters to his credit, played his final 22 minutes.

For the first time on the basketball court, the Titans and Trojans did battle. Both teams were coming off 2-game losing streaks but it was the Trojans who righted their ship.

Fullerton's turn in the spotlight came in the early going. With an animated Pape Sow scoring three quick baskets, the Titans jumped out to leads of 7-3 and 9-5 as USC committed numerous turnovers. But Robert Hutchinson came off the bench with a hot hand and the game turned around in a hurry. Hutchinson hit three threes in three tries to fuel a 17-6 run that turned an 11-8 deficit into a 25-17 lead with 6:33 to go in the first half. The Trojans kept on rolling, stretching the lead to as many as 15 points before settling for a 12-point halftime bulge.

Ralphy Holmes had kept the Titans alive by scoring 16 first-half points on 7 of 10 shooting. But after intermission he took only three shots until the final minutes and Sow didn't get his fourth field goal until 7:50 to play. The USC lead got as large as 25 points before a late Titan surge made the deficit more respectable.

The other hero for the Trojans was forward Rory O'Neil, who scored a career high 22 points and grabbed 7 rebounds while missing only one of 10 shots.

With three consecutive losses behind them and four road games around the bend, the Titans took to their home floor against Idaho State desperate for a victory. The visiting Bengals came in 2-4, but two of those losses had come in overtime and they came out hot, hitting their first three 3-point field goal attempts for an early 16-9 lead. With Bron Groomes scoring inside, the Titans scored the next 7 points to tie and neither team would lead by more than 3 points until intermission, which fittingly began with a score of 33-33.

But 2:25 before the horn, Pape Sow had to be helped off the floor after turning his previously injured ankle. He came back in the second half and even hit a couple of 3-point field goal tries as the Titans eased out to a 41-39 advantage. But that was the end of the good news. Idaho State used an 8-0 run to turn a 45-45 tie into a 53-45 lead at 10:20 and during the run, Groomes went down with a severely sprained ankle.

With Groomes out and Sow playing on one leg, the Titans were beaten badly on the backboards. Idaho State got six offensive rebounds in each half on the way to a 41-25 carom supremacy. Again, a Titan opponent shot well over 50 percent from the floor. That was compounded by a poor Titan effort at the foul line and the losing streak was four heading out on the road.

Possibly the most improbable victory in the history of Titan basketbal -to date -- was registered in this nonconference game at Sacramento State.

Fullerton was playing on the road, where it had won only five games in the past 3+ seasons. The Titans dressed only 8 players with Pape Sow (ankle), Bron Groomes (ankle) and Denver Lopez (ankle) joining Brandon Campbell on the sidelines. And they saw Babacar Camara go down with an ankle injury after only 10 seconds in relief of Amir Bar-Netzer, who picked up two early fouls. So the Titans went with six players — Joe Nichols played only the final 17 seconds — and they had only five eligible for the final 7:47 after Jamal Forcheney fouled out.

The Titans played with passion and zeal. They were diving for loose balls and they dominated the taller Hornets on the backboards by almost a 2-to-1 margin. Anthony Bolton, who had scored only 23 points in the previous 6 games, tallied 17 in the first half alone on his way to a career-high 20 points. With Ralphy Holmes contributing 21, the Titans led most of the game.

Sacramento made its most serious challenge late in the first half. It turned a 28-18 CSF lead into a slim 28-27 margin with 4:01 left. But the Titans scored the final 11 points and the first four of the second half to re-establish control at 42-27. The Hornets didn't get the deficit into single digits until the final seconds, even though the Titans missed their final eight free throws.

The Titans suited up only seven players for their second trip to Northern California in two weeks but the surprising success they enjoyed at Sacramento State could not be repeated.

With Ralphy Holmes joining the wounded list with a separated right (shooting) shoulder, the Titans had to go with a starting lineup averaging a combined 23 points. USF star Darrell Tucker was averaging close to that himself and he didn't hurt those numbers, eventually erupting for 23 points and 11 rebounds.

Fullerton played competitively for 13 minutes and built a 5-point lead over their hosts, who had won two games in a row since welcoming New Mexico transfer Alvin Broussard and Nevada transfer James Bayless. The Dons had scored only 16 points in 13 minutes but they exploded for a 16-0 run over a 4-minute span to build a double-digit lead that never was seriously threatened.

The Dons stretched their halftime lead to as many as 21 points at 71-50 with 5:15 to play at which point Coach Phil Mathews showed mercy for his friend Donny Daniels and pulled most of his starters. But he had to put them back in moments later after the Titans used an 8-0 run to narrow the margin.

Guard Fedi Holm-Hadulla made his Titan debut and played 28 minutes, tallying a pair of free throws. Bron Groomes made a strong return from the ankle injury he suffered two weeks earlier against Idaho State. He led the team with 16 points on 6 of 7 field-goal shooting and grabbed 4 rebounds.

The Titans opened Big West play on the road but in a building where they had won on their last two visits. But only Derick Andrew could relate to that success as the only returning letterman still active. Fullerton added walk-ons Joe Nichols and Andrew Maxie to the seven men who made the USF trip but Coach Donny Daniels benched Anthony Bolton for the game for missing a practice, leaving the Titans with six scholarship players.

For about 23 minutes, the Titans' strategy of using as much of the 35-second shot clock as possible and playing a compact zone defense was working a compact zone defense was working well. After trailing by only four points at the half, they were within two at 28-26 after Jamal Forcheney's field goal. But the Mustangs, who hit only 2-of-11 3-point field goal tries in the first half, started finding the range. They went on an 18-0 run over an 8-minute span and suddenly the Titans were staring at a 20-point deficit.

Both Fedi Holm-Hadulla and Derick Andrew played all 40 minutes and Cal Poly's shooting statistics show the Titan zone lost its energy as fatigue set in. Cal Poly shot 31 percent in the first half and 56 percent in the second half and its 3-point field goal percentages made a similar improvement, from 18 to 50.

Nichols hit his only two shots late in the game to post a career scoring high of 5 points in 9 minutes, many of those played on the front line.

