How to get your tax rebate

Seniors need to be aware that those who would not normally have to file a tax return need to fill out only a couple of lines on their tax return for 2007 to get their rebate checks under the economic stimulus package signed into law a few weeks ago.

Those receiving Social Security and/or veterans' benefits need to file form 1040 or 1040A to note only their names, addresses, Social Security numbers and the amount of that income on line 20a of Form 1040 and 1040A. Low-income filers may be able to use Form 1040EZ to simply note that they earned income of at least \$3,000.

Low-income and moderate-income taxpayers can get help from VITA, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance, at (800) 906-9887. Filers who are 60 or older can call AARP Tax-Aid program at (888) 227-7669.

According to California law, all participants will


be eligible to receive a discount on their automobile insurance. It will also be helpful for drivers over 70 who are preparing to take the written test for license renewal

Questions about flood insurance

I am aware of one recent incident where the lender for a Leisure Village resident added flood insurance premiums to the property owner's monthly mortgage payment. The owner was given no notice and no opportunity to obtain the coverage for herself.

The property owner was not aware of any flood zone affecting the Village. I suggested that she contact the Association office. She was told to contact the city.

After a search of Federal **Emergency Management** Agency flood zone maps, the city confirmed that, in fact, Leisure Village is not in a flood zone and the additional insurance coverage was not necessary - a \$2,700 per year premium.

The property owner contacted her lender and after considerable effort and numerous conversations, she was able to demonstrate to the lender that it had placed this coverage on her property incorrectly.

According to FEMA, Leisure Village is not currently in a flood zone. Flood insurance is not required at this time.

If you or anyone you know in our Village receives a similar notice or increase in monthly payment for flood insurance, contact the city of Camarillo. They are most helpful. After obtaining the FEMA flood maps from the city, contact the lender to have this additional insurance and charges reversed.



Stay inside during an earthquake

Two of three fatalities of the Whittier Earthquake of 1987 occurred when the victims tried to escape shaking.

A college coed tried to flee from a sturdy parking garage and was killed when a panel fell from an outside wall. A young man was killed when he leaped in panic from a secondstory window.

Do not attempt to leave a shaking building until the shaking has stopped.

Buildings are unlikely to collapse, even during a major temblor. Seek a doorway or get under a sturdy table.

If you remain calm while making quick but intelligent decisions, you are far more likely to escape serious injury or death.


Here we are already into March, flowers are blooming, the wind is blowing and spring is just around the corner. So, once again I remind you to remember better breathing techniques that will help you get things done a

How Planned Giving program helps Village

Here's everything you wanted to know about Planned Giving but were afraid to ask.

Question: Leisure Village has existed for many years without Planned Giving. Why is it needed now?

Answer: Good question. Perhaps the function should have been created years ago to encourage donations to the Village from a will or an estate bequest. Perhaps the Board recognized the need after a bequest was received and there wasn't a formal mechanism to deal with it.

Question: What is the mechanism now?

Answer: If a donation is received with specific instructions on how the money is to be spent, Planned Giving will ensure that the wishes of the donor are carried out to the letter. If there are no restrictions to the donation, Planned Giving will work with the Board to find the most beneficial way for our community to use your contribution.

Question: How do I make the Village a beneficiary of my will or trust? Answer: It's easy. Ask for a form at the administration office. Fill it out — by all means consult your attorney — and when it is completed, return it to the Village office. The Planned Giving Committee will assist you in any way we can.

Question: If that's all Planned Giving does, why am I hearing about bus shelters?

Answer: Planned Giving has a dual function. Not only do we request estate bequests with the mandate to use the money as you direct, but we also want to fund — from undirected donations and our fund raisers — projects needed in the Village. We want to use these undirected funds and fund raiser monies to create additional beauty and function without raising the common charges.

Question: Is that why Planned Giving is selling granite blocks and creating a new walkway?

Question: Why did Planned Giving decide to create sheltered bus stops in the first place?

Answer: A poll was taken, and Planned Giving received more requests for shelters than for any other project. The residents made their wishes known, and the Board supported the idea, since there have not been extra funds to do it within the budget.

Ouestion: How was the bus shelter design chosen?

Answer: Our criteria included a structure that would not need Village maintenance, would not need painting and would be termite resistant. This led us to vendors who specialize in these structures, since local contractors do not have the structural engineering credentials to deal in metal products. The vendor chosen is located in Corona and has surpassed all of our LV architectural standards.

Question: How long until we get our first bus shelter?

Answer: We need more blocks sold. The beauty and utility of the selected structures make them more expensive — you get what you pay for — but worth it. Wait until you see them! You can check them out online if you wish. Call Lin Grant for the address.

Question: Does Planned Giving have other projects in mind?

Answer: Yes, we have a few and are looking for suggestions. We have been requested to consider creating a new social area outside the Rec Center, near the Billiards Room. It would be a party area for the whole Village to use and enjoy. We would also like to contribute drought-

resistant plants in front of the Rec Center to beautify the area. We'd need fundraisers for these projects as well.

Question: What can I do to support Planned Giving?

Answer: "Change happens when people show up." Therefore, "Show up for Planned Giving" is our slogan. Consider leaving a bequest to the Village from your estate.

Buy a granite block. Write a check outright to LVA Planned Giving. Come to our committee meetings the third Tuesday of the month at 5:30 p.m. in the Garden Room. Make suggestions and help us formulate plans. Work with your LV club to hold a fundraiser for Planned Giving. All profits come right back into the Village.

Ouestion: Is there a minimum for a donation?


Answer: Heck, no. We'll even accept rolls of dimes to get the projects completed!

bequest from your estate or from pure old-fashioned fundraising.



Are bionic teeth really possible?

conventional bridges and dentures and in many cases is the treatment of choice.

longer do dentists need to cut down healthy teeth for bridges to replace missing teeth. Cutting teeth down for bridges actually damages the teeth and reduces their long-term survival.

Patients have traditionally struggled with dentures. Today, implant options allow patients to chew effectively, thereby digesting their food effectively. There have been studies comparing patients who have dentures and those who have implant supported dentures. Those patients with conventional dentures were on more medications for digestive tract problems and were less able to digest their food. Those with implant supported dentures had better health and were on less medication.

Patients with dentures don't know that they are losing bone all the time and that the long-term outcome often is an elderly patient that cannot chew.

Any patient that has a missing tooth is a candidate for dental implants. Anyone in reasonable health who wants to replace missing teeth is a candidate. You must have enough bone in the area of the missing teeth to pro-

What is a dental im-

A dental implant is nothing more than a metal screw that is placed into the jawbone. It acts as an anchor for a false tooth or a set of false teeth.

What is the success rate of dental implants?

This depends very much on where the implants are placed and what they will be called upon to do. The best case scenario is the placement of implants in the front portion of the lower jaw. Here success can be as high as 98 to 100 percent. In other areas of the mouth,

success rates can drop significantly. According to figures that we have today, the success of implants in the front part of the upper jaw are anywhere from 90 to 95 percent. Success rates of implants in the back part of the upper and lower jaw can be in the 85 to 95 percent range.
