With memories of the wildfires last year that threatened, but thankfully, were turned away


should prepare for the potential dangers of the 2019 fire season. Emergency supply kits should be updated (particularly water bottles, fresh batteries and necessary medications), and contain food for several days, charging devices for phones readied, and a review of how to open the garage door manually. Plus, a new aspect of fire protection has been added; it's called PSPS.

PSPS stands for Public Safety

areas deemed from Leisure Village, residents to be at high risk for wildfires in dangerous weather conditions. By this proactive plan, SCE customers will be notified as much as two days ahead of a shutoff that they may be "potentially affected" by a wildfire. The second warning will be sent one day ahead to those deemed in areas of "imminent extreme fire conditions." The third notice will announce the total power shutdown.

## Lin Grant - Her Good Works are Easy to Locate

As a chemistry major in college, Lin Grant set a path for her life. "In chemistry, you are self-directed: if the experiment works, good; if it does not, then you fix it," she explains. She smiles. "I guess I'm still doing that." Her laboratory is now an array of service inside and outside Leisure Village. Her motives remain the same. "I like to focus on making things better," she adds.

"I've always been other-directed. Growing up poor in Appalachia, we looked for ways to better our lives and others," Lin explains, as she remembers sorting donated clothes at a thrift shop or bringing a water wagon to school. It was assumed she'd become a teacher or nurse. the way she likes it.

But when a teacher urged her to go to college and study chemistry, she did. Lin earned a BS, later a Masters, and proved that her teacher was right. When she retired from a career in clinical chemistry, she had two US patents, one European Union patent, and successfully led a department with a \$13 million budget and 104 employees.

Lin didn't spend much time retiring after she moved to the Village in 2008. "I wanted to help any way I could," she recalls. "I live in one of the best communities in Southern California, and I love building on that." She was elected to LV's Board of Directors four times, serving as its President for four years. During that time, the



## The Woodstock Generation is Back!


Remember "Peace, Love and Rock 'n Roll?" Can you hum "With a Little Help from My Friends?" Or hear Joe Cocker singing it? Then you are ready for the "50th Anniversary Woodstock Reunion," an evening of music and memories presented by LV's Players Guild on August 15, exactly fifty years to the day that the iconic music festival began in Bethel, New York.

"A lot of us here remember it well," says co-producer Marlynn Block, "So we dug out our peace signs, love beads, and Jefferson Airplane albums for a trip – no, not that kind – back to what was a singular event in American pop culture." Woodstock, as remembered by the Players Guild, will feature music, dancing, instrumentals and comedy presented with an abundance of tye-dye-clothed flower children who now live in the Village.

## **When Your Medications Can Harm You**

Whether it's an over-the-counter pain reliever or a prescription statin, you cannot be expected to know everything about the medications you take, but here is one thing you need to know about all of them - drugs have a troubling downside in common: the risk of side effects.

Side effects are the expected (and usually unwanted) reactions you hear rattled off in TV drug ads: constipation, diarrhea, dizziness, dry mouth, drowsiness, nausea, upset stomach, and more. They may not be serious, but these side effects may be especially problematic for older adults.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, older adults are twice as likely as others to suffer an adverse drug event – serious enough to require a trip to the emergency room and seven times more likely than younger adults to be hospitalized as a result.



One likely reason: As you age, you're facing more ill-health conditions and taking more medications to treat them. "And the more meds you take, the greater the likelihood of multiple, often compounded side effects," says Dr. Michael Steinman, professor of medicine at the University of California, San Francisco. According to a study in JAMA Internal Medicine, 88% of adults age 62 to 85 take at least one prescription drug regularly. "And at the same time," Dr. Steinman adds, "Other age-related factors can play a role in how meds affect you."

With age, the body often gains more fat and holds less water than it once did – all of which can cause drugs to become more concentrated in the body. And medications can linger longer in your system, which can further increase the risk and severity of side effects. And, the key organs that are responsible for breaking down medications, mainly the liver and the kidneys, begin to function more slowly. As a result, those meds you are taking don't get excreted as quickly. Conversely, meds might not be effectively absorbed into the bloodstream, which could reduce a drug's effectiveness.

Certain medications which stick around longer in your system are particularly dangerous. Example: all sedative drugs used to treat insomnia. They are especially risky because we older adults are more sensitive to the sedating effects, which can increase the risk for falls and other accidents.

notifications at SCE.com by registering an email address, text number, or a phone number for a voice message. Alerts will come from Southern California Edison to those registered, as well as from social media, and local community responders like police officers.

The possibility of a Power Shutoff could be particularly concerning to those who use medical equipment that requires electricity. SCE representative Susan Cox advises that those residents can register on SCE's Medical Baseline or go to www.energystar.gov/products. "These provide helpful information about uninterruptible power supplies for these crucial devises," she says. 

# Conflict Resolution Training for Volunteers

■ The Conflict Resolution Institute (CRI) provides training to volunteers for mediation services

Established in 1990, the Conflict Resolution Institute (aka Ventura Center for Dispute Settlement) provides conflict resolution training, education and mediation services to the community of Ventura County. The training teaches participants how to more effectively resolve conflicts in their personal and professional lives, become better negotiators, serve as mediators, and volunteer in the small claims court. In the past two years, over 100 members of the community have been equipped with the tools to peacefully resolve their conflicts and help others do the same.

Operating under the direct supervision of the Dept. of Consumer Affairs, CRI staffs the Ventura County small claims courts in Ventura and Simi Valley with trained volunteer mediators every week. Litigants may choose to mediate with volunteers free of charge instead of having their case heard by the judge. The efforts of small claims volunteers relieve the court of approximately 500 cases each year.

Join the September 6, 7, 13 and 14 four-day Communication, Negotiation and Mediation training. Alternatively, select September 6 and 7 for one and one-half day Communication and Negotiation training. The four-day training qualifies for Continuing Education Units through the Dept. of Real Estate, CA Assoc of Marriage & Family Therapists and CA Bureau of Real Estate Appraisers. new Fitness Center was built, the Rec Center bathrooms and pool deck were remodeled – among other important projects. "Like many of us, my house is my legacy. It's important that we protect the value of the Village."

Her next project became the Women's Club. Some members lobbied Lin to become President, she recalls with a laugh, "They made me an offer I couldn't refuse. So I said I'd try it." The club focus – like Lin's – has become other-directed. She instituted "Change for Change," in which members donate coins they bring to each meeting to Food Share. In the first half of 2019, they raised

more money than was donated all last year. And the Club now collects plastic toiletries from hotel rooms to be given to Casa Pacifica.

Lin also shares her time outside the Village. She's been a long-time volunteer at SoCal hospices, a natural move from her professional work to the personal connection with end-of-life patients and their families. And she is a trained member of the Camarillo Police Department's Citizen Patrol, volunteers who assist deputies in the community.

Oh, there's one more, Lin says, her favorite of all. "I'm Nana to my four-year-old granddaughter Shelby several days a week. And that always makes life better."
