

MEDIA INFORMATION and DIRECTORY

PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Five telephone lines are available -- two at all times and three after the conclusion of radio post-game shows. PRESS TABLES: Primary beat reporters and broadcasters will be located on the south side of the playing floor near the scorer's table. Auxiliary seating and scout seating is available at tables situated along the base lines.

GAME SUMMARY PACKETS: Consisting of computer generated halftime boxes, final boxes and play-by-play summaries will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building.

PRESS/PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective "home" SIDs. Photo credentials must be worn in plain sight at all times. Photographers may shoot only from the designated areas behind both baselines.

PARKING: Parking is available by:

- a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Blvd. or Lot B off State College Blvd. and paying \$1.50 (Monday thru Thursday only) upon entry for a daily permit, or:
- b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the corner of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

BROADCAST SPACE: One table is allocated to each team's designated commercial radio station. Each holds three persons comfortably across the working counter with one cramped seating space available to the rear. TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 773-3970 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building. Please call if you have special telephone needs.

LOCKER ROOMS: Are located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. Bob Hawking will conduct his post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is CLOSED to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

FAX on DEMAND: Fullerton's releases, statistics and most recent box scores are available by calling (404) 399-3066. The Big West Conference is 292#. Fullerton's codes are 1220 for the release, 1221 for notes, 1222 for cumulative statistics and 1223 for the most recent box score.

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies, such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959, and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 22,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states

and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public adminis-



tration, speech and hearing and theater. All told there are 94 degree programs -44 of them at the graduate level plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs. Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain onthe-job experience

tion program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to Cal State Fullerton for residencies and public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing

> Learning Experience, which spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

> The Ruby Gerontology Center serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience.

> Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the University and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex.

> To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State Fullerton has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.



Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President



Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at

Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as a mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is the Big West Conference representative to the NCAA Presidents Commission, California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of New Orleans, Louisiana.

John Easterbrook, Athletic Director



John Easterbrook was appointed director of athletics at Cal State Fullerton on Sept. 1, 1994, by President Milton Gordon as part of a message to the campus and the community.

"This isn't just a hiring," said Dr. Gordon, "it's a message to the athletic department that the athletic program is an integral part of our overall university program."

Easterbrook was chosen from a field of 41 candidates on the strength of his experience at a successful Div. I program and his familiarity with the California State University system as an associate athletic director for the past nine years at Fresno State. Easterbrook, 55, was involved primarily in compliance, facilities and event management at Fresno State, which drew more than 500,000 fans to athletic events last year.

Easterbrook was hired at Fresno State by Dr. Gary Cunningham. The pair had crossed paths at the University of Wyoming in Laramie where Easterbrook was the president and chief executive officer of American National Bank and Cunningham was the UW athletic director.

Easterbrook previously coached college football for 13 seasons at Idaho, Oregon State, Illinois and Wyoming. He was a threeyear starter at quarterback and also played two seasons of basketball at Illinois. He was the Most Valuable Player of the Copper Bowl. He earned a bachelor's degree in commerce and law and attended law school for two years before entering coaching.

The Champaign, Illinois, native and his wife, Cynthia, have three adult children and three granddaughters. John and his two sons are avid golfers.

As we near the end of the century, universities and colleges around the country are making a concerted effort towards increasing their academic programs in the athletic departments. Cal State Fullerton is no exception as the department places a high priority on the education and graduation of student-athletes. The Athletic Academic Services department was established by the University to help ensure the academic success of intercollegiate athletes.

The mission of Athletic Academic Services, according to Director Christine McCarthy, is to provide academic and effective

support services to help each student reach his academic goals.

"We want all of our student-athletes to benefit fully from his or her educational experience at Cal State Fullerton," said McCarthy.

The department's many programs and services are directly aimed at this goal. The office is responsible for academic advisement, coordinating study plans, class schedules, study skills workshops, tutoring, study hall, faculty and peer mentoring and referrals to the many campus services available to the student-athlete.

The office is staffed by two full-time workers, McCarthy and Barbara Kempton, and four halftime graduate assistants who serve as academic counselors and peer mentors. Kempton has been at Cal State Fullerton for 28 years, and her knowledge of the campus and the athletic department is immensely valuable to student-athletes who may need help with administrative paperwork and problems.