If the Titans' earlier win at Sacramento was the most improbable in memory, this victory at UCSB relegated it to second place. After tying a school record with only 14 points in the first half, the Titans erased a 15-point deficit and then beat the defending BWC tournament champs in OT. The catalyst was Ralphy Holmes, who drove from Fullerton on game day, declaring himself ready to help after two weeks off with a separated shoulder.

The Gauchos tried to pick up the tempo from the outset and forced Fullerton into several violations and hurried shots. With UCSB hitting its first 3 shots, the hosts jumped to a 9-2 lead and stretched it to 29-14 at the half.

The game was played evenly until 8:00 to go when UCSB quit scoring. The Gauchos saw their 46-35 lead cut to 46-42 at 1:54 on Amir Bar-Netzer's layup. Casey Cook finally hit a free throw with 1:04 remaining and when Cecil Brown made a layup for 49-44 with 13 seconds left, UCSB seemed safe. But Bar-Netzer scored again and Nick Jones missed the front end of a 1and-1 with 4.5 second left. The ball got to Holmes near mid-court and he took a couple of dribbles before launching a high-arching 30-footer that as the dropped through the rim for a 49-49 tie as the buzzer sounded.

Holmes' only point in OT put Fullerton ahead to stay at 52-51. Jamal Forcheney's second basket of OT and a Bolton free throw upped the lead to 55-51. Jones hit a 3-pointer at 2:05 but Bolton answered with a deuce at 1:48 that proved decisive.

Yogi Berra would have loved this game. It seemed "over" many times.

The game evolved into a battle between UCI's 7-1 center Adam Parada and the Titans' "game-shortening" style of deliberate offense and packed-in zone defense. Parada had the early upper hand and scored 8 points as UCI took a 16-15 lead. But the Titans took advantage of some poor shooting by UCI to open a 5-point halftime lead.

Fullerton stretched the lead to 33-26 in five minutes. But Parada personally retaliated for UCI, scoring eight consecutive points for a 34-33 lead with 12:37 to go. Fullerton came back with a 13-0 run over the next 4 minutes for a 46-34 lead that seemed sufficient.

Not so fast, Yogi. The Anteaters cut the gap to 7 before the Titans steadied and regained a 10-point lead at 54-44 with 1:19 left. Safe lead, right? Wrong. Mike Efevberha hit a pair of threes to get it back to 54-50 with 43 seconds left. The Titans missed some free throws and UCI scored every time down the floor, finally tying the game at 0:03 when Jordan Harris scored.

In OT, Ralphy Holmes scored Fullerton's first 5 points but Parada had 4 and Ross Schraeder hit a 3 to give UCI a 64-62 lead at 1:43. The odds against a third consecutive overtime game were tremendously long, but that's what the Titans got in their encounter with rival Long Beach State. Unlike the come-from-behind effort at UCSB and the almost come-from-ahead decision vs. UC Irvine, this one swung both ways down the stretch.

After building a 5-point lead with a strong first-half finish, the Titans nursed their advantage between 1 and 7 points after intermission, the latest at 37-30 with 10:24 remaining. Long Beach then took a page from UCI's rally book and hit four consecutive 3-point baskets to go from a 41-35 deficit at 7:17 to a 47-43 lead with 3:56 left after a Jibril Hodges trey.

But the 49ers wouldn't score again in regulation. Derick Andrew hit a pair of buckets, the second with 57 seconds left, to tie the game at 47. Long Beach had the ball the rest of the way thanks to a CSF kicking violation but fumbled away a game-winning shot attempt.

In OT, Andrew hit a 3-pointer on the first possession and CSF would never relinquish the lead despite back-to-back treys by Darden at 1:12 and 0:30. Both teams missed key free throws before the Beach turned the ball over at 0:05. Anthony Bolton was fouled and hit two free throws.

The NCAA does not post a record for consecutive wins in OT but the mark for consecutive OT games played is four, shared by Jacksonville in 1982, Illinois State in 1985 and Dayton in 1988. Since none of them won all four of those contests, the Titans, who share the NCAA record of four ROAD OT wins in a season (1988), at least tied another record with three wins in a row.

The Titans took a break from the Big West schedule to finish out a home-andhome series and the non-conference slate with a return game at Idaho State, which was playing its final tuneup before opening Big Sky play.

The Bengals had scored a 79-70 victory in Titan Gym on Dec. 14, which was the last game Pape Sow played, and that loss took the Titans' record down to 1-6. Riding the momentum of a 4-2 mark since then, the Titans hoped to avenge that loss in refurbished Reed Gym in Pocatello.

The Bengals got the early jump with center Ray Munyagi scoring his team's first eight points for an 8-2 lead. The Titans drew within two at 14-12 on Fedi Holm-Hadulla's 3-pointer at 10:20. But Idaho State scored 8 points on its next three possessions for a 10-point lead and it got bigger until Ralphy Holmes finally hit two buckets in the half's final minute.

Fullerton could recall its rally from a 15-point deficit at UC Santa Barbara but the memory was fleeting as Idaho State opened the second half with a 10-3 run. The lead grew to as many as 20 points, the last time at 60-40 with 7:41 to play, and Holmes was out with a recurrence of his shoulder injury.

A couple of technical fouls on the Bengals helped fuel a late Titan rally. With Anthony Bolton hitting a pair of 3-pointers and the Titans making 9 of 10 free throws, the Titans outscored the Bengals 26-10 to narrow the gap to 70-66 with 1:01 left after two Jamal Forcheney free throws. But from there the Bengals hit 4 of 6.

The Titans entered this game sharing first place but, as feared, Ralphy Holmes had to sit it out because of his right shoulder injury. And his absence was compounded by the game-day loss of Amir Bar-Netzer, who encountered a sciatic problem in his back during the afternoon shoot-around and he would eventually miss three games.

UCR hit its first three shots of the game for a quick 7-0 lead and it would never trail. The Titans got as close as 18-17 but the Highaldners would stretch the lead out to 24-19 at the half despite geting only 4 points in the period from leading scorer Nate Carter.

In the second half, Fullerton closed within a single point on three occasions but could never get over the hump. When UCR opened a 41-33 lead on a Carter put-back at 4:41, the outcome seemed sealed.

