First, my thanks for your courteous response to my letter in behalf of Miss. Connie Uyeda, who, at my suggestion, is applying for a job at Manzanita Lodge this coming summer.

I enclose Miss. Uyeda's completed application and I sincerely hope that you will be able to use her this summer. I call your special attention to the fact that, though she is just completing high school this spring, she has held a number of responsible positions; While in high school -- mostly of a service nature and without pay, and what is more important, in each case, she has been judged to have been so thoroughly dependable that she has been consistently given work of increasing responsibility.

I know personally that, if you could use her, you will have an employee who combines personal appeal, complete honesty, responsibility, industry and loyalty. These have been well demonstrated.
