

I became active as a volunteer, joined various committees and was elected to our board and became its President from 2003 to 2004.

One of my major objectives was to emphasize our need to catch up on our maintenance programs for both our streets and lawns. In retrospect, I want to congratulate Bob Ellis and his constituents on the board, who, instead of concentrating on only keeping monthly assessments low, had the courage and foresight to increase our assessments so that our Village could catch up on this much-needed maintenance.

I also want to congratulate our current board of directors for not reducing the monies allocated to continue this catch-up maintenance program. The catch-up maintenance program, together with the recycling installation, should be completed within the next three years.

With lowered maintenance savings, plus savings from the use of recycled water, and in spite of possible increased costs due to inflation or barring any unexpected emergencies such as earthquakes or floods, these savings could enable our future assessments to remain at current levels or could even be lowered.

Therefore, "Don't just plan for the present — plan for the future."

CLASSIC MOVIES

'Singin' In The Rain' screens this month

On March 12, we will once again trot out an old favorite: "Singin' In The Rain," with Debbie Reynolds, Gene Kelly and Donald O'Connor.

Many folks consider this the epitome of the Hollywood musical. It is, in fact, a very biting satire of Hollywood in general and musicals in particular. Several of the greatest talents in Hollywood came together for this. Gene Kelly not only starred but also directed it. Donald O'Connor was his foil, a dancer of great talent on his own. Debbie Reynolds had never danced before but was a quick study.

The film was directed by both Stanley Donen and Gene Kelly. This was

not unusual for those days. Donen directed the dramatic scenes, and Kelly directed the dance numbers.

I remember when I worked on "Hello, Dolly" in 1968. Gene Kelly directed the dramatic scenes, and Michael Kidd directed the dance numbers. It was ironic, because Kelly was one of the foremost dance directors in Hollywood his-

I found Gene Kelly to be a good director, very exacting. He knew precisely what he wanted his actors to do, and he wasn't afraid to tell them in no uncertain terms. Walter Matthau, Tommy Tune and Michael Crawford — later to become famous as the Phantom of the Opera - had

no problem with that, but Barbra Streisand didn't appreciate Kelly's approach to directing all the time, and there were moments of dis-

agreement between them. This was odd to us, members of the crew, because it happened so seldom in Hollywood.

Arthur Freed produced "Singin' In The Rain." He was MGM's resident musical producer, having also produced "Meet Me In St. Louis," "The Harvey Girls,"
"On The Town," "Show-boat" and literally dozens of other films. A noted lyricist, he wrote the words to such songs as "You'll Never Know," "You Are My Lucky Star," "Here Comes the Sun," and "Singin' in the Rain," among dozens of others. He was one of Hollywood's most talented musical producers.

Gene Kelly was no slouch, either. His record of movies acted or directed is legion. His athletic dancing style contrasted nicely with Fred Astaire's elegant



top-hat-and-tails smoothness. Gene's style was so unique that MGM could not find an appropriate description of it. They had the same problem with Fred Astaire. So in press releases, they usually referred to Gene and Fred as "tap dancers," which was only a small part of their talent.

Gene Kelly came to Hollywood in 1941 to recreate the role he had acted on Broadway in "Pal Joey." His first movie, however, was "For Me and My Gal," with Judy Garland. MGM kept him, even though his contract called for him to act in only one movie.

This is the good thing about the early movies. We are privileged to see some classic actors, singers and dancers whose work has been immortalized on film and tape. We know that Joseph Jefferson, Edwin Booth and Ellen Drew were superb actors, but we cannot appreciate their work because there is only a written record of it; nothing is on film or tape. But we get to see the great Al Jolson singing his best in "The Jazz Singer," Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers dancing with such grace and elegance, and all the rest of the crew whose work will live as long as film and tape, and now digital media, exist. What a pleasure!

Back to the movie.

Donald O'Connor was a child star at MGM and Universal long before he was picked up for "Singin' In The Rain." In fact, he had been acting since age 12. Few people remember that he played "Beau Geste" as a child in 1939. His expertise as an actor was evident many times, but it is his singing and dancing talent that brings back more of his memories. Oh, yes, we also remember him as the human friend of Francis, the talking mule.

Debbie Reynolds was new to the movies and had never danced before she appeared in "Singin' In The Rain." She was very nervous about appearing in the film because of her inexperience, but it launched a career that still is going strong. She has appeared in films, on the radio, and on records also. Remember records? Remember "Abba Dabba Honeymoon?'

Ms. Reynolds is still very active. She has a prize collection of movie costumes, many of which are on display at the Hollywood Motion Picture Collection near the Kodak Theatre in Hollywood.

Also in the cast are Millard Mitchell as the

put-upon studio head, and Jean Hagen, whose brilliant portrayal of an airhead egocentric actress set a standard that has never been equaled. Watch also for Cyd Charisse in the ballet sequence. Watch carefully during Kelly's famous rain dance. The man he hands the umbrella to at the end of the dance is "Snub" Pollard, one of the most famous of the silent comedians. Pollard's long career from 1915 through 1961 included more than 400 movies.