But Anthony Bolton and Derick Andrew hit 3-point field goals on backto-back possessions to set the stage for a game-tying bucket at 1:46 by Bron Groomes. It was the only tie of the game and it would last only 21 seconds.

UCR beat the ensuing Titan press and got the ball to Carter ahead of the pack for an easy layup to regain the lead. Fullerton had a turnover and a missed shot on its next two possessions and UCR closed out the scoring on a basket by Jake Wessel at 1:00 and another Carter follow shot at 0:31.

Each team took 43 shots in the game and UCR hit four more than CSF, which also was outrebounded badly.

The loss prevented the Titans from posting their first 4-1 conference record since the 1984 season.

The Titans' ever-changing playing roster took another turn in unseasonably warm Moscow when Zakee Smith was held out of the game for missing a practice. Without him, seven Cal State Fullerton players battled until the final minute before losing at Idaho, which made 11 of 12 free throw attempts in the final 1:04 to hold on for the win.

Just as they did a week earlier across the state in Pocatello, the Titans fell behind at the start. Idaho built a lead of 17-9 before Fullerton closed the gap to 19-18 behind the scoring of Anthony Bolton (8 points). Fullerton went to the locker room down by one possession at 21-18.

At Idaho State, the Titans fell behind by 20 points before closing within 4 points in the final minute. At Idaho, the deficit got as large as 15 points at 42-27 with 8 minutes left after Tyrone Hayes erupted for the Vandals. Using primarily a mid-range jump shot, Hayes scored the first four points of the second half and 10 of Idaho's first 12 after intermission. Jon Tinnon's dunk was the only other Idaho scoring as the lead became 33-27. Then Tinnon made a 3-point play and Hayes added a jumper followed by baskets by May and Powell for a 42-27 lead at 7:57.

The Titans used a 14-3 run to get as close as 45-41 with 2:25 remaining. They had two chances to get closer in the next 1:21 but couldn't make a shot and they had to start fouling.

Ralphy Holmes returned to the active roster and he hit a pair of 3-pointers in the final minute but Fullerton never got closer than 4 points. Idaho made 11 free throws in a row -- 2 by Rashaad Powell, 4 by Zach White, 2 by Justin Logan and 2 by Hayes -- before Dwayne Williams hit one and then missed one with 3 seconds to play.

Fullerton's luck or lack thereof in Logan has been well-chronicled. The Titans walked into the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum with a 2-19 record in the building including 18 losses in a row. They hadn't won there since Feb. 6, 1982, or 9 months before Derick Andrew was born. But each of those years the temperature in the Cache Valley was below freezing, and this year was different. It was in the 40s so maybe the Titans' luck would change, too.

Utah State weathered poor shooting from its front line and the Titans' best field goal percentage since Feb. 3, 1990 -- ironically, vs. Utah State but in Titan Gym -- and squeaked out a 61-60 victory. Ralphy Holmes hit another buzzer-beating 3-pointer which left the Titans a point shy because the Aggies hit four free throws in four tries in the final 11 seconds.

Utah State had built a 10-point lead earlier in the half at 37-27 with 15 minutes to play. The Titans went on a 17-7 run to catch the hosts at 44-44 with 7:24 remaining. But Cardell Butler and Desmond Penigar hit 3-pointers to more than offset an Anthony Bolton deuce and the Aggies would lead the rest of the way.

Fullerton cut the deficit to only 1 point, the last time at 55-54 on a Holmes 3-pointer at 2:50. But Butler, who scored 11 of his 15 points in the second half, added a tough shot in the paint at 2:12 and the Titans got only as close as 2 points and never had the opportunity to tie or take the lead.

Fullerton's only lead was 6-5 after an Andrew jumper at 15:27.

The final score would indicate a fairly convincing Titan win and for most of the 40 minutes the Titans were in control. But a frantic 30 seconds late in the game turned this one into a war.

With the Matadors concentrating their defense on Ralphy Holmes and Anthony Bolton, Fullerton turned to Derick Andrew for shots and he was more than up to the challenge. He took more shots in the first half -- 11 -- than he had ever attempted in a game and his 15 points paced Fullerton to a modest 27-23 halftime lead.

After Northridge closed within a basket, the Titans pulled away. Bolton's 3-pointer triggered a 17-4 run that left Fullerton ahead at 46-31 with 10:23 remaining. And it was still a 12-point lead at 54-42 when Zakee Smith hit the first of two free throws at 3:45.

He missed the second try and Justice Graham hit a 3-pointer at 3:34. After a timeout, the Titans got a quick 5-second call trying to inbound and CSUN got another trey from Curtis Slaughter at 3:28. Ralphy Holmes missed the front end of a one-and-one and Ian Boylan canned a trey at 3:05, leaving the lead at 54-51.

Holmes made a baseline runner to break the momentum and the Matadors rushed some more threes. The strategy that had gotten them back in it, took them out of it. Nemesis Pacific rolled into Titan Gym carrying a 7-game win streak over Cal State Fullerton and 12 wins in its last 13 matchups with the Titans. Only because of the phenomenal game of Demetrius Jackson, who would earn conference player of the week honors, would they escape with the streaks at 8 in a row and 13 out of 14.

Pape Sow returned to action and made his presence felt in 25 minutes of play with 9 points and a game-high 7 rebounds. It looked like he had scored the game-winning basket when he fought off traffic in front of the rim and dropped in a layup with about 15 seconds to go for a 61-59 Titan lead.

But Jackson took the inbounds pass, hurried up court and caught the Titans by surprise by pulling up from beyond NBA distance above the top of the key and drilling a 3-point field goal, his fifth of the game and fourth of the half, with 7 seconds left. Fullerton got an off-balance shot by Anthony Bolton that drew iron but no more.

Jackson scored 20 of Pacific's last 23 points covering the final 11:19 of the game. The numbers clearly summarize this game but it was probably the mindset of the Titans that set the stage. Having beaten Long Beach without Pape Sow in Titan Gym, the Titans appeared to come into the Pyramid complacent for the rematch and their lack of defensive intensity helped Long Beach to a phenomenal shooting night.

