MARINE OFFICER
INFORMATION

A Marine Corps Officer Selection and Information Team will visit Cal State Bakersfield on Wednesday, December 16, 1970, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. The team will be positioned on the patio. Their intent will be to offer information on Marine Corps ground and aviation programs leading to commissioned officer status. The Marine representatives will be discussing the Platoon Leaders Class (PLC), Platoon Leaders Class Aviation (PLC(A)), Platoon Leaders Class Law (PLC(L)) and Platoon Leaders Class Graduate Studies (PLC(GS)) programs which are open to qualified college students. All programs require six weeks of training for two summers at Marine Corps School, Quantico, Virginia. There are no requirements during the academic year and the student is draft deferred.
