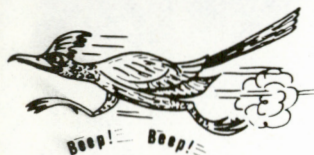

PREREGISTRATION

Preregistration of continuing students for the Fall Quarter takes place May 12-25.
