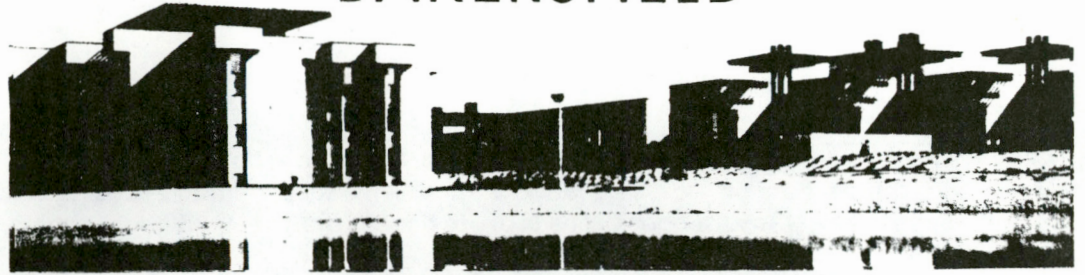

WEDNESDAY LECTURE SERIES - Students, staff, and faculty are encouraged to take advantage of the Wednesday noon Lecture Series this quarter. Students may still take the series for one hour credit on a pass/fail basis by registering for General Education 150; such registration involves individuals in a discussion group that immediately follows each lecture. This week Dr. Roger Simmons will present an anthropological lecture on "Some Problems of Modernization." Dr. Simmons has just returned from two years of field work in Bolivia. Time is Wednesday, January 13 at 12:10 p.m. in Lecture Hall 100. Bring your lunch and join the crowd.

STUDENT TEACHING APPLICATIONS - Students are reminded that the deadline for filing applications for SPRING QUARTER student teaching is Tuesday, January 12. Applications may be obtained in the Education Division office, and completed forms must be filed there prior to the deadline.

The student must have successfully completed a minimum of 15 quarter units at C.S.B. prior to student teaching. Education course prerequisites for elementary student teaching are Educ. 301, 310, 311, and 403; for secondary student teaching Educ. 301, 351, and 452.

Dr. Dale Moody, Division of Education, spent several days during the vacation looking at the pattern of teacher education in Mexico by visiting the Ministry of Education and the National Normal Institute in Mexico City. Visits were also made to preparatory and technical schools in Mexico City, Puebla, Taxco, and Acapulco.

Dean John Coash attended an Invitational Workshop on Curriculum Development in Ecology and Related Environmental Science, sponsored by the Chancellor's Office and held in Newport Beach on December 10-11. Dean Coash attended and served as workshop chairman for the group discussing curricular needs in general education.

Mr. Tibor Machan will participate in a Political Philosophy Conference to be held at the University of Hawaii from January 11 through January 14. SKI CLUB

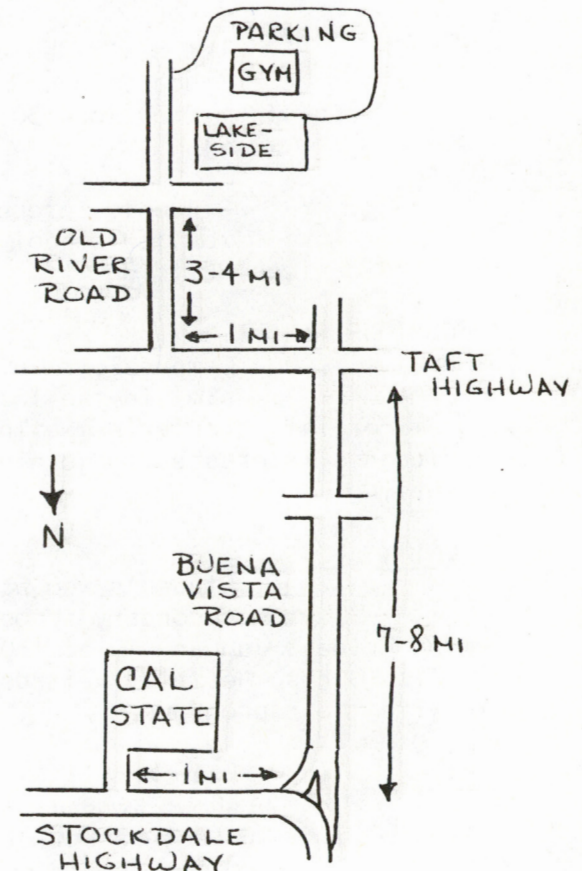
