»DIRECTIONS TO CAMPUS



From the 57 freeway, take the Yorba Linda Blvd, exit and turn left (when heading north) or right (when heading south). Make a left at the next light (Associated Blvd.) and park in Lot G. Additional parking is available in Lot

***ATHLETIC MEDIA RELATIONS OFFICE**

The Cal State Fullerton Media Relations Office is located on the east side of Titan Gym between the racquetball courts and pool in offices 191G & 191E. Members of the staff include Associate Athletics Director Mel Franks (men's soccer, men's basketball, wrestling, fencing, and track & field), Assistant Media Relations Director Jason Spencer (women's soccer, women's basketball, women's gymnastics, softball, and women's tennis), and Assistant Media Relations Director Michael Greenlee (women's volleyball and baseball).

***SOFTBALL INFORMATION**

Information on Cal State Fullerton's softball program can be accessed via the Internet at **www. TitanSports.org.** The website contains news, results, statistics, schedule information, and weekly notes as well as links to audio webcasts and information on all of the university's 17 varsity athletic squads. Box scores and game recaps will be posted as soon as possible following the game.

»MEDIA CREDENTIALS/INTERVIEW REQUESTS

Interviews with Cal State Fullerton softball coaches and student-athletes MUST be coordinated through Jason Spencer in the media relations office. Home phone numbers or email addresses of student-athletes will not be released under any circumstances. Players and coaches can be made available before or after practice depending on availability at a time beneficial to both the media member and student-athlete. No interviews will be granted the day of a game.

Credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis only. Requests must be made either via fax, email, or phone at least 24 hours in advance of a weekday game or by 5 p.m. on Friday for a weekend contest. The media pass list will be kept at the ticket table at the main entrance to the Titan Softball Complex. Press seating is located in the press box located directly behind home plate on the main field.

»PHONE LINES

The press box on the main field is equipped with five phone lines and five high-speed data lines for use by visiting SID's and members of the media. Please contact Jason Spencer in the Sports Information Office as far in advance as possible to reserve a line for radio or internet broadcasts. During tournaments, additional phone and data lines may be available for use by SID's and media members at the adjacent Goodwin Field baseball press box.

»PARKING

Parking regulations are enforced from 7:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. on Monday-Thursday and from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Friday. There is no charge for parking during the weekends. Daily permits are available from vending machines at the entrance to each parking lot for \$4 (bills and quarters accepted). Or, present your media credentials at the Information Booth located to on the northwest corner of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues during normal business hours to obtain a daily pass.

STUDENT ATHLETIC TRAINER

The phrase "strength in numbers" will have extra-special meaning when talking about the Cal State Fullerton softball team this season.

With 19 players on the roster entering the 2005 campaign, the Titans will field the deepest roster in Head Coach Michelle Gromacki's tenure and the largest roster that the program has seen in eight years since the 1998 squad took the field with 20 players to open the season.

"Our depth is defiinitely one of our strengths," Gromacki said. "We come

into this season with a lot of young talent and team players. We have many versAtile players and that always helps."

As horrible as it sounds, Cal State Fullerton will need all the help it can get after the Titans, who had won four consecutive league titles entering last season, posted the first-ever losing season (18-34 overall, 7-14 in the Big West Conference) in the history of the program.

"I feel that there is such a valuable experience to take from losing," Gromacki said. "We did the best we could to relay the message of its value instead of dwelling on losing. As far as rebounding... we have such a young and vibrant nucleus this year that we like to think of it as reestablishing instead of rebounding."

Now, Gromacki will continue rebuilding her squad into a national contender with depth never before seen on a Titan squad. Cal State Fullerton welcomes 12 newcomers to the roster to supplement a squad that features seven returning letterwinners and only two seniors.

"Many have the opportunity in making an immediate impact, actually, I'm relying upon it," Gromacki said. "Amanda Kamekona, Katie Gollhardt, and Crystal Vieyra were all highly-recruited and should make an immediate impact."

Fullerton will be bolstered by the fact that it returns five starting position players and both starting pitchers from last season's squad who come in a little wiser after rough and tumble rookie seasons.

»FROM THE CIRCLE

A little stronger, a little wiser, and a whole lot deeper. That aptly describes the Cal State Fullerton pitching staff entering the 2005 season as the Titans return both starters from last year's squad and add three more hurlers to the depth chart.

"The staff is shaping up very well. We have worked very hard in the fall, and the pitchers have made a tremendous amount of progress," third-year pitching coach Dee Dee Weiman said. "We have done a lot of game type situations in the fall which I think will be very helpful in the spring.

"Also, I am excited about the depth of our staff, and we really made an effort to recruit more of a 'staff' for this year. With the regionals set up being a little different, and problems with injuries, we decided to go with a larger staff."

Sophomore Brooke Weekley (Mission Viejo, Čalif.) was the workhorse of the staff last season, leading the conference in innings pitched while compiling a 14-18 overall record and a 2.94 ERA.

Opponents hit just .243 against her as she also led the league in appearances and starts.

"Brooke is very hard working, and very coachable," Weiman said. "She had to take on the brunt of our duties last year, and learned a lot from her experiences. She has gotten bigger and stronger in the off season, and should have a lot more speed and movement this year. She will only get better and better as she gets older."

Sophomore Candice Baker (Buena Park, Calif.) was inducted into the rigors of Division I softball rather rudely. However, considering that 11 of her 20 decisions came against nationally-ranked or receiving votes teams, she performed admirably before an ankle injury kept her from the circle in the latter part of the

Baker was just 4-16 overall with a 4.44 ERA and struggled with bouts of wildness (35 wild pitches and 16 hit batters) while adjusting to the collegiate pitching distance.

"Candice is just so incredibly talented," Weiman said. "She needed a year

under her belt to get comfortable at this level (in the circle) and has had a phenomenal fall season. She is throwing the ball very hard, with much better control, and has picked up a few pitches which gives her a lot more to work with.

In the wings will be three talented newcomers who will all battle for starting time.

Highly-regarded redshirt junior Marissa Marzan (Fresno, Calif.) has actually been a student at Cal State Fullerton for the last two seasons, but she was

forced to sit out her first year after transferring from Arizona and last season due to a knee injury suffered during fall practice.

Now, completely recovered, Marzan will finally get a chance to shine at the Division I level after redshirting her true freshman season with the Wildcats. Marzan was a two-time NFCA high school All-American at Bulard HS in California's Central Valley, helping the Knights to a pair of mythical *USA Today* High School National Championships in 1999 and 2001.

