



Jason Spencer is in his fourth full year as an assistant sports information director at Cal State Fullerton. He serves as the chief media contact for the Titans' women's soccer, women's basketball, gym-

nastics, softball, and women's tennis teams. Prior to Cal State Fullerton, Spencer spent 18 months as an assistant sports information director at the University of Portland in Oregon, serving as the contact for the women's volleyball, women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track, and men's and women's tennis teams.

While in the Pacific Northwest, he also worked as a Communications Assistant with the now defunct Portland Fire of the WNBA during its inaugural season in the Rose City. Spencer, a native of Fresno, Calif., graduated with a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and a minor in sociology from the University of Southern California in 1999. There, he served as a student assistant in the sports information office for three years and was the public address announcer for the Trojans' baseball team for four seasons. He and his fiancee, Kelly, live in Downtown Los Angeles.

Players and coaches can be made available before or after practice depending on availability. Interviews will be arranged at a time beneficial to both the coach or student-athlete and the media. 

HOW TO GET HERE

The campus is located within 40 miles of three major airports (LAX to the West, Ontario to the Northeast and Orange County/John Wayne to the South). The campus is located immediately adjacent to the Orange (57) Freeway, which is accessible from most major Southern California freeways.


The Titan Softball Complex is located to the south of the baseball field (Goodwin Field) and just east of the soccer stadium and track.

From the 57 freeway, take the Yorba Linda exit and turn left (when heading north) or right (when heading south). Make a right at the first light which will be Associated Road.

Parking is located on your immediate left in either Lot "G" or Lot "A". Daily Permits may be purchased at machines located throughout both lots for \$3 per day. Regulations are enforced Monday-Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Parking is free on Friday nights after 5 p.m. and all day Saturday and Sunday.

Continuing the tradition of success which has built the Cal State Fullerton softball program into one of the most prestigious programs in the nation, Head Coach Michelle Gromacki returns for her fifth season at the helm.

Gromacki returned to her alma mater as head coach in 2000 after spending five years as an assistant to legendary Hall of Fame Head Coach Judi Garman, who retired following the 1999 campaign. And while the length of service is not yet equal to that of Garman's, Gromacki's tenure has been filled with accomplishments and accolades just as impressive.

Under her tutelage, Gromacki's Titans have staked their claim to the last four consecutive Big West Conference championships, bringing the programs total to seven league crowns overall — the most of any other school in the history of the conference.

After a two-year absence, Fullerton has reached the NCAA Regionals in each of the last five years (the last four under Gromacki), even earning a bid into the 2002 regional championship game for the first time since 1995 (the last Fullerton squad to reach the Women's College World Series) before falling to eventual national champion California, 1-0.

Gromacki's teams have finished in the top 20 in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's poll in each of her four seasons, including top-10 finishes in 2002 (No. 9) and 2003 (No. 10). The Titans also finished ninth in the inaugural year of the ESPN.com/USA Softball coaches poll.

Gromacki's head coaching career got off to a great start in her rookie year in 2000, leading an inexperienced Titan squad to a 45-15 overall record and the school's first Big West title since 1993 with a 19-5 mark — the best conference finish for the Titans since the 1995 squad finished second. For her efforts, Gromacki was named Big West Conference Coach of the Year.

With a little more experience under its belt in 2001, Cal State Fullerton won its second consecutive league crown thanks to a 19-2 record and finished the year 48-14 overall after a tough NCAA regional in Tucson, Ariz.

The 2002 season was a banner year for Titans softball as Gromacki led Fullerton to a 53-13 overall record, posting the most victories in a season since Gromacki helped the Titans to 59 wins as a player in 1987. Fullerton clinched its third-straight conference title wih a 22-2 mark, posting the best single-season conference winning percentage in school history.

That campaign featured a 32-game winning streak (the second-longest in the history of the program and the second-longest in the nation that season) and Gromacki's 100th career coaching victory. She became the fastest coach in school history to 100 wins (134 games), besting Garman (142 games) and former baseball coach Augie Garrido's previous record of 135 games.

Last year, featuring a roster chock-full of talented seniors, Gromacki piloted the Titans to a 41-15 overall record and a 20-1 mark in the Big West to clinch the programs fourth consecutive league title. The Titans broke the school record for best Big West winning percentage (.952) and hosted the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 1996.

Gromacki has been honored by her peers throughout her coaching career, serving as head coach on three Speedline/NFCA West Region Coaching Staffs of the Year in the last four seasons (2000, 2002-03).

She has even taken her talents to the next level for the past three years, serving as an assistant coach for the USA Blue Team in 2001 and the U.S. "Elite" National Team in 2002-03, competing in international tournaments and serving as the "sparring partner" for the U.S. National Team.

In 2003, she helped lead the "Elite" Team to a gold medal at the Canada Cup with an 11-1 record and a roster which featured former Titans Gina Oaks and Jodie Cox. Cox was named MVP of the tournament, posting a 3-0 record without allowing an earned run in 19 innings and striking out 15.

Gromacki's coaching career began in 1995 as an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton, helping the Titans to a 184-129 (.588) overall record and a



79-69 (.534) mark in Big West play in five seasons. Fullerton posted a 20-8 league record in her first season as an assistant (46-17 overall) and finished second in the conference before advancing to the Women's College World Series.

Regarded as one of the best catchers in the nation, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a combined 170-19-1 overall record and a 65-10-1 mark in the Big West as a player while claiming the 1986 NCAA National Championship.

In 1995, Gromacki was invited to participate in the first-ever Olympic try-out camp and led the Redding Rebels to three ASA Women's Major Fastpitch National Championships. She was named an ASA All-American in 1995 — an honor she has earned eight times throughout her playing career.

Gromacki was also selected as a member of the U.S. National Team that participated in the tournament to open the Olympic Softball Complex in Columbus, Ga., prior to the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta.

In 1994, Gromacki was a member of several U.S. National Teams which claimed gold medals at the South Pacific Classic Tournament, the World Championships in Canada, and the Pam Am Qualifier in Guatemala. She was a participant in the Olympic Sports Festival in St. Louis as both a player and assistant coach.

From 1985-92, Gromacki participated in three Olympic Sports Festivals and was a member of two U.S. National Teams that took gold medals in international competition in China (1987) and Japan (1985). She also spent eight months playing on a travelling team in New Zealand from 1988-89.

Aside from playing, Gromacki has also been involved in numerous activities to promote the sport of softball. She was responsible for Junior Olympic try-outs and Pan Am Team practicies held at Cal State Fullerton, has conducted numerous coaching clinics and speaking engagements around the world, and conducted a clinic in Italy, spending three days working with the Italian Junior Olympic National Team.

Gromacki is also a contributor to numerous athletic publications, including authoring a monthly column for Southern California Softball Magazine and writing articles for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association newsletter.

A native of Antioch, Calif., Gromacki currently resides in Huntington Beach. Her parents are Rick and Adeline.





Cal State Fullerton assistant coach Terry Schweikert returns for her third season as part of Michelle Gromacki's staff, serving as the team's "defensive coordinator" and recruiting coordinator, while helping Gromacki in all aspects of the program, including camps and clinics. Hired to her post in July, 2001, Schweikert spent the previous five years as an assistant coach at a pair of Big 12 Conference schools.

"Terry's knowledge of the game and her experience have been the reason for our consistant success. It didn't take me long to realize that every great program has great assistants," Gromacki said. "Terry has high standards for herself which translates into the team's high standards. I couldn't do without her."

She has been a member of four NFCA Regional Coaching Staffs of the Year, twice with the Titans and once each at Nebraska and Missouri.

Cal State Fullerton has finished in the top half of the league in fielding percentage in the Big West Conference over the last two seasons, including a high of .968 in 2002. She has teamed with Gromacki to win a pair of Speedline/NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards the past two seasons.

Schweikert's broke into coaching in 1997, serving as an assistant coach at her alma mater, Missouri. In her first season, the Tigers won the Big 12 Conference regular season and tournament title and returned to the NCAA Tournament. In her second season, Schweikert helped Missouri reach as high as No. 9 in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's top 25 poll.

While with the Tigers, Schweikert helped coach 11 All-Big 12 Conference team members, 11 Academic All-Big 12 Conference honorees, one Big 12 Conference Player of the Year, and an All-American.

