## CHURCH SERVICES


The work of the Christian church in the Center was established for the purpose of gaining deeper understanding of the human situation and firmer undergirding of the faith in the Redeemer that can stand in this tragic day, and of making this life an experiment and practice of Christian brotherhood.

The staff of the Christian group included four pastors: Rev. K. Inori, Rev. T. Sakaguchi, Rev. H. Hashimoto and Major M. Imai. The pastors took turns at preaching at the various services, such as the Morning meditation, which was held for both the issei and nisei groups at the Center Bowl on Sunday mornings; Japanese worship service; Adult Bible class; Wednesday evening prayer meetings; English worship services. The office secretary was Yeiko Dakuzaku, and John Tamura, office assistant.

The Center Administration has provided a Christian office, equipped with tables, files, shelves, chairs and other office facilities.

The Sunday school was started on May 24 with an attendance of about 150 students, and later increased to 336 pupils. The Sunday school instructors are: Mrs. Sugimoto, Fumi Mikami, Mary Mochizuki, Mrs. Kasai, Mrs. Kobayashi, Julia Dakuzaku, Tsuyu Abo, Sumi Sahara, Shige Matsuyama, Fujiyo Tahara, June Masuda, Matsu Mawaki, Goro Asaki, Shizu Dakuzaku, Mitsu Sayegusa, Ernest Takoda, Mrs. Koda, Harvey Aki, Soichi Mikami, Rev. H. Hashimoto, Rev. T. Sakaguchi, Rev. K. Inori, and Major M. Imai, Mrs. Akamine, Mrs. A. Tsukamoto, Ted Ono and Beatrice Tamura have also taught.

The Christian Youth Fellowship is loosely organized and takes charge of the evening young peoples meetings. Soichi Mikami,



former Fresno Sectional Y.P.P.C. head, is the chairman, and Grace Mano, secretary. The Christian choir was organized by Mary Kasai, and has participated in many services.

Fortunately, the Christians were provided by the outside Fresno Sunday schools and endeavorers who sent progressive up-to-date Sunday school materials and provided flowers for the services. Dwight Trowbridge and the Christian Businessmen's Association have provided a piano, piano tuning, portions of the Bible, and other such materials.

Christian work in the Center began while the evacuation was in progress, and the first meeting was held on May 17 at which time Dr. W. P. Rankin, of the First Methodist Church, preached.
