JOSE FAJARDO was born in Guane-Provencia Pinar Del Rio, CUBA on October 19, 1919.

His professional career began some forty-five years ago, playing flute with an orchestra that consisted of his own family. Led by his father, ALBERTO FAJARDO, who was a great, well-known clarinetist in his own right, this musical family had his sister, HILDA FAJARDO on piano, brother ALBERTO on violin and JOSE himself on flute.

He soon struck out on his own and played with many bands, the most notable being the Cuban "ORQUESTA TIPICIA", which was also known as the "Orquesta De Viento" because of its wide use of horns before the evolution of Charanga music as it is known today. Horns are no longer an internal part of Charanga music, with the emphasis being on flute and violins. After having played Cuban Charanga music in many

countries and large cities for years, FAJARDO feels today it is refining itself to a good sound. In 1975 FAJARDO signed a longterm recording contract and became part of the COCO RECORDS family. His first album on the Coco label, "LA RAIZ DE LA CHARANGA" was produced by HARVEY AVERNE and has enjoyed tremendous popularity. FAJARDO has recently completed an album entitled "EL TALEN-TO TOTAL" and the title exemplifies his total talent — band leader, flutist, he also composed and arranged all the songs on this LP. The album produced by RAY BARRETTO in association with HARVEY AVERNE, is a blend of traditional Charanga music with today's modern sounds.

Today, JOSE FAJARDO is firmly established as an institution in Charanga music. There are few fathers in todáy's Latin Music, and FAJARDO is one.

QUAKES NEW COACH: TERRY FISHER

The Earthquakes have a new head coach, and while he's not making the campaign promises reserved for politicians coaches, his enthusiasm jolts one

into BIG thoughts.

Terry Fisher, 28 years old and the youngest head coach in professional sports, was named to the San Jose coaching position on June 19. The new leader immediately set forth his goals at a press conference held at the Le-Baron Hotel.

"We must get the team's enthusiasm back and get the best things out of the best people," Fisher commented. "There is sufficient talent on this team to make a run at the playoffs, but it is up to them, and it will be my challenge to see that we get there.

The stocky blonde has coached in the North American Soccer League for three and a half seasons prior to joining the Quakes, all of that experience with the rival Los Angeles Aztecs. In 1975, 1976 and 1977 the Aztecs qualified for league playoffs under the guidance of Fisher. Last season's Aztecs squad led the NASL in total goals, scoring an impressive 65 goals in 26 contests.

Before Fisher was offered his chance to coach professional', he was a very successful head coach in the college ranks. In 1972, at Whittier College in Southern California, Fisher coached the varsity squad to an 11-3-2 mark, good enough for the conference championship and qualification in the NAIA tournament. The following season Fisher was offered

and accepted the head duties with UCLA Bruins where he earned marks of 19-1-4 and 15-3-4 over two seasons. Both campaigns saw the Bruins qualify for the final-four tournament.

"I despise defensive soccer," says Fisher. "I have an attacking philosophy which has worked in the past and I see no reason to change that here. Why lose 1-0? Why not 7-6? I believe in putting opposing teams, especially when we are at home, under pressure."



Fisher's challenge in San Jose is a long - term opportunity, according to Earthquakes owner Tony Kovac. For the 1978 season, there are 12 games remaining in the regular season and seven of those are at home. Fisher is honest and forthright and looks forward to building the Quakes squad into a winning team. More goals and more wins, that's what Mr. Fisher is all about.





RICARDO CERATTO/ BIOGRAFIA

Ricardo nació en Loma Alta, un pequeño pueblo de la provincia de Santa Fe, en Argentina. Desde muy pequeño sintió vocación por la música, a la vez que le atraia el acordeón como nada en el mundo. Su primer acordeón fue regalo de su abuelo, cuando apenas tenía 10 años. En poco tiempo ya tocaba de oido varias canciones populares. Más tarde formó parte de un grupo musical; y el pequeño acordeonista ya era acontecimiento en la ciudad de Gálvez, cerca de Loma Alta.