From Columbia, Mo., Schweikert moved to Lincoln, Neb., where she spent three seasons as an assistant to Head Coach Rhonda Revelle at the University of Nebraska, helping the Cornhuskers to regional final appearances in 1999 and 2000. Schweikert also helped Nebraska to back-to-back Big 12 Championships in 2000 and 2001.

While with the Huskers, Schweikert worked primarily with the middle infielders and coached a three-time All-America infielder. She assisted Revelle with recruiting and also coordinated Nebraska's camps, clinics and community outreach programs.

Nebraska was 138-57 (.708) overall and 41-12 (.774) in Big 12 play during Schweikert's three seasons. She also coached a pair of All-Big 12 Conference honorees and three All-Midwest Region awardwinners.

Schweikert played softball for Missouri from 1982 to 1985, earning Missouri's rookie of the year honors as a freshman and player of the year honors as a junior. She helped the Tigers to their only Big Eight Tournament title and first College World Series appearance in 1984. During her junior and senior years, Schweikert captained the Tigers and was named all-region both seasons.

After earning a bachelor's degree in education, Schweikert returned to her hometown of Springfield, Mo., to serve as the head swimming coach, head volleyball coach and assistant basketball coach at Parkview High School. She also spent four years at Hopkins High School in Minnesota, where she served as the head softball coach and led her teams to two state tournaments. In 1996, she led Hopkins to a perfect 14-0 conference mark and was named the Minnesota High School Coach of the Year.

Throughout her coaching career, Schweikert has continued to play softball competitively. In 1990, she was named an Amateur Softball Association All-American while winning a national championship.

Schweikert currently resides in Corona. Her parents are Bill and Dorothy.

Assistant Coach Dee Dee Weiman returns for her second season on the Titans' bench, focusing her efforts on the development of the pitching staff while also assisting Gromacki with other aspects of the program.

"Some are convinced that games are won and lost in the circle. The pitchers have rapidly developed because of the addition of Dee Dee," Gromacki said. "I am confident that the pitchers are in good hands and their contribution from the circle will add to our success."

Weiman was hired to her post prior to the 2003 season and her impact on the program was immediately felt.

Under Weiman's tutelage, the Cal State Fullerton pitching staff led the Big West Conference in six different categories including, ERA (1.35), opponent batting average (.156), strikeouts (417), strikeouts looking (156), wins (41), and fewest hits allowed (208). Titan pitching was also second in runs allowed (101) and earned runs allowed (73).

Individually, pitchers Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks were named third-team All-American and were also first-team All-Big West Conference pitchers. Cox was named the Big West Conference's Co-Pitcher of the Year, posting her first career 20-win season and finishing with 224 strikeouts to lead the league.

In fact, a Titan pitcher led or co-led the league in six different pitching categories (see pg. 42 for the complete list).

Later that summer, the duo would be selected to the U.S. National "Elite" Team where Cox earned MVP honors at the Canada Cup, helping the squad to a championship with a 3-O record without allowing an earned run in 19 innings.

Prior to returning to Southern California, Weiman spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Wisconsin of the Big Ten Conference, where she was in charge of coaching the Badgers' pitching staff and also working with the catchers. She helped guide the Badgers to three straight Big Ten Tournaments and appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2002.

Weiman coached the school's first-ever first-team All-Big Ten pitcher in Andrea Kirchberg, who owns nearly every pitching record at Wisconsin.

In 2002, Weiman, head coach Karen Gallagher and assistant coach Ali Viola were named the Speedline/NFCA Division I Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year, sharing the honor with the Notre Dame coaching staff.

As a player, Weiman was a member of the 1990 and 1992 UCLA national championship-winning squads while earning All-Pacific-10 Conference honors twice in her career and first-team All-America honors as a senior in 1994.

A Honda Broderick Award nominee in 1994, Weiman finished her Bruin career with a 59-13 overall record, a 0.79 ERA, 746 career strikeouts and 16 nohitters. Weiman's 359 strikeouts in 1994 still stand as a single-season record.

Weiman also holds the NCAA career record for strikeout ratio at 10.4 strikeouts per seven innings.

She continued her playing career in the Women's Professional Softball League, playing four seasons (1997-00) after being drafted as the 10th selection of the second round of the 1996 Amateur Draft.


Weiman won the 1999 WPSL championship with the Tampa Bay Firestix and recorded the first strikeout, complete game, victory, save and shutout in team history. She was also the first-ever pitcher to throw a perfect game in WPSL history, shutting down the Carolina Diamonds on Aug. 1, 1998.

Weiman was a two-time WPSL All-Star selection in 1998 and 1999, and ranks first in league history in games started (83), complete games (70), innings (640.3) and appearances (113). She ranks second in strikeouts (446) and saves (6) while ranking third in wins (46) and shutouts (10).

This season, Weiman will be reunited with her catcher on the 1993 ASA Women's Open National Championship in Gromacki, when the duo helped lead the Redding Rebels to the national title.

Weiman graduated from UCLA with a bachelors degree in sociology in 1994. She has a 7-year-old son, Tyler, and resides in Fullerton.

STORYLINES

HELLO... MY NAME IS ..

Cal State Fullerton will welcome 11 newcomers to the squad in 2004 – the most new faces for the Titans since the 1997 team which featured 13 newcomers on the roster to start the season. That total is also the most of any team in the history of Titan softball.

GROMACKI IN SEARCH OF NO. 200

Titans Head Coach Michelle Gromacki enters her fifth season at the helm of the softball program looking for another milestone.

She begins the 2004 campaign with 187 career head coaching victories, just 13 short of career win No. 200. Gromacki is scheduled to earn her 200th career win on Feb. 28 against Notre Dame at the NFCA Leadoff Claesic.

Last season, Gromacki earned career victory No. 150 against Massachusetts on Feb. 7 at the Arizona State Fiesta Bowl Classic. Ironically, that win came almost a year after earning career win No. 100 against the Minutewomen at the NFCA Leadoff Classic.

POLL POWER

Cal State Fullerton begins the season ranked No. 13 in the nation according to the NFCA and No. 16 in the nation according to the ESPN.com/USA Softball Coaches Preseason poll.

The Titans finished the 2003 season ranked No. 10 (NFCA) and No. 9 (ESPN.com) in the country, marking the fourth consecutive year that Cal State Fullerton has finished in the top 20, and the third straight season the Titans have been ranked in the top 15 at the end of the year.

BIG WEST STREAK SNAPPED?

Cal State Fullerton was picked to finish third in the Big West Conference standings according to a poll of the conference's head coaches.

The Titans received three first-place votes and 56 points overall to stand three points back of Long Beach State, which was picked to win the Big West for the first time since the 1999 season.

Cal State Fullerton has won the last four consecutive Big West championships and has seven league titles overall – the most of any other conference member since 1986.

PROGRAM REACHES 1,100 WINS

Fullerton claimed the program's 1,100th victory at the end of last season when the Titans defeated Penn State, 8-0, in NCAA Regional action. Fullerton has an all-time record of 1,100-433-4 (.716) and a 382-161-2 (.703) mark in Big West play in 24 seasons.

KIA KLASSIC LOADED WITH OPTIONS

Cal State Fullerton will once again play host to 16 of the nation's top teams for the 2004 Kia Klassic presented by Marriott at the Titan Softball Complex on March 17-21.

Of the 15 collegiate teams vying for the tournament crown (the U.S. Olympic Team will also compete, but in pool play games only), 12 of those are ranked in the top 25 of the NFCA Preseason Poll.

The Titans won the last two consecutive Kia Klassic crowns in 2001 and 2002, before the 2003 event was washed out prior to championship bracket play.

This season, former Kia champions Arizona, Arizona State, Washington, Fresno State, Oklahoma, and Louisiana-Lafayette will battle alongside Cal State Fullerton for the tournament title. wenty-four years ago, the very first Cal State Fullerton softball team took the field in search of athletic excellence. Built from the ground up by legendary Hall of Fame Head Coach Judi Garman, and fielding a roster that featured seven freshmen and 11 junior college and college transfers, the Titans went on to finish ninth in the nation and start a tradition of success which carries on to this day.

For the past four seasons, Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Michelle Gromacki has lived up to, and, in some cases, surpassed the accomplishments of her predecessor, leading the Titans into the 21st century.

Among her accolades: four consecutive Big West Conference titles, four consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament, 37 All-Big West selections, three NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards, and so on, and so on...

Now, with all of that behind her, Gromacki will need every ounce of her coaching savvy and know-how as she faces perhaps the toughest season in her career as a head coach.