Student-athletes at Cal State Fullerton take an average of 4 1/2 to 5 years to graduate, and some of that success can be credited to Athletic Academic Services. The staff members assist with selecting and registering for classes, referring students to faculty advisors and tracking and evaluating their progress toward graduation. The office's services are available to all past and current student-athletes.

McCarthy comments, "Not all student-athletes are able to graduate in four years, because of professional opportunities or personal commitments. We developed a re-entry program for former student-athletes who wish to complete their studies, offering them the same services which were available to them when they competed for us."

The office of Athletic Academic Services helps student-athletes feel comfortable in the CSUF environment and McCarthy's experience before coming to the department in July, 1992, helps the orientation process. McCarthy received her Masters in Social Science from Cal State Fullerton in 1987 and has been working in education since 1984. Previous to her appointment in athletics,

McCarthy worked for three years as the Assistant Director of the Learning Assistance Resource Center at CSUF before budget cuts eliminated the department. At the LARC, she supervised 80 student employees who were responsible for the various tutorial, strategies classes, computer skills and study skill programs which were available for the university students. Before coming to Cal State Fullerton, McCarthy was the Director of Student Services at Western State University, College of Law and before that was the Director of Student Services at the University of Phoenix.

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out

of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division

students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became

known that spring afternoon in

1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the elephant mascot to life also has changed as evidenced by the adjacent photo-

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange

County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was

formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue in uni-


forms and printing instead of the "reflex" blue of recent years was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange, originally furthered by former Director of Ath-Lynn Eilefson in the mid 1980s.

finally, there is the matter of the school's

name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further

change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. To its alumni of about 100,000, it's simply Cal State Fullerton.




COACH BOB HAWKING

It took 18 years of high school basketball coaching and six years as a college assistant to prepare Bob Hawking for a head college job that came his way in a whirlwind 72 hours at Cal State Fullerton in late September.

"It has been a lifelong dream to become a Division I head coach," said Hawking upon his Sept. 22 promotion from assistant to head coach for the 1994-95 season to replace Brad Holland, who resigned on Sept. 19 after two years at Fullerton. "There are only 301 of these jobs in the nation."

"I think this is the best move for the university, for the basketball players and



the athletics department right now," said John Easterbrook, director of athletics. "We're happy to have somebody with Bob's experience as a head coach and as an assistant coach at the Division I level on board."

"I'm a work-ethic guy," said Hawking.
"I'm not the most talented, but I've tried to
make up for it by outworking my competition."

Under Hawking's direction, the Titan program will continue to focus on quietly building itself into a West Coast power. He feels as though the Titans are well on their way to accomplishing just that.

"We will continue the process we started two years ago of building this program," he said. "Brad did not leave an empty cupboard. We like our players. I've recruited most of them and I felt good that they went to John Easterbrook and told him they wanted me as their coach.

"Our recruiting philosophy remains

constant. We are looking for outstanding young people, who have a strong desire to excel on the court and in the classroom. My intention is to be coaching the Titans in the year 2020."


No major changes in the Titans' style of play are anticipated.

"Our style of play will be fun to play, fun to watch and fun to coach," said Hawking. "We will also be fundamentally sound in our execution of the basic skills of the game.

"Brad and I have similar basketball backgrounds. I played for ex-UCLA assistant coach Denny Crum at Pierce College in Woodland Hills and we did the same things John Wooden and his UCLA teams were doing at Pauley Pavilion. We also have a few differences. I'm a little older, a little more portly and I get my golf handicap from Golf 'n Stuff rather than the Riviera Country Club."

Hawking, 45, has been the top assistant the past two years at Fullerton after two-year stints under Bob Williams at UC Davis and Tom Asbury at Pepperdine.

Hawking's high school coaching career began at Pater Noster High in Los Angeles. He later served as head coach at Simi Valley High School for 14 years and developed a championship program. His teams went to the CIF playoffs nine times and won five Marmonte League championships. His 1987 team was ranked No. 4 in the state and his 1988 team won the CIF



title behind the play of Don MacLean, who went on to become the alltime leading scorer in the Pac-10 for UCLA. Hawking was selected the CIF Southern Section 4A Coach of the Year.


