having a pleasant time - let us hear
of July animals you - if you incline to
drop - I believe I will visit Emma
and I want to tellies wedding -
Emma's little case is not healing
as rapidly as we wish. Margaret

is disgustingly cross - yesterday your
Grandma went down stairs and
walked over to the back fence and
up stairs - then down to lunch - at
night she was very tired - and today
sick in bed. As Dettor received to-
day from Pam tells that they got
there safely, are dissatisfied in
the place - no deer - in two hours
they caught 60 fish some quite large
ones. the house is only a three room
cabin and only an old man &
woman and one child in family
mail only once a week. his gun
would not work. I sent him by mail
a new trigger for it. I do not
know what was the matter with
young Herbert Thomsen - I enclose
you in this ten dollars so you will
have enough to pay Art's bill
and ask her to send or give
you your and Sam's bill and
your Pa will send it up later.
