

Mercy Bowl

\$150,000 Realized On Game

It will be five more days before official announcement is made on net proceeds of the Mercy Bowl. It could be as many months before Fresno State stops celebrating its surprising 36-6 upset of Bowling Green State in the worthy classic.

Dr. Ferron Losee of Los Angeles State College, Mercy Bowl game manager, will reveal the amount realized for the Cal Poly Memorial Fund next Wednesday at a Sheraton-West luncheon.

It's believed the figure will fall short of the \$200,000 goal set to aid survivors of last year's terrible plane crash which killed 17 Cal Poly football players and injured 40 others. Cal Poly coach Roy Hughes, who escaped death in the air fall after takeoff at Toledo, Ohio, following a game with Bowling Green, said:

"I believe we should hit around \$150,000 for the Fund."

MAJOR SURPRISE

A crowd of 33,145 attended yesterday's Coliseum game, but at least twice as many tickets, priced at \$3, were sold.

Those who came out for the Thanksgiving morning contest were treated to one of the year's major surprises in the Figueroa bowl.

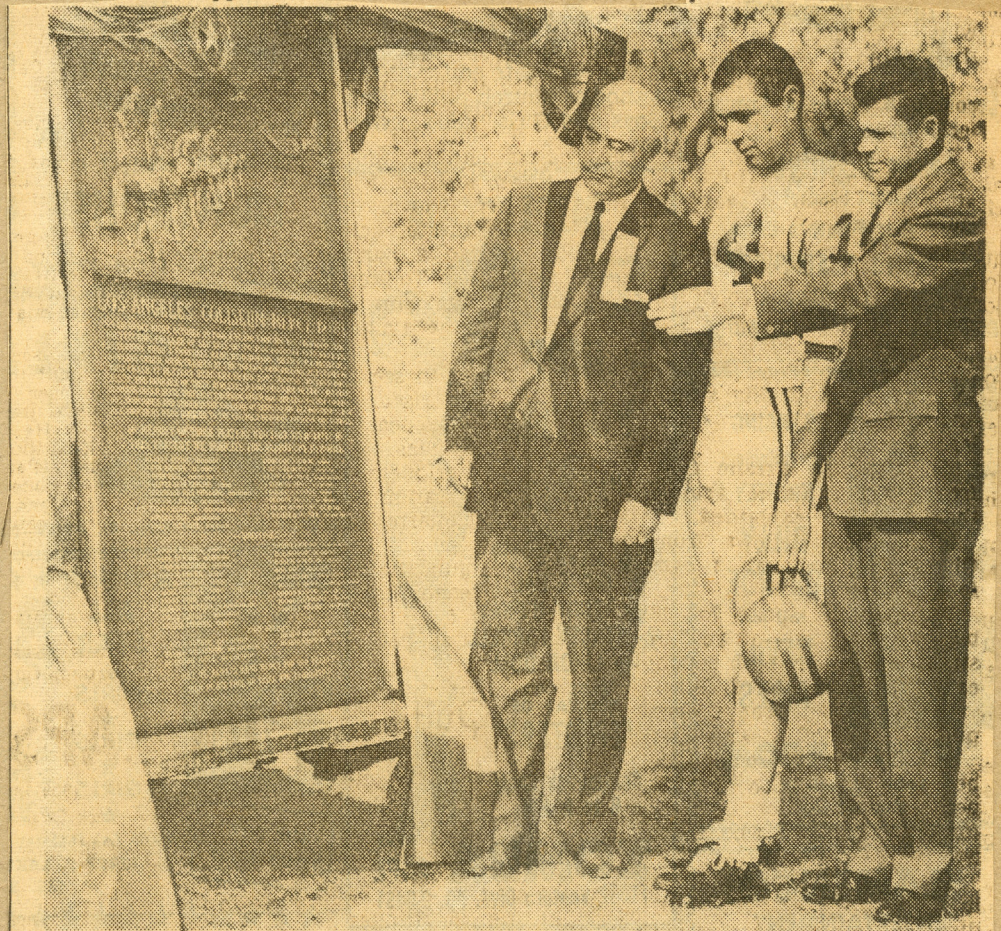

I've ever taken as a coach," admitted Perry, who has been at Bowling Green for seven seasons.

Perry only had lost one previous game in his career by as much as two touchdowns. Miami (Ohio) licked B.G. 28-14 in 1957.

Fresno piled up almost as many points as the Falcons yielded in nine previous games (42) during their Mid-American Conference championship run. High score against them had been 11 points, compiled by Dayton.

"They didn't look fourth in the nation on defense today did they?" laughed the happy Fresno kids in the dressing room. "Where do they get off putting Bowling Green in the major college class and us in the small colleges?" inquired another Fresno player.

Fresno was ranked third and fifth in the small college rankings of the wire services, behind Pittsburgh, Kan., first in both.

"I'm sure we deserve to be number one," said Coleman, who added:

"But don't take us out of the small college ranks just because we beat Bowling Green."

The Fresno rooters struck up a chant in the third period: "The Rose Bowl."

Winners of 10 straight, the Bulldogs might not be a bad western representative at that.

CARTER, BARRETT BEST

Two Fresno players were voted best back and lineman, in the game. They were quarterback Beau Carter and end Jan Barrett.

Carter passed for two touchdowns and scored two others. Barrett caught six passes, and perhaps a pro contract. Two of his receptions were for scores and gained 161 yards. Carter's tosses were good for 248 yards as he hit 14 of 28.

Jon Anabo, Fresno's other brilliant thrower, completed 8 of 13 for 120 yards. The Bulldogs outgained the Falcons 468 yards to 319 with 368 of them coming in the air.

B.G. led 6-3 at one stage, but a dropped pass in the end zone on the last play of the first half took all the starch out of the visitors, who trailed 10-6 at intermission.

Perry offered no excuses, although he had one built-in for him. His squad has been in a social whirl ever since its arrival Sunday night. He said:

"We just got the heck kicked out of us." Coleman said: "We played our best game by far. I know Bowling Green did not play as well as it can."

Both squads toured Disneyland today, with the Fresno kids maintaining an alert. To make sure none of the downcast Ohioans attempt a swan dive off the Matterhorn.
