Dear Mrs. Clark:

Several months ago the Monday Club, a civic organization of San Luis Obispo, consisting of women who are working for the betterment of their community, wrote you, hoping for help in the erection of their club house. This building is needed not only by the Club as a work shop, but by the city as a community home. We have nothing to answer those needs at the present time.

We have our lot paid for - a most attractive site on upper Monterey Street, overlooking the old J. P. Andrews property.

Miss Julia Morgan, architect for the Hearst Estate, has offered to draw the plans and overlook the work during the erection of the building free of charge.

The structure is to cost \$16,000.00, and of that amount we have raised approximately \$10,000.00. We are trying to raise the balance thru loans, without interest. Cannot you see your way to make us a loan at this time, and help a fine group of women put over this project that will mean so much to your old home town?

Remember how hard it is to really accomplish things in San Luis Obispo, harder than any other city, I believe. Your help would be so appreciated. Remember too, it is not a gift, but a LOAN.
