AAS 19-ASIAN AMERICAN HISTORY. WE ARE OFFERING TWO SECTIONS OF THIS CLASS ON MWF, AND TTH, BOTH AT NINE THIRTY A.M. THE CLASS IS A HISTORY COVERING THE ASIAN AMERICAN PAST FROM 1850 TO THE PRESENT. IT WILL COVER THE IMMIGRATION PATTERNS OF THE CHINESE, JAPANESE, PILIPINO AND PACIFIC ISLANDER GROUP. THIS CLASS ALSO FULFILLS THE REQUIREMENTS FOR HISTORY 17B, ONE OF THE G.E. REQUIREMENTS.

AAS 160-ASIAN AMERICAN WOMEN. THIS CLASS IS A SOCIOLOGICAL AND HISTORICAL STUDY OF THE ROLE AND CONDITION OF ASIAN WOMEN IN AMERICA WITH SPECIAL FOCUS ON THIER HISTORY UPON ARRIVAL IN AMERICA AND DIFFICULTIES IN ADJUSING. THE CLASS IS TAUGHT TTH AT EIGHT IN THE MORINING. IT ALSO FULFILLS ELECTIVE REQUIREMENTS FOR WOMEN'S STUDIES AND SOCIOLOGY.

AAS 183-ASIANS AND THE MASS MEDIA. THIS CLASS IS TAKING A HISTORICAL VIEW OF HOW ASIANS ARE TREATED IN THE MASS MEDIA THROUGH VIEWING OF FILMS AND TAPES. THE CLASS WILL FOCUS ON PSYCHOLOGICAL, SOCIOLOGICAL AND POLITICAL EFFECTS THE MEDIA HAS HAD ON SOCIETY AND ASIANS IN AMERICA. THE CLASS IS TAUGHT ON MONDAYS FROM TWO P.M. TO FOUR FORTY-FIVE P.M.

AAS 193-HISTORY OF THE PHILIPPINES. THIS CLASS IS A STUDY OF PILIPINO HISTORY TO THE SPANISH AMERICAN WAR (1898) WITH EMPHASIS ON SPANISH DOMINATION AND RULE, AND A STUDY OF PHILIPINO HISTORY SINCE 1898 EMPHASIZING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PHILIPPINES AND THE U.S. THE CLASS IS BEING OFFERED ON WEDNESDAYS FROM TWO P.M. TO FOUR FORTY-FIVE P.M.