"Believe me, the knowledge of our past great athletes will be missed but it's very exciting to have some new great athletes that are so willing to want to have that knowledge in conjunction with their work ethic," Gromacki said. "It's an exciting time and we are in the business of education. I wouldn't want to coach if it weren't for constant new challenges."

As Cal State Fullerton takes the field for its 25th season, the similarities between this year's team and that very first squad are numerous. The Titans, who graduated seven seniors following last year's campaign, will redefine the phrase "starting from scratch" in 2004 as Fullerton returns just four letterwinners (two of those seniors) and two position starters from last season's squad which posted a 41-15 overall record and clinched its record-setting seventh Big West crown with a 20-1 mark.

Numerically what does that mean? Cal State Fullerton's offense returns just 15 percent of the team's hits from 2003, 17 percent of the runs scored, and only 14 percent of the team's RBI. Adding insult to injury is the fact that the Titans don't have a single pitcher on the roster with Division I experience, boasting a pair of freshmen and a pair of transfers who will miss a significant part of the year due to injury or did not play at the junior college or Division I level last season.

"Replacing the offensive numbers that we've had in the past isn't going to be easy," Gromacki said. "The game plan on offense doesn't change much, that's how we are able to reach the levels of production that we have seen from our offense in the past."

That means plenty of new faces will be gracing the turf at the Titan Softball Complex... in fact, there will be 11 of them — seven junior college or Division I transfers and four freshmen.

THE RETURNERS

The Titans will be led by a core group of four players who have seen significant action in their careers, but will need to produce even more for Cal State Fullerton to be successful this season.

Senior catcher Jennifer Holt has seen the better part of the last two seasons behind home plate, serving as the backup to the departed three-time All-American Jenny Topping in 2002 and starting nearly every game behind the dish for the Titans last season.

"Jenn Holt is our quarterback and a leader on and off the field," Gromacki said. "Her presence behind the plate is valuable to this team. It's been a pleasure to coach her."

Holt, most likely the everyday catcher in 2004, will be a steadying force for Fullerton's young pitching staff in her final season. Defensively she was stellar as a junior, committing just five errors in 430 chances (.988 fielding percentage), while hitting .188 with five doubles, a pair of home runs and 15 RBI. Her numbers got even stronger in Big West play, hitting .283 with six runs, three doubles and nine RBI.

She enters the season ranked third on Cal State Fullerton's career fielding percentage list at 990

Outfielder Julie Watson also enters her final season in a Titan uniform looking to break out of a slump that has plagued her since her freshman year. Watson, who hit .285 as a freshman, has hit .214 and .222 in the last two years. A speedster on the basepaths, she did lead the team with five steals in seven attempts as a junior in 2003.

"Julie has a spark about her that is contagious," Gromacki said. "Her spirit lifts this team and at the same time she is looked up to as a leader."

Junior Jody Campbell performed well in her first season of Division I softball, hitting .259 with three doubles and 10 RBI. A physically imposing hitter, Campbell finished third on the team with 21 walks – drawing two walks in a game on three separate occasions.

"Jody has the potential to be a power hitter for us," Gromacki said. "Her injuries have limited her from those possibilities. I'm looking forward to having a healthy Jody this season."

Sophomore Crystal Medina was steady on the infield last season, committing only two errors in 44 chances (.955). She made only four official at-bats as a freshman, notching her first career hit against Cal Poly, while appearing mostly as a pinch runner, adding speed to the Titans' offensive attack.

"Crystal has had constant challenges because of injury, but it's her work ethic that has allowed her to contribute to some of our team's wins," Gromacki said. "I expect nothing less. She has a great attitude."

THE NEWCOMERS

The old adage, "you can't tell the players without a scorecard," will ring true this season at the Titan Softball Complex as fans will have to deal with a gaggle of new faces on the field for the Titans in 2004

"Our newcomers will be expected to come in and be efficient right away," Gromacki said. "We would be lowering our standards if we expected anything less."

Cal State Fullerton was dealt an early blow when redshirt freshman Marissa Marzan, a hearlded transfer from the University of Arizona and expected to be Fullerton's No. 1 starter, suffered a knee injury during fall practice and will miss a significant portion of the

Because of that loss, the Titan pitching staff will have to adapt to the Division I game quickly as it will be comprised of a pair of freshmen and a player who hasn't pitched in two years.

"Though Gina Oaks and Jodie Cox were able to hold their own on the mound, that was a result of the game plan we've always had and that is working together as a staff for one common goal," Gromacki said. "That plan is still in place and with the expertise of our pitching coach, Dee Dee Weiman, I feel we are able to compete at the same level that we have in the past.'

The other Division I transfer is junior outfielder Lindsey Bashor, a hard-hitting, athletic centerfielder who will provide tremendous range and a solid bat at the top of Fullerton's lineup. Bashor, who played her first two seasons at the University of lowa, hit .323 with eight doubles and four home runs as a sophomore, and was named to the All-Big Ten Second Team. She also scored 26 runs and drove in 25 more.

"Lindsey has brought talent, leadership, and an attitude of wanting the ball to be hit to her and wanting to be at the plate to win the game. You can't replace that," Gromacki said.

Gromacki also brought in a talented group of four freshmen and three walk-ons for the 2004 campaign - all of whom will be expected to compete right away.

The freshmen are led by pitcher/infielder Candice Baker, who was selected as one of 20 at-large selections for the 2003 Junior Women's National Team tryouts last summer. She is a four-time All-Empire League selection and an All-CIF selection from Cypress HS and will form one-third of the Titans pitching staff to begin the year.

Infielder Tiffany Hoff will battle for playing time after hitting better than .350 for all four seasons for Vacaville HS. She is a four-time All-Monticello Empire League honoree and helped her team to a CIF title in 2003.

Pitcher Brooke Weekley makes up another third of the Titans' pitching staff this season after earning All-South Coast League honors all three years at Capistrano Valley HS. A two-time All-CIF pick, Weekley was 20-6 with a 0.84 ERA as a sophomore and 17-9 with a 0.68 ERA as a junior while also hitting .321 at the plate.

Infielder Jenna Wheeler was a four-time All-Empire League honoree at Loara HS in Anaheim, Calif., while also earning All-CIF honors for three seasons.

The Titans also brought in five junior college transfers - three of those coming from their own backyard. Junior walk-on Carolyn Bullard twice earned All-Orange Empire Conference honors at nearby Fullerton College, hitting .317 as a freshman and .257 last season. Bullard brings a tremendous amount of speed to the lineup after stealing 35-of-38 bases for the Hornets in two seasons.

Her teammate, infielder Marisa Trevino, hit .248 with a home run and 15 RBI as a freshman last season, hitting .286 in OEC play.

Catcher Melissa Hughes is a junior transfer from nearby Mt. San Antonio College where she won a state championship last season and was coached by former Titans' assistant Kelly Ford. Hughes hit .330 for the Mounties with 30 runs scored, five doubles and 20 RBI as a sophomore in 2003.

The final transfer is junior outfielder Monica Tantlinger, a two-time All-Foothill Conference honoree at Antelope Valley College, who also walked on this season. She hit .282 as a sophomore with 28 runs scored and 12 RBI. She ranked 12th in the conference in hits (40), eighth in runs, and tied for 22nd in RBI.

Senior Porsha Draper played two seasons at Tallahassee Community College and signed to play at the University of Tennessee, but decided not to attend. The Southern California native (Lakewood, Calif.) did not play softball anywhere in each of the last two years.

Draper is a multi-faceted player who was an outfielder, infielder, and pitcher for TCC in 2000 and 2001. She was named the 2001 Panhandle Conference Player of the Year after hitting .349 with six home runs, 50 RBI and 32 runs scored while going 15-2 in the circle with a 1.27 ERA.

THE SCHEDULE

Even with the new-look Titans in 2004, Cal State Fullerton's schedule will be no less daunting. The Titans, who were picked to finish second in the Big West Conference this season behind Long Beach State, will face 14 teams ranked in the preseason ESPN.com/ USA Softball poll top 25 (including seven of the top 10), along with seven other teams receiving votes in that poll. In addition, 13 of Fullerton's opponents this season are ranked in the NFCA Preseason Coaches top 25, with six other teams also receiving votes.

A "GEM" OF A DIAMOND ...

WELCOME TO THE TITAN SOFTBALL COMPLEX!