Junior Sara Gonzales (Lancaster, Calif.) joins the Titans from Weiman's old stomping grounds, the University of Wisconsin. Gonzales played two seasons for the Badgers, going 3-2 with a 1.97 ERA as a sophomore in 2004.

Freshman Dana Crucil (Orange, Calif.) played four seasons at El Modena HS, helping the Vanguards to the CIF finals as a freshman and sophomore. She was a second-team All-CIF honoree as a senior, hitting .390 and going 15-7 in the circle.



One of the good things about the 2004 season was that a very young pitching staff was

guided by a very experienced catcher in the now-departed Jennifer Holt.

This season, the Titans will not have that luxury as three newcomers will don

This season, the Titans will not have that luxury as three newcomers will do the gear and call the game.

Junior transfer Ashlee Weatherford (Woodland, Calif.) is the most experienced after spending her sophomore year at Solano College in northern California and her freshman campaign at Providence College in Rhode Island.

Weatherford hit .431 for the Falcons last season with 32 runs scored and 34 RBI, finishing in the top 25 among northern California community college players in average.

She started all 53 games with the Friars as a freshman, hitting .228 with a home run and 16 RBI.


A pair of freshmen will also battle for playing time with Katie Gollhardt (Glendora, Calif.) and Ariana "Kiki" Munoz (Orange, Calif.). Gollhardt played four seasons at Bishop Amat HS as an infielder and catcher, earning three All-CIF awards in her career.

Munoz helped El Modena HS to CIF runner-up finishes as a freshman and sophomore, earned three All-Century League awards and second-team CIF honors as a senior after hitting .419 at the plate.

»ON THE INFIELD

Continuing the theme of depth, the Titans are deep at all four positions on the infield, but are also very young. Of the nine players listed as infielders or utility players – six of those are underclassmen, and half of those are freshmen.

Leading the returnees is sophomore All-Big West Conference Honorable Mention selection Jenna Wheeler (Anaheim, Calif.), who hit .227 overall on the year, but exploded in league play by hitting .305 with three home runs and 14 RBI. She started all 52 games for the Titans at second base.



However, her status for the season is unknown after suffering an off-season concussion that may keep her sidelined.

Sophomore Tiffany Hoff (Vacaville, Calif.) returns for her second year after splitting time as the Titans' starting designated player and first baseman as a freshman in 2004. Hoff started 48 of the Titans' 52 games, hitting .217 with four home runs and 11 RBI.

Baker will split time between the circle and the infield, where she started 30 games as the shortstop when she wasn't pitching. She finished third on the team last season with a .252 average to go with three home runs and second with 24 RBI. She led the team with 13 doubles and finished second with six stolen bases.

Also pulling double duty in the circle and on the infield will be Marzan, who was also an accomplished hitter in high school.

Another Central Valley product, junior Crystal Medina (Visalia, Calif.), will also be ready to step in as both a defensive substitution and a pinch runner.

Three newcomers will battle for playing time as freshmen Amanda Kamekona (Chino Hills, Calif.) and Crystal Vieyra (Stanton, Calif.) join Cypress College transfer Molly Perez.

Kamekona played only one season of softball as a senior, but spent two years on the baseball team at Ayala HS as a freshman and sophomore.

Vieyra joins the Titans from perennial powerhouse Pacifica HS in Garden Grove, Calif., where she was an NFCA All-West Region high school selection as a senor after hitting .313 with 26 runs scored. She helped the Mariners to a pair of CIF and state titles as a junior and senior.

Perez helped the Chargers to a 43-4 overall record last season after spending her freshman year at Fairleigh Dickinson University in New Jersey.

»IN THE OUTFIELD

Fullerton will have a good mix of experience in the outfield, but it is probably the thinnest position for the Titans in 2005.

The corps is led by senior Lindsey Bashor (Riverside, Calif.), who did it with both her bat and her arm last season.


Bashor, a second-team All-Big West selection in her first year with the Titans, hit .277 with nine home runs and 27 RBI while also racking up 11 outfield assists.

The other Titan senior is Monica Tantlinger (Lancaster, Calif.), who started all 52 games for Fullerton, but hit just .167.

The outfield will be bolstered by sophomore transfer Ashley Van Boxmeer (Orange, Calif.), who was an NFCA All-West Region selection as a freshman

at New Mexico in 2003. Van Boxmeer hit .349 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI as a rookie.

"Ashley will be relied upon heavily this season because she brings power along with some experience at the Division I level," Gromacki said.

Freshmen Erin Atherton (Lake Elsinore, Calif.) and Whitney Kroh (Fullerton, Calif.) will also battle for time in the outfield.

Atherton, a "Titan" from Temescal Canyon HS, helped her school to a Southwestern League title as a senior, hitting .265 on the year while playing the outfield and second base.

Kroh, from nearby Fullerton Union HS, played four seasons as a middle infielder for the Indians, earning a pair of All-Freeway League honors.

***THE SCHEDULE**

The young Cal State Fullerton squad will be immediately thrown into the fire, facing top-ranked and defending national champion UCLA twice along with top-10 foe Georgia at the Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament to kick off the season.

The UCLA tournament will be the first of three preseason events away from home in February as the Titans also travel to Tempe, Ariz., for the Kajikawa Tournament hosted by Arizona State, and to Cathedral City, Calif., for the 2005 Palm Springs Classic hosted by Oregon State.

Fullerton, which was picked to finish fifth in the Big West Conference by the league's coaches in January, then returns home to host a pair of tournaments as nine teams come to the Titan Softball Complex for the 2005 Worth Invitational.

Pacific, Nevada, Illinois State, Boston College, Bowling Green, Northwestern, and Minnesota join Pacific-10 Conference rivals Stanford and Oregon State.


After non-conference contests against San Diego State and Syracuse, the Titans host 15 teams in perhaps the top spring tournament in the country – the Kia Klassic (Mar. 16-20).

Fullerton will meet North Carolina, Michigan, and Fresno State in a revamped tournament format before bracket play begins on March 19.

Non-conference contests against Washington, Ohio State, UCLA and future conference rival UC Davis loom following the Kia while the Big West slate opens on the road at UC Santa Barbara on Mar. 25-26.

Continuing the tradition of success which has built the Cal State Fullerton softball program into one of the most prestigious programs in the nation, Head Coach Michelle Gromacki returns for her sixth season at the helm.

Gromacki returned to her alma mater as head coach in 2000 after spending five years as an assistant to legendary Hall of Fame Head Coach Judi Garman, who retired following the 1999 campaign. And while the length of service is not yet equal to that of Garman's, Gromacki's tenure has been filled with accomplishments and accolades just as impressive.