The 49ers were one of the poorest shooting teams in the Big West Conference and they led it in turnovers. But on this night they shot .615 from the floor in the first half while committing only 3 turnovers while bolting to a 13-point halftime lead.

It seemed unlikely Long Beach would be as hot in the second half and they weren't-- they were hotter! They missed only 4 of 18 shots despite increased pressure from the Titan defense and held the lead although it was seriously threatened.

Fullerton got within one possession of the lead on several occasions. The Titans had a season-low of 7 turnovers but two came when they had a chance to tie or go ahead. Back-to-back layups by Cody Pearson at 3:09 and 2:04 proved Fullerton's undoing, giving Long Beach a 72-66 lead at 2:04. The Beach missed three free throws in the next 90 seconds but Fullerton never got closer than 4 points.

After playing 10 games in a row that weren't decided until the final minute, the Titans couldn't compete with UC Irvine on a night when Mike Hood and Stanislav Zuzak played at an extremely high level.

Hood made 5 of 7 3-point tries and Zuzak was 8 for 12 overall as UCI shot 68 percent in the second half to pull away to a 20-point victory.

Almost everything was a turnaround from the teams' first meeting on Jan. 8. In that one, Adam Parada dominated the paint, but UCI couldn't score from the perimeter until a last-minute barrage in regulation. And Fullerton controlled the tempo and the shot clock with Ralphy Holmes hitting the big shots on a 23-point night. This time, Parada wasn't much of a factor but neither was Holmes.

Playing on rainy Wednesday night to accommodate a live KDOC TV broadcast, the Titans ran their record to 2-0 this season in front of the Anaheim station's cameras with a critical road victory, only their third of the year away from Titan Gym. They avenged an earlier home loss to the Highlanders, who had to face Ralphy Holmes and Pape Sow for the first time this season.

Holmes got the Titans off to a rare fast start. After a Sow 3-pointer erased a 2-0 UCR lead, Holmes hit a 3, a 2, a 3 and a 2 for a 13-2 Titans' advantage with 14:17 to go in the half. When Holmes finally missed, Amir Bar-Netzer rebounded and scored on a putback and Sow hit a jumper as the Titans were ahead, 17-4, with 12:44 to go.

Fullerton ended up with a 14-point lead at the half, only their sixth advantage at the turn all season and this one matched the previous high margin of 14 points (40-26) vs. Morris Brown.

It appeared the Titans might have an easy win when UCR star Nate Carter picked up his fourth foul with 16:39 to go and the Titans ahead, 43-31. But CSF wouldn't get its second basket of the half until the 8:02 mark (Holmes) and by then the Highlanders were back in the game. John Galbreath followed his own missed free throw for a basket to draw UCR within 50-48 with 7:42 remaining.

Anthony Bolton hit his first field goal in almost two games and Holmes added a jumper as Fullerton regained control. UCR got as close as 3 points at 59-56 at 4:13 after two Mark Peters free throws, but Zakee Smith drove through traffic for a layup and Sow started a string of 11 of 12 made Titan free throws to preserve the lead.

Utah State strolled into Titan Gym with triple-barreled motivation. The Aggies had the bunched up 2002-03 Big West Conference standings to ponder, a narrow win over Cal State Fullerton in Logan to contemplate and a stunning loss a year earlier in Fullerton to avenge. Put them all together and you had a fired up Aggies' team that overwhelmed a well-rested Titan team that might have been rusty after an 8-day break.

This one was over at the first media timeout. The Aggies hit four of their first five shots while Fullerton missed its first eight tries. The score was 9-0 in favor of Utah State before Ralphy Holmes scored on a baseline drive at 14:58. Back-to-back buckets by Holmes -- a trey -- and a layup by Jamal Forcheney on a feed from Holmes -- brought the Titans to 14-7. But the Aggies responded with an 8-0 run and the Titans would never trail by a single digit again.

Utah State more than doubled the offensive output of the Titans in the first half despite 11 points by Holmes. No other CSF starter made a field goal and with a rebounding deficit of 22-8, it was surprising the Titans were only down 17.

The second half was more of the same. Desmond Penigar made 4 of 6 shots and the Aggies gradually stretched the lead to as many as 28 points at 57-29 with 8 minutes remaining.

Holmes scored almost 60 percent of the Titans' points as he matched his 24-point effort the previous game at UCR. But his teammates made only 5 of 26 shots (.192) as the Titans matched their season low of 41 points.

The Titans rebounded from their debacle against Utah State with a far more determined effort and they came away with a critical win over Idaho.

Despite another slow start, the Titans led virtually the entire game. Bron Groomes broke an 8-8 tie at the 11:05 mark and Fullerton would hold the lead until the final 10 seconds of regulation.

After building an 8-point halftime lead, the Titans used the defensive efforts of Pape Sow and a revitalized offensive game from Anthony Bolton to keep Fullerton ahead. The lead was 6 points with 1:07 to play after Bolton hit a pair of free throws. But Dwayne Williams hit a layup and a trey around a missed one-and-one by Holmes and the lead was down to 52-51. He hit his second 3-pointer of the season on Fullerton's first possession to get the lead for good. He added a free throw at 1:58 before fouling out at 0:41. Groomes' layup at 0:59 produced a 62-58 lead and it survived Idaho's last two possessions.

Already burdened with a 13-game losing streak in Spanos Center, the Titans were further hampered by the absence of Ralphy Holmes, who didn't make the long bus trip north for disciplinary purposes. But in a display of grit and determination, the Titans held on to go home from Stockton happy for the first time since Jan. 28, 1989.

The game swung late in the first half. The Titans turned a 3-point deficit (30-27) into a 3-point lead with Jamal Forcheney tallying 4 points. The Titans then opened the second half with a 10-0 run for a 43-30 lead with 15:50 to go.

Fullerton would make only two more baskets and score only 12 more points, but a combination of offensive patience, determined defense and poor shooting by the Tigers kept the Titans ahead.

The margin was shaved to 6 points at 48-42 when Christian Maraker scored with 6:57 to play. Anthony Bolton countered with two free throws and then neither team scored until the 2:54 mark when Matt Kemper tossed in a 3-pointer.