The playing career of Hawking began at Alemany High School in Mission Hills and continued at Pierce College and Cal State Northridge, where he earned a degree in 1971.

George Fuller (Grand Valley State '78)


George Fuller joins the Titan coaching staff for 1994-95 and steps right into the top assistant's post for new Head Coach Bob Hawking. An assistant the past 10 years at Grand Valley State in Allendale, Michigan, he was hired as the No. 2 assistant at Fullerton on Aug. 22 and stepped up a notch on Sept. 22.

Fuller will spearhead the Titans' recruiting efforts and play a large part in game preparation both in practice and in opponent scouting. In addition, he will assist Coach Hawking with the summer basketball camp. His focus with the players primarily will be with the post players and on team defense.

Fuller, 38, had spent his entire basketball career at Grand Valley. A two-time all-conference selection, he was the starting point guard on three conference championship teams for Head Coach Tom Villemure and earned his degree in 1978 in public administration. He stayed on campus as first a part-time and then a fulltime aide to Villemure.

During his tenure, Fuller also coordinated the athletic study table for all sports except football and he worked four years in the school's financial aid department. He also taught physical education classes and earlier worked in the university's admissions office. He obtained a master's degree in public administration in 1993 at Grand Valley State.

George and his wife, Rochelle, have a son, Jonathan, 5. George's brother, Tony, is the head basketball coach at Pepperdine.



George Tuttle (Texas '90)

Versatile George Tuttle returns to the Titans' coaching staff for a second season in 1994-95. Last year he coordinated the Titans' academic monitoring and shared in scouting, game preparation, on-floor coaching, camp administration and oncampus recruiting.

This season Tuttle adds off-campus recruiting to his list of responsibilities. Again he will concentrate on improving the Titans' guard play and team defense.

Tuttle, 27, came to Fullerton in 1993 after a busy two years at Sheridan Junior College in Wyoming. In addition to his coaching duties, he served as academic advisor and physical education instructor as well as sports information director. Tuttle had the privilege of working under one of the winningest JC coaches in America in Bruce Hoffman. Together, they compiled a 52-12 record including a 1992-93 season mark of 28-4 and a No. 12 national ranking.

Tuttle served one year as a graduate assistant at the University of Texas for Coach Tom Penders in 1990-91. He has worked summer basketball camps around the country and coached on the prep level in Oklahoma and Texas.

Tuttle played on the St. Edward's University varsity basketball team in Austin and was a two-time academic all-conference and all-region selection. He earned his bachelors degree at the University of Texas and has worked toward a master's degree at the Universities of Texas and Wyoming.



Jeff Dunlap (UCLA '86)

Jeff Dunlap joins Coach Bob Hawking's staff after a late October appointment to fill the spot vacated by George Tuttle's promotion.

Dunlap returns to Southern California after a three-year term as an assistant to Coach Steve Hawkins at Quincy College in Quincy, Illinois. There he was the recruiting coordinator, supervised team and individual defense, worked with the guards and supervised academics.

Dunlap began his coaching career in 1986 with the junior varsity at North Hollywood High School, his alma mater. He moved in 1988 to College of the Canyons in Valencia where he was an assistant to Lee Smelser with the men's program and the head coach for the women's program for three seasons.

With the men he was the main floor assistant as the Cougars won back-to-back conference championships. The Lady Cougars made their first appearance in the state tournament under Dunlap as he compiled a 44-20 record that included a school-record 25 wins in a season including 13 in a row. He also was the school's sports information director.

Dunlap was a three-year letterman at UCLA and a member of the 1985 NIT championship squad under Coach Walt Hazzard. Dunlap, originally a walk-on, was selected the team's Outstanding Senior in 1986. He also played one season of basketball at Pierce College in Woodland Hills after earning All-San Fernando Valley and all-league prep honors.

SEASON PREVIEW

Three returning starters are among the six returning lettermen to be bolstered by two junior college transfers and four freshmen as Cal State Fullerton tries to get back on the winning side of the ledger in men's basketball during the 1994-95 season, which will feature a new head coach.

Bob Hawking was appointed head coach on Sept. 22 upon the sudden resignation of Brad Holland, who left after two seasons to become the head coach at the University of San Diego. Hawking's appointment is through the end of the season and he expects to make few changes in the Titans' style of play or organization over the past two years.