Fully remodeled prior to the 2001 season, the dual-diamond Titan Softball Complex stands as one of the top collegiate softball venues in the nation.

After spending the first five seasons at Lions Field located at Brea Blvd. and Lemon St., the Cal State Fullerton softball program moved into its new, permanent home on campus in 1985 where it has remained ever since.

With the addition of the baseball stadium and the 10,000-seat multi-purpose Titan Stadium in 1992, the Titan Softball Complex also received a face-lift.

Upgraded press facilities and expanded seating for up to 3,000 fans on portable bleachers were in the works as well as the addition of a message board to the already existing electronic scoreboard beyond the leftfield fence.

With the start of the 1995 season, the stadium underwent a second facelift with the addition of concrete paving around both backstops for added fan comfort and safety as well as expanded batting cages and bullpens.

At the end of the 2000 season, the face of the complex was drastically changed as the main diamond was literally flipped on end to expand seating for nearby Goodwin Field and create more of a stadium atmosphere for softball competition.

The primary diamond features elevated grandstand seating with permanent box seating directly behind home plate. Chairback bleachers were added down both baselines to hold a capacity of 1,000 fans.

A permanent expanded two-tiered press box was added as well as a beautifully landscaped grassy knoll that runs from the left field foul pole to right centerfield, making the area perfect for fans to enjoy the beautiful Southern California weather during day games.

The main field also features two complete bullpens with room for two pitchers to warm up simultaneously and sunken dugouts for both teams.

The softball and baseball stadiums are joined by a structure between the two housing the Doubek VIP room and the Wilson baseball clubhouse. Both programs received expanded locker room facilities and offices for the coaching staffs.

The secondary diamond matches the dimensions of the main stadium (190' down the lines, 220' to straightaway centerfield) with seating for up to 500 fans on bleachers.

The current configuration encompasses two lighted and fenced softball fields that are utilized at their capacity during Ca! State Fullerton's two premier spring softball tournaments: the Worth Invitational and the annual Kia Klassic, considered by many to be the premier regular season tournament and standing second only to the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla.

The fields are also in use year-round by the City of Fullerton and other area organizations.

With seven seniors on the roster, 2003 was meant to be a magical season for the Cal State Fullerton softball team.

Armed with enough firepower to propel them into the Women's College World Series for the first time since 1995, the Titans set their sights on Oklahoma City a year after falling just a run short of their goal.

However, the dream ended much too soon as Cal State Fullerton's run ended in the NCAA Regionals for the sixth consecutive season, this time. In front of the home crowd.

The Titans finished the season with a 41-15 overall record (the fourth-consecutive season with at least 40 wins) and clinched their fourth-consecutive, and seventh overall, Big West Conference title with a 20-1 mark – setting the record for the most league softball titles by any school.

Cal State Fullerton entered the NCAA Tournament on a roll, winning ite last 10 consecutive contests (and 20 of its last 21) after dropping an extra-inning heartbreaker to archrival Long Beach State on April 19 for the Titans' lone conference defeat.

Hosting an NCAA Regional for the first time since the 1996 season, the top-seeded Titans (seeded No. 6 nationally) looked to capitalize on home field advantage on the road to Oklahoma City. Fullerton did just that, opening tournament play with a dominating performance against Rider University.

Senior Amy LaRocque had all three RBI and senior Jodie Cox did the rest from the circle, striking out 12 batters and scattering three hits in the 3-0 Titan victory.

Fullerton's next opponent would be significantly tougher as Louisiana-Lafayette eked out a run in the second inning on a two-out dropped flyball which fell into fair territory by mere inches.

Turns out, the defensive miscue led to the only run of the game as eventual regional MVP Brooke Mitchell struck out 12 Titans and scattered only two Titan hits without allowing a walk en route to leading the Ragin' Cajuns to the 1-O victory.

Gina Oaks was equally as masterful in the loss, striking out 12 batters for the Titans and also scattering only two hits.

With its season on the line, Cal State Fullerton recovered in grand fashion later that night, earning a run-rule victory over Penn State, 8-0, in six innings.

Cox and Amanda Hockett each blasted home runs while Oaks was 3-for-4 with three RBI to pace the offense. Cox scattered three hits and struck out nine batters in the win, keeping Cal State Fullerton's hopes alive for another day.

However, everything came crashing down on day three of the tournament as upstart Oregon sent seven batters to the plate in the first to score a pair of runs and solid pitching in relief led the Ducks to an upset of the Titans, 2-1.

All-American Jenny Topping, who would finish her career as the leader in numerous categories, blasted her 10th home run of the season in the fifth, but it was too little, too late.

Despite the efforts of Cox (one hit, eight strikeouts) in relief after Oaks was knocked out after 2/3 of an inning, Fullerton's offense left 10 runners on base and hit. 248 for the tournament.

Cox and Topping were named to the regional All-Tournament Team for their efforts while Louisiana-Lafayette defeated Oregon to earn a berth into the Women's College World Series.

The awards came in bunches for the Titans following the season as Cal State Fullerton added to its All-American tradition.

Topping was selected as a first-team All-American for the third time in a Titan uniform (fourth overall), making her only the second player in Fullerton history to accomplish that feat (Sue Lewis).

Oaks earned her second consecutive All-America honor, this time voted to the third team as a utility player. She was a first-team utility player as a junior in 2002.

Cox, who was joined on the team by her sister Kellie to make them what is thought to be the first sister tandem at Cal State Fullerton to play on the same softball team at the same time, was named a third-team All-American pitcher after posting stellar numbers.

All three were also named to the All-West Region squad.

At the conference level, Topping and Cox headlined the Titans' trophy haul as Topping was named Big West Player of the Year for the third consecutive season and Cox was named the league's Co-Pitcher of the Year.

Topping hit .438 with 10 home runs, 36 RBI and 46 walks on the year, leading the Titans in eight offensive categories.

Cox was 21-7 overall in the circle with a 1.06 ERA and 224 strikeouts – narrowly missing tying the school record for career strikeouts by three.

Cox would go on to earn first-team All-Big West honors at pitcher and outfielder while Topping was the conference's first-team first baseman.

Oaks was named to the first team at two different positions for the second consecutive season, earning the nod at pitcher and utility player.

Sophomore Heather Saltarelli was named to the All-Big West Second Team at second base despite missing 14 games due to injury. She was joined on the second team by seniors Amy LaRocque (3B), Amanda Hockett (SS). and Krista O'Hanlan (OF).

Topping was named Big West Player of the Week five times and holds the conference record by winning the award 12 times in her career.

Oaks was named pitcher of the week twice and finished second on the conference list with 11 such awards. Cox was named pitcher of the week four times (which puts her in a tie for third all-time) and player of the week once.

Amanda Hockett, Amy LaRocque and Jennifer Holt also earned conference player of the week honors, while Hockett was named USA Softball's first-ever National Player of the Week on Feb. 18.

While not as statistically productive as the 2002 season when seven offensive school records were set, the Titans did have a solid year number-wise.

Cal State Fullerton led the Big West Conference in nine different major offensive categories (average, slugging, on-base percentage, runs, hits, RBI, home runs, total bases and walks) and six

different pitching categories, including: ERA, opponent's batting average, strikeouts, and hits allowed.

The Titans led or co-led the conference in 14 different categories spearheaded by Topping's trifecta of batting average, slugging percentage, and on-base percentage.

Oaks led the league in runs on offense and strikeouts looking while in the circle, while Cox justified her Co-Pitcher of the Year award by leading the league in ERA, opponent's batting average, strikeouts and wins.

Topping completed one of the most storied careers in Cal State Fullerton softball history. The three-time All-American finished as the career leader in four different offensive categories (see pg. 48) and holds seven different single-season records.

Perhaps the most stunning career records include her three-year batting average of .443, which obilterated the previous best of .396 held by Denise DeWalt (1992-93), and her walk total of 137, which topped Sue Lewis' previous record of 89.

Oaks and Cox also finished their careers as two of the top pitchers in school history. The duo finished 2-3 in career strikeouts per seven innings and 3-4 in career wins.

Cox's 699 strikeouts puts her third on the career list while Oaks is fourth with 685. The pair also finished eighth (Cox) and ninth (Oaks) on the career winning percentage list.

The trio of record-setters also enjoyed the spotlight on the world stage as all three were selected (along with Head Coach Michelle Gromacki) to represent their country on various U.S. National Teams.


Topping won a gold medal with the U.S. National Team at the Pan Am Games in the Dominican Republic.

