



Mental Health SERVICE

The San Jose Community Mental Health Services' move to its new quarters at the City Health Department Building was announced recently by Dr. Raymond C. Miller, Acting City Health Officer.

The City's Mental Health Program has been operating for three years under the direction of Dr. Stanley J. Milstone, Program Chief. With a team of psychiatrists, psychologists, psychiatric social workers, public health nurse and a health educator, the program will continue to offer services of mental health consultation, education and information, and psychiatric treatment. The out-patient psychiatric treatment services are provided through contract with the Adult and Child Guidance Clinic.

"The only change in the program is the increased amount of funds under the contractual arrangements with the Adult and Child Guidance Clinic for outpatient psychiatric treatment services for individuals unable to afford private care," Dr. Miller pointed out. "However, in an effort to make the greatest use of these funds we shall be asking the Clinic to place priority for services to those persons in need of emergency psychiatric evaluation or treatment; to ond to persons who will benefit from short term treatment; and to persons referred by other community agencies for psychiatric evaluation."

According to Arvin Robb, local attorney and chairman of the City's Mental Health Advisory Board, the City is responding to the community's demand for increased psychiatric treatment services. "We are

pleased that the City Council accepted the recommendation of the Board to increase the budget for outpatient psychiatric treatment."

The current budget for the community mental health program is \$156, 342. Cost of these services is shared equally by the City of San Jose and the State of California under the provisions of the 1957 Short-Doyle Act.

Many times we have talked about education. We have stressed its importance and hoped that perhaps this message would reach receptive ears. We have in this issue some news or information which we feel will be of value to those who have some question, either real or not about the value of education.

What are those persons who did not graduate from elementary school doing today? Those who did not graduate from elementary school are either working as laborers, in farms or service industries in the amount of 50%. This means that fifty percent of those who did not graduate from grammer are doing farm work or such work as watchmen, janitors, porters, ushers, waiters, bootblacks and elevator operators. Most of the others are streetcar operators, cab drivers, dyers, miners and rodmen. There is also a small percentage of which are members of professions and some who are managers.

What about those who graduated from college, what are they doing? A small number of these are farm laborers and unskilled workers. About 70 percent are in the professional work. We mean by professional work accountants, airline pilots, teachers, lawyers, doctors, pharmacists, economists, dentist, designers and registered nurses.

About 20 percent of these college graduates are buyers, administrators, superintendents, postmasters, credit men, etc.

What happens to the high school graduate? The high school graduate becomes a variety of things in his life. About 30 percent of the high school graduates are bank tellers, sales clerks, secretaries, dental assistants, real estate agents, bond salesmen, bookkeepers, and library assistants.

Another 30 percent become bakers, inspectors, toolmakers, furriers, boilermakers, delivery men, typesetters, carpenters, electricians and shoemakers. The .est of the high school graduates are involved in farm labor, professional work and in managerial work with the greater part involved in farm work.

What does this mean? I do not need to explain that as you go to school so does your opportunity for a better job. We all know this but sometimes we fool ourselves and allow ourselves to think that he or she will be different. This is not always the case. The figures don't lie. They are there. Where do you fit? Where will your children fit?

Slightly over half the American labor force (18 to 64 years old) had a high school diploma in 1959 and nearly one in ten was a college graduate. In 1940,

only one third had completed high school and one in 18 had a college degree. Approximately two out of three college graduates were employed in a professional capacity in March 1959 and one in seven was working as a manager, official or proprietor.

FALSTAFF BEER

FALSTAFF BREWING COMPANY NOW THIRD LARGEST IN AMERICA !

Falstaff Brewing Corporation, since its founding in 1917 by the late Joseph Griesedieck, has grown from a small 300-barrel-a-day brewery to become one of the nation's leading brewers.

The picture was not always so bright for Falstaff, however, because only three years after the company began operation it was forced to close by the passage of the Volstead Act, which became effective in December of 1920.

Determined to keep the company alive, "Papa Joe" Griesedieck, as he was affectionately known throughout the industry, managed to keep his firm spoing through the prohibition era by producing non-alcoholic malt beverages and soft drinks. It has been said that these troubled times fostered and nourished the tenacity of spirit and will to succeed that has characterized the company's constant growth.

With the passage of the Repeal Amendment in 1933, Falstaff was the FIRST BREWERY IN AMERICA GRANTED A FEDERAL PERMIT TO PRODUCE BEER. With repeal began a record of company growth which has seen new production records established nearly every year.

The company took its first step toward de-centralization of production with the acquisition of a plant in Omaha, Nebraska in 1935.

By 1937 sales gains in the southern states made it necessary to set up another plant, in New Orleans. Today this plant is one of the South's largest and most modern breweries.

After the Second World War, in 1948, Falstaff purchased the Columbia Brewing Company in St. Louis and the company's record of growth continued. The San Jose plant was established in 1952, giving FALSTAFF coast-to-coast distribution for the first time.

In 1954 the firm acquired a plant in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and began to exploit new markets to the north. Also in this year civilian markets were opened in Hawaii, and FALSTAFF production topped 3 million barrles for the first time.

In 1956 the company purchased breweries in Galveston and El Paso, Texas, a state where Falstaff has long been a favorite.

The key to Falstaff's growth pattern has been the concentration of sales in depth fairly close to the point of production. When popularity of the product made it necessary to ship greater distances, another brewery would be acquired to serve the newly won territory.

At present, FALSTAFF IS DISTRIBUTED IN 28 STATES which encompass about 40 percent of the nation's total population. The present distribution pattern provides great selectivity as well as excellent potential for future marketing expansion.
