SEASON PREVIEW

George McQuarn makes his collegiate debut as a head coach this season at Cal State Fullerton and faces a formid-

able rebuilding challenge.

Only two players return from the 1979-80 squad which was 10-17 (12-15 after forfeits) under Bobby Dye, who resigned after seven years at the post. McQuarn was hired in March and, despite a late start in recruiting, thinks he has assembled a squad which will be competitive in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association.

"I'm generally pleased with the athletes we've been able to recruit and those we have returning," said McQuarn, who helped elevate the University of Nevada-Las Vegas program to national prominence as an assistant to Jerry Tarkanian the

past four years. "The recruits are all top notch players. Our lack of experience and depth, however, is a major concern."

Sophomore forward/center Lance Ball and senior guard George Barrios are the returnees from Fullerton's first losing

team in seven years.

Ball (6-9, 210) scored 4.7 points a game and averaged 2.7 rebounds in a limited role. The U.S. Air Force veteran from Salem, Oregon displayed considerable progress throughout the season and during summer play. He must fill the shoes of departed all-PCAA performer Calvin Roberts, the top scorer (16 points) and rebounder (9.5) for the Titans last year.

Barrios (6-0, 170) was a part-time starter in the backcourt averaging 3.3 points per game with 70 assists on the

season.

A quartet of junior college transfers, two freshmen and a pair of redshirts will complete the squad until December when University of Texas transfer Keith Stephens (6-7, 215) becomes

eligible to play.

'Keith will make a difference in our lineup," said McQuarn. "But it creates an immediate problem, affecting our style of play and substitution pattern. We have to start the season with only two big men and then we will have three for conference play."

Redshirts joining the squad are 6-foot-8 center Dave Wear from Fresno State and 6-foot-2 guard Doug Cherry from Merced Junior College. Wear prepped at Rancho Alamitos High

School in Garden Grove.

Topping the list of recruits is all-state forward Michael Anderson from Oxnard Junior College. The 6-foot-5 former all-City star from Dorsey High in Los Angeles averaged 20.4 points and nine rebounds while leading Oxnard to a 23-9 record and the Western State Conference championship. He will be a swing man between guard and forward for the Titans.

Playing the power forward position will be 6-foot-61/2 John Bell from Portland, Oregon. He averaged 15 points and 10 rebounds last year at North Idaho Junior College and led the team to the quarterfinals of the NJCAA tournament. He was an all-City performer at Roosevelt High School in Portland.

Two JC transfers at guard bring impressive credentials to the Titans' program. Ronald Portee (5-10, 160) led Western Texas Junior College to a 37-0 record and the NJCAA title. John Hall (6-3, 175) was the leading scorer in California for

Cerro Coso College in Ridgecrest.

Both freshmen could see considerable action off the bench with McQuarn operating with a 12-man roster. Guard David Gilreath (5-10, 170) was an all-State performer for Marshall University High School in Minneapolis, Minnesota and forward Victor Green (6-51/2, 185) was the most valuable player in Nevada after an outstanding season for Valley High in Las Vegas.

Another guard candidate is walk-on Jerry Alfafara from

Kennedy High School and Cypress College.

"We want to play pressure defense beginning at half court with the ability to extend our defense further down the ' said McQuarn, who compiled a 123-8 record and won four CIF titles at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles. "Offensively, we will run the fast break at every opportunity."

McQuarn rates Fresno State and Utah State the teams to

beat in the PCAA race.

"We're really not in a rebuilding year but a building year," said McQuarn. "We're going to have to scrap for everything we get. We will be in the physical condition it takes to play that way."

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON



California State University, Fullerton is a relatively young institution, having opened only two decades ago. However, it already has grown to 22,500 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is

actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its over-all program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, journalism, music, speech and hearing and theater. All total there are 80 degree programs—38 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their reg-

ular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the

campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A new development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with

high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 8,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arbore-tum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus

in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community service, President L. Donald Shields has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to achieve the president's chief goal for the university. That goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the foremost bachelor's/master's degree granting institution in the nation.

DR. L. DONALD SHIELDS, PRESIDENT

Dr. L. Donald Shields will step down as president of California State University, Fullerton in January after serving almost 10 years at his post to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Shields has been a part of CSUF since 1963 when he joined the faculty as an assistant professor of chemistry. He became an associate professor in 1966 and a full professor in 1967. He was elected chair of the Faculty Council in 1967 and

later that year became the campus' first vice president for administration. From October 1970 to May 1971 he was acting president of the university.

At the time of his appointment in 1971, Dr. Shields was 34, making him the youngest chief executive of a major state university in the nation. During his term the enrollment has grown from 14,000 to 22,500 and degree programs have grown from 58 to 80, 38 of which are at the graduate level.

