

## **Educational Policies Committee Minutes for Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> 2006**

- It was moved to add curriculum approval forms to the agenda as a business item

Elaine Sundburg (ES) v. provost discussed the approval of programs and forms and how the office of academic programs fits in. There was a handout of short version of the curriculum changes guidelines for the routing process.

Time Certain 11:00 a.m. Computer Science revision of the BS degree to match the curricular guidelines in CS national accreditation. The Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) recently published new curriculum guidelines and this proposal updates the CS program at SSU to be in accordance with such guidelines.

Present by Lynn Stauffer (Chair of the CS dept) and Tia Watts (full professor of the CS dept) were a letter of introduction, proposal for revision of the existing BS program including a table of comparisons of courses, wtu and units for the existing vs the revised program, impacts on other depts in SST, rationale, expected results, resource impact, and signatures of the chair of the CS dept, chair of the school curriculum committee and the dean of SST.

Discussion by EPC members and questions

In summary the major has increased by 4 units but the capstone experience has increased by 3 of those 4 units. General electives have been decreased. Accreditation is not approved ABET because they are missing 2 semesters of physics and the teaching load is high. This will help since the number of courses will be reduced.

TS asks a question concerning the wtu of labs

CW moves to waive the first reading and continue to the second reading

CBB finds that there are practices that have never been written down. Academic affairs serves as a information resource to help dept implement curriculum changes. ES added a line where the provost signs

Andy Merifield wrote a letter recommending that ECP suspend program review

SC Art dept demands resources to conduct program review

SB reports – program review money hurts other programs and there needs to be a permanent line item in the budget to support program review. LS will find the money and have it in place.

This was followed by a general discussion of resources and SB and CW volunteered to collect data from their schools about what resources have been given to conduct program review and what is actually needed.

Time Certain 12:00 p.m. English proposal to change graduate program for all English graduate students. This consists of the elimination of English 501 as a required course and making it an elective course. English 500 will continue to be required but the course description will change.

Presented by Thaine Stearns (TS) a letter to the graduate studies subcommittee regarding the nature and rationale for the program changes including impact and a plan for MA program with the changes.
