

Fire Season Brings Concerns to Those With Special Medical Needs

We are fortunate to live in a community that understands there are those of us who have certain limitations. LV has many handicapped parking spaces, especially in the Rec Center east parking lot. Unfortunately, from time to time, they are used by residents who do not display the handicapped license or placard. Having a sore toe or a significantly high golf handicap does not mean the handicapped parking spaces are for you. California's handicapped parking rules are meant to ensure that only those with true disabilities have access to preferential parking spaces. The state has specific requirements for obtaining a handicapped placard or license plate. To qualify for one of these, an individual must have impaired mobility documented by a health care professional. While the law does not specifically address this circumstance, if your spouse is handicapped and is eligible for a placard but they are not in the vehicle with you, let someone genuinely eligible have the handicapped parking place. Be the good citizen!

It was several months ago when suggested preparations for the upcoming fire season were reported to Villagers – including emergency kits, a water supply, medications, and being alert for a PSPS, the Public Safety Power Shutoffs by Southern California Edison. In the last few weeks, the importance of being ready became real as fires whipped through areas in the state and the Power Shutoffs occurred for more than 600,000 Californians.

Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) could happen here, warned SoCal Edison in August. If conditions are dangerous due to a fire threat to electrical wires from high winds or dry vegetation, a Power Shutoff notification would go out, if time permits, both 48 and 24 hours prior to shutdown. And that potential danger has raised concerns among Villagers who require continuous power for medical conditions. The answer may be a home generator, and SoCal Edison may be able to cally in a power outage. They usually

financially assist those who qualify.

Backup power for special medical equipment can be provided by a generator that runs on gasoline or solar power. Portable generators can power appliances and electronics; they cost from \$500 to \$1500. Standby generators are permanent installations, usually powered by propane or natural gas that start automati-

cost around \$5000. Leisure Village has a permanent generator at the Association Office to power phones and emergency equipment.



A History of Marquardt's **Civil War History**

While it's true that the American Civil War ended with the fall of Atlanta in 1865, it started here at Leisure Village in 2013 with a talk on the battle of Gettysburg.

In attendance at that fledgling venture were 85 folks inside the Multi-Purpose Room. Seven lectures later, the annual event has blossomed to 175 rabid fans in the much larger AR venue. And it is all one big mistake, says Don Marquadt, LV resident, and resident Civil War lecturer.

"It was never my intention to do a series. I just picked Gettysburg because that is a battle most people would relate to, and that will be it. It won't happen again," he said, but he found that he had unwittingly created some history amorists.

NEW STREET SWEEPING SCHEDULE

LV's one-day street sweeping is here to stay. All Village streets will be done on the first and third Wednesday of each month. In November, the sweeper will clean the streets and parking lots on November 6 and 20. The "morning sweep" is from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in Villages 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28. 

How Your Cellphone Can Help **Locate Your Missing Keys**

■ The magic of Bluetooth trakers

A group of seniors are sitting in a classroom ready to listen to a lecturer. A sign is plastered on the wall above him, "Short-Term Memory Loss Support Group." The speaker begins his talk, "Good Evening. You're probably wondering why you just walked in this room." Sound familiar?

Have you ever torn your house apart hunting for your eyeglasses only to discover you are wearing them? I have good news for those looking for short term memory support. However, it's not a group that meets in the Leisure Village Recreation Center. Rather, your quest for missing items can be resolved by an electronic gadget.

Last Christmas I bought my wife a present that she needed more than she actually wanted. I purchased several Bluetooth trackers. Not too romantic, is it? Yet this tracker, made by Tile, is the best tracking tool for anyone wanting to keep their belongings safe and present. All you need to buy are the Tiles and download the Tile app on your smartphone to communicate with your missing belongings that have the Tile tracker attached.

For my wife, I dropped one Tile in her wallet where she keeps credit cards; the next Tile was attached to her keys and a third tracker went into her medicine pack. Now, when her car keys go missing, my spouse opens the Tile app on her phone. She then looks for the graphic symbolizing her keys, pushes the "find" button and a ringing sound on the other side of the house takes her to the precious keys.



Let's sum up what you should look for in a top-of-the-line

•Size: you don't want a tracker that is too big to attach to your items. Smaller and lighter is the optimum.

•Range: The farther the range, the more distance you can be from the tracker and still be able to locate your lost item.

•Volume: Be sure you purchase a tracker with lots of volume potential.

•Replaceable battery: this is not a must, but it sure is convenient to be able to replace the battery rather than the tracker itself.

For those of us experiencing a diminishing short term memory, these Bluetooth trackers can be a real time saver.

"I thought maybe we'd have 15 people there" for the first Gettysburg presentation in '13, but "We had 85," Marquardt said. "So, I had to do an encore where we had 55 more, and ever since then we have been (lecturing) in the AR."

it was the 150th anniversary of that 1863 battle (of Gettysburg)," Marqurdt said - and that got him to pondering: "What's the biggest battle of 1864, and that would be Cold Harbor with a 150 year anniversary in 2014, followed by the battle of Appomattox in 2015. And, suddenly

"I got no place to go, as the war and Vicksburg this past August. was to end shortly thereafter."

So, in 2016 a presentation embracing the assassination of Lincoln was accomplished. "And then I'm truly out – there's nothing after that.'

But his LV history buff partisans continued their hunger for Civil War stories. "Fans - I call them The thing about 2013 is that my groupies – are saying, "What are you going to do next, Don?"

While the main force of the war (about 90%) was fought in the state of Virginia, an on-going Western War was simultaneously underway in Tennessee and Mississippi.

And that is how we found out about the battles of Shiloh in 2017

The battle of Gettysburg was revisited in 2018, a discourse Marquardt labeled 'the rest of the story' - the battle as incorporated with Lincoln's Gettysburg Address.

To be traversed next year is the battle of Chattanooga, a third Western War clash. "Then I'll do the Battle of Atlanta, and that's where the west war and main war come together because by that time Sherman is down through the south and has absorbed both armies."

With the completion of the Battle of Atlanta in 2021, Marquardt's lecture plans for years beyond remain a question.

Do You Drink Enough Water?

It used to be easy enough to follow the old eight-glasses-of-water a day rule, but the power of hydration is so important, especially in the golden years, that fresh research has amended the rule for everyone's benefit. When we consume the water does matter!



Jumpstart your hydration with a 16-ounce glass of room temperature water when you first awaken every morning. Helpful tip: Have the water at your bedside overnight, to drink up within the first ten minutes of morning consciousness. This early daily practice first thing in the morning will help your body start off with enough fluid to feed your kidneys, according to the British researchers from Loughborough University.

Older research on this subject did not take into account other beverages that contribute to hydration such as coffee, tea, and other drinks. Consider all these as just 22% of the

water you get in a day. Plus, you have to take your activity level into account – the more you exercise or sweat, the more fluids you need to replace.

•The power of hydration protects your heart. When you are dehydrated, your blood thickens, which puts more demands on your heart because it has to work harder pumping dehydrated blood through your veins.

•The power of hydration is central to how your body maintains a safe temperature. High activity can lose over eight cups of water in an hour.

•The power of hydration improves thinking; increases alertness and the ability to concentrate. In a state of dehydration, on the other hand, one can trigger headaches and migraines, as observed and reported following important studies conducted at the City of London Migraine Clinic.

And you can have my heart


