She will be teaching as Visiting Professor in Women's Studies and Film at Harvard University next Fall.

After finishing a successful local book earlier this year for her most recent collaboration with Paper Mache If I Had My Life To Live Over I Would Pick More Daisies and the well-known anthology When I Am An Old Woman I Shall Wear Purple, Burkhalter-Lackey now looks at this topic from her own original perspective.
