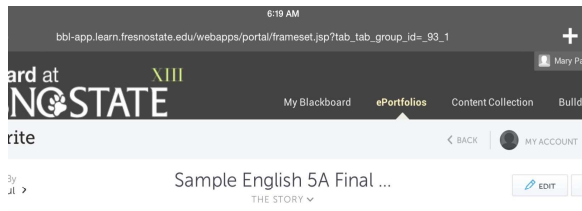

SAMPLE ePortfolio

Recording a lecture video detailing the step instructions was extremely helpful.

Students can insert entire essays or portions of essays.



Reflection becomes an important teaching tool to include in each category.

Category	Introductory Paragraph	Introductory Paragraph Revised
Sample Essay 1	On the first week of February 2010, seven senior students from Central High School East Campus cut down two trees. In result the five of the seven seniors were expelled from school and heavily fined. The students described this vandalism as a "Senior Prank". This prank led to much investigation to find out who the true culprit for such an action was. The school district stated, "The total cost for this prank was approximately \$14,000, and it's not a joking matter" (Bullock). The school had then stated that they would fully prosecute the students who vandalized the school. The parents of these students believed it was wrong of Central School District to ban them from Central High for vandalism. I believe the students who participated in the tree vandalism at Central High School should not be allowed to continue their enrollment in the same high school. They should receive punishment for the crime they committed, just like any other citizen. Sample Essay 2	This is where you would offer a reflection of what you have learned about introductory paragraphs and discuss the two examples you have placed in this portion of your Portfolio. There is no minimum or maximum word count for your reflection, rather offer what you feel is a complete portrayal of your learning process in this segment of an essay.