Under her tutelage, Gromacki's Titans staked their claim to the four consecutive Big West Conference championships from 2000-03, bringing the program's total to seven league crowns overall – the most of any other school in the history of the conference.

After a two-year absence, Fullerton reached the NCAA Regionals in each of Gromacki's first four seasons from 2000-03, even earning a bid into the 2002 regional championship game for the first time since 1995 (the last Fullerton

squad to reach the Women's College World Series) before falling to eventual national champion California, 1-0. Gromacki's teams have finished in the top 20 in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's poll in four of her first five seasons, including top-10 finishes in 2002 (No. 9) and 2003 (No. 10). The Titans also finished ninth in the inaugural year of the ESPN.com/USA Softball coaches poll.

After all that success, Gromacki is now charged with rebuilding the Titans into a national contender. With the loss of seven seniors (including three All-Americans and six all-conference honorees) following the 2003 season, the Titans struggled with a roster flush with newcomers in 2004 to an 18-34 overall record and a 7-14 mark in the Rin West

Gromacki's head coaching career got off to a great start in her rookie year in 2000, leading an inexperienced Titan squad to a 45-15 overall record and the school's first Big West title since 1993 with a 19-5 mark. For her efforts, Gromacki was named Big West Conference Coach of the Year.

With a little more experience under its belt in 2001, Cal State Fullerton won its second consecutive league crown thanks to a 19-2 record and finished the year 48-14 overall after a tough NCAA regional in Tucson, Ariz.

The 2002 season was a banner year for Titans softball as Gromacki led Fullerton to a 53-13 overall record, posting the most victories in a season since Gromacki helped the Titans to 59 wins as a player in 1987. Fullerton clinched its third-straight conference title wih a 22-2 mark, posting the best single-season conference winning percentage in school history.

That campaign featured a 32-game winning streak (the second-longest in the history of the program and the second-longest in the nation that season) and Gromacki's 100th career coaching victory. She became the fastest coach in school history to 100 wins (134 games), besting Garman (142 games) and former baseball coach Augie Garrido's previous record of 135 games.

In 2003, featuring a roster chock-full of talented seniors, Gromacki piloted the Titans to a 41-15 overall record and a 20-1 mark in the Big West to clinch Fullerton's fourth consecutive league title. The Titans broke the school record for best Big West winning percentage and hosted the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 1996.

Gromacki has been honored by her peers throughout her coaching career, serving as head coach on three Speedline/NFCA West Region Coaching Staff's of the Year in the last four seasons (2000, 2002-03).

She has even taken her talents to the next level for the past four years, serving as an assistant coach for the USA Blue Team in 2001 and the U.S. "Elite" National Team in 2002-04, competing in international tournaments and serving as the "sparring partner" for the U.S. National Team in preparation for the 2004 Summer Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

In 2003, she helped lead the "Elite" Team to a gold medal at the Canada Cup with an 11-1 record and a roster which featured Titans Gina Oaks and Jodie Cox. Cox was named MVP of the tournament, posting a 3-0 record without allowing an earned run in 19 innings and striking out 15.

Gromacki's coaching career began in 1995 as an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton, helping the Titans to a 184-129 (.588) overall record and a 79-69 (.534) mark in Big West play in five seasons. Fullerton posted a 20-8 league record in her first season as an assistant (46-17 overall) and finished second in the conference before advancing to the Women's College World Series.

Regarded as one of the best catchers in the nation, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a combined 170-19-1 overall record and a 65-10-1 mark in the Big West as a player while claiming the 1986 NCAA National Championship.

In 1995, Gromacki was invited to participate in the first-ever Olympic try-out camp and led the Redding Rebels to three ASA Women's Major Fastpitch National Championships. She was named an ASA All-American in 1995 – an honor she has earned eight times throughout her playing career.

Gromacki was also selected as a member of the U.S. National Team that participated in the tournament to open the Olympic Softball Complex in Columbus, Ga., prior to the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta.

In 1994, Gromacki was a member of several U.S. National Teams which claimed gold medals at the South Pacific Classic Tournament, the World Championships in Canada, and the Pam Am Qualifier in Guatemala. She was a participant in the Olympic Sports Festival in St. Louis as both a player and assistant coach.

From 1985-92, Gromacki participated in three Olympic Sports Festivals and was a member of two U.S. National Teams that took gold medals in international competition in China (1987) and Japan (1985). She also spent eight months playing on a travelling team in New Zealand from 1988-89.

Aside from playing, Gromacki has also been involved in numerous activities to promote the sport of softball. She was responsible for Junior Olympic try-outs and Pan Am Team practicies held at Cal State Fullerton, has conducted numerous coaching clinics and speaking engagements around the world, and conducted a clinic in Italy, spending three days working with the Italian Junior Olympic National Team.

Gromacki is also a contributor to numerous athletic publications, including authoring a monthly column for Southern California Softball Magazine and writing articles for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association newsletter. She is also a clinician at the NFCA Coaches College.

A native of Antioch, Calif., Gromacki currently resides in Huntington Beach. Her parents are Rick and Adeline



ASSISTANT COACH 4TH SEASON MISSOURI '85

Cal State Fullerton Assistant Coach Terry Schweikert returns for her fourth season as part of Michelle Gromacki's staff, serving as the team's "defensive coordinator" and recruiting coordinator, while helping Gromacki in all aspects of the program, including camps and clinics.

Hired to her post in July, 2001, Schweikert spent the previous five years as an assistant coach at a pair of Big 12 Conference schools.

"Terry's knowledge of the game and her experience have been the reason for our consistent success. It didn't take me long to realize that every great program has great assistants," Gromacki said. "Terry

has high standards for herself which translates into the team's high standards. I couldn't do without her."

She has been a member of four NFCA Regional Coaching Staffs of the Year, twice with the Titans and once each at Nebraska and Missouri.

Cal State Fullerton has finished in the top half of the league in fielding percentage in the Big West Conference in two of the last three seasons, including a high of .968 in 2002. She has teamed with Gromacki to win a pair of Speedline/NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards in 2002 and 2003.

Schweikert broke into coaching in 1997, serving as an assistant coach at her alma mater, Missouri. In her first season, the Tigers won the Big 12 Conference regular season and tournament titles and returned to the NCAA Tournament. In her second season, Schweikert helped Missouri reach as high as No. 9 in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's top 25 poll.

While with the Tigers, Schweikert helped coach 11 All-Big 12 Conference team members, 11 Academic All-Big 12 Conference honorees, one Big 12 Conference Player of the Year, and an All-American.

