**MAJOR AND MINOR**

A health education major for the bachelor of arts degree consists of 30 units of which 18 are upper division; and a minor consists of 18 units of which nine are upper division. One-half of the major or minor requirements must be selected from courses carrying a health education designation. The remaining units may be selected from the courses in the basic biological sciences, family life education, nutrition, and mental health. Consult the department adviser for program planning.

**MASTER OF ARTS DEGREE**

**JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL CREDENTIAL**

The junior high school credential authorizes the holder to serve as a teacher in grades seven, eight, and nine of elementary and secondary schools. For general and professional requirements, see page 151.

The junior high school credential major in health education is the same as the portion of the general secondary credential major in this field which is required for the degree major; the minor is the same as the general secondary credential minor.

**GENERAL SECONDARY CREDENTIAL**