"I'm thankful for the opportunity," said Hawking. "We will work hard to continue the process we started two years ago of building this program.

"We will be running basically the same kinds of things. We will try to keep it simple and execute. We may go to a three-guard alignment and see what happens. I will stress fundamentals.

"Brad didn't leave the cupboard bare. We have a good nucleus to build around. Last year we started out with only one returning player in Greg Vernon and he had averaged only 2 points."

The least experienced team in Division I basketball entering the 1993-94 season was thinned by November injuries that left it with a 9-man roster. The Titan staff developed the survivors into

a competitive unit by mid-season and the Titans split their final eight games to finish with an 8-19 record. Three incoming recruits, a pair of healthy redshirt freshmen and a walk-on will enhance Fullerton's chances of approaching the success of 1992-93.

The six returnees are led by honorable mention All-Big West Conference selection Winston Peterson, a senior to be. The muscular 6-6 center led the Titans in scoring (15.3 points per game) and rebounding (7.5 rpg) last year and was best in field goal percentage at .537. He was in

double figures in scoring in all but three games and was in double figures in rebounds in seven contests.

The Titans expected to have both forwards back as well but 6-foot-7 Darren Little, who averaged 11.7 points and 4.3 rebounds, was declared academically ineligible in September. David Frigout, a 6-9 junior, is a transfer from Groupe Pigier University in Evreux, France, and he made great strides his first year in the U.S. while averaging 5.3 points and 4.1 rebounds.

The only Titan to start every game in 1993-94 was James French at point guard, but the 6-2 senior will probably move over to the off guard spot vacated by Vernon. French averaged 11.7 points and 3.3 assists last year and will leave the point position to letterman Danny Robinson and junior college transfer Ali Nayab from Southwestern JC in San Diego. Robinson played about 20 minutes per game behind and with French and averaged 2.3 points and 1.3 assists. Other candidates for playing time at guard are sophomore Chris St. Clair (4.3 ppg, 1.9

assists per game), redshirt freshman Chris Dade, who sat out last year with a wrist injury, and 6-3 wing player Chuck Overton, an All-America pick last year at Salt Lake City Community College.

Other roster members are young forwards DeVaughn Wright and John Williams and walk-ons Fred Amos and Andy Hinkle. Wright, 6-6, sat out his true freshman season after aggravating a

knee injury in November. He is a product of the prominent program at Mater Dei High School in Santa Ana. Williams, 6-5, averaged 15 points last year at Rialto High.

Amos, a 6-7 senior, was a major surprise for the Titans last year who played about 13 minutes per game. The transfer from Rancho Santiago College averaged 4.4 points and 3.9 rebounds. Hinkle, 6-5, joins the program after beginning his collegiate studies at UC Davis. He is a product of El Dorado High School in Placentia.

The 1993-94 intercollegiate sports season marked the Silver Anniversary of the Big West Conference, which is poised for change as the century concludes. Begun in 1969 as the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) with seven charter members in California, the Big West has evolved into an 11-member conference with institutions currently in five western states. The name change was made in the summer of 1988.

Big West Conference members are nationally competitive and have won 12 NCAA Division I men's championships and 11 NCAA Division I women's championships.

Several major developments have given a new-look to the conference in the past two years. Dennis Farrell, who has worked in the conference office in a variety of roles since 1980, was named Commissioner in August of 1992. Fresno State, a charter member in 1969, moved to the Western Athletic Conference and was replaced by the University of Nevada for the 1992-93 seasons. A football consortium has been created that brought Arkansas State, Louisiana Tech, Northern Illinois and Southwestern Louisiana into a scheduling combine to creater a much broader Big West on the gridiron. More change looms in 1996 as UNLV and San Jose State head for the WAC to be replaced by Idaho, Boise State, Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and University of North Texas.

The conference's name was changed to reflect a simpler, more accurate description of the league's 11 member institutions -- Cal

State Fullerton, Long Beach State, Nevada, New Mexico State, San Jose State, UC Irvine, UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii (women's sports only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State.

