



## Cal State Fullerton Campus Profile

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies, such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959, and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 22,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told there are 94 degree programs—44 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.



Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to Cal State Fullerton for residencies and public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which spearheaded the fundraising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

The Ruby Gerontology Center serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the University and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State Fullerton has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.



## **Titan All-America Selections**

The National Softball Coaches Association annually honors the top collegiate softball players with the selection of the NSCA All-America teams. Head coaches choose three teams with 13 athletes on the first and second teams and 15 athletes on the third team. The teams are announced each year in conjunction with the College Softball World Series in May.

Cal State Fullerton's All-America history is deep, with at least one selection on every team except three since the program was launched in 1980. Nineteen different Titan players have been selected to a total of 25 All-America berths. First baseman Sue Lewis is the only three-time winner among the Titans. Tiffany Boyd, Denise DeWalt, Susan LeFebvre and Chenita Rogers are two-time winners.

Selected as a recipient of the 1995 Woman of Excellence in Sports Award, Judi Garman was honored by the Orange County community for her efforts to provide opportunity for girls and women to participate in softball. As she enters her 17th season at Cal State Fullerton, Garman's reputation as a mainstay at the institution and in the sport precedes her. Consider: Since establishing the softball program in 1980, the Titans have participated in post season play every year; Garman has helped to raise over \$750,000 to provide opportunities for girls in the sport; she is a sought after speaker across the nation and abroad; and, several of

her student/athletes have represented the United States in international competition.

Long regarded as one of the top softball coaches in the nation, Judi Garman saw that reputation permanently acknowledged on Dec. 4, 1993, when she was elected to the National Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

The nation's winningest collegiate coach with 986 victories—211 at Golden West Junior College in Huntington Beach and 775 at Cal State Fullerton—was enshrined in Atlantic City, New Jersey.





Her career record is 775-264-4 (.745) at the Division I level and 986-304-4 (.762) including eight seasons at Golden West. The induction is only the latest in a seemingly endless stream of honors and accomplishments for Garman, who established the CSUF softball program in 1980 and never has placed lower than ninth in the nation in her 16 seasons.

Her inaugural team finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth in the AIAW Tournament.

Since then, Garman's teams have won or shared eight conference titles and seven regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985; third in 1982 and 1987; fifth in 1995 and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Garman's accomplishments stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College to Cal State Fullerton.

She earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers' softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-

78) while compiling a record of 211-40 (1972-79). Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions. Due to those outstanding feats at GWC she was named to the California Community College Hall of Fame in 1992.

When she came to Fullerton there was no on-campus diamond. Her first five teams called a municipal facility at Lions Field their home diamond until an outstanding two-diamond complex with lights was constructed as part of a joint venture with the city of Fullerton.

Very involved professionally, Garman served a two-year reign as president of the National Softball Coaches Association from 1990-1991. Each year she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

In February, 1991, Garman was honored at the Fifth Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Luncheon sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles for her contribution to collegiate athletics in Southern California.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman has also made numerous trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia, Japan and, most recently, Australia. She runs a camp each summer in Italy.

Fishing and snow skiing in Aspen occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins. Her sister, Lorraine Garman Klippel, was twice named the LPGA professional of the year for her accomplishments as the head pro at Bumble Bee Hollow golf club in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania.

## Asst. Coach Michelle Gromacki

Michelle Gromacki, a former all-conference catcher at Cal State Fullerton and a former member of several gold-medal winning USA teams, returns for a second year on the Titan coaching staff for 1996.

"Michelle brings a lot of positive energy to our program and as a current player she provides a great working example," said Garman. "Her experiences on both the national and international level mean that she will bring the latest techniques and a winning attitude to our program."

After playing the 1984 season at Butte Community College in her native northern California, Gromacki was a reserve for the Titans in 1985 and then the starter the next two years as Fullerton won the national championship in 1986 and placed



third in 1987. She won All-Pacific Coast Athletic Association honors in 1987 and received a large share of the credit for the development of pitcher Connie Clark, the 1987 Honda Broderick Award winner who posted a 53-7 career record.

Gromacki also caught the 1986 Broderick winner in the Titans' Susan LeFebvre.

Gromacki, 31, has won Amateur Softball Association All-America honors eight times and was a member of the three-time national champion Redding Rebels. She also was reunited with Clark on a team that won the national championship of New Zealand. Other trips have taken her to Japan, China and Australia, and, in the summer of 1994, Guatemala.

## Asst. Coach Susie Parra

Susie Parra joins the Titan staff this year after a distinguished collegiate playing career at the University of Arizona, in Tucson.

She graduated from the University in May 1995 and was an assistant coach for the team last season,



which finished second at the College World Series.

Susie was a two-time All-American pitcher who led her Wildcats to the National Championship an incredible three out of four possible years from 1991 through 1994. In her final collegiate appearance, May 30, 1994, she tossed a one-hitter as the Wildcats defeated Cal State Northridge by a score of 4-0. It capped a 33-1 season for her.

As pitching coach for the Titans, Susie looks forward to bringing her knowledge of the game – and of winning – to younger players. Still an outstanding pitcher herself, Susie will also continue to pitch for the United States in international competition.

## Season Preview

Cal State Fullerton's trip to the 1995 College Softball World Series whet the appetite for an encore visit in 1996 for the talented nucleus of the lineup that returns for this season. And, after 16 seasons and 775 victories at Cal State Fullerton, softball coach Judi Garman finds herself as excited as ever about the Titans' 1996 season.

"I'm very optimistic," says the woman who launched the Titan program in 1980. "We have a majority of the players back from last year's team. They really came together and I think if they continue to play that kind of ball, a return trip to the tournament is reasonable."

