Mr. Joy will be very happy to come down and will call you up on his arrival Saturday morning.

Enclosed is a letter from Mr. Byne I found on my return. Perhaps this is involving more expense than warranted.

Before moving the old chicken houses I took Mr. Rossi down and talked the matter over with Mr. Parks who said he was not in a position nor had he the men to do the work. So, as I reported to you, I had Mr. Rossi send down the necessary equipment ~~to~~ do it. To avoid misunderstanding now that all is kindly, would it be too much trouble to let Mr. Parks know that the chicken houses are to go ahead? The grading and re-routing of the stream ditch could be done either by Mr. Parks' men and teams, or the teams from above could be brought down as you think best.
