Cal Poly Swimmers Retain Second Place Berth in CCAA Swim Championships

Northridge, Calif.---The Cal Poly Mustangs maintained their second place standing after the second day of the CCAA swimming championships Friday at San Fernando Valley State College in Northridge.

Coach Dick Anderson's team had 52 points. The Mustangs are far behind defending CCAA and national champion San Diego State. The Aztecs have accumulated 122 points with tomorrow (Saturday's final competition still ahead. Poly had a 15-point lead over third place Fresno State which has 37 points. Host San Fernando Valley is fourth with 24 points followed by Cal State Long Beach 20, Cal Poly Pomona 17 and Cal State Los Angeles 13.

Cal Poly swimmers placed in five of Friday's six events with the Mustang 400-yard freestyle relay team setting a school record. Poly's Larry Gray, Earl DeVries, Tim Adams and Hank Biddles swam a 3:27.3 race to shave seven-tenths of a second off the old mark set in 1964. San Diego State's winning time was 3:19.

Three Mustangs placed in the 200-yard butterfly event. Dave Meurer was second, Jim Burror third and Larry Toombs fifth.

Freshman Bob Bruchart took a fourth in the 100-yard freestyle for Cal Poly.

Santa Maria senior Pete Scaroni placed second and teammate Don Drew third in the 100-yard backstroke event.

Toombs, a junior from Bakersfield, placed in his second event when he finished fourth in the 400-yard individual medley.