Tiempo despues emprendió la aventura que sería definitiva en su carrera: viajar a Europa. Llego a España con solo 50 pesetas, le costó abrirse camino, hasta que consiguió formar parte de una orquesta que tocaba en en centro

nocturno.

Ricardo Ceratto empezaba a dar sus primeros pasos como cantante e interprete del acordeón, instrumento del que ya se le consideraba un virtuoso. En España consiguió convertirse en un buen fabricante de canciones, que le abrió las puertas como autor, después de cinco años de continua luchaafirma Ceratto. A partir de entonces empezó a escribir con mayor empeño hasta situarse como compositor de fama con un primer lugar en popularidad.

Los Festivales ayudaron definitivamente a consolidar su reputacion como compositor de renombre. El de Mallorca por ejemplo, durante cuatro años consecutivos, le otorgó el primer premio 10 como la mejor canción de Autor

Hispanoamericano, y un primer premio también para otra de sus canciones, interpretada por el italiano Tony Dallara. En el Festival del Atlántico, en Tenerife (Canarias) obtuvo también el primer lugar. En el Festival de Miño de Grese (Galicia) se llevo el primero y el segundo lugar. En 1969 el primer lugar de Eusovisión. En el III Festival OTI junto con Nidia Caro ganó el primer lugar con la canción "HOY CANTO POR CANTAR" con la cual se dió a conocer en México.

Inmediatamente popularizó en México, Estados Unidos, Puerto Rico y Latinoamerica, los temas "QUE MAS DA", "ME ESTOY



ACOSTUMBRANDO "UN MINUTO DE SILENCIO", "EXCESO DE EQUIPAJE". etc. que lo llevaron a la cúspide de su carrera ya no sólo como compositor sino tambien como interprete.

Acaba de salir al mercado el cuarto Long Play de RICARDO CERATTO, que promete ser un éxito más en su larga carrera

artística.

Acupuncture

Acupuncture is a medical procedure in which hair-thin needles are inserted in the body at certain well-defined points. It has become the preferred method of anesthesia in China.

Utilizing acupuncture as the only pain-killer, major operations are performed on conscious patients. The Medical Tribune reported: "Dr. White and Dr. Diamond, both cardiologists, watched open heart surgery in Peking with acupuncture anesthesia. They said that the patient was awake, alert, relaxed during surgery, and that the surgery was performed as well as any they had ever seen.

In an attempt to explain some of these mystifying aspects of pain, a "gate theory" has been offered. Opening and closing of a so-called "gate" in the spinal cord is said to either permit or block passage of pain signals to the brain. Conversely, the brain initiates impulses to the appropriate motor nerves which function to control and coordinate the whole physiological system. It may seem simple to explain acupuncture in terms of the human nervous system, but in practice, the routes of the impulses follow what is called the meridian system. The meridian system consists of 12 pairs of main meridians, each of the 12 paired meridians is associated with a particular physiological unit of the body. The units are the 12 basic organs distinguished in Chinese medicine: the lungs, heart, large intestine, the small intestine, kidbladder, stomach. the spleen, the pericardium, the gall-



bladder, and the liver. There are 365 acupuncture points over the meridians, half of them lie above the nerve fibers and the other half being as close as within 1/2 cm.

Thus, it is thought, acupuncture may prevent undergoing open heart surgery, by triggering impulses that close the spinal-cord gate to block pain signals from

reaching the brain.

Acupuncture is but one of four traditional Chinese medical sciences, the other three are herbiology, massage, and cupping. Trained Chinese acupuncturist are skilled in all four healing arts. There are four methods of diagnosing a disease in Chinese medicine. They are examinations by observation, listening, interrogation and pulse diagnosis

Observation is based on the physical appearance of the patient including the face, eyes, and tongue. Listening is based on the breath and the voice. The purpose of interrogation is to take into consideration the history and symptoms of the illness. Instead of giving the disease a name, the Chinese doctor will study the pulses and so determine what kind of treatment is needed to restore these two forces in balance.

The pulse diagnosis is both a science and an art. Figure 2 describes how pulse diagnosis works, though in actual practice, it can only be satisfactorily learned by careful judgment and accumulated experience.

