program, with instruction in English, is also available in Taiwan, Republic of China.

Selected students remain enrolled and continue to earn residence credit at their California campus. Full credit is earned for academic work successfully completed at the cooperating institutions abroad. Application of credit earned toward the degree requirements of the home campus is in accordance with college regulations. Students are selected from each campus on the basis of academic, linguistic, and personal qualifications, as well as career objectives. Requirements include:

- (a) Upper division or graduate standing by the beginning of the academic year abroad;
- (b) Grades of B (3.0) or better in 30 semester units or 45 quarter units;
- (c) Proficiency in the language of instruction, as specified below;
- (d) Faculty recommendations.

Proficiency in the language of the host country is a requirement for the programs in France, Germany, Italy (except for students applying for the area studies program), and Spain. Even where language proficiency is not required, competence in the language of the host country will assure broader curricular opportunities.

Application for the 1973-74 academic year must be submitted before March 1, 1973 (except for United Kingdom applicants who must submit applications by January 5, 1973). Applicants are notified of acceptance by April 1, 1973. Average expenses for the entire year—including round-trip transportation between California and the study centers, room and board, health and accident insurance, home campus fees, moderate vacation traveling, textbooks, and personal expenses—range from \$2,600 to \$3,050. Students ordinarily remain eligible for any financial aids for which they otherwise would qualify on their home campus.

COURSES (1 S A)

Fresno State College students under the California State University and Colleges International Programs register concurrently at Fresno State College and at the host institution abroad, with credit assigned in terms of Fresno courses. Undergraduate students who find appropriate study opportunities at the host institution but no counterpart course Fresno State College may use Independent Study (190), and International Study Abroad 92 or 192. Graduate students may use Independent Study (290), and International Study 292.

92. Projects in Study Abroad: (Subject) (1-3; max total 6)

Open only to students in California State University and Colleges International Programs. Study undertaken in a university abroad under the auspices of the California State University and Colleges.

192. Projects in Study Abroad: (Subject) (1-3; max total 6)

Open only to students in California State University and Colleges International Programs. Study undertaken in a university abroad under the auspices of the California State University and Colleges.

292. Projects in Study Abroad: (Subject) (1-3; max total 18)

One- to three-unit registrations. Prerequisite: admission to master's degree program; written plan approved by the Fresno State instructor, department chairman, and the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies. May require one or more papers and oral or written examination on the student's return, pending which In Progress (IP) grade will be recorded.

LATIN AMERICAN STUDIES

The Latin American Studies major and minor are designed to meet the needs of students interested in an academic interdisciplinary major, those who wish to broaden their studies in a given discipline with a background in the Latin American area, and those who are interested in obtaining a teaching credential. Students following this program will be assigned to a faculty adviser in the Foreign Language or History Department.

Students who wish to major or minor in Latin American Studies must complete Span 20A-B or equivalent. Lower division prerequisites for required courses listed in the major and
