While the rest of us were balancing our work lives, parenting and home responsibilities back in our pre-retirement years, Judy Smith was focused on balancing of another kind, and it continues to serve her well today.

Judy used to ride and dance bareback on a horse!

"I never fell off once," she says with a smile. "It was a wonderful feeling."

Judy, a Leisure Village resident since 1999, came to this risky business by marriage. Her husband was a professional horseman. Mark Smith performed in circuses as a young boy, trained horses (and riders) for the movies, entertained crowds at Knotts Berry Farm, and he gave lessons to aspiring equestrians of all ages. The base of

operation was his 10-acre ranch in Burbank, where he brought his new bride in 1965.

"I'd never been on a horse in my life," Judy recalls. "The first time I sat on a saddle I was scared to death. But Mark was a great teacher."

Judy had been a professional dancer years before, so she learned quickly and rode regularly around the ranch. She still remembers the moment that changed. She was watching Mark's relatives ride bareback at the ranch. Mark said, "Why don't you try it?" She did — successfully. The rest is a montage of Judy Smith riding bareback, dancing bareback, and loving it.

"We would put on shows on Saturday mornings at the ranch," Judy recalls. "We also performed at the Madonna Inn in San Luis Obispo. It was an

Village takes voting seriously; turnout exceeds 82 percent

Now that all the ballots have been counted from the November election, Leisure Village continues to be a standout for Ventura County electoral participation.

The voting booths in the AR — identified officially by the county recorder as Precincts 756 and 758 — were filled with 2,131 voters on Nov. 6. Only 444 Leisure Village residents who had registered to vote did not do so.

The LV turnout was

an impressive 82.66 percent, far ahead of Ventura County's total participation of 67.76 percent of eligible voters.

The LV precincts are divided by alphabet: No. 756 is for people whose names begin with A through F, No. 758 is for G through Z. The A-F Villagers outdid the G-Z voters 85.83 percent to 79.49 percent.

The county is divided into 630 precincts. Only 18 of those drew 80 percent


It's that time again — time to start getting ready for the holidays. I hope you are all able to breathe better so that you are able to enjoy having company or going to visit others.

Realtors Corner: Safety check

I'd like to continue from last month's article discussing safety items around the house.

Before a home can be sold, California law requires that the water heater be strapped to the wall with approved strapping and blocked from the heater to the wall in order to make certain it cannot move in the event of an earthquake. Here in Leisure Village most of the water heaters are in the garage. If so, it is also recommended that a heavy metal pole be installed into the garage floor to prevent a car from accidentally hitting the water

Another safety item which is highly recommended is GFCI (Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter)

outlets for any electrical outlet that is closer than six feet from any water source. These are the outlets that are usually found in home bathrooms which have the test and reset buttons. When there is any significant change in electrical resistance in the circuit, the GFCI "trips," much like a circuit breaker, immediately stopping the electrical supply to avoid electrocution. These should be in kitchens, bathrooms and garages. They are inexpensive and fairly easy for an electrician or handyman to install. They should be checked for proper operation on a regular basis.





And the response is multidimensional.

On the most basic level, each village is assigned at least one EPO Village Coordinator. (At the present time, there are openings for 10 coordinators; if interested contact Karen at 437-6782.)

There are approximately 50 Villagers who are CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) trained, and our Security personnel are, for the most part, trained in CPR and first aid.

In addition to all of the above people-oriented assets, Leisure Village has emergency supplies of water, generators and first-aid equipment

strategically placed around the development, most in trailers for ease of movement to where the supplies are needed.

In terms of connecting to the outside world, the EPO has prearranged with the Red Cross to use the AR as an emergency shelter.


And last, but very definitely not least, our Leisure Village ham radio club is prepared to provide communications with the outside world in the event of a catastrophic loss of telephone and cell phone communications.





200 attend 'Salute to Veterans' USO-styled show

Boosters' 2-hour program features Color Guard, clips of Bob Hope and Red Skelton, many patriotic songs

That Veterans Day is a widely celebrated holiday in Leisure Village should be no surprise given the large number of veterans of World War II, Korea, Vietnam and the Cold War who live here. So it was no surprise when the LV Boosters' "Salute To Veterans" show was attended by more than 200 veterans and their spouses.

The show, emceed by Lin Grant, was modeled after the USO shows that have entertained our troops around the world since the dark days of World War II.

In keeping with the spirit of the holiday, the show opened with a video clip of troops returning from Afghanistan, followed by a U.S. Navy Color Guard presenting the colors while the audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance and robustly sang "The Star-Spangled Banner."

The program then launched into the USO theme with pictures and an audio clip of Bob Hope entertaining the troops at a South Pacific naval hospital in August of 1944 followed by a video clip of Bob and company entertaining the troops in 1966 Vietnam. As old as these clips are, the jokes were every bit as funny today and the act every bit as appreciated.

The show continued with "home grown" Leisure Village talent as the LV Rhythmettes presented a melody of patriotic songs, including "Grand Old Flag" and "God Bless America." LV's own crooner, Al Botta, entertained with "The Tender Trap" and "This Love of Mine."

After a coffee and donut break (still in the time-honored tradition of the Red Cross and the USO), Lin presented a collage of current recruitment videos featuring the men and women of the Navy SEALs, the Air Force, Coast Guard, Merchant Marine and the oldest service of all, the Army. This was immediately followed by the veterans of the various services singing their own service hymns.

The two-hour program concluded with a video of Red Skelton explaining the real meaning of the words of the Pledge of Allegiance, and the audience joining in the singing of "God Bless The USA" and "God Bless America."

This is the third year that the Boosters Club has done a Veterans Day show. If you missed this one, be sure to mark your calendar for next year.