Pitcher Brandi Isgar and the heart of the batting order are back for Coach Garman, whose 17th season at Fullerton begins with a pre-season national ranking of 6th.

Isgar posted a 17-5 record in her freshman season, while second baseman Chris Zboril, shortstop Julie Williams and outfielder Senetha Thomas provided much of the Titans' potent offense.

Zboril was an All-Regional selection who led the Titans with a .373 batting average (seventh on the all-time list for best average in a season). She had 8 home runs and 25 RBI. Her slugging percentage was a team-leading .602. She returns for her senior season and figures to continue her strong defensive play at second base.

Along with her outstanding bat, Williams developed into a fine defensive short-stop for the team as well. In her freshman campaign, she hit .301 with 8 home runs, 7 doubles and a team-high 40 RBI.

Thomas, who saw action last year as both an outfielder and the designated player, begins her senior season after posting some impressive 1995 numbers as well. Her .326 batting average ranked her second on the squad. She hit 7 home runs, 5 doubles and a triple while driving in 28 runs and scoring a team leading 38 runs herself.

"Last year we had a question mark with our pitching, but Brandi Isgar from San Dimas High School and Gabby Guerrero from College of the Sequoias JC proved they could perform in the 'big time' and were impact pitchers for us."

Although the loss of senior Jennifer Mortensen (23-8) – a three-year veteran and a second-team All-Big West Conference selection in 1994 – will be felt, Garman feels that

with Isgar and Guerrero and the infusion of strong newcomers, the pitching will be extremely solid.

"Brandi really developed last year with fine games under pressure," Garman said.

"Gabby moves the ball around and hits her spots She's smart, and doesn't make the same mistake twice."

Newcomer Liza Brown, a freshman out of Upland, Rancho Cucamonga H.S., may make an impact early for Titans.

"I'm looking forward to seeing how Liza handles the jump to college play. She's a tough competitor who also has the skills to be a strong utility player for us. I look for her to make an impact for us in several ways," Garman said.

Several key senior position players were lost including Shannon Dolan, Rose Garces, Heidi Robertson, Tracie Noggle and Mortensen.

Prominent among the other Titan veterans are third baseman Traci Fischer, who batted .297 and had 3 home runs, and the versatile Beth Queypo, an outfielder who posted a .280 batting average in the 1995 effort. Both of these players return for their senior seasons. Also returning for her senior season is Monica Bagalayos, providing solid support on the infield. Rocky Medina, Barbara Saavedra and Teresa Stippey also return for the 1996 season.

"With Julie at short, Traci at third and Chris at second, most of our infield is set and is stronger offensively and defensively.

We have a great core group of freshmen who will challenge these players for playing time and for the spot at first."

These freshmen include: Brown; Wendy Griffin, out of Garden Grove H.S.; and Bevan Trueblood, out of Ventura's Buena H.S., each of whom Garman expects to have an impact.

The Titans catching will likely fall to junior Teresa Stippey, who played in 27 games for Cal State Fullerton in 1995. Redshirt freshman Rocky Medina and freshman Erin Kirkpatrick, out of Serrano H.S., will compete for catching duties.

The outfield will be again be very competitive. Beth Queypo will likely anchor the group, along with Thomas and newcomers Carrie Davis, a freshman out of Bellflower H.S., Griffin and Saavedra.

Returning for her second season is assistant coach Michelle Gromacki (Cal State Fullerton '87), and Susie Parra (Univ. of Arizona '94) joins the Titan coaching staff this year.

Gromacki, 31, is a former all-conference (1987) catcher for the Titans while Parra, 22, was an All-American pitcher for three years at the University of Arizona. Both are still active players on the international level who were considered for the 1996 U.S. Olympic team.

"Their enthusiasm and energy is contagious," said Garman. "They bring such a positive attitude and approach. The players see the example of what it takes to be a winner and a champion at this level."

## **PONY Mid-Season Tournament**

Cal State Fullerton annually hosts what is generally regarded as the premiere midseason collegiate tournament in the country in the PONY Invitational to be held in 1996 from March 20 through March 24.

Sixteen teams, most of them in the preseason Top 20 national poll, will collide in a pool-play format consisting of four pools of four teams. Results from pool play will seed a 16-team single-elimination championship bracket. The champion will be crowned on Sunday, March 24.

Cal State Fullerton has won eight of the 16 previous PONY events. The now defunct

Cal Poly Pomona program and Arizona are the only other multiple winners, capturing titles in 1983 and 1984; and 1988 and 1995, respectively. Fresno State (1990), Oklahoma State (1989), Cal State Northridge (1993) and Southwestern Louisiana (1994) each have won a title and are in this year's field, looking to repeat. 

## Titan Softball Complex



The Titan Softball Complex encompasses two lighted and fenced softball fields which are utilized at capacity during the annual 16-team PONY Tournament as well as year-round by the City of Fullerton.

The primary diamond features elevated grandstand seating, individual chair-backs on the third-base side, an improved electronic scoreboard and multiple batting cages with astroturf and warm-up mounds. Improvements constantly are being made.

Last year's additions included concrete pavement around both

backstops for added fan comfort and safety and expanded batting cages and bullpens.

Additionally, the press facilities were improved by enclosing and elevating them on the top rows of the homeplate grandstand.

The softball complex is part of a unique joint partnership among the city of Fullerton, the University and the Marriott Hotel Corp., that was responsible for the \$14 million multivenue complex that also includes a 1,500seat baseball pavilion and a multi-purpose 10,000 seat stadium.
