The School of Education and Human Development (SOEHD) has established as its primary mission the maintenance of quality educational programs designed to prepare teachers and other educational leaders for service in public and private schools and other educational institutions.

Emphasis is directed toward preparing highly competent educators and human development specialists, providing professional support and leadership to the area community,

promoting applied research, and providing experiences and opportunities that will enable employed professionals to remain current in their fields.

The 1993-94 academic year will find students attending classes, studying, and working in a state-of-the-art Education Building. The five-story facility, scheduled for occupancy in Fall 1993, will offer clinical areas and computer and microteaching laboratories. One of the special features is a Learning Development area that is organized for observation and teaching young children, from infants through age six.

SOEHD directs its full attention to the enhancement of human potential so that those who work in the field of education and human development function more effectively and productively in an ever-changing and increasingly diverse society.

Education majors complete two student teaching experiences, and one of them must be in a school with high levels of student diversity and "at risk" learners. CSU Fresno graduates from the School of Education and Human Development are prepared with the knowledge, skills, and values to work effectively with students of diverse backgrounds.