Basketball success among Big West institutions has been growing over the years and reached its apex in 1989-90 when UNLV won the NCAA championship in convincing fashion over Duke yet couldn't even claim sole possession of the Big West championship. New Mexico State tied the Rebels for the regular season title and actually was the No. 1 seed in the post-season tournament in Long Beach. The league's third-place team, UC Santa Barbara, went on to beat Houston in the first round of the NCAA tourney and help the Big West top all other conferences in tournament play with a .778 percentage (7-2).

In 1990-91, UNLV was ranked No. 1 in the nation all season until losing to Duke in the semifinals of the Final Four. New Mexico State again was ranked nationally, but Cal State Fullerton was the only other team to avoid a losing overall season. In 1992, New Mexico State captured the nation's fancy by advancing to the Sweet 16.

The Big West Conference recently adopted a "FAX on Demand" information system. Conference and individual institutions' news releases, game results and cumulative statistics are available to media by calling (404) 399-3066. The Big West code number is 292 and prompts a directory.

1993-94 IN REVIEW

As the least experienced team in Division I men's basketball, the Cal State Fullerton Titans were not expected to have many highlights during the 1993-94 season. And when three players -- letterman forward Todd Satalowich and freshmen Chris Dade and DeVaughn Wright -- went down in November with season-ending injuries, the prospects grew even grimmer.

But second-year Coach Brad Holland and his staff milked the maximum out of their nine-man squad. Picked to finish at the bottom of the 10-team Big West Conference, the Titans tied for eighth with a 6-12 mark as part of their 8-19 season record. Still, it marked only the second time (4-23 in 1980-81) in two decades that the Titans failed to win at least 10 games.

Fullerton had some memorable victories but never could string two together. They won at Nevada for the second year in a row only to come home and lose back-to-back games to San Jose State and Pacific. They won for the third year in a row at UC Irvine

but came home to lose to Long Beach State. The Titans wrapped up the regular season by completing a season sweep of UC Santa Barbara but then lost in the postseason tournament to Nevada. another team they had beaten twice. Probably the most memorable win came on Feb. 17 when Fullerton ended a string of fruitless visits to UNLV with an inaugural 84-75 victory. snapped a string of 10 consecutive losses in the Thomas and Mack Center and 14 defeats in a row in Las Vegas.

Greg Vernon was the lone senior on the club and the 6-foot-4 guard from Los Angeles

emerged in the latter stages of the season as the team leader. A reserve in his three previous seasons, he led the Titans with 890 minutes and was the No. 2 scorer at 13.3 points per game. His clutch second-half play became the team's trademark in February and March.

Center Winston Peterson, a transfer from San Jacinto JC in Texas who began his career at Wichita State, was the team's top scorer and rebounder and also led the team in field goal percentage at .537. The muscular, 6-foot-6 junior averaged 15.3 points and 7.5 rebounds from his low block post.

Other newcomers filling out the regular starting rotation were redshirt guard James French, JC transfer Darren Little and David Frigout from Groupe Pigier University in Evreux, France. French, a transfer from Washington, started all 27 games at point guard and averaged 9.1 points and 3.3 assists. Little, a 6-foot-7 junior from Palomar JC, was in double figures in scoring at 11.7 points per game and averaged 4.3 rebounds. Frigout, a slender 6-foot-9 sophomore, averaged 5.3 points and 4.1 rebounds.

The other four Titans all played in every game for which they suited. Fred Amos, a 6-foot-7 junior walk-on from Rancho Santiago JC, averaged 4.4 points and 3.9 rebounds behind Peterson. Danny Robinson, a transfer from Sheridan JC in Wyoming, backed up French and averaged 3.1 assists along with 3.6 points per game. A pair of freshmen had their moments. Forward Josh King started the first five games of the year and the 6-foot-7 product of Jesuit High in Carmichael was the team's No. 5 scorer at 6.7 points per game. Chris St. Clair, a scrappy 6-foot guard from Sonora HS in La Habra, averaged 4.3 points and 1.9 rebounds and assists.

About half of last year's faces will not return, however. In addition to Vernon, the Titans also lost Head Coach Brad Holland to the University of San Diego as well as two key forwards. King opted to transfer to Rhode Island to be near his grandparents. Little was declared academically ineligible in September but hopes to regain his playing status for the Titans in 1995-96.

It took 12 minutes of lackluster basketball before the Titans got their act together against the No. 1 NAIA team in the nation in Oklahoma Baptist.