Of the four methods, the last one is most important and the other three are just to help confirm the findings from the pulse

diagnosis.

Acupuncture has no equivalent

and is, therefore, at first glance, often regarded as rather foreign and highly suspicious. It seems strange if not impossible, that a thin needle placed in the skin can actually cure diseases and kill pain. Acupuncture has been successful in treatments of weight control, nervousness, insomnia, allergy, migrain headaches, sinusitism, arthritis, back problem, hypertension and digestive problems.

The Justices are appointed by the President. Sometimes their policies outlive them.

The prresent Court, the Burger Court (after Chief Burger) is also known as the Nixon Court.

Thehe are nine Justices sitting. Two more have courtesy chambers in the Washington D.C. building, although they are retired.

The nine Justices are attended by 36 Court clerks who are the cream of top law graduates. Approximately 30,000 new lawyers obtain their diplomas each year. There are no blacks or Hispanics among the 36.

Is this dame color blind as well? Perhaps it is the Nixon

Court that is color blind.

The court's decision in the Bakke case created tidal waves, with vast and diverse interpretations of the six separate opinions

given in 154 pages.

As interpreters of the Constitution, these nine Justices form the court of last resort. Yet . . . if the so-called American Dream were a reality . . . if we had a fair-minded society without prejudice or malice toward some (to paraphrase Lincoln) . . . would not students be admitted in direct

proportion to their numbers in that society?

Were it done this way, the Supreme Court would not have 17

needed to give six separate opinions in 154 pages about a 38-yearold engineer named Bakke, white, with point 3.5 grades. claimed he was not admitted to the school of Medicine in Davis because his place was given to a less qualified member of a racial minority in a now unlawful quota program.

Perhaps fortunately for us, the nine Justices have recessed and "gone to the hills" . . . but only after:

* "Saying no" to seven dirty words ever being broadcasted over the airwaves which are supposedly owned by US (not U.S., but you and me).

* Ruling that government need not disclose information it prefers to with-hold. A kind of "it's none of your business" to public whose taxes pay expenses and salaries of those who sit in the seats of power.

Too bad for Mr. Nixon this ruling was not in effect at the

time of Watergate.

*—Ruling that reporters may be made to disclose their sources of information and that-with a search warrant—their files may be examined.

*_Ruling that state courts may

gag hostile witnesses.

All these rulings were major defeats to a FREE PRESS.

For the record, those Justices who voted that Bakke must be admitted to med-school were:

1—CHIEF JUSTICE WARREN BURGER (who once was picketed simultaneously by "right to life" anti abortion demonstrators and by gay liberation groups).

2—JUSTICE JOHN PAUL STE-VENS, 56, the latest appointee.

18 3—POTTER STEWAR, 62, Presi-

dent Eisenhower's fifth and last Court appointee (in 1958).

4—WILLIAM REHNOUIST, 52. youngest of the nine Justices who was appointed by Richard Nixon in 1972.

5—LEWIS POWELL, 69, also a Nixon appointee who sided with the other four on grounds that UC Davis School of Medicine had failed to prove to the court that Bakke would have been barred had there been on minority admission program.

THE MINORITY OPINION:

That Bakke should not be admitted to the School of Medicine was expressed by these four judges:

1—THURGOOD MARSHALL. 68, the first black ever appointed to the court (by LBJ) in 1969). 2—WILLIAM BRENNAN, 70, appointed in 1957 and now in his 21st year on the bench, and thus the Court's senior member.

3-BYRON WHITE, 59, former All-American football star at Colorado University (where he was known as "Whizzer") ... He was appointed by President John

F. Kennedy.

4-HARRY BLACKMUN, 68, a lover of brevity fond of quoting Justice Holmes, who said simply to his colleagues on the day of his retirement. "I won't be here tomorrow."



Another program offered is coordination of community services to help meet the needs of cardiac and stroke patients through information and referral services. People with special needs are brought in contact with the agency qualified to help them.


There also are school health programs designed to assist school elementary, secondary and college levels, by furnishing guidance and educational materials on cardiovascular disease.

