



Notes on DM2 Summer Special 2001

The story and concept for **Abortive** was originally conceived during the Summer of 94 as a potential short-story submission for a anthology comic that was being published at the time. That anthology was cancelled before I ever really started the pages for Abortive and so I moved on to other projects. I always liked the basic idea though and would occasionally toy around with sketches of the underworld and the protagonist. Now years later I get to finally do the comic I wanted to do long ago. Now that I'm finished I see that I probably took the execution of the artwork a little too seriously and this is probably why alot of the art is a bit stiff in my opinion. I am going to try and loosen up more in the future.

Smoking Is Cool was a sort of warm up before taking on Abortive. It was so long since I had tried doing a comic in this format. It was also an attempt to make up a story as I went along, which is probably evident. In some ways it is also a response to Paul Popes Smoke Navigator project or more specifically five pages of Smoke Navigator. Paul had published it as a work in progress in Buzz Buzz Comics Magazine in 96 and I was completely taken by a short chapter called Clove Cigarettes. Obviously if you read it then you know what I'm talking about but if you haven't let me just tell you that Paul Pope (or "PeePee" as he seems to enjoy referring to himself as) among many things, explored smoking in a feminine perspective or at least a male interpretation of this feminine perspective, that I had never quite seen or read since. I think maybe Smoking is cool is my non-smokers interpretation of a male perspective.

When I came up with the story for Home Is Where The Home Is I knew the only artist that could draw it right was Japanese Pop Idol Shino Arihara who has been hiding in America for the last several years disguised as a pantsless monkey. 

Ok C.C. I used the picture, quit choking me.


Drunken Master Complains (monku monku monku)

Fon-Lin: Hell Yeah!

P-Girl: He better. Because we have a song with him in it. We have a marriage proposal to him in the song.

Princess: Or at least Brandon Lee. At the very least.

Dm: So I was wondering. Since Shonen Knife is a Japanese girl band that sings rock songs in English, have you thought about doing Shonen Knife covers in Japanese?

Princess: Maybe we could try it in Chinese because at least one third of the band knows Chinese. I don't think any of us knows Japanese.

All together: That's a good idea though. Great idea. We'll think about that.

DM: If you were an all boy punk band, what would your gimmick be?

Princess: Originality maybe.

P-Girl: Were trying to work on a gimmick for our selves right now because being an all girl band doesn't seem to be doing anything for us.

DM: How do you feel when people say "You're the Hissyfits, you're the all girl band."?

Princess: Well yeah we are.

Princess: Like the "girl" Korn the "girl" Ramones.

P-Girl: The girl "teenage" Ramones. I mean, if they were 25 and they were the girl Ramones I don't know if anyone would care. Because there are plenty of girl bands out there that sound like that. And when we see a band like that we wonder what's going on behind the scenes. Because we have no way of knowing, but like, who's producing? Who's pushing all the buttons?

Princess: Because we know how much work it is. I mean I could never have done this when I was seventeen.

P-Girl: If you want to form a band you just gotta do it. What ever you want do, you just have to do it. But for girls especially. That's one of the problems is that girls think they can't do it... (because) it's like a boy thing.

Fon-Lin: They're never encouraged to do it.

P-Girl: When your between 11 and 15 boys are totally antisocial at that point and can't figure out what to do with themselves. So they're at home in their rooms learning to play guitar. Playing guitar like idiots to Led Zeppelin or whatever it is that they are listening to for hours and hours and hours. And girls are being social. Then when they're 15, boys figure out how to be social and by that time they already have this cool skill. They can be in a band, whereas girls never did that. So they're all "oh shit! all together: Hair. More hair bands in LA.


DM: Do you think it has to do with the weather? Hair just grows better in this climate?

Princess: We might have our own sit-com. We were sort of like the Monkeys last night, we all slept in the same bed. All in a row, it was very cute.

DM: Is Hello Kitty good or is Hello Kitty harbinger of doom?

all together: We like Hello Kitty.

DM: Thumbs up for Hello Kitty?

P-Girl: Thumbs up for the Badtz-Maru. He's like the homeboy of the Hello Kitty world.

DM: So do you guys have any thoughts or explanation why Digimon can't be as popular as Poke-Mon?

Fon-Lin: It's like Transformers and Go-Bots. You know? It's like Transformers came first they're the original, they're cool, they got street cred. When I was little I didn't have Barbies I had "transformers".