The Big West Conference schedule began but the Titans were about four minutes late. That's how long it took UC Irvine to jump out to a 10-0 lead on their way to a 27-7 advantage that proved too much for Fullerton to overcome.

On the day the Northridge earthquake rattled Southern California, the Titans shook out of their road doldrums with a much-need victory in Reno. A combination of Josh King's second-half brilliance, poor free-throw and 3-point shooting by the Wolf Pack and excellent foul shooting by the Titans gave Fullerton its first road win since the previous year's win at Nevada.

Any momentum the Titans may have generated out of their victory at Nevada dissipated in a barrage of offensive rebounds by San Jose State as the Spartans crashed the boards to give Coach Stan Morrison his first win ever in Titan Gym, a streak of five losses with Pacific and four with San Jose State.

The Spartans had 11 offensive rebounds in the first half to Fullerton's nine defensive rebounds. So, despite falling behind 5-0 and shooting 29 per cent from the floor, San Jose State held a 7-point halftime lead. The fact that Fullerton hit only 4 of 16 shots also was a major factor.

It was the best of times. It was the worst of times for the Titans.

Suiting up only seven players (Darren Little, flu, and David Frigout, foot injury) and facing the second-best team in the Big West to date, the Titans in general and Greg Vernon in particular gave a courageous performance. But what would have been a storybook victory became a heartbreaking defeat when Vernon and Winston Peterson combined to miss four of five free throws in the final 25 seconds of regulation and Pacific seized the opportunity to forge a tie and escape with an overtime win.

Vernon had a career game with 28 points and 8 rebounds and hit his first 7 free throws before missing his final 3. The Titans shot a season-low 31 per cent from the floor and only 13 per cent from 3-point land but hit 73 per cent from the line including 20 of the first 24.

Pacific shot a miserable 15 per cent in the first half in falling behind by 13 points at the break. But the Tigers scorched the nets at a 65 per cent clip thereafter and produced 8 points on their final 3 possessions of regulation for only their third Titan Gym win in 21 tries.

For only the second time all season, the Titans were overwhelmed early and never got into the game. This night it was a Long Beach State team, coming off a sloppy, foul-filled overtime win over UC Irvine, that put on a phenomenal shooting display.

The 49ers improved upon a 59 per cent first half with a 79 per cent second half, hitting 19 of 24 shots after intermission. Of 49ers taking more than one shot, the worst shooting percentage was 60 per cent by James Cotton.

Winston Peterson made the first basket of the game and his two free throws gave the Titans a 6-5 lead, their last. The 49ers turned the deficit into a 30-13 lead with a 25-7 run over the next 10 minutes.

Fullerton flirted with a secondhalf rally. The value of the home-court advantage became quite obvious in the Fullerton-Pacific series of 1994.

With a 7-man contingent, the Titans had taken the second-place Tigers into overtime in Titan Gym before losing. Pacific had shot only 15 per cent from the floor in the first half and only 28 per cent from 3-point range for the game.

But at full strength in Spanos Center, the Titans were overwhelmed as the Tigers shot 68 per cent from the floor in the first half and 53 per cent from 3-point range. It was the worst loss ever for Fullerton against Pacific (previous worst was 18 points in 1980) and the Titans' worst defeat since a similar 31-point loss at UNLV (98-67) on Jan. 4, 1991.

In one of the more dramatic turnabouts in memory, the Titans overcame an abysmal start to enjoy their most lopsided victory of the season.

Any kind of victory seemed far fetched eight minutes into the game when Nevada was holding a 20-3 lead. But a pair of three-point bursts -- a traditional 3-point play by Winston Peterson and a Josh King trey from outside -- brought Fullerton to 20-9 and triggered a 32-16 surge to close the half and pull the Titans within a point the lead.

Darren Little's 3-point basket at the 18:29 mark put Fullerton ahead to stay at 41-38 and the Titans never looked back. A 12-0 run triggered by a 3-pointer by James French and capped by his jumper gave Fullerton a 75-58 lead. Nevada never got closer than 13 points.

Fullerton totaled 62 points in the second half while shooting 64 per cent from the floor, 71 per cent from 3-point range and 78 per cent from the line. It was the biggest Fullerton half since Dec. 11, 1985, when the Titans scored 72 points in a 117-94 win over USIU.