Missed free throws by Zakee Smith gave UoP a window of opportunity and Demetrius Jackson made it a 1-point game at 1:41 when he finally hit a 3-pointer after six misses.

Pacific missed four shots around a made free throw by Pape Sow, who blocked one of the UoP tries. Myree Bowden had a chance to tie the game with 11 seconds to go but made only one of two free throws.

With 10 seconds left, the Tigers fouled Amir Bar-Netzer, who calmly sank both tries for a career-high of 10 points and a 3-point lead that stood up.

Having locked up a post-season tournament berth by virtue of their win in Stockton, the Titans headed to Northridge trying to climb up in the standings and improve their seeding.

Ralphy Holmes was back in good graces and the Titans got a quick boost when Amir Bar-Netzer scored the first five points of the game. But Holmes would have a miserable shooting night and so would Anthony Bolton. Only a hot hand in the second half by Fedi Holm-Hadulla got the Titans into a competitive position in the final minutes.

Northridge came alive behind senior Curtis Slaughter, playing his final home game. His trey at 15:33 put the Matadors ahead to stay at 8-5. He made another one for an 11-7 lead and a third for an 18-9 cushion at 9:56. Two buckets inside by Chris Davis capped a 22-5 run and gave the hosts a 22-10 advantage.

The lead got as big as 15 points at 32-17 before Pape Sow scored the final four points of the half for an 11-point deficit.

Holm-Hadulla hit 5 of 6 shots in the second half including 3 of 4 from 3-point land and the Titans inched their way back. They got the lead down to single digits at the 9:34 mark only for the Matadors to pull out to a 16-point lead at 56-40.

The rematch between the Gauchos and the Titans had a different outcome but the similar final seconds of regulation set the stage for an instant replay of the Jan. 4 encounter in Santa Barbara..

Once again, UCSB had the ball and a 3-point lead in the waning seconds. At UCSB, Nick Jones missed a one-and-one free throw with five seconds remaining and Ralphy Holmes dropped in a 3-pointer at the buzzer to force overtime, where the Titans manufactured a 2-point win.

This time the Gauchos turned the ball over when Pape Sow stole a cross-court pass with about five seconds to go but Holmes missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game. The win gave UCSB the No. 1 seed in the post-season tournament and two nights later it would nail down the regular season title.

Branduinn Fullove, who missed the first game against Fullerton due to a groin injury, made his presence felt early. He didn't miss a shot in a 13-point first half and when he ran his string of made 3-pointers to five in a row early in the second half, the Gauchos had the biggest lead of the game at 39-29.

But Fullerton had Pape Sow, who didn't make it for the first encounter in Santa Barbara. He was controlling the backboards and he made a couple of baskets as the Titans got even at 42-42.

UCSB pulled away to lead by as many as 8 points before the Titans rallied again. Sow's layup with 16 seconds left made it a 1-point game. Fedi-Holm-Hadulla was called for an intentional foul. Jones made two free throws with 12 seconds left and UCSB got the ball back, trying to run out the clock. Sow's steal gave the Titans one more chance but this time Holmes missed.

Cal Poly won on its last five trips into Titan Gym and the Mustangs handed Fullerton a 21-point setback in their first meeting in January in San Luis Obispo. But when the Mustangs hit only 1 of their first 9 shots, they let the Titans get off to a good start and a dogfight ensued.

Fullerton scored 11 unanswered points for a 15-5 lead and the Titans built the margin to as many as 14 points, the last time at 38-24 with 2:41 to go in the half. Inevitably, the Mustangs found their shooting hand, particularly Minnesota transfer Shane Schilling, who would end up with a career-high 32 points, the best total by any Big West player this year.

Cal Poly caught the Titans at 55-55 and pulled away to a 61-57 lead with about 8 minutes to play. Fullerton stormed back for a 65-65 tie and neither team had a lead larger than 3 points the rest of regulation. SLO looked like a winner when Sow was called for stepping out of bounds in traffic in the closing seconds and Cal Poly ahead, 70-69. Jason Allen made two free throws with 6 seconds left but Anthony Bolton buried a 3-pointer from the top of the key in the final second and the game went to OT.

Fedi Holm-Hadulla put Fullerton ahead to stay at 79-76 with 0:55 remaining and Fullerton went up by 6 after free throws by Bolton and Sow. But Cal Poly hit three 3-pointers in the final 20 seconds and it took expert free-throw shooting by Sow (2-for-2) and Bolton (4-for-4) to hold off the Mustangs.

Fullerton had a season high in points, 3-pointers and 3-point field goal percentage as well as a 25-for-29 effort at the foul line. Bolton had a career high and Holm-Hadulla matched his as the Titans won their fifth overtime game.

On the 25th anniversary of the Titans' last tournament championship, in the same venue and with former Coach Bobby Dye in attendance, the Titans saw their overtime magic come to an end along with their 2002-03 season.

Utah State hit 11 of 12 free throws in OT and the one they missed proved most devastating to Fullerton's hopes. Desmond Penigar rebounded Spencer Nelson's miss and put it back in for a 78-75 lead with 1:56 to play. Anthony Bolton missed a shot at the other end, Cardell Butler hit a trey for Utah State and the Titans had to foul in the last minute. Mark Brown foiled that strategy by making 8-of-8 in the final 0:44.

Fullerton staged a furious rally to force the overtime, where the Titans could have tied the NCAA record for single-season OT wins at six. Down 68-59, the Titans got a 3-point play from Pape Sow at 1:07. Butler hit two free throws for USU but Ralphy Holmes made a layup to make it 70-64 with 52 seconds left. Bolton made two free throws to one by Toraino Johnson to make it 71-66. Holmes then hit a 3pointer with 30 seconds left and a 2pointer with 15 seconds to go to forge the tie. But in blocking a shot by Penigar in the interim, Sow sprained both his left ankle and left knee and could not return.

At the outset, Utah State looked like it would cruise to an easy win. The Aggies turned a 4-4 tie into a 15-4 lead before Bolton rallied the Titans on his way to a career-high 25 points. He made his last 22 free throws and 44 of 47 to end the year.