Oaks, Cox, and Gromacki were all chosen as members of the U.S. Elite Team, which competed in the Canada Cup and in a series against the Australian National Team in San Francisco.

Cox was chosen MVP of the Canada Cup by going 3-0 in the circle without allowing an earned run in 19 innings.

Based on their performances, all three were chosen to participate in the 2003 U.S. Olympic Trials in September to compete for spots on the team that will compete in Athens, Greece, in 2004.

Topping was selected to the final list of 18 players and was named as one of the official 15 players in January, 2004.

The history of Cal State Fullerton softball begins in 1979 with the Administration's decision to add the sport to the University's list of Division I competitors. Judi Garman, coach of the very-successful Golden West Rustlers, is hired while Linda Shafor is named the program's first assistant coach.

1980 Pam Edde, a pitcher from Utah State, and Pam Knox, a shortstop who played two years at Golden West and a season at the University of Arizona, transfer to Cal State Fullerton and a local product - Janet Lloyd from Tustin High School - commits to Fullerton and the upstart Titans are ranked as high as 7th in the coaches' pre-season poll.

After compiling a 37 - 29 season record, the Titans earn a trip to the Western AlAW regionals in Fresno, where the Titans eliminate defending national champions UCLA when UCLA makes an illegal defensive substitution in the bottom of the seventh inning. The Titans go to the AIAW College World Series in their first year and finish 9th out of 32.

1981 Terry Keasling and Sue Lewis along with new Assistant Coach Jan Dunlap, arrive at Fullerton and help the team to a 60-14 record including a sweep at the Western regional. They earn a return trip to the AIAW College World Series.

In the first game Janet Lloyd, recovering from knee surgery, hits a dramatic three-run home run in the bottom of the seventh with two outs and an O-2 count to rally for a 7-6 come-from-behind win over New Mexico State.

In game 2, Terry Keasling steals the spotlight by pitching a two-hit shutout, striking out 13 batters and hitting a two-run home run in the bottom of the 15th inning to beat Western Michigan, 2-0.

In game 5, freshman Sue Lewis hits a pair of home runs to defeat UCLA, 5-4, to advance the Titans to the Championship Game. (The Titans complete a six-game sweep over the Bruins in 1981.)

After losing to Fullerton, 6-1, to force the double-elimination tournament to a final Championship Game, Utah State survives a seventh-inning rally by the Titans for a 4-3 victory. Cal State Fullerton finishes as the No. 2 team in the nation in only its second year.

Pam Edde, Sue Lewis and Janet Lloyd are named to the All-America team and Terry Keasling establishes the single-season record for strikeouts among Titan pitchers in a season, fanning 328 batters.

1982 Kathy Van Wyk joins the team when Defending Champion Texas Woman's University drops softball. She compiles an incredible NCAA record 33 consecutive wins in a season - still the record - on her way to a 35-1 record, with a 0.18 ERA.

The Titans compile a 55-6-2 record and earn a trip to the first-ever NCAA College World Series where Cal State Fullerton finishes 3rd.

Kathy Van Wyk wins the Broderick Award (national player of the year) and is named to the All-America team, along with Sue Lewis. Terry Keasling finishes her two-year career with a 13-3 record and her average of eight strikeouts per seven innings pitched still ranks her sixth on the all-time NCAA list for career strikeout ratio. Additionally, Lewis leads the nation in home runs and RBI - 9 and 50, respectively.

1983 JoAnn Ferrieri, Elise King and Susan LeFebvre begin their careers as Titans and Kathy Van Wyk becomes the program's third assistant coach. Cal State Fullerton finishes 56-15 overall and 17-3 in a tie with UCLA for 1st place of the WCAA Conference.

The Titans defeat New Mexico in the West Regional to advance to their fourth-straight College World Series. They beat Indiana, South Carolina and UCLA to advance to the Championship Game against Texas A&M, where they lose to the Aggies, 2-O. It is the program's second appearance in the Championship Game in only four years.

Elise King and Susan LeFebvre are selected to the All-America team.

1984 Debbie Mygind begins her Fullerton career and combines with Susan LeFebvre and Lori Neff for a 54-12 record as the Titans qualify for their fifth consecutive post-season appearance. Although the Titans lose to Defending Champion Texas A&M in the Western Regional, Titan Sue Lewis is selected to the All-America team for the third time. She becomes the only Titan to accomplish this feat.

1985 Terri Oberg begins her two-year Titan career. A return trip to the College World Series pits the Titans against their old rivals, the Bruins of UCLA. The Titans had already suffered a loss at the hands of Nebraska when the Bruins beat the Titans, 1-0, in a game which landed Fullerton in the No. 3 spot for the tournament.

However, after UCLA beat the Cornhuskers in the Championship Game, it was determined that Nebraska had used an illegal player throughout the CWS. Although the NCAA record book doesn't reflect it, Cal State Fullerton claims its third No. 2 finish.

Debbie Mygind, JoAnn Ferrieri and Terri Oberg are selected All-America.

1986 After one ninth-place, one third-place and three second-place finishes, Cal State Fullerton finishes the 1986 season with the NATIONAL CHAM-

PIONSHIP. Behind the strong pitching of Susan LeFebvre, Connie Clark and April Jones, the Titans finish with a 57-9 record.

In Game 1 at the College World Series the Titans defeat Long Beach State in what proved to be the most difficult game of the series for Fullerton. Connie Clark pitches a four-hit shutout in the nine inning game. Alani Silva leads off the ninth inning with a double and Robin Goodin advances her to third. Rina Foster drills a single up the middle to knock in the winning run.

LeFebvre pitches a one-hit shutout over Cal in the second game of the series and the Titans beat the Bears, 3-0. The third game was highlighted by a no-hitter from Clark, her second of the season over the Aggies, and the Titans beat Texas A&M, 3-0. Riding a streak, Fullerton faces Indiana in one semi-final game and for the first - and only time in the series - the Titans are scored on. But LeFebvre and the Titans prevail and take the game, 3-1, to set up the Championship Game vs. Texas A&M. Clark pitches a one-hit shutout

and the Titans score in the fifth inning when Rina Foster triples and scores the winning run on a fielder's choice on the next play. Fullerton adds two more and wins its first national title, 3-0. The Titans tie a CWS record by going undefeated in the tournament.

Susan LeFebvre culminates a brilliant Titan career, receives the Broderick Award and joins teammate Chenita Rogers on the All-America team. Still the career leader in wins with 100, games played with 149, shutouts with 59, strikeouts win 702 and innings pitched with 894.2, LeFebvre remains on the NCAA top 20 list for season-best ERA with a 0.23 average in her freshman season, 1983.

1987 Missy Coombes, Valerie Douglas and Carey Hess begin Titan careers and Connie Clark returns for her senior year. The Titans finish 59-10 and earn a trip back to the CWS to defend their championship.

Cal State Fullerton defeats Florida State 3-0 in Game 1 of the CWS to set up a rematch of the 1986 Championship Game, the Titans and the Aggies. In what many people consider the greatest softball game in CWS history, the country's two best pitchers, Clark and Shawn Andaya, pitch 13 innings. Deadlocked O-O through ten innings (including two tie-breaker innings), the Aggies got on the board in the top of the eleventh. But, in Fullerton's half of the inning, Foster opens at second, is sacrificed to third and, with two outs, Missy Coombes drives Foster in with an infield single. The effort continues deadlocked at 1-1 until the 13th inning when Andaya herself scores the winning run for the Aggies. After 13 innings, the 3 hour and 25 minute contest is over.

A tired Titan team takes the field the next afternoon and defeats Freeno State, 2-1. Going into the bottom of the seventh inning down by one run, the Titans rally with an opening single by Alani Silva. Michelle Gromacki reaches on an error. After a failed sacrifice attempt, the Titans have one out, Gromacki at second and Charis Monroe at first. Then, with one out, Cathi Hall, in the biggest hit of her collegiate career, doubles off the wall to score Gromacki. Chenita Rogers sends a sacrifice fly to deep right and the Titans come from behind to beat the Bulldogs.

Playing that same night, the Titans face familiar rivals UCLA. The Titans are unable to beat the Bruins and settle for a third-place finish. (Texas A&M goes on to beat the Bruins twice the following day to record its second national title.)

Connie Clark pitches every game and inning of the CWS and is awarded the Broderick Award, the third time a Titan pitcher has been given the honor. She is joined by Chenita Rogers on the All-America team, her second selection. Rogers leads the nation in hits with 89 and posts a .401 batting average.