From Columbia, Mo., Schweikert moved to Lincoln, Neb., where she spent three seasons as an assistant to Head Coach Rhonda Revelle at the University of Nebraska, helping the Cornhuskers to regional final appearances in 1999 and 2000. Schweikert also helped Nebraska to back-to-back Big 12 Championships in 2000 and 2001.

While with the Huskers, Schweikert worked primarily with the middle infielders and coached a three-time All-America infielder. She assisted Revelle with recruiting and also coordinated Nebraska's camps, clinics and community outreach programs.


Nebraska was 138-57 (.708) overall and 41-12 (.774) in Big 12 play during Schweikert's three seasons. She also coached a pair of All-Big 12 Conference honorees and three All-Midwest Region awardwinners.

Schweikert played softball for Missouri from 1982 to 1985, earning Missouri's rookie of the year honors as a freshman and player of the year honors as a junior. She helped the Tigers to their only Big Eight Tournament title and first College World Series appearance in 1984. During her junior and senior years, Schweikert captained the Tigers and was named all-region both seasons.

After earning a bachelor's degree in education, Schweikert returned to her hometown of Springfield, Mo., to serve as the head swimming coach, head volleyball coach and assistant basketball coach at Parkview High School. She also spent four years at Hopkins High School in Minnesota, where she served as the head softball coach and led her teams to two state tournaments. In 1996, she led Hopkins to a perfect 14-0 conference mark and was named the Minnesota High School Coach of the Year.

Throughout her coaching career, Schweikert has continued to play softball competitively. In 1990, she was named an Amateur Softball Association All-American while winning a national championship.

Schweikert currently resides in Corona. Her parents are Bill and Dorothy

ASSISTANT COACH 3RD SEASON UCLA '94

Assistant Coach Dee Dee Weiman returns for her third season on the Titans' bench, focusing her efforts on the development of the pitching staff while also assisting Gromacki with other aspects of the program.

"Some are convinced that games are won and lost in the circle. The pitchers have rapidly developed because of the addition of Dee Dee," Gromacki said. "I am confident that the pitchers are in good hands and their contribution from the circle will add to our success."

Weiman was hired to her post prior to the 2003 season and her impact on the program was immediately felt.

Under Weiman's tutelage, the Cal State Fullerton pitching staff led the Big West Conference in six different categories – ERA (1.35), opponent batting average (.156), strikeouts (417), strikeouts looking (156), wins (41), and fewest hits allowed (208). Titan pitching was also second in runs allowed (101) and earned runs allowed (73).

Individually, pitchers Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks were named third-team All-American and were also first-team All-Big West Conference pitchers. Cox was named the Big West Conference's Co-Pitcher of the Year, posting her first career 20-win season and finishing with 224 strikeouts to lead the league.

In fact, a Titan pitcher led or co-led the league in six different pitching categories: ERA (Cox, 1.06), opponent batting average (Cox, .125), strikeouts (Cox, .224), strikeouts looking (Oaks, 76), wins (Cox, .21), fewest earned runs allowed (Cox, .29).

Later that summer, the duo would be selected to the U.S. National "Elite" Team where Cox earned MVP honors at the Canada Cup, helping the squad to a champion-ship with a 3-0 record without allowing an earned run in 19 innings.

Last season, Weiman helped mold freshman Brooke Weekley into one of the conference's best rookie hurlers, as Weekley ranked among the league's top 10 in opposing batting average (t10th, .243), innings pitched (1st, 224.0), strikeouts (3rd, 140), strikeouts looking (t5th, 34), wins (t7th, 14), appearances (1st, 42), and starts (1st, 31).

Prior to returning to Southern California, Weiman spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Wisconsin of the Big Ten Conference, where she was in charge of coaching the Badgers' pitching staff and also working with the catchers. She helped guide the Badgers to three straight Big Ten Tournaments and appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2002.

Weiman coached the school's first-ever first-team All-Big Ten pitcher in Andrea Kirchberg, who owns nearly every pitching record at Wisconsin.

In 2002, Weiman, Head Coach Karen Gallagher and Assistant Coach Ali Viola were named the Speedline/NFCA Division I Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year, sharing the honor with the Notre Dame coaching staff.

As a player, Weiman was a member of the 1990 and 1992 UCLA national championship-winning squads while earning All-Pacific-10 Conference honors twice in her career and first-team All-America honors as a senior in 1994.

A Honda Broderick Award nominee in 1994, Weiman finished her Bruin career with a 59-13 overall record, a 0.79 ERA, 746 career strikeouts and 16 no-hitters. Weiman's 359 strikeouts in 1994 still stand as a single-season record.

Weiman also holds the NCAA career record for strikeout ratio at 10.4 strikeouts per seven innings.

She continued her playing career in the Women's Professional Softball League, playing four seasons (1997-00) after being drafted as the 10th selection of the second round of the 1996 Amateur Draft.

Weiman won the 1999 WPSL championship with the Tampa Bay Firestix and recorded the first strikeout, complete game, victory, save and shutout in team history. She was also the first-ever pitcher to throw a perfect game in WPSL history, shutting down the Carolina Diamonds on Aug. 1, 1998.

Weiman was a two-time WPSL All-Star selection in 1998 and 1999, and ranks first in league history in games started (83), complete games (70), innings (640.3) and appearances (113). She ranks second in strikeouts (446) and saves (6) while ranking third in wins (46) and shutouts (10).

At Cal State Fullerton, Weiman is reunited with her catcher on the 1993 ASA Women's Open National Championship in Gromacki, when the duo helped lead the Redding Rebels to the national title.

Weiman graduated from UCLA with a bachelors degree in sociology in 1994. She has a 7-year-old son, Tyler, and resides in Fullerton.





»A LOOK BACK...

The Cal State Fullerton softball team had a season to forget in 2004. Entering the season with a roster depleted by the departure of seven seniors - including three All-America selections - and featuring nine newcomers, the Titans struggled to an 18-34 overall record (7-14 in the Big West Conference for sixth-place).

It was the first losing season in the 25-year history of the program and the fewest wins in a single season since Fullerton went 29-26 in 1997.

»FIRST SOME BAD NEWS

Cal State Fullerton was saddled with only its second losing conference season in the history of the program, joining the 1997 squad which went 13-19 and finished seventh. The

14 conference losses were the most since the Titans lost 16 in 1998 and were more than the last four years combined (10).

»POSTSEASON STREAK SNAPPED

The 2004 NCAA Championships went off without a hitch and also without Cal State Fullerton. The Titans failed to reach the postseason for the first time since 1998 and for only the third time in the history of the program.