Fullerton failed to build on the momentum of its first home conference victory and negated the win over Nevada with a rare home loss to Utah State, which hadn't won in Titan Gym since 1986.

In a low-scoring battle reminiscent of the teams' first meeting in Logan, the Titans scored the final five points of the half for a 23-22 lead. Both teams shot poorly and there were few free throws.

Utah State opened the second half with a 10-2 run capped by three successive baskets by Roddie Anderson for a lead at 32-25 that the Aggies would never surrender. Fullerton ended more than two decades of frustration in Las Vegas with its inaugural victory in Nevada over the Rebels. The turnstile count was only 4,000 and the Rebels are a shadow of the Larry Johnson era teams, but it still was a monumental accomplishment.

Senior Greg Vernon, who had seen three UNLV wins in the Thomas and Mack in his three previous visits, took over the game down the stretch to snap the Titans' losing streaks at 10 in the building and 14 in the city. He hit 7 of 8 free throws in the final 2:03 and added a layup to cap a 16-point second half.

The game may have swung in the first half when the Rebels jumped out to a 30-22 lead but then let the Titans get back in it. Baskets by David Frigout and James French and four Vernon free throws tied the game at 30. The Titans then erased a 34-32 halftime deficit by scoring the first nine points of the second half for a 41-34 lead they never surrendered.

Buoyed by their first win ever in Las Vegas, the Titans went for a jackpot road trip in Las Cruces, where their previous efforts had produced one win in 10 tries.

A miracle did not occur. The Aggies demonstrated why they would become the regular season conference champions with a stifling match-up zone defense that forced 12 Titan turnovers in the first 11 minutes. With the demise of the Titan football program, Homecoming festivities were moved indoors and the Titans put on a great show for their alumni and friends and a Prime Ticket television audience.

Superlatives were overflowing. Brad Holland ran his record to 4-0 over Jerry Pimm and UCSB. Once again the Titans couldn't stand prosperity. Thanks to the previous victory over UCSB and two previous wins over first-round foe Nevada, Fullerton took positive momentum into the 19th annual Big West Conference post-season tournament.

Fullerton pulled away from a see-saw game in the middle of the first half to a lead as large as seven points and took a 5-point advantage into the locker room.

But what they had accomplished in 20 minutes was erased in less than 90 seconds. Nevada scored the first three buckets of the second half to take the lead and force a Titan timeout. Nevada kept rolling and moved out to a lead as large as 48-40 with 12:25 to play before senior Greg Vernon got hot. He scored five points and Danny Robinson hit a 3-point field goal to tie the game at 48-48.

James French took over down the stretch and scored 7 of his 9 points to help lift the Titans from a 58-57 deficit to a 64-60 lead with 1:55 to play. But the WolfPack got a pair of 3-pointers and the Titans countered with a missed shot and a turnover as French's wing pass was stolen with 9 seconds to play.



once. Wood completed a 6-year NBA career with Sacramento on Christmas Eve, 1990. He played last in the CBA and in France and was touring recently with Magic Johnson's All-Stars in Europe. He began his post-Titan career as the point guard on the United States' gold-medal 1984 Olympic team under Coach Bob Knight.

Other former Titans in and out of the NBA and CBA the past few years were 1988 graduates Richard Morton and Henry Turner. Morton started the 1988-89 season with Indiana and later played with Golden State. Turner, who was a teammate of Morton's in the CBA, spent much of the 1989-90 season with Sacramento. Morton was one of the top scorers in

the CBA the past few seasons and has made the loop's all-star team. Guard Aaron Sunderland, a 1993 product, was doing well in the CBA.

Other Titans to play in the NBA include guard Kevin Henderson, who played with Golden State and Cleveland. Other players drafted in the 1980s were Ricky Mixon (Lakers), Tony Neal (Lakers) and Kerry Boagni (Utah Jazz).

From the decade of the 1970s, the Titans saw forward Greg Bunch play for the New York Knicks and forward Mike Niles play with the Phoenix Suns. Foreign leagues have featured the likes of center Herman (Demone) Webster, Boagni and sharpshooter Kevin Heenan to name a few.