There were only two original songs in the movie. "Moses Supposes," and "Make 'Em Laugh." The rest were brought from other MGM musicals of earlier years. As a special treat, we will see some of these earlier versions of the songs after the break.

In April, we will see a true classic. In 1929, King Vidor directed an all-black cast in "Hallelujah." This was the very first all-black talkie feature, and it's one of the most entertaining films ever made. Be sure not to miss this one, on Sunday, April 23, at 7 p.m in the AR. Make a note of the date, as it's the fourth Sunday, not the second, in April. We won't have a movie in May, but we should be back on schedule in June.







On March 30 at 11 a.m., Joan Virginia Allen Esq., Coordinator of Ventura County FAST (Financial Abuse Specialist Team), will present a seminar titled, "The Crime of Indignity: Financial Abuse of Elders.'

"One of the greatest indignities is to work hard all your life toward your golden years, only to find when you get there the gold has disappeared," said Ms. Allen.

Financial exploitation of elders not only can rob you of your independence, it can be life-threatening, and in many cases, the money is never recovered.

Come learn how you can

become part of the solution to this problem.

- Current schemes and scams designed to separate you from your money.

 How you can recognize and help prevent financial exploitation.

Joan Virginia Allen graduated from law school with honors in 1982. She is an elder law and estate planning attorney, public speaker and published author.

In 1997, she founded the Orange County FAST. She coordinated that team until the end of 2002. In 2003, she founded the Ventura County FAST and continues to coordinate the team of more than 40 public and private multidisciplinary professionals who volunteer their time to facilitate comprehensive services to elder and dependent adult victims of financial abuse.

FAST is a program of Senior Concerns in Thousand Oaks.

Ms. Allen was also the first coordinator for the Santa Barbara County FAST from September 2004 through the end of 2005.

Recipe of the month: Noodle pudding

1 pound of broad noodles 1/4 pound butter 4 eggs 1/2 pint sour cream 1/2 cup raisins 1/2 cup sugar Juice of 1/2 lemon

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Let's start at the begin-


ning.





Woodshop undergoing safety improvements

A general rearrangement and upgrade is underway in the Woodshop.

A recent addition of an auxiliary space for storage and for the dust collector has sparked a technical and aesthetic improvement of the facility in general.


Until recently, the Woodshop dust collector stood in the same room as the shop itself. The fine particles of dust that escaped from the collector bag, by far the most dangerous ones from a health and hazard standpoint, merely remained in the shop.

When the collector was moved to the auxiliary storeroom, the collection


system was reviewed and found to be bad for those who inhaled this fine dust, but it became clear that an explosion hazard existed as well.

When the system was installed in the shop, plastic piping was used to convey the dust to the collector. Plastic pipe can accumulate a static electric charge under such conditions that could then cause a spark that could ignite the fine dust/air mixture, causing it to explode. This situation has occurred many times in the past in coal mines, lumber mills, flour mills and other places where such a dust/air mixture was found.

from the technical information on such systems that the piping originally used was undersize, greatly reducing the effectiveness of the system. It was decided to upgrade the installation with new, larger metal piping to eliminate these problems.

The next issue to be dealt with was one of overall difficulty in managing the accumulation of wood scraps and pieces, and keeping the shop clean. This will be addressed by removing many of the machines from their individual bases and mounting them on built-in workbenches. They will become more stable, and the various parts of the floor that allowed scraps and dirt to accumulate will be eliminated.

The workbenches will

contain storage cabinets, improving that capacity as well.

Finally, an air system has been incorporated into the shop. An air compressor has also been placed in the storage room, with plumbing to bring the compressed air into the shop to an overhead reel and hose assembly, removing the hazard presented by an air hose on the floor when air is being used for cleaning or air-operated tools.

Finally, the location of all supplies and hand tools will be concentrated on the east wall of the shop so that anyone wanting access to things of that sort need not push past someone else working on a dangerous machine to get at them.

These changes are expected to raise the safety, efficiency and enjoyment of the Woodshop by a great deal.

There will be some interruptions in the availability of the Woodshop while these improvements are being made. We sincerely hope that no one is seriously inconvenienced by them during the process.







Gets you back where you belong:

Earthquake science goes high-tech

By Joe Foraker

A few minutes after 9 p.m. on March 10, 1933, Jesuit Fathers at Fordham and Georgetown universities on the East Coast watched in fascination as the seismographic needles jerked erratically across drums covered with white paper.

Simultaneously, Harvard scientists estimated from their instruments that an earthquake was occurring some 2,600 miles distant. A quick and substantial release of energy in the Earth's crust had just occurred, and crude instruments were detecting the disturbance thousands of miles from its origin, or epicenter.

The slowly developing science known as seismology was not immediately able to locate the earthquake site. A clue to its location came from a long distance telephone operator in Los Angeles, who informed a would-be caller from New York, "Sorry, I can't connect you. We're having an earthquake." The operator immediately passed news of this potential major event to The New York Times. More than an