»CLEAR OFF THE MANTLE

Despite the struggles on the field, Cal State Fullerton players did garner some individual recognition at season's end.

Departed senior outfielder Julie Watson completed one of the most dramatic offensive turnarounds in the history of the program to earn her first career All-America honor (2nd Team) and the 36th such selection for the program.

Watson experienced a break-out senior season, finishing second in the Big West Conference in batting with a career-best .426 average and a leagueleading 78 hits. She also ranked second in stolen bases with 18 and drove in 16 runs on the year from the leadoff spot.

She finished eighth in the league in total bases (87), ninth in slugging (.475), sixth in on base percentage (.441), and seventh in runs scored (31).

Outfielder Lindsey Bashor was named to the All-Big West Second Team after hitting .277 with nine home runs and 27 RBI. She led the team in four different offensive categories including walks (27) and slugging percentage (.500).

Rookie second baseman Jenna Wheeler was named to the honorable mention team after hitting .227 on the season with three home runs and 19 RBI. In conference play, Wheeler hit .305 while starting all 21 games with three home runs and 14 RBI.

»SHOULDERING THE LOAD

Cal State Fullerton freshman hurler Brooke Weekley



quickly became the workhorse of the Titans' young pitching staff during her rookie year, tossing 224 innings to lead the conference in that category.

Weekley became the first Titan pitcher to throw 200 innings in a season since Jana Oetgen tossed 212 innings as a senior in 1999 and was the second consecutive freshman to lead the league in innings, joining Utah State's Leslie Higley (198.0) in 2003.

In addition, Weekley became only the third freshman since 1990 to lead the conference in innings pitched after Hawaii's Brooke Wilkins 275.2 innings in 1994.

»GROMACKI NOTCHES WIN NO. 200

Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Michelle Gromacki

earned her 200th career coaching victory on Apr. 10 in the Titans' 4-0 shutout of Cal State Northridge to win the three-game series.

Gromacki, the quickest coach in school history in any sport to 100 career wins, accomplished the feat in her 281st career game. By comparison, former Fullerton Hall of Fame Head Coach Judi Garman, who finished with 913 career Division I coaching wins, won her 200th game in her 264th contest with the Titans in with the Titans in 1984 -- also reaching the mark with a 3-1 win over Cal State Northridge.

»ROOKIE THROWING LIKE A VETERAN

A young pitching staff needed someone to step up and take control. Enter Titans' freshman Brooke Weekley.

The talented rookie, who went 14-18 overall during her freshman season in the circle, ranked among the top 10 in six different pitching categories, including leading the league in innings (see above note), appearances (42), and games started (31).

She ranked third in the league in strikeouts (140) and was one of only eight pitchers in the league to top the century mark in strikeouts. Weekley also placed in a tie for fifth in batters struck out looking (34) and was tied for seventh in the conference in victories.

»THE HEAD THAT WEARS THE CROWN

Brooke Weekley led the Titans in all three "triple crown" pitching categories (ERA, Wins, Strikeouts), becoming the third straight Titan pitcher to accomplish the feat.

In 2003, Jodie Cox led the Titans in the circle en route to Big West Co-Pitcher of the Year honors. Gina Oaks did it in 2002, posting a 0.73 ERA, 22 wins and 189 strikeouts.

Weekley became the 14th different Cal State Fullerton pitcher to accomplish the feat as it was the 17th time a single pitcher has led the team in the "triple crown" categories since 1980.

»HERE'S SOMETHING NEW

Aside from the aforementioned record woes discussed earlier, there were some other significant developments as the 2004 season progressed.

The Titans were swept by Utah State for the first time since the Aggies joined the Big West) and Cal Poly for the first time since dropping all four meetings in 1997.

The Titans saw their 19-game winning streak over UC Santa Barbara snapped with a pair of losses to close out the year. It was the first time the Gauchos had posted a win over Fullerton since 1998, but still left the Titans in control of the series, 85-6.





The Big West Conference is entering its 21st season of sponsoring the sport of softball and its 36th year of operation overall.

The conference is home to the 1986 NCAA National Champion and seven-time league champ Cal State Fullerton and is made up of eight softball-playing league members: the Titans, Cal Poly, Cal State Northridge, Long Beach State, UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara, the University of the Pacific, and Utah State.

The Aggies will depart the league following the 2005 season to join the Western Athletic Conference. The Big West will welcome 2003 Division II National Champion UC Davis beginning with the 2007-08 academic year.

The conference began sponsoring softball in 1985 as the sixth women's sport. UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii, UNLV, Pacific, and associate member Cal Poly Pomona competed as charter members.

In 1986, Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, and San Diego State were added to the softball-playing roster as the Titans won the league title in their first season and advanced to the Women's College World Series, eventually defeating Texas A&M to bring home the national champiopnship.

Fresno State and San Jose State entered the league in 1987, bringing the conference to a total of 10 teams and, in 1990, a record five schools advanced to NCAA regional competi-

That season, Cal Poly Pomona and San Diego State left the conference in favor of New Mexico State and Utah State.

Two seasons later in 1992, a record six Big West schools advanced to the postseason, including Long Beach State and Fresno State, which advanced to the Women's College World Series. The Bulldogs advanced to the semifinals before losing to eventual national champion Arizona.

The current league alignment was achieved following the 2002 season when associate member Sacramento State left the conference.

Cal State Fullerton is the most-recent conference member to reach the Women's College World Series, finishing fifth in 1995.

The Big West Conference has placed a team in the NCAA Tournament every season since 1985 and a team in the Women's College World Series in 11 of the previous 20 seasons.

In 20 years of competition, 85 players from Big West institutions have been named All-Americans wih 28 more named to the All-Women's College World Series team.





» PAM EDDE (1981)

Edde was masterful for the Titans from the circle, posting a 25-8 record and a 0.61 ERA. She also hit .284 that season with 34 runs scored, six doubles, 15 RBI and 32 walks.

» SUE LEWIS (1981, 1982 & 1984)

One of two three-time All-American Titans, Lewis hit .354 with 25 home runs and 138 RBI in her career. Lewis still holds school career records for hits (257), doubles (53), and triples (20).

» JANET LLOYD [1981]

Another "Titan"-ic slugger for Fullerton, Lloyd hit .381 with 15 home runs and 41 RBI in her All-American season. Her home run mark stands third on the single-season list.

» KATHY VAN WYK [1982]

After transferring from Texas Women's University, Van Wyk posted a 35-1 record with a 0.18 ERA and 270 strikeouts. She was named the National Player of the Year, winning Fullerton's first-ever Honda Broderick Award.