1988 Marty Rubinoff becomes the fourth Titan assistant coach and Mich DeBree becomes a Titan. Fullerton uses four young pitchers throughout the season who combine for a 52-20 record and a third-place finish in the final season of the PCAA Conference. (The conference becomes the Big West for the 1989 season.) In a difficult West Regional, the Titans draw eventual National Champion UCLA and lose in a best-of three format.

1989 Ann Van Dortrecht begins her pitching career for the Titans. Fullerton posts a 47-15 record and finishes 28-8 in second place in the Big West. The Titans draw cross-town rivals Cal Poly Pomona in the NCAA West Regional and are knocked out by the Broncos.

Missy Coombes and Carey Hess are named to the All-America team. Additionally, Hess leads the nation with 52 runs scored. 1990 Joy Tiner becomes a Titan. The Titans finish 45-23, 22-13, good for third place in the Big West and draw Long Beach State for the West Regional. Both teams were ranked in the top five. After beating Long Beach State, 3-2, on the opening night, the Titans suffer a 4-0 defeat and then a difficult 2-1 loss in 16 innings to the 49ers. It is the eleventh consecutive year that the Titans compete in post-season play.

1991 Kathy Van Wyk returns as an assistant coach and Tiffany Boyd arrives at Fullerton and the tradition of Fullerton pitching dominance continues as she and Van Dortrecht combine for most of the Titans' 52-16-1 record and Cal State Fullerton finishes 25-9-1 in the Big West. Again, Cal State Fullerton qualifies for post-season play and for the second time loses a best-of-three series to Long Beach State. However, the Big West has three teams - Long Beach State, Fresno State and UNLV - representing it at the CWS.

1992 Denise DeWalt selects Cal State Fullerton and the Titans post a 45-20 record and a 25-11, second-place finish in the Big West. Tiffany Boyd is named Conference Pitcher of the Year and DeWalt is named Conference Field Player of the Year. But, for the third year in a row, the Titans are eliminated after qualifying for post-season play by Long Beach State in a best-of-three series.

1993 Traci Fischer begins her career at Fullerton after sitting out most of the 1992 season as a medical redshirt. The Titans use four pitchers to combine for a 37-21 record and take second place in the Big West.

Fullerton qualifies for the West Regional and is sent to UCLA for another best-of-three series. The Defending Champion Bruins down the Titans and return to the CWS where UCLA loses to Arizona

Denise DeWalt posts a .418 batting average and is selected to the All-America team. DeWalt's career .396 average marks the all-time best for the Thans

1994 The "yellow ball" is introduced in collegiate softball. Three pitchers, led by Jennifer Mortensen and Trinity Johnson, combine for a 35-29 record and place third in conference play.

Participating at the NCAA Regionals at Cal State Northridge, Cal State Fullerton is a part of a four-team Regional. The Titans beat Washington in the first game, 2-1, then lose to Northridge in game 2. The Titans beat Washington again, 4-0, and Northridge, 2-0, to force a final showdown between the Titans and the Matadors. Johnson takes the loss as CSUN bests Fullerton, 4-0, to advance to the CWS.

1995 Chris Zboril begins her career as a Titan and Michelle Gromacki returns as the program's fifth assistant coach. Also, Melanie Roche becomes the program's first pitching-only coach. Cal State Fullerton posts a 46-17 overall record and a 20-8 Big West mark, good for second place. The Titans draw a return trip to Northridge for the NCAA Regional with CSUN. Missouri and Illinois State. Shaking off seven years of regional frustrations, the Titans blast Illinois State in the opener, 9-1, and then beat Northridge twice, 1-O and 2-1, to gain a berth as one of the final eight in the CWS at Oklahoma. The Titans beat first-place conference foe UNLY, 1-O, and then lose to two-time defending champion, Arizona, 11-0, and to lowa, 6-5, to finish fifth.

1996 Susie Parra Joins the Titans' staff as pitching coach. In this Olympic year, the Titans travel to New Zealand and Australia to participate in exhibition softball in an international settina.



Former Head Coach Judi Garman (right) was enshrined in the NFCA Hall of Fame in 1993 after 913 career victories with the Titans.

On the strength of two young pitchers and a barrage of veteran offensive talent, Cal State Fullerton finishes 41-28 overall and 17-15 in fourth place in the Big West. The Titans bid, and receive, the NCAA West Regional and play host to Northridge, UCLA and Southwestern Missouri State. It is the 17th consecutive year that the Titans aualify for post-season play.

The Bruins and Titans meet for the first time in three years and for the first time in the newly expanded Itan Softball Complex. Chris Zboril leads off the game for the visiting Titans (by seeding) with a home run, followed by another by Traci Fischer and the Titans don't look back as they hand the Bruins a 5-1 defeat in front of a crowd of 551 for the afternoon affair. The Titans continue their roll as they greet Northridge with 9 runs in the first inning and an 11-0 mercy rule pounding. The first inning is capped by a Zboril grand slam. But the Titans' offense falters and their pitching inexperience shows when Fullerton loses its surprising bid to return to the CWS as the Bruins beat the Titans. 14-1, and 7-2, to advance to the CWS.


Traci Fischer is selected to the All-West Regional team and the Titans finish the season with a ninth-place Coaches Poll nod.

1997 The season features the most newcomers a Fullerton team has ever fielded, but the Titans go 29-26 on the year. Although the squad is disappointed by not making post-season play for the first time in the history of the program, 1997 is not without highlights.

Donna Coombes throws a perfect game as the Titans defeat Purdue at the Florida Tournament and Fullerton ages on to capture the crown there.

The Titans get off to their worst conference start, O-6, but never give up, battling to conclude the season with a split with Long Beach State, eventual Big West Champions. Second baseman Nikki Hart is named to the 1997 All-Big West Team, along with shortstop Julie Williams. Outfielder Rachel Olvera is named to the second team and pitcher/utility player Jana Oetgen earns Honorable Mention.

1998 Prior newcomers with a year of experience under their collective belts, combine with a couple of new faces to provide one of the most potent offenses Cal State Fullerton has ever



fielded. However, pitching continues to be inconsistent and the Titans go 32-29 on the year and miss post-season play for only the second time in the program's history.

Brenda Iglesias and Kristy Osborne earn All-Western Regional honors for their outstanding hitting and are joined on the All-Big West squad by Dara Marzolo and Hart for her second consecutive selection.

1999 Although Stephenie Little had arrived on campus in time to play for the Titans in 1998, it was her senior season, 1999, when she established herself as one of the nation's premier hitters—both contact and for power. And, if there was a word that summed up the 1999 season of offense for Cal State Fullerton, it was power. Led by Little's single-season record of 23 home runs, Fullerton pounds 54 round-trippers compared to their opponents' 23. The offense also sets Titan and Big West single-season records in doubles collecting 99 of them, led by Monica Lucatero's 18 (which ties her for No. 2 in the CSF record book).

The maturity of senior pitcher Jana Oetaen and the talent of newcomer Christy Robitaille mark the return of solid pitching for the Titans and the team - although flirting with the conference title for much of the season after taking two of three from eventual champions Long Beach State in Long Beach — finishes the regular-season dropping three straight to Pacific and fall all the way to fourth in the Big West. However, overall record, strength of schedule and the strength of their opponents' schedules land the Titans back in the NCAA post-season after the only drought in the program's history. Fullerton receives a berth as the No. 4 seed at Regional 3 in Seattle, Wash., as 1999 marks the first time the softball post-season features eight, six-team regionals in an expanded 48-team format tournament.

The Titans play their best softball in several years, pummeling No. 3 seed Tennessee in the first game, 12-1. Fullerton ties the NCAA post-season mark for doubles in a single game, smashing seven of them. Facing postseason nemesis Texas A&M (see years 1983-86), Fullerton gets great pitching from Robitaille and a save by Oetgen to win, 2-1, and advance to the Regional to face host Washington in the winner's bracket matchup.

The Titans battle the Huskies better than anyone at that regional and lose the heart-breaker, 1-O, in the 9th to the eventual NCAA runners-up. Fullerton has to come back after a two-hour respite to battle Hawai'i on Saturday night. The Titans wage another battle with the Rainbow Wahine — the two teams having met three times in the regular season with Hawai'i holding the 2-1 edge. This time the two teams get timely hitting and great defense to produce an 11-inning gem, but the Titans come up a run short and lose, 4-3.