#### Lyle Parks, Jr., Titan Hustle Award



The *Titan Hustle Award* was established during the 1989-1990 season by a group of Cal State Fullerton basketball boosters then known as the *Playmakers*. The trophy traditionally has been presented to the Titan, who, in the opinion of the boosters, has displayed the greatest amount of "hustle" on offense, defense and during practices.

In 2002, the *Titan Hoop Club* board of directors unanimously voted to rename the trophy the *Lyle Parks, Jr. Titan Hustle Award*, in honor of the long-time president of the *Executive Playmakers*, whose perseverance kept the basketball booster group going throughout the mid-to-late 1990's. The

*Executive Playmakers* were responsible for successfully raising funds that were used for physical improvements to the basketball locker room and the coaches' offices.

Cal State Fullerton has been well represented at the professional level despite the relative youth of the intercollegiate basketball program. Seven Titans have been drafted in the past two decades and several more players have signed as free agents

with the National Basketball Association.

The most prominent former Titan is late bloomer Bruce Bowen, whose professional career has been a model for perseverance and determination. Signed originally as a free agent by Cleveland in 1995, he spent a couple of years in Europe, (Evreux, France, where he averaged 29 points per game) played in the CBA and has been waived and resigned numerous times by several teams while

crossing paths with numerous legendary coaches. He first captured the attention of Pat Riley with the Miami Heat in 1996-97, where he played in only one game before moving on to Boston. There he appeared in 91 games during the 1997-98 and


1998-99 seasons for Rick Pitino, serving primarily as a defensive specialist and playing less than 10 minutes per game. He was well travelel during the 1999-2000 season -- signed by Philadelphia, traded to Chicago, waived two days later and signed by Miami again where he was reunited with Riley. He became a starter during the 2000-01 season and averaged 7.2 points in 82 games before signing a free-agent contract for 2001-02 with the San Antonio Spurs. That year he started every game (59) except for the seven weeks he missed with a broken finger on his right hand. Not coincidentally, the Spurs went only 11-12 in his absence.

"You really don't know how good Bruce is until he isn't around," said captain David Robinson.

The Spurs got knocked out of the playoffs by the Los Angeles Lakers but then returned the favor last year with Bowen


leading the Spurs' charge to the NBA title. He ended up leading the league in 3-point field goal percentage while usually guarding the opponent's top perimeter threat -- the Kobe Bryants of the world.

Prior to Bowen's emergence, the most recognizable former

Titan was Cedric Ceballos, who became one of the league's top scorers for the Los Angeles Lakers and made the NBA All-Star team in 1994-95, but was unable to play due to an injury. He began his career in Phoenix, returned to the Suns and then also played for the Mavericks, the Pistons and the Heat before getting cut by Denver and retiring.

During his first four years with the Suns, he was known primarily for two things: winning the NBA slam-dunk contest in 1992 with his blind-folded "hocus pocus" act and scoring a phenomenal number of points when Charles Barkley was injured. Ceballos' absence due to another injury may have swung the tide toward Chicago in the 1994 playoffs.

Bowen and Ceballos played together as Titans during the 1989-90 season, when Cedric was a senior and Bruce was a freshman.

Success has seemed to come in pairs for Fullerton players in the pros. The Titans hit it big in 1984 when two players made NBA rosters -- guard Leon Wood with Philadelphia and center Ozell Jones with San Antonio. Wood completed a 6-year NBA career with Sacramento on Christmas Eve, 1990. He played last in the CBA and in France and toured with Magic Johnson's All-Stars. He has spent the last seven seasons as an NBA referee, only the second former NBA player to make that transition. Wood began his post-Titan career as the point guard on the United States' gold-medal 1984 Olympic team under Coach Bob Knight.

Other former Titans in and out of the NBA and CBA during recent years were 1988 graduates Richard Morton and Henry Turner. Morton started the 1988-89 season with Indiana and later played with Golden State. Turner, who was a teammate of Morton's in the CBA, spent much of the 1989-90 season with Sacramento. Morton was one of the top scorers in the CBA in recent seasons and has made the loop's all-star team.

Guard Aaron Sunderland, a 1993 product, has done well in the CBA and 1994-95 products Winston Peterson and David Frigout have played in Europe. J. D. Green (1990-92) has become a star in Australia and former center Dirk Rassloff was summoned three summers ago to join a team in Milan, Italy.


Other Titans to play in the NBA include guard Kevin Henderson, who played with Golden State and Cleveland; forward Mike Niles with Phoenix; and forward Greg Bunch with the New York Knicks. Foreign leagues have featured center Herman (Demone) Webster, forward Kerry Boagni and sharpshooter Kevin Heenan to name a few. Other players drafted in the 1980s were Ricky Mixon (Lakers), Tony Neal (Lakers) and Boagni (Utah Jazz).

Sean Williams gained fame first as an actor ("Blue Chips") and later as a member of the Harlem Globetrotters, for whom he entered the Guinness Book of World





Cal State Fullerton student-athletes have yearround access to the services offered by the Strength and Conditioning Program, under the direction of Mike Nagler. Aimed at developing speed, power, strength and endurance in Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes, the program plays a key role in the success of Titan teams.

Individual workouts are designed, implemented and regularly adjusted by Nagler to help each student-athlete develop the stamina needed to maintain the rigorous year-round workouts associated with Division I sports.

Located inside Titan Stadium is a 6,000 squarefoot weight room facility featuring eight platforms, eight squat racks, plyometric devices and nearly 8,000 pounds in free weights. The facility will service more than 300 student-athletes over the course of the year.

Mike Nagler was named Cal State Fullerton's first full-time strength and conditioning coach on Jan. 4, 2000. Nagler had spent the previous 17 months as assistant strength coach at the University of Iowa. At Iowa, Nagler was in charge of developing and implementing weight lifting programs for women's basketball, volleyball, women's soccer, men's and women's track, gymnastics, softball and men's and women's golf. He also assisted with the men's basketball program.

He also previously worked as an assistant at Baylor University, the University of Washington, UNLV and Washington State and served as an intern with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks.

