1991 graduate receives prestigious fellowship

Arshad Bachubai Desai, a 1991 graduate of Cal State Hayward in biological sciences, was named a recipient of the prestigious Hughes Predoctoral Fellowship in Biological Sciences. Desai is one of seventy individuals to receive the award. The predoctoral fellowship supports a student for up to five years of full-time study towards the Ph.D. at a level of \$25,700 per year. Desai will begin his doctoral work in genetics and molecular biology at UCSF.

Ten Californians received the award. Three are from Stanford, two from UC Berkeley, and one each from Cal Tech, UC Davis, UCLA, UC San Diego and Cal State Hayward.

Deadline for assistive devices funds is July 17

The 1992/93 California State University budget for the Affirmative Action for Disabled Employees Programs will continue the implementation of the Systemwide Assistive Equipment/Auxiliary Aid Program for faculty and staff who are disabled.

Auxiliary aid requests for current employees are due in the campus Affirmative Action Office (President's Office) by July 17, and auxiliary aid requests for new employees and equipment requests for new and current employees are due October 9, 1992.

Examples of equipment include: braille, one-handed or large print typewriters, talking calculators, telephone amplifiers, telecommunication devices, modified chalk boards, special amplifiers and special dictation machines.

Employees are encouraged to attempt to make full use of this program.