Fullerton finishes the season 36-29 and Little earns third-team All-American honors and is the Big West Player of the Year. In addition to Little's first-team All-West Region honor, Nikki Hart earns second-team All West Region status. Both Little and Hart earn first-team All-Big West honors and are joined by Oetgen, Lucatero, Yasmin Moesadeghi and Kristy Osborne on the second team. Oetgen, Dara Marzolo, Wendi Griffin and Stacy Pierson are selected to the All-Regional team.

But, 1999 marks the year in which the Titans announce to the softball world, "We are back."

It also marks Judi Garman's last year as head coach as she announces her retirement after 20 years guiding the program. At the time of her retirement, she leads the nation in all-time wins. Her final Division I coaching record ends: 913-376-4 (.708).

2000 The Michelle Gromacki Era begins at Fullerton and the Titans return to the national

stage once again to usher in the new millenium, advancing to the postseason as one of six teams invited to the NCAA West Regional in Fresno, Calif.

Gromacki's troops sliced through the regular season, posting a 45-15 overall record and a 19-5 mark in the Big West Conference. Fullerton put together winning streaks of 11 games to open the season, another string of 11 games, and a streak of 14 games during the Big West schedule.

It was the first outright Big West title for the Titans dating back to 1986 when Fullerton advanced to the College World Series and came home as the National Champions.

Youth was served in the 2000 season, led by an outstanding group of freshmen and sophomores who paced the Titan offense and shut down the opposition inside the circle.

Lucatero (third-team All-American) and Mossadeghi were two of the Big West's big bats, hitting .343 and .335, respectively, en route to post-season honors. In the circle, two freshmen and a sophomore proved to be a triple threat for opposing teams as the Titans regularly featured three different pitchers throughout the year. Highlytouted freshmen Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks combined for 31 of the Titans' 45 wins on the year.

After a masterful regular season, Fullerton entered the West Regional as the No. 14 team in the nation, and quickly jumped into the winner's bracket with a hard-fought 2-1 victory over Texas in the first round.

However, the Titans ran into an upstart California squad, which defeated Fullerton, 3-2, before advancing to the College World Series by defeating host Fresno State. In the fifth-place game, the Titans ran up against the host Bulldogs, but could not defeat the 1998 National Champions, falling, 4-3, to end their season.

2001 Star slugger Jenny Topping transfers from Washington and immediately makes Cal State Fullerton a national championship contender once again.

A little wiser and a lot more experienced, Cal State Fullerton ran away with the Big West, out-distancing second-place Pacific by three games in the standings for the Titans second straight title. The Titans finish with a 48-14 overall record and a 19-5 record in the Big West.

Fullerton advanced to the NCAA Regional in Tucson, Ariz., home of the top-seeded Arizona Wildcats. The Titans won their first two games over Texas Tech and Southwest Texas State to set up an undefeated match-up with the host Wildcats. Cal State Fullerton managed 10 hits off of Arizona ace Jennie Finch, but still trailed by three runs entering the seventh.

Cox got the Titans to within 5-4 with her tworun single and Fullerton had the bases loaded with one out and Amanda Hockett at the plate. She lined a hot shot back through the circle which would have at least tied the score, but Finch made a spectacular grab on her follow through and doubledup the Titans to end the game.

Down, but not out, Cal State Fullerton had to rebound against Southwest Texas State in the nightcap, but could not find enough offense, losing 4-3, to end its season. Nine Titans were named All-Big West Conference and Topping was named Big West Player of the Year and a first-team All-American in her first season with the Titans.

2002 The most explosive season in Cal State Fullerton history was highlighted by a 32-game winning streak and a 53-win season — the most since 1987. The Titans' offense would set six school records (home runs, runs scored, RBI, runs per game, walks, hit by pitches) and four Big West Conference marks (runs, home runs, RBI, walks) over the course of the year.

Fullerton was nearly unbeatable at home, post-

ing 30 consecutive wins at home after dropping the season opener. The Titans finished 53-13 overall and claimed their third-straight Big West title with a 22-2 mark – one game ahead of rival Pacific.

The Titans earned the top-seed into arguably the toughest NCAA Regional in the nation. Fullerton was joined by four other top-25 teams in the regional, and eventually faced three of them.

Fullerton won its opening games over Evansville and Fresno State to set up a rematch with California, whom the Titans had defeated 2-1 in eight innings earlier in the year.

Behind tournament MVP Jocelyn Forest and her 13 strikeouts, the Golden Bears won the matchup of undefeated teams, 4-2, sending the Titans into the losers bracket to face an old nemesis in Stanford, who had defeated the Titans in three previous meetings this season.

However, Oaks was not about to let history repeat itself. She scattered four hits and allowed only a first-inning run as the Titans went on to a 4-1 victory and a rematch with California in the championship game. This time, however, Fullerton would have to beat the Golden Bears twice in order to return to the Women's College World Series.

That dream was not to be however, as Cal got an RBI single in the third inning and Forest retired the final 12 batters she faced to send the Golden Bears to the World Series with a 1-0 victory.

Topping, Oaks, and Mossadeghi were all named All-Americans while four Titans and Head Coach Michelle Gromacki were invited to the U.S. National Team Camp. The Titans placed six on the All-Big West teams and Topping earned her second-consecutive Big West Player of the Year award.

2003 With seven seniors on the roster, the Titans believed it was their year to win the big one. Cal State Fullerton posted a 41-15 overall record and a 20-1 mark in the Big West to win its fourth-straight Big West crown and the seventh overall — the most by any other school in the history of the leadue.

Fullerton played host to an NCAA regional for the first time since 1996, earning a national No. 6 seed in the process. Heavily favored to win the regional, the Titans opened the tournament with a win over Rider, and battled with Louisiana-Lafayette, until a dropped fly ball which fell into fair territory by mere inches sent Fullerton into the losers bracket to battle its way back.

The Titans defeated Penn State in a game decided via the eight-run rule, but could not find their offense on day three, fallling to Oregon, 2-1, after the Ducks scored both runs in the first and used three pitchers to stymie the Titans' offense.

Seven Titans were named All-Big West and Topping (who was named Big West Player of the Year for a third consecutive year), Cox and Oaks all earned All-America honors.

al State Fullerton has produced a professional baseball player (Missy Coombes of the Silver Bullets) and several former players who are still involved with softball as international players or coaches, collegiate and high school coaches, athletic trainers or sports information professionals. Than teams and players have traveled all over the world as players or coaches and have influenced the international softball community with their knowledge and experience.

The history of Titan softball includes a National Championship, three second-place finishes, two third-place finishes, three Broderick Award winners (now called the Honda Broderick Award), 35 All-Americans and dozens of all-conference and all-region selections. Additionally, it includes countless individual highlights and memories.

Cal State Fullerton is one of only seven schools to win the NCAA Championship and has participated in post-season play 22 of its 24 years.

TOPPING NAMED TO 2004 OLYMPIC TERM

Cal State Fullerton catcher Jenny Topping was selected as one of 15 players to represent the United States at the 2004 Summer Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, as a member of the U.S. National Softball Team.

Topping was a three-time first-team All-American for Cal State Fullerton after transferring from the University of Washington in 2001. One of only two Titans to ever be honored as an All-American three times in their career (Sue Lewis), Topping was also named Big West Player of the Year all three seasons in a Titan uniform.

She was a three-time selection to the U.S. National Training Team (2001-03), but missed playing in 2002 due to injury. In 2001, she hit .371 with three home runs, 16 walks, 19 runs scored and 19 RBI with the USA Blue Team in three international tournaments, including the Pan Am Games qualifier.

In 2003, she was a member of the U.S. National Team which went 9-0 against international competition and took home the gold medal at the Pan American games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

She hit .263 with that team, scoring six runs, a home run and 11 RBI.

Perhaps the most dominate player in Cal State Fullerton history, Topping hit .443 for her career, breaking Denise DeWalt's previous record by 47 points. Topping owns career records for average, slugging percentage (.771), on base percentage (.573), and walks (137), as well as seven single-season records: average (.472), slugging (.861), on base percentage (.576), runs scored (55), doubles (19), RBI (59), and walks (56).

Topping was a three-time first-team All-Big West selection (twice at catcher, once at first base), a two-time first-team All-West Region Selection (2001-02), and a second-team All-West Region selection in 2003.