» ELISE KING (1983)

King hit .293 with 35 runs and 16 RBI while stealing 12 bases for the Titans in her All-American vear.

» SUSAN LEFEBVRE (1983 & 1986)

LeFebvre finished her career with a 100-21 record in the circle and a 0.29 ERA to go with 740 strikeouts. In 1986, she became the second Titan to be named Player of the Year and helped Fullerton to the National Championship.

» DEBBIE MYGIND (1985)

Posted a 28-4 record with a 0.27 ERA and 183 strikeouts. She is second in career ERA and third in career winning percentage.

» JOANN FERRIERI (1985)

Hit .328 with 27 runs and 23 RBI, leading the team in hitting.

» TERRI OBERG (1985)

The third Titan All-American in 1985, Oberg hit .298 with 7 home runs and 35 RBI - both team high's. Her eight triples that season set a school record.

» CHENITA ROGERS (1986 &1987)

A career .365 hitter who led the team in hitting in both of her All-American seasons. Hit .386 in 1986 to help the Titans to the national title.

» CONNIE CLARK [1987]

The current Texas head coach went 33-5 with a 0.47 ERA and 261 strikeouts en route to Co-Big West Player of the Year and Fullerton's third Broderick Award.

» VALERIE DOUGLAS (1988)

Led the team with a .351 average with 19 runs and 28 RBI. Her 72 hits rank tied for ninth on the single-season charts.

» MISSY COOMBES (1989)

Hit .359 with 14 doubles and 29 RBI. Went on to earn three All-Big West and two All-West Region honors.

» CAREY HESS (1989)

Hit .409 with 10 doubles and 52 runs, which stood as a school record until 2001.

» JOY TINER (1990)

Hit .311 with 30 runs and 17 RBI. Was a twotime All-Big West selection.

» ANN VAN DORTRECHT (1990)

Was 29-12 with a 0.43 ERA while pitching a school season record of 310.2 innings. Was named Big West Pitcher of the Year in 1990.

» TIFFANY BOYD (1991 & 1992)

Combined 63-15 in her two All-America seasons with 543 strikeouts. A three-time Big West Pitcher of the Year.

» PAULA "MICH" DEBREE (1991)

Hit .313 with nine doubles, 33 runs and 19 RBI. A two-time All-Big West honoree.

» DENISE DEWALT (1992 & 1993)

DeWalt hit .396 for her career, a record which stood until 2003, to go with 70 runs, 29 doubles and 49 RBI.

» CHRIS ZBORIL (1995)

Led the team with a .373 average, eight home runs and 25 RBI.

» STEPHENIE LITTLE (1999)

Led the team with a .372 average, 57 RBI, and set the single-season record with 23 home

» MONICA LUCATERO (2000)

Hit .343 with six home runs and 39 RBI while walking a team-high 20 times. Named top the All-Big West second team.

» JENNY TOPPING (2001, 2002 & 2003)

The Titans' second three-time All-American (all first-team honors), Topping holds four career records and seven single-season marks.

» YASMIN MOSSADEGHI (2002)

Named to the third team after hitting .367 with 13 home runs and 45 RBI. Was also an All-Big West and All-West Region first team selection while being invited to U.S. National Team Camp.

» GINA OAKS (2002 & 2003)

Twice earned All-America honors as a utility player (Oaks pitched, played second and third base, and the outfield), hitting .295 for her career and 74-23 with a 1.37 ERA in the circle.


» JODIE COX (2003)

An All-American pitcher in 2003, Cox was 21-7 in the circle with a 1.06 ERA and 224 strikeouts. She went undefeated in conference play in her final two seasons (21-0).

» JULIE WATSON (2004)

Completing one of the biggest offensive turnarounds in Titan softball history, Watson was named to the second team after hitting .426 and amassing 78 hits - both of which rank among the school's top 10 for a single season.

»TITANS IN THE PROS

In the 25-year history of Cal State Fullerton softball, eight former Titans have gone on to greener pastures and played professionally in the United States in the Women's Professional Softball League (later renamed National Pro Fastpitch in 2003).

Last season, the Titans were represented professionally by former All-Americans Gina Oaks and Jodie Cox. Oaks was a member of the championship-winning New York/New Jersey Juggernaut while Cox was the workhorse in the circle for the California Sunbirds.

Three more Titans were signed to contracts, but did not compete in the pro league: Brenda Iglesias (1998-01) was selected in the December, 2000, draft before the league suspended play in order to explore the possibilities for expansion. Yasmin Mossadeghi (1999-02) and Monica Lucatero (1999-02) signed free agent contracts to play for the Colorado Altitude in 2003, but the team suspended operations and did not compete.

The 2005 season will see three Titans on the diamonds in the pro league as Cox moves back East to compete for the Juggernaut, Oaks joins the expansion Chicago Bandits, and Julie Watson is on the roster of the Texas Thunder.

Titan Athletics...A Proud History

From modest beginnings and never with abundant resources, the Cal State Fullerton Titans have achieved successes that are the envy of many older and larger institutions across the country.

"Titan Pride" has been the rallying cry for 12 national team championships in seven different sports, hundreds of individual All-Americans, dozens of eventual professional athletes, numerous national coach of the year award winners, Olympic basketball players, a Miss America candidate and the subject matter of a Walt Disney film.

The tenor was set by the first intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only his second season, Coach Alex Omalev advanced the Titans five rounds into the NAIA playoffs in 1961-62. Sixteen seasons later, the nation watched another "Cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association postseason tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the NCAA Western Regional.

The basketball tradition began even stronger on the women's side. Recent Naismith and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Billie Moore coached the Titans to the national championship in 1970 and star forward Nancy Dunkle was one of her players on the women's 1976 silver-medal winning Olympic team. The most recent Titan All-American was center Genia Miller-Rycraw in 1991.

The Titans earned gold in 1984 when point guard Leon Wood directed the men's Olympic team to victory in Los Angeles. The first-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers went on to a 6-year National Basketball Association career and is now a veteran NBA referee, only the second former NBA player to make that career switch.

Future NBA performers Richard Morton, Henry Turner, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen (a member of the 2003 NBA champion Spurs) were some of the stars of the 1980s and 1990s, when the Titans made NIT appearances on both the men's and women's sides. Ceballos gained notoriety for winning the NBA Slam-Dunk contest one year while the women can point with pride to Autumn Hollyfield, the nation's top 3-point field goal shooter in 1993-94, and Koko Lahanas, the nation's scoring leader in 1994-95. Rycraw still holds NCAA records and came back from a career in Japan to earn a spot with the Los Angeles Sparks before returning to Fullerton as an assistant coach.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton considerable fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division NCAA titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had subsequent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation. Coach Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation 12 times and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while Tami Elliott (1984-86) won 10 All-American awards before becoming Miss Virginia and competing in the Miss America pageant.