The Chicano is an individual of Mexican descent that represents today a new ethnic breed. He is the product of the Mexican-American that roamed this country only a few short years ago.

The Mexican-American himself was the direct descendant of the "Spanish" now an extinct species that inhabited the Southwest for several generations.

The metamorphosis from "Spanish" to Chicano took place in the amazingly short period of 15 years because examples of the "Spanish" species were quite prevalent in this valley as late as the early 1960s.

The "Spanish" species in its time existed in a hostile environment and had to maintain a delicate social balance in order to survive. For the aspiring "Spanish" individual it required that he undergo a radical behavorial change in order to leave the barrios for the more affluent Anglo-Saxon residential areas, and the prune orchards for the blue and white collar jobs in industry for government.

This social change was not an easy one, it required first of all total abstention from speaking Spanish in public, avoidance of being seen with other Mexicans, and most important, Anglizing the spelling of his first name and the pronunciation of his last name.

If he could change the spelling of his last name to make it look and sound Italian or Portuguese, so much the better were his chances of acceptance in the Anglo world.

Life was not easy for the "Span-

ish" in those days. He lived under constant fear of exposure. Especially if he was blonde or fair skinned and could pass as an An-

If he was dark completed "Mexican-like," and he had been able to Anglicize enough to be "accepted," the problem of being exposed did not really exist because everybody knew he was Mexican, only that no one ever talked about it. The situation became uncomfortable at times, anyway.



Nevertheless, in order to keep his near-Anglo status, he had to keep his distance from the other Mexicans and never divulge or give away his Mexican customs such as bringing tacos to work in his lunch pail or biting into a green chile in front of everybody when he ate his lunch.

Then a social conscience began to develop in the nation in the early 1960s. The civil rights movement had by then taken a strong hold in our society and the "colored people" were making fast gains. It was the era of liberalism and ethnic tolerance.

These social changes brought a sudden end to the remaining "Spanish" species that were already by that time disappearing because government and agencies at all levels began to focus their attention to our needs and soon there was diversity of community action programs that put the "sleeping gian" on his feet and ready to go.

The era of the Mexican-American was short but very significant in the impact it had on the cultural, economic, and political

status of the group.

The Mexican-American began



in large numbers and reappearing as Mexican-Americans.

Massive federal grants began to flow in, justified by the number of Mexican-Americans unemployed, school dropouts, in poverty, etc.

Mexican - American leadership began to appear in unprecedented numbers. At last it became clear we were Mexican-Americans, and we had been deprived of our rights for generations, and now our time had come to speak out and demand what was rifhtfully ours.

Things worked out rather well

to learn how to play the game of how to get the most mileage out of what had apparently been liabilities in the past.

Knowleage of good Spanish and Mexican culture became popular and these were surfaced to develop ethnic pride. Long lost Mexican-Americans began to return to the flock.

About the same time that the "colored people" became "blacks, the Mexican-Americans became Chicanos.

These were primarily young Mexican-Americans that con- 25

stituted a totally new breed. They were the result of an unstable and precarious melting of the Spanish conquest, geography, racial discrimination and cultural residuals from Mexico.

The Chicano today is a schizolingual and he can mix English and Spanish in every sentence and effectively relay his message to his fellow Chicanos. He also has combined U.S. and Mexican culture plus something of his own into a unique Chicano culture.

Now for the first time, the individual of Mexican origin in this country feels ethnic pride and he can be himself. He is confident in his abilities and is making good use of them to advance his socio-

economic status

Chicanos are graduating from colleges and universities in record numbers, more are going into businesses and professions.

Chicano is now involved in politics and in organizations designed to bring about civic changes that will better meet his needs.


Once the Chicano has made it socially and economically and has gained enough confidence and pride in himself, what happens next? Where does he go from

there?

I believe the Chicano era will disappear when that happens. Our people of Mexican descent in this country, no doubt, will continue to change, but the change will probably be in more than one direction and not necessarily as a

It also won't be in the direction of Anglo-Saxon conformity, but rather in a direction that will ultimately blend and merge into a way of living that is distinctly "American." whatever

means.




