

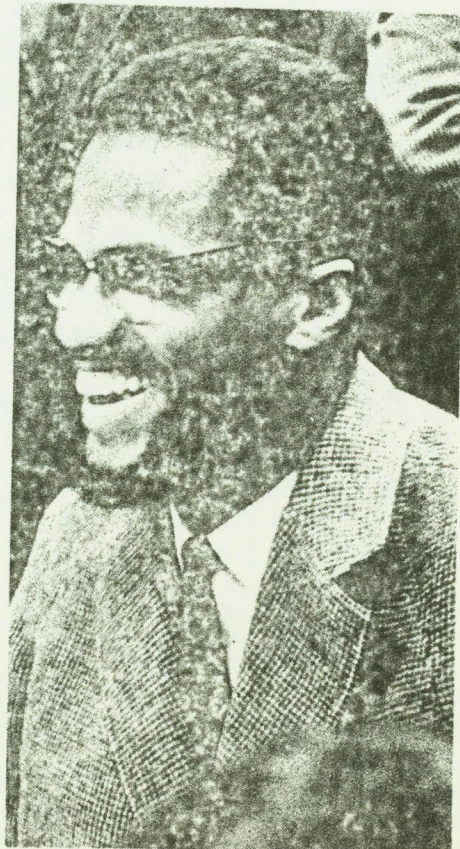

R.S.U. RALLY-MORE OF THE SAME

The Radical Student Union held a rally to protest the killings of 8 black brothers yesterday at noon at the Agora. After the 4 speakers talked about imperialism and the draft, the small crowd walked over to President McCunes office to demand his response to the four student demands issued 2 weeks ago. McCune was out to lunch.

The rally, ostensibly held to protest the Southern killings, was a flop. First, there was no Black participation in the event, not even Blacks in the audience. (And the BSU President didn't know about the rally until it had already started). Second, the rally was ill-timed and uncoordinated. What does the Auxillary Foundation have directly to do with the murders in the south? Few students see the connection and even fewer knew about the rally at all. Third, the energy level yesterday was very low, the lowest so far in the strike (see Jay Kadis in this issue). Students are apathetic on this campus, too damn apathetic for their own good. War goes on while business is usual.

The feeling I got yesterday while marching over to the Fine Arts Building was one of purposelessness. We've all been over to the Presidents office one time or another, ol' Ellis knows our demands (even if his veep says he doesn't), and I'm fucking tired of repeating useless action.

The rally and march ended at a hour and a half later with people going back to their "things", vowing to come and see McCune today.

EIGHT MORE DAYS-----STILL NO ANSWER

In light of the continued repression at home with the murder of eight black people in the South during the past week, coupled with escalated action by U.S. troops in Cambodia, we feel that it is necessary for us to restate our demands which have thusfar gone unanswered by the college administration. These demands are clear:

- 1) That Cal-State and all colleges completely disassociate themselves with the war effort. This includes individual campus actions against ROTC, war-related research, and the war-recruiting on campus.
- 2) We urge all men of draft age to resist induction into the military service. We urge continued complicity with this action by the women of the country.
- 3) We demand political amnesty for all persons who have been, or will be, arrested for political reasons in this country, including any and all arrests which may arise from the anti-war effort.
- 4) To implement demands for the California Offensive, all California campuses, universities, junior colleges, and high schools will be closed to "business as usual." The full facilities of the campus will be brought to bear against the war effort, racism, and poverty until the United States withdraws completely from Indochina and racism and poverty are eliminated at home.

We further demand that all flags at Cal-State be flown at half mast in mourning for last week's systematic murder of eight black brothers. Ellis McCune has until 11:00am today to respond to these demands.

The military orientation of this country is infecting the whole world. With all our technology and resources, we chose to pervert it into weapons manufacturing. The U.S., a self-declared hegimónial power, spends fourty-five cents of each tax dollar on "defence".

Defence..... that includes surplus rotting in dumps, beating the brains out of a Vietnamese kid, and shredding a village with napalm because "Charlie" might be there.

We are defending the people of South Vietnam against the North Vietnamese aggressors. That is why our soldiers murder innocent peasants... they might be Cong, and if they are, they will kill our friends.

Now, we are defending the Cambodians who are murdering Vietnamese indescriminately in their country.

The police and national guard are assuming army tactics, too. Police defending the peace in Augusta Georgia began shooting people in the back. National guardsmen at Kent State defended themselves from bottles and rocks. Even if there was a sniper involved, does firing into a crowd constitute defence, or retalliation?

Throughout history, aggressive nations have committed their crimes in the facade of "defence". The U.S. is no exception.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES RESOLUTION

In response to the widening war in Southeast Asia and the opressive tactics of the present power structure, the student members of the board of trustees on this campus demand that the Board be restructured as follows:

1. The board of trustees be reconstituted to have 50% student membership.
2. That faculty members of the board be full-time teaching faculty
3. That these faculty members be appointed by the academic senate not the administration
4. That a number of lay public trustees be appointed to the board in proportion to the faculty and administration representatives.
5. That the lay members of the board reflect a proportionate representation of the minority social groups of Hayward.

The student members have threatened to remove themselves from the board if these demands are not met.

Up against the wall, board of trustees!

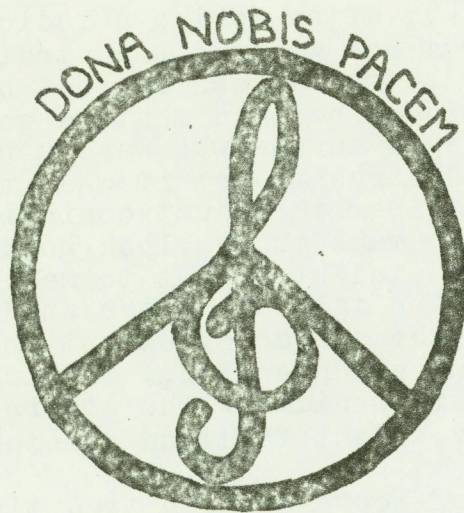
MORE FUCKING COMMITTEES?

Last Sunday night a Kent State tragedy was narrowly averted here at CSCH. A group of six CSCH students were making a frontal assault upon the bus near Meiklejohn hall as part of a pre-guerilla tactics class, (a joke) and were apprehended in the act by a roving Hayward city pig.

The pig wanted to "talk"; after making a radio call to his station he was soon rapping on about how we were bad strategists, giving us advice on how to make a better attack so that his side would have more suitable adversaries. Later he said that he would like to see us students get killed because anyone who was as poorly trained in fighting as the students, deserve to get it when trouble comes.

The pigs commanding officer then just coincidentally drove up, and the first pig had to make things look good for his boss, so he demanded I.D.'s from the students, just to make it obvious to his boss that he wasn't having fun talking to the students. The pig then made out cards for each of the students, except for one who slipped out, and escaped to the student Union Bldg, talking the strike committee's files with him into hiding. The others gave the police what they wanted, a positive identification of students training for underground activity.

The role of the police officer has been traditionally to keep the peace, but recent police actions indicate that police have become nothing less than stooges for the national government, in other words, they are "pigs". The situation was serious at the bus stop because had the students run, because they didn't like the idea of having their name on a future round-up list, they could have been shot, and I'm positive, considering the attitude of the pig that they would have been arrested if caught. Also various aspects of the situation must be kept in mind, such as; the whole episode occurred on the Cal-State campus, the six students were definitely only playing a game, and lastly that the Cal-State campus police, who were present didn't protect the rights of the students.