Baseball exploded onto the national scene behind former Coach Augie Garrido by breaking the USC monopoly in the NCAA western regionals in Fullerton's first Div. I season in 1975. The Titans have gone on to win four national championships and establish a remarkable winning tradition over four decades. The Titans captured their first NCAA title in 1979 behind Tim Wallach, who would go on to play 17 major league seasons. They won again in 1984 behind College World Series MVP John Fishel, in 1995 behind national player of the year Mark Kotsay and again in 2004 behind All-American pitcher Jason Windsor, who won two games and saved a third in Omaha to cap a two-year, 8-0 post-season record. Coach George Horton has won national coach of the year honors in each of the past two seasons.

Women also have sparkled on Fullerton diamonds. Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and won more games (913) than any previous coach The Titans have made eight trips to the College World Series and 22 regional appearances. They brought home an NCAA Championship in 1986 and boast three national players of the year in pitchers Kathy Van Wyk, Susan LeFebvre and Connie Clark.

The now-defunct football program made great strides in Division I-A after its humble Div. II beginnings in 1970. Coach Gene Murphy guided the Titans to two conference championships and four runner-up finishes between 1983 and 1989. Titan products included Super Bowl rookies Bobby Kemp (Cincinnati in 1982) and Mark Collins (New York Giants in 1987). Titans have had remarkable success in the Canadian Football League. Allen Pitts was the CFL's all-time leading receiver and Damon Allen, who was still active this season, is the all-time leading passer. Mike Pringle is the No. 2 all-time rusher and could become No. 1 if he stays healthy.

HISTORY & TRADITION

With the loss of football, Head Coach Al Mistri's soccer program filled the void in Titan Stadium. A women's squad was launched in 1993 and it coincided with a memorable men's season that saw the Titans climb as high as No. 3 in the national rankings. They were led by All-American forward Eddie Soto and competed at the NCAA Final Four, placing third. There have been three subsequent trips to the playoffs and a No. 2 national ranking in 1996. On the international level, former Titan Brian Dunseth captained the U.S. Olympic team in the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1974) and individual standouts such as golfer Martha Wilkerson, runner Mark Covert and wrestler Laszlo Molnar, who finished second in the nation in 1994 at 167 pounds. Heather Killeen became the Titans' first Div. I cross country All-American in 1994, won three events at the 1995 Big West Conference track championships and was one of 10 finalists for 1995 NCAA Woman of the Year Award. Brandon Campbell was the Big West track and field male athlete of the year in 2001 after starring in the high jump, long jump and quarter mile. He also was a starter on the basketball team.

Several current and recent Titans have garnered international attention including appearances in the 2004 Olympics in Athens. Catcher Jenny Topping played for the gold medal-winning U.S. Softball team while outfielder Lindsey Bashor was on the Greek team. Competing for Mexico were pole vaulter Giovanni Lanaro and soccer player Marlene Sandoval.

What about the nickname?

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that arise when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit to an area. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, there are some recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explained Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname "Titans." "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done but then along came the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions of the caricature have been made to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a female Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was appropriate on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange.





NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills

Cal State Fullerton is a participating institution in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program, which is aimed at enhancing the



quality of the studentathlete experience within the university setting. Throughout their career, Cal State Fullerton studentathletes are provided with resources that will assist their development in five primary areas: academics,

athletics, personal development, career development and community service.

The Athletic Academic Services department, tabbed more simply as Titan Scholars, provides effective support services to help student-athletes reach their academic goals. The academic services staff takes a proactive role by coordinating study plans, study skills workshops, tutoring sessions, study halls, faculty and peer mentoring and campus services referrals. Staff members also monitor progress toward graduation, assist student-athletes in selecting and registering for classes and teach a Life Skills 100 class.

Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department has an "early warning" system in place, which utilizes periodic grade checks and clear communication with faculty members when studentathletes may require additional academic support.

The department also provides a re-entry program for former student-athletes who return to Cal State Fullerton to complete their degree.

ATHLETIC TRAINING

The athletic training program at Cal State Fullerton plays a major role in maintaining the health of Titan student-athletes. Team physicians, three full-time certified athletic trainers, two certified graduate assistants and more than 20 student assistants comprise a program that is generally regarded as one of the very best in the country.

Titan athletic training personnel specialize in preventive medicine, recognition of injuries and rehabilitation. Student athletic trainers who are admitted into the highly selective ATEP (Athletic Training Educational Program), which is administered through the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotion, must meet demanding requirements. In addition to taking 100 units of kinesiology and athletic training courses, they must serve five semesters and 1,500 clinical supervised hours. Before becoming certified, candidates must pass the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification examination. Since 1997, nearly 80 percent of Cal State Fullerton graduates have passed on their first attempt, compared to the national rate of about 30 percent. Since the inception of the program, dozens of alumni have moved into coveted positions across the country (see below).



Julie Max, MeD, ATC Head Athletic Trainer

Julie Max, Cal State Fullerton's Head Athletic Trainer, has been the driving force behind the development of an athletic training program that has received national acclaim. Max is in her 25th year at her alma mater since replacing her mentor, the late Jerry Lloyd. Recently, Max completed a second two-year term as president of the 25,000-member National Association of Athletic Trainers (NATA). Max, the first female president in the organization's history, previously served a sixyear stint on the organization's board of directors and a one-year term as its vice president. In 1997, Max was honored with the NATA Service Award, which recognizes out-standing service to the athletic training profession at the state and district level.



ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Titan Gymnasium

Titan Gym continues to undergo major renovations. In the past few years, chairback seats have replaced most of the bleachers, portable basket supports have replaced the fold down backboards, new paint and banners have been applied to the walls and the playing surface has been redone. Recently completed was an expansion that features numerous classrooms, physical testing laboratories, a new upstairs practice facility, as well as additional seating. A new "drop down" scoreboard over center court was installed in the spring of 2003. The facility also features practice and match rooms for the wrestling, gymnastics and fencing programs.

Goodwin Field

Goodwin Field has played host to four NCAA Regionals and three Super Regionals in the past five years. A \$3 million expansion project, spearheaded by a \$1 million gift from Jerry and Merilyn Goodwin, has transformed the field into one of the premier collegiate facilities on the West Coast. The field now features the Wilson Clubhouse – which includes lockerrooms, a reception area and offices for the coaches – and the Doubek VIP Room.

