**Chair Report:**

- Approved items from last meeting are on the consent list for April 26 Senate.

GE didn't meet last week (CW)

**APC (AG)**

- support the immediate need to hire Institution Research person
- need data for next year's assessment
- statistical dashboard for faculty
- lost 30 probationary faculty
- interest in looking at junior faculty retention, also adjuncts
- Question to ask: why so many FERPs? Why the departures from junior and adjunct faculty?
- Looking at faculty productivity – a method to catalog and advertise the work being done

**Program Review (AK)**

- Stephen Galloway (Chr, Program Review) is creating a memo on program review subcommittee

**Grad Studies (JR)**

- MOU with Extended Ed discussion,

**Pre-discussion:**

Online Student Evaluations – creating a form to capture SETEs. Question about security of online form software.

AG – clarity on section IV A 1 may be needed, around the idea of dept chairs

IV A 1 – refers to depts. making decisions without further consultation. Also second sentence, "Departments will be encouraged" – not entirely clear. May need clarification (ES)

**Online Course Policy –D. Roberts, B. Warner**

Background – directed to come up with an online policy. SSU is one of two CSUs currently without a policy. Took best practices and looked at regulating bodies (CSU and WASC), vetted through CFA and Academic Freedom, IT, Disability Services.

Comment (AG) – no online student evaluation process.

IV A 1 – talking about Department curriculum, committees –language is vague.

Language suggested by Kelly –

“Departments, via the established departmental procedures for curriculum review, “

There are currently two routes to online instruction:

- new course
- taking established course and entering into an online format

#### Recommendation

- all courses, new or established, going to online format should be reviewed and approved

#### Discussion

(JR) Re:approval of courses

- as long as curriculum is clearly stated and defined, within the approval process, delivery should not be an issue

(AG) If probationary faculty are teaching online, how is evaluation or a peer review taking place?

(DR) Nursing is currently using online software to capture SETE information. Peers are able to review nursing instructors teach via access to their moodle portals.

FSAC had requested that document be sent to Academic Freedom

(ES) Clarification (IV A 2) WASC has revised their definition. “50% of instruction in the major and not the total degree”

- nothing in the policy about development of online courses and what constitutes a quality online course.

#### Suggestions

(AG) Change section 4 to section 5. New section 4 would/could talk to rigor of the curriculum and details/guidance on creating online courses.

(DR) response, put AG suggestion to IV B 2.

### **MOU – Kelly Estrada, Beth Warner**

(BW) Revisions to document created in 1996.

- included language that Sch of Ext Ed operates “under policies governed by CSU”
- two sections added: program review and discontinuation (??)
- essentially to say that ExEd is following same procedures that normal classes follow

(AG) Language change, preamble, add “and periodic” after “levels of prior”