Nagler, 32, earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from Washington State in 1993 and picked up a master's degree in kinesiology from UNLV in 1996.





# The Titan Tradition...

From modest beginnings and never with abundant resources, the Cal State Fullerton Titans have achieved successes that are the envy of many older and larger institutions across the country.

"Titan Pride" has been the rallying cry for 11 national team championships in seven different sports, hundreds of individual All-Americans, dozens of eventual professional athletes, numerous national coach of the year award winners, Olympic basketball players, a Miss America candidate and the subject matter of a Walt Disney film.

The tenor was set by the first intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only his second season, Coach Alex Omalev advanced the Titans five rounds into the NAIA playoffs in 1961-62. Sixteen seasons later, the nation watched another "Cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association postseason tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the NCAA Western Regional.

The basketball tradition began even stronger on the women's side. Recent Naismith and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Billie Moore coached the Titans to the national championship in 1970 and star forward Nancy Dunkle was one of her players on the women's 1976 silver-medal winning Olympic team. The most recent Titan All-American was center Genia Miller Ryecraw in 1991.

The Titans earned gold in 1984 when point guard Leon Wood directed the men's Olympic team to victory in Los Angeles. The first-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers went on to a 6-year National Basketball Association career and is now a veteran NBA referee, only the second former NBA player to make that career switch.

Future NBA performers Richard Morton, Henry Turner, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen (a member of the 2003 NBA champion Spurs) were some of the stars of the 1980s and 1990s, when the Titans made NIT appearances on both the men's and women's sides. Ceballos gained notoriety for winning the NBA Slam-Dunk contest one year while the women can point with pride to Autumn Hollyfield, the nation's top 3-point field goal shooter in 1993-94, and Koko Lahanas, the nation's scoring leader in 1994-95. Miller still holds NCAA records and came back from a career in Japan to earn a spot with the Los Angeles Sparks before venturing to Fullerton this year as an assistant coach.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton considerable fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division NCAA titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had subsequent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation. Coach Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation 12 times and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while Tami

Elliott (1984-86) won 10 All-American awards before becoming Miss Virginia and competing in the Miss America pageant.

Baseball exploded onto the national scene behind former Coach Augie Garrido by breaking the USC monopoly in the NCAA western regionals in 1975. The Titans won the national title in 1979 behind Tim Wallach, who would play 17 major league seasons. They won the College World Series again in 1984 and John Fishel was the MVP of the CWS. They were national runners-up in 1992 with another MVP in third baseman Phil Nevin, who also was the first pick in the amateur draft by the Houston Astros.

The Titans placed third in the CWS in 1994 and came back with their best season ever in 1995, going 57-9 en route to their third national championship. Leading the way was Player of the Year Mark Kotsay, now with the San Diego Padres, and one of 36 former Titans to have played in the majors. Fullerton has made three more trips to Omaha under Coach George Horton, the Baseball America 2003 national coach of the year.

Women also have sparkled on Fullerton diamonds. Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and won more games (913) than any previous coach The Titans have made eight trips to the College World Series and 22 regional appearances. They brought home an NCAA Championship in 1986 and boast three national players of the year in pitchers Kathy Van Wyk, Susan LeFebvre and Connie Clark.

The now-defunct football program made great

strides in Division I-A after its humble Div. II beginnings in 1970. Coach Gene Murphy guided the Titans to two conference championships and four runner-up finishes between 1983 and 1989. Titan products included Super Bowl rookies Bobby Kemp (Cincinnati in 1982) and Mark Collins (New York Giants in 1987). Titans have had remarkable success in the Canadian Football League. Allen Pitts was the CFL's all-time leading receiver and Damon Allen, who was still active this season, is the all-time leading passer. Mike Pringle is the No. 2 all-time rusher and could become No. 1 if he stays healthy.

With the loss of football, Head Coach Al Mistri's soccer program filled the void in Titan Stadium. A women's squad was launched in 1993 and it coincided with a memorable men's season that saw the Titans climb as high as No. 3 in the national rankings. They were led by All-American forward Eddie Soto – now an assistant coach with the program – and competed at the NCAA Final Four, placing third. There have been three subsequent trips to the playoffs and a No. 2 national ranking in 1996. On the international level, former Titan Brian Dunseth captained the U.S. Olympic team in the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1974) and individual standouts such as golfer Martha Wilkerson, runner Mark Covert and wrestler Laszlo Molnar, who finished second in the nation in 1994 at 167 pounds. Heather Killeen became the Titans'

first Div. I cross country All-American in 1994, won three events at the 1995 Big West Conference track championships and was one of 10 finalists for 1995 NCAA Woman of the Year Award.

Several current and former Titans garnered national recognition last summer at the Pan Am Games in the Dominican Republic. Jenny Topping suited up for the USA softball squad, Nadia Hernandez and Marlene Sandoval were members of the Mexican national soccer team and Giovanni Lanaro placed fifth for the Mexican nationals in the pole vault.

# Why the nickname?

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explained Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname "Titans." "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College.


"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done but then along came the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions of the caricature have been made to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a female Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was appropriate on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange.



Headed by **Dr. June Kearney**, the Athletic Academic Services department, tabbed as Titan Scholars, provides effective support services to help student-athletes reach their academic goals. The academic services staff takes a proactive role by coordinating study plans, study skills workshops, tutoring sessions, study halls, faculty and peer mentoring and campus services referrals. Staff members also monitor progress toward graduation, assist student-athletes in selecting and registering for classes and teach a Life Skills 100 class.

Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department has an "early warning" system in place, which utilizes periodic grade checks and clear communication with faculty members when student-athletes may require additional academic support.

The department also provides a re-entry program for former student-athletes who return to Cal State Fullerton to complete their degree.

#### **NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills**

Cal State Fullerton is a participating institution in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program, which is aimed at enhancing the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting. Throughout their career, Cal State Fullerton student-athletes are provided with resources that will assist their development in five primary areas: academics, athletics, personal development, career development and community service.





The athletic training program at Cal State Fullerton plays a major role in maintaining the health of Titan student-athletes. Team physicians, three full-time certified athletic trainers, two certified graduate assistants and more than 20 student assistants comprise a program that is generally regarded as one of the very best in the country.