Titan Softball Complex

Having received a complete makeover since the 2000 season, the Titan Softball Complex boasts one of the top facilities in the nation. Utilizing the adjacent Wilson Clubhouse and Doubek VIP Room, the two-diamond complex can now adequately serve as a host site for postseason competition (it was the site of an eight-team NCAA Regional in 2003) in addition to the annual Kia Klassic, the top regular-season tournament in the nation.

Titan Stadium

Titan Stadium is considered among the finest soccer facilities in the nation and regularly hosts professional and international soccer matches in addition to the Titan men's and women's programs. The facility, completed in 1992, was home to the Titan football program for one year before the sport was dropped after the 1992 season. The stadium is also a hot-spot for the entertainment industry and is regularly featured in television commercials and programs. UCLA also utilized the facility in 2003 for its fall football camp.














STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Cal State Fullerton student-athletes have year-round access to the services offered by the Strength and Conditioning Program, under the direction of **Andy Williams**. Aimed at developing speed, power, strength and endurance in Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes, the program plays a key role in the success of Titan teams.

Individual workouts are designed, implemented and regularly adjusted by Williams to help each student-athlete develop the stamina needed to maintain the rigorous year-round workouts associated with Division I sports.

Located inside Titan Stadium is a 6,000 square-foot weight room facility featuring eight platforms, eight squat racks, plyometric devices and nearly 8,000 pounds in free weights. The facility will service more than 300 student-athletes over the course of the year.

Andy Williams was named Cal State Fullerton's second full-time strength and conditioning coach on Oct. 11, 2004. Williams came to Cal State Fullerton after spending the previous 20 months as the director of human performance at Somerset Sports and Rehabilitation in New Jersey.

Armed with a wide range of experience, Williams spent two years as the head strength and conditioning coach at Tennessee State, working with football and women's basketball, and a year each at Middle Tennessee State (assistant strength and conditioning coach) and the University of Connecticut (graduate assistant).

In 1999, Williams was the head strength and conditioning coach for the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe during their World Bowl Championship season and also served as the assistant special teams coach. He also served a two-year internship with the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs from 1996-98 and was an intern with Major League Baseball's Kansas City Royals during spring training in 1997.

Williams earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from Missouri Western State College in 1997, where he also played three seasons at outside linebacker, and completed his coursework for a master's degree in education at Middle Tennessee State in 2002.

Dr. Milton Gordon University President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 9, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of the Arts and Sciences for Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as mathematician

at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences. He is the vice chairman of the NCAA Presidents Commission and has been appointed to the committee to name a successor to outgoing NCAA President Cedric Dempsey. He also is the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of

Brian Quinn Athletics Director

Brian Quinn assumed the post of Director of Athletics at Cal State Fullerton on January 14, 2002

Under Quinn's leadership, the Titans are successfully weathering a state and systemwide fiscal crisis with minimal impact on student-athletes. Academic performances have improved dramatically and Titan Gym has undergone a dramatic makeover. In each of the last two years, the Titans have outperformed the rest of the Big West Conference in the NACDA Cup Standings, capped by consecutive appearances by the baseball team at the College World Series, where the Titans placed third for the fourth time in 2003 and then won their fourth national title in 2004.

Quinn, 63, was the athletic director at Loyola Marymount University from 1985 through 1998. He then dedicated his time towards completing the Burns Recreation Center and Aquatics Center at LMU. He also directed the athletic fundraising efforts as executive director of athletic development.

During his years as director of athletics at LMU the Lions won nine

Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA men's basketball tournament three times and once to the NIT. The basketball team advanced to the Final Eight and led the nation in scoring. The baseball team advanced to the College World Series where it defeated the No. 1 seed, LSU. Women's volleyball won numerous conference championships as well and the women's crew team won the national championship.

Quinn graduated from Loyola (1963) with a degree in business administration and received his masters degree from Long Beach State. He was a long-time coach and athletic administrator at the high school level in the Irvine Unified School District and taught volleyball classes for Irvine Valley College for six years.

He was the chair of the athletic directors for many years in the West Coast Conference and was the chair of the NCAA men's volleyball committee, as well as serving on the board of directors for USA volleyball.

Quinn was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame both at his high school (Serra High School) and university (LMU). He was the captain of the basketball team and MVP and three-year starter on the baseball team. The basketball team was the WCC champion and defeated USC in the NCAA tournament. Quinn also was a member of the Balboa Bay Club national champion volleyball team. He continues to be an avid beach volleyball player and is definitely a "beach" guy.

Quinn and his wife of 41 years, Collette, live in Manhattan Beach. They have four adult children: Andrew, a teacher in Atlanta; Janet, who lives in Rye, NY; Suzanne, a teacher in Inglewood; and Maureen, who recently married. The Quinn's have five grandsons, Brendan, Ryan, Owen Kiernan, Dylan and Colin Brian. Quinn is a member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.



Dr. Allison Rich Senior Woman Administrator

Dr. Allison Rich began her duties as Senior Associate Athletics Director and Senior Woman Administrator at Cal State Fullerton on Jan. 3, 2005.

Dr. Rich most recently was associate director of athletics at University of the Pacific in Stockton, California, where she was in charge of virtually all internal affairs.

The Fullerton position had been vacant since Dr. June Kearney retired from an interim assignment on July 23. Dr. Maryalyce Jeremiah resigned the position on Apr. 29, 2003, to return as head women's basketball coach.

Dr. Rich had been at Pacific since April of 1998. She previously was a membership services representative for the

NCAA for two years. She obtained her bachelors degree from Princeton in 1991. She earned a law degree from Chicago-Kent College of Law in 1995 and her doctorate in educational administration from Pacific in 2002.

Cal State Fullerton is nestled in sun-drenched Orange County, with its mountains, amusement parks, professional sports, cultural showcases and seashores among the top attractions. Students can reach ski slopes in 45 minutes and the beach in less than a half hour. Los Angeles, with its never-ending cultural and entertainment opportunities, lies just 30 miles northwest of the campus and San Diego is 100 miles to the south. The city of Fullerton itself, which has a fascinating history dating back to the late 19th century, boasts a beautiful historic downtown area that features dozens of restaurants, museums and shops.

The extensive development of the 42 miles of beaches in Orange County and attractions such as Disneyland, Knott's Berry Farm, the Laguna Festival of Arts and Pageant of the Masters, the Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim, Angel Stadium and the Orange County Performing Arts Center continue to make tourism an increasingly important activity. So does the Mediterranean-type climate, with rainfall averaging 14 inches per year, and generally mild days (either freezing or 100-degree temperatures uncommon) with frequent morning fog during the summer.