Dr. Shields will become the eighth president of SMU which considered more than 350 candidates for the position. He will succeed Dr. James H. Zumberge, who resigned in May to accept the presidency

of the University of Southern California.

Dr. Shields served six years (1974-80) on the National Science Board and was its chairman for the last two years, administering a \$1 billion annual budget.

In 1977, Dr. Shields became the first western trustee on the pres-

tigious National Commission for Cooperative Education.

This past summer Dr. Shields won the 1980 Distinguished Honor Scroll Award from the western chapter of the American Institute of Chemists for national leadership in science and higher education and for professional contributions to chemistry.

DR. MILES D. McCARTHY, ACTING PRESIDENT

Dr. Miles D. McCarthy will serve as acting president of California State University, Fullerton beginning in January when Dr. L. Donald Shields moves to the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. McCarthy is chair of the health professions committee and former vice president for academic affairs. A founding faculty member at CSUF, McCarthy has distinguished himself academically and administratively. The professor of

biology was academic vice president from 1970-74 until asking for re-

assignment to teaching due to a health problem.

Dr. McCarthy's other administrative posts have included service as chair of both the Biological Science Department and the Division of Science, Mathematics and Engineering, as well as dean of the School of Letters, Arts and Science.

As chair of the health professions committee he established in 1959, McCarthy grooms CSUF students and recommends them to schools for graduate work in medicine, optometry, dentistry and related health professions.

Last year 85 per cent of those students recommended overall were

accepted, which is an unprecedented success rate.

Chair of the executive committee of the Orange County-Long Beach Consortium in Nursing Education, McCarthy is a trustee of the Southern California College of Optometry. He was a member of the admissions committee at UC Irvine's College of Medicine from 1977 to 1979.

In 1965, McCarthy was chosen outstanding professor both at Cal State Fullerton and by the CSUC trustees.





TITAN ATHLETIC FOUNDATION

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization with the express purpose of aiding the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals, not necessarily alumni, who have a genuine interest in athletics and the University.

It is community involvement for some, business involvement for others, or simply an interest in a fine sports program that has attained national recognition and respect

the past few years.



The foundation supports the athletic program by providing funds for scholarships and grants-in-aid which insure an effective recruit-

ing program that attracts the best student-athletes available.

The Titan Athletic Foundation was founded in January 1973, and is the University's official athletic booster organization. In the TAF's first year approximately \$30,000 was raised and 150 members enlisted. Just seven years later the TAF raised over three hundred thousand dollars and has a membership of about a thousand.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first presi-

dent and he has been succeeded by Don Karcher, president of Carl Karcher Enterprises; Buck Johns, president of California Climate Control, and the current president, Larry Slagle, vice president of Yel-

low Cab Co. of North Orange County.

MIKE MULLALLY, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Mike Mullally, who guided Eastern Illinois from the doldrums to the forefront of Intercollegiate athletics at the Division II level the past few years, is the new director of athletics at Cal State Fullerton. He replaced Neale Stoner, who is now director of athletics at Illinois.

Mullally became athletic director at Eastern Illinois in August 1974, when the Charleston institution's programs were in disarray. In five of the following six years, Eastern Illinois had the nation's most out-

standing Division II program, as determined by polls conducted by University of California, Davis, among others. In 1978 the Panther men won the national championship in foot-

ball, made their fifth straight trip to the NCAA basketball tournament, finished second in wrestling and third in soccer. The Panthers won the national championship in cross country in 1977 and the track title in 1974. They also compete in baseball (fifth in

1978), swimming (third in 1975), tennis and golf. Before joining Eastern Illinois, Mullally served eight years at Univer-

sity of Oklahoma.

He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at University of South Dakota with the undergraduate work in political science and the graduate work in history. In addition he has taken doctoral studies in history at Oklahoma.

He is 42, married (Carole) and the father of three (Heidi, Edward and Matthew). They reside in Fullerton.

HEAD COACH GEORGE McQUARN

After helping elevate the University of Nevada-Las Vegas program to national prominence, George McQuarn will try to carve a niche of his own at Cal State Fullerton where he makes his collegiate debut as a head coach.

McQuarn, 39, served four years as an assistant to Jerry Tarkanian at UNLV before returning to southern California to replace Bobby Dye, who resigned in February after seven sea-

NCAA championships in 1977 and reached the semifinals of the National Invitational Tournament last season with a 23-9 record.

McQuarn's track record features tremendously successful teams at the high school level and an outstanding record in recruiting on the collegiate level. He was appointed to his current post on March 8, 1980.

Players recruited by McQuarn to UNLV include Michael Loyd, Flintie Williams, Sid Green, Michael Johnson, Larry Anderson, Richard Box, Michael Burns and Greg Goorjian. Some of that talent will be back to haunt McQuarn when the Titans meet the Rebels in December at the Anaheim Convention Center in the Los Angeles Times Classic.