Titan athletic training personnel specialize in preventive medicine, recognition of injuries and rehabilitation. Student athletic trainers who are admitted into the highly selective ATEP (Athletic Training Educational Program), which is administered through the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotion, must meet demanding requirements. In addition to taking 100 units of kinesiology and athletic training courses, they must serve five semesters and 1,500 clinical supervised hours. Before becoming certified, candidates must pass the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification examination, Since 1997. nearly 80 percent of Cal State Fullerton graduates have passed on their first attempt, compared to the national rate of about 30 percent. Since the inception of the program, dozens of alumni have moved into coveted positions across the country (see below).

## **Head Athletic Trainer Julie Max**

Julie Max, Cal State Fullerton's Head Athletic Trainer, has been the driving force behind the development of an athletic training program that has received national acclaim. Max is in her 24th year at her alma mater since replacing her mentor, the late Jerry Lloyd. Recently, Max was elected to a second two-year term as president of the 25,000-member National Association of Athletic Trainers (NATA), Max, the first female president in the organization's history, previously served a six-year stint on the organization's board of directors and a one-year term as its vice president. In 1997, Max was honored with the NATA Service Award, which recognizes outstanding service to the athletic training profession at the state and district level.

**Brian Quinn** assumed the post of director of athletics at Cal State Fullerton on Jan. 14, 2002.

Quinn, 62, was assistant dean and AD at Loyola Marymount University from 1985 through 1998. During his tenure the Lions won nine West Coast Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA men's basketball tournament three times. Both the baseball team and the women's volleyball team made five trips to the NCAA Playoffs with the baseball team reaching the College World Series in 1986. Among his accomplishments away from competition were bringing the department into full Title IX compliance

and earning a 10-year NCAA accreditation without conditions in 1997.

In June of 1998, Quinn was appointed executive director of athletic development and promotion. He was responsible for major gift solicitation to build new recreation and health facilities, new athletic offices and auxiliary services as well as improved playing facilities.

Quinn graduated from Loyola in 1963 with a degree in business. He was a starter for the Lions in both baseball and basketball and was captain and most valuable player of the latter for the 1962-63 season. He was inducted into the LMU Athletics Hall of Fame as both a player and administrator.

Quinn began a teaching and coaching career at St. Anthony H.S. in Long Beach in 1968 and earned a master's degree at Long Beach State in 1973. He moved on to St. Bernard H.S. in Playa Del Rey, University H.S. in Irvine and Irvine H.S., where he was the head basketball coach. He was a part-time physical education instructor at Saddleback College (North campus) and assistant principal at Woodbridge H.S. in Irvine from 1980-85.

Quinn and his wife, Collette, live in Manhattan Beach. They have four adult children: Andrew, who lives in Atlanta; Janet, who lives in Rye, New York; and two recent LMU graduates in daughters Suzanne and Maureen. The Quinns have three grandchildren — Brendan, Ryan and Dylan.



**Dr. June F. Kearney** is in her 17th year at Cal State Fullerton, where she continues to wear numerous hats.

She was appointed Senior Woman Administrator for the Titans in June, replacing Dr. Maryalyce Jeremiah, who relinquished that role to again coach the women's basketball team. Dr. Kearney has been Assistant Director of Athletics, Compliance since 1995 and in 2001 she gained the added duties of supervising the student-athletes' academic assistance program.

Dr. Kearney came to Cal State Fulleton in 1985 to serve as an assistant women's basketball coach

during Dr. Jeremiah's first tenure (1985-86 thru 1991-92). During those seven seasons, the Titans were 112-93 including a 25-9 performance in 1990-91 that included a trip into the second round of the NCAA Tournament. She coached one more season (1992-93) under head coach Debbie Ayres.

Dr. Kearney also assisted Dr. Jeremiah for three seasons at Indiana University, but the roots go even deeper. Kearney coached Jeremiah at Cedarville College in Ohio when the latter was an aspiring student-athlete. Kearney coached four sports for the Yellowjackets and had a lifetime winning percentage of nearly .600. Her basketball teams won 70 percent of their games.

Dr. Kearney played basketball at Taylor University in Upland, Indiana, where she earned a bachelors degree in 1962. She gained a masters degree from Wittenberg University and her Ph.D from The Ohio State University.

**Dr. Milton A. Gordon** was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 9, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of the Arts and Sciences for Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is the vice chairman of the NCAA Presidents Commission and was a member of the committee that appointed Myles Brand as the NCAA president. He also is the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.

# Titan Gymnasium

Titan Gym currently is undergoing major renovations. In the past few years, chairback seats have replaced most of the bleachers, portable basket supports have replaced the fold down backboards, new paint and banners have been applied to the walls and the playing surface has been redone. #### **Goodwin Field**


Goodwin Field has played host to three NCAA Regionals and a pair of Super Regionals. Every one of the Titans' postseason games at the facility in 2003 was nationally televised by College Sports Television or ESPN. A \$3 million expansion project, spearheaded by a \$1 million gift from Jerry and Merilyn Goodwin, has transformed the field into one of the premier collegiate facilities on the West Coast. The field now features the Wilson Clubhouse - which includes lockerrooms, a reception area and offices for the coaches - and the Doubek VIP Room.


# Titan Softball Complex

Having received a complete makeover since the 2000 season, the Titan Softball Complex boasts one of the top facilities in the nation. Utilizing the adjacent Wilson Clubhouse and Doubek VIP Room, the two-diamond complex can now adequately serve as a host site for postseason competition (it was the site of a 2003 NCAA Regional) in addition to the annual Kia Klassic, the top regular-season tournament in the nation.

#### **Titan Stadium**

Titan Stadium is considered among the finest soccer facilities in the nation and regularly hosts professional and international soccer matches in addition to the Titan men's and women's programs. The facility, completed in 1992, was home to the Titan football program for one year before the sport was dropped after the 1992 season. The stadium is also a hot-spot for the entertainment industry and is regularly featured in television commercials and programs. UCLA also utilized the facility this year for its fall football camp.