GINA OAKS JOINS NATION'S "ELITE"

One of the country's most versitile players, former Cal State Fullerton "jill-of-all-trades" Gina Oaks continued to improve her game as a member of the U.S. National "Elite" Team for the second straight season.

She was first selected to the "Elite" Team following her junior year as one of five Titans to be invited to the U.S. National Team Camp in Chula Vista, Calif.

She appeared in eight games, hitting .250 and ranking fourth on the team with a .455 on base percentage, second in walks, and tied for fifth in runs.

In 2003, Oaks helped her squad to an 11-1 record and a championship at the Canada Cup. She hits just .211 in 10 games, but had a pair of doubles, three RBI and three runs scored while making just one error in 36 fielding chances (.972).

A two-time All-American for the Titans as a utility player, Oaks was a .295 career hitter for Fullerton with 24 home runs and 108 RBI. She was also one of the Titans' winningest pitchers with a 74-23 career record, 1.37 ERA, and 685 strikeouts.

Oaks ranks among the top 10 in 10 career pitching categories and holds the school's career record for runs scored (150).

She was the first-ever player in Big West Conference history to be named first-team all-conference at two positions in 2002 and was a three-time first-team All-West Region honoree.

JODIE COX STARS FOR U.S. ELITE TEAM

After dominating the nation and the Big West Conference during her four seasons at Cal State Fullerton, former Titan hurler Jodie Cox took her game to the world stage in 2003 as a member of the U.S. National "Elite" Team.

Cox did not disappoint in her first appearance with the national team, winning MVP honors at the Canada Cup after going 3-O without allow-

ing an earned run in 19 innings pitched as the United States claimed the gold medal. She had 15 strikeouts and held opposing hitters to a .134 batting average – the lowest on the team.

In a five-game series with Australia at the Pacific Challenge, Cox was 1-O in the circle with a save and a 1.50 ERA.

She earned her first All-America honor following her senior year when she was 21-7 in the circle with a 1.06 ERA and 224 strikeouts in 190.2 innings. Cox held opponents to a .125 batting average and led the Big West Conference in five different categories en route to Co-Big West Pitcher of the Year honors.

For her career, Cox was 75-22 in the circle with a 1.42 ERA and 699 strikeouts – just three short of tying the school record. She held opponents to a .170 batting average and ranks among the top 10 in 10 different career pitching categories.

Cox, a three-time first-team all-conference honoree, also hit .298 at the plate with 21 home runs and 110 RBI in her career.



THE BIG WEST CONFERENCE

The Big West Conference is entering its 20th season of sponsoring the sport of soft-ball and its 35th year of operation overall.

The conference is home to the 1986 NCAA National Champion and seven-time conference champion Cal State Fullerton, which has won the last four consecutive league crowns.

The Big West Conference is made up of eight softball-playing league members: Cal Poly, Cal State Fullerton, Cal State Northridge, Long Beach State, UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara, University of the Pacific, and Utah State.

Utah State will leave the league following the completion of the 2005 season to join the Western Athletic Conference. The Big West will welcome 2003 Division II National Champion UC Davis beginning with the 2007-08 academic year.

The conference began sponsoring softball in 1985 as the sixth women's sport. UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii, UNLV, Pacific, and associate member Cal Poly Pomona competed as charter members.

In 1986, Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, and San Diego State were added to the softball-playing roster as the Titans won the league title in their first season, advancing to the Women's College World Series and bringing home the national championship.

Fresno State and San Jose State entered the league in 1987, bringing the league to a total of 10 teams, and in 1990, a record five schools advanced to NCAA Regionals.

That season, Cal Poly Pomona and San Diego State left the conference in favor of New Mexico State and Utah State.

Two seasons later, in 1992, a record six Big West schools advanced to postseason play as Long Beach State and Fresno State moved on to the Women's College World Series. The Bulldogs advanced to the semifinals before losing to eventual national champion Arizona.

The current league configuration was achieved following the 2002 season when associate member Sacramento State left the conference.

Cal State Fullerton is the last current conference member to reach the Women's College World Series, finishing 5th in 1995.

The Big West Conference has placed a team in the NCAA Tournament every season since 1985 and a team in the Women's College World Series in 11 of 19 seasons.

In 19 years of competition, 82 players from Big West institutions have been named All-Americans with 28 more being named to the All-Women's College World Series Team.

Pam Edde (1981): Edde was masterful for the Titans from the circle, posting a 25-5 record and a 0.61 ERA. She also hit .284 that season with 34 runs scored, six doubles, 15 RBI and 32 walks.

Sue Lewis (1981-82, 84): One of two three-time All-American Titans, Lewis hit .354 with 25 home runs and 138 RBI in her career. Lewis still holds school career records for hits (257), doubles (53), and triples (20).

Janet Lloyd (1981): Another "Titan"-ic slugger for Fullerton, Lloyd hit .381 with 15 home runs and 41 RBI in her All-American season. Her home run mark stands third on the single-season list.

Kathy Van Wyk (1982): After transferring from Texas Women's University, Van Wyk posted a 35-1 record with a 0.18 ERA and 270 strikeouts. She was named the National Player of the Year, winning Fullerton's first-ever Honda Broderick Award.

Elise King (1983): King hit .293 with 35 runs and 16 RBI while stealing 12 bases for the Titans in her All-American year.

Susan LeFebvre (1983, 86): LeFebvre finished her career with a 100-21 record in the circle and a 0.29 ERA to go with 740 strikeouts. In 1986, she became the second Titan to be named Player of the Year and helped Fullerton to the National Championship.

Debbie Mygind (1985): Posted a 28-4 record with a 0.27 ERA and 183 strikeouts. She is second in career ERA and third in career winning percentage.

Joann Ferrieri (1985): Hit .328 with 27 runs and 23 RBI, leading the team in hitting.

Terri Oberg (1985): The third Titan All-American in 1985, Oberg hit .298 with 7 home runs and 35 RBI – both team high's. Her eight triples that season set a school record.

Chenita Rogers (1986-87): A career .365 hitter who led the team in hitting in both of her All-American seasons. Hit .386 in 1986 to help the Titans to the national title.

Connie Clark (1987): The current Texas head coach went 33-5 with a 0.47 ERA and 261 strikeouts en route to Co-Big West Player of the Year and Fullerton's third Broderick Award.

Valerie Douglas (1988): Led the team with a .351 average with 19 runs and 28 RBI. Her 72 hits rank tied for ninth on the single-season charts.

Missy Coombes (1989): Hit .359 with 14 doubles and 29 RBI. Went on to earn three All-Big West and two All-West Region honors.

Carey Hess (1989): Hit .409 with 10 doubles and 52 runs, which stood as a school record until 2001.

Joy Tiner (1990): Hit .311 with 30 runs and 17 RBI. Was a two-time All-Big West selection.

Ann Van Dortrecht (1990): Was 29-12 with a 0.43 ERA while pitching a school season record of 310.2 innings. Was named Big West Pitcher of the Year in 1990.

Tiffany Boyd (1991-92): Combined 63-15 in her two All-America seasons with 543 strikeouts. A threetime Big West Pitcher of the Year.

Paula "Mich" DeBree (1991): Hit .313 with nine doubles, 33 runs and 19 RBI. A two-time All-Big West honoree.

Denise DeWalt (1992-93): DeWalt hit .396 for her career, a record which stood until 2003, to go with 70 runs, 29 doubles and 49 RBI.

Chris Zboril (1995): Led the team with a .373 average, eight home runs and 25 RBI.

Stephenie Little (1999): Led the team with a .372 average, 57 RBI, and set the single-season record with 23 home runs.

Monica Lucatero (2000): Hit .343 with six home runs and 39 RBI while walking a team-high 20 times. Named top the AII-Big West second team.

Jenny Topping (2001-03): The Titans' second threetime All-American (all first-team honors), Topping holds four career records and seven single-season marks.

Yasmin Mossadeghi (2002): Named to the thirdteam after hitting .367 with 13 home runs and 45 RBI. Was also an All-Big West and All-West Region first team selection while being invited to U.S. National Team Camp.

Gina Oaks (2002-03): Twice earned All-America honors as a utility player (Oaks pitched, played second and third base, and the outfield), hitting .295 for her career and 74-23 with a 1.37 ERA in the circle.

Jodie Cox (2003): An All-American pitcher in 2003, Cox was 21-7 in the circle with a 1.06 ERA and 224 strikeouts. She went undefeated in conference play in her final two seasons (21-0).