McQuarn's 14-year coaching career includes a phenomenal tenure at Verbum Dei where he started out with a 25-0 record as the freshmen coach and between 1969 and 1973 won four consecutive CIF titles on three different levels of competition. The final team went 32-1 on the AAAA (highest) level and completed McQuarn's prep career at 123-8 for a .939 winning percentage.

David Greenwood, Roy Hamilton, Raymond Lewis and former Titans Donny Daniels and Keith Anderson are some of the Eagles who played for McQuarn.

McQuarn left Verbum Dei to become Recreation Superintendent for the City of Compton but he returned to coaching

with the UNLV appointment in 1976.

A Fresno native, McQuarn graduated from Centennial High in Compton where he earned all-CIF honors in basketball and baseball. He attended Compton College and was selected to the JC All-America baseball team.

McQuarn attended UCLA on a baseball scholarship and earned all-West Coast honors as a catcher. He graduated from Cal State Long Beach in 1966 with a degree in physical education.

McQuarn and wife Jackie have two children (Tracey, 13 and Michael, 11) and live in Long Beach.

Assistant Coach John Sneed

Experience with winning programs at the Division I level and a remarkably successful record as a high school coach make John Sneed a valued assistant to

George McQuarn.

Sneed was an assistant for one year at the University of Arizona, a 21-6 season (1976-77) which took the Wildcats into the NCAA playoffs. During 1977-78 he was an assistant at San Diego State and the 19-8 Aztecs won

the regular season PCAA title before being eliminated in the season-ending tournament by Cal State Fullerton. He also was at San

Diego for the 1978-79 season.

Sneed, 32, succeeded McQuarn at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles in 1974 and won the CIF 4A title and CIF Coach of the Year honors with a 30-2 record. The next two seasons the Eagles won two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons which gave Sneed a career mark of 81-8 for a .910 winning percentage.

The 1974 Verbum Dei team was recognized as national high

school champions by the National Sport News Service.

A Long Beach State graduate, Sneed was an assistant to McQuarn for two years at Verbum Dei. He left a prosperous private business last spring to rejoin McQuarn at Fullerton, where he will work primarily with the forwards.

The native of Gastonia, NC has been married (Rose Mary)

for one year.

Assistant Coach Bill Genian

Youthful experience as well as a year of working together with George McQuarn at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas combined to bring Bill Genian into the Titans' basketball program.

Genian, 30 as of the season opener, already has coached on the community college level and in two different Division I conferences so he brings a varied background to Fullerton.

Genian was an assistant for one season at UNLV after a similar stint at Idaho State. Prior to those jobs he spent three years as an assistant at Pasadena City College and the Lancers twice were ranked among the top teams in California. Earlier at Pasadena, Genian played guard for two seasons under coach Dan Ayala. After winning All-Metropolitan Conference honors, Genian attended Cal State Hayward and was a two-year starter before completing his degree work at Hayward. He went immediately into coaching at Pasadena.

A 1969 graduate of Pleasant Hill High School in northern California, Genian will work primarily with the Fullerton post



Utah State had conference games at Fresno State cancelled due to a ruling by the PCAA Executive Committee. As a result of this ruling, Utah State played just 13 conference games. USU also was awarded a forfeit win from the University of Utah. USU's adjusted overall-record became 19-8.

Fresno State was forced to cancel its home games with San Jose State and Utah State due to a ruling by the PCAA Executive Committee. The ruling was handed down after it was discovered that Fresno State had participated in countable preseason scrimmages which would have placed the school in violation of the NCAA's 27-game limit rule had it played its remaining scheduled games and participated in the PCAA postseason tournament.

San Jose State had conference game at Fresno State cancelled due to a ruling by the PCAA Executive Committee. As a result of this ruling, San Jose State played just 13 conference games. San Jose State also was awarded two forfeit wins from UC Santa Barbara. San Jose State's adjusted record became 9-4 in PCAA and 19-10 overall.

Pacific was awarded a forfeit win from the University of Utah. UOP's adjusted overall record became 16-15.

UC Santa Barbara was forced to forfeit all of its games due to a ruling by the PCAA Executive Committee. The ruling was handed down after it was discovered that UC Santa Barbara had used an ineligible player in its games. UCSB's adjusted record became 0-14 in PCAA and 0-27 overall.

Cal State Fullerton was awarded a forfeit win from UC Santa Barbara and one from the University of Utah. CSF's adjusted record became 5-9 in PCAA and 12-15 overall.

UC Irvine was awarded two forfeit wins from UC Santa Barbara. UCI's adjusted record became 3-11 in PCAA and 9-18 overall.
