

High-tech gadget expected to reduce LV's electricity bills

Leisure Village is about to get a new demand controller.

And, exactly what is a demand controller? It is a high-tech gadget that the Clean Energy Committee found to further reduce our electricity costs.

The problem lies once again in that the Association is billed as a business. Without going into too much detail, we pay

for electricity based on peak demand, with a premium for summertime use. The higher a short-term spike in usage, the higher the cost. Couple that with the fact that there are 27 different air conditioners in the Recreation Center facility and you have a mind-boggling, complex problem to manage to prevent too many of the AC units from running at one

Looking Back: 'Curse You, Jack Dalton'





There is a hidden treasure open for discovery in our lovely Camarillo neighborhood.

Recently, the Village Arts club took a tour of the Studio Channel Islands Art Center Gallery (SCIART) and several studios where the resident artists maintain their creative workspaces. Located in Old Town Camarillo at 2222 Ventura Blvd., in grammar school classrooms that have been converted for artists, it is a cultural hub with 20 studios shared by 40 working artists. Several of these artists have come to Leisure Village to demonstrate their crafts at the Village Arts meetings.

It is a non-profit art and education center founded in 1997 on the campus of California State University Channel Islands (CSUCI), and it moved to its more accessible location in 2010.

The Art Center Gallery was kind enough to offer the Village Arts group an opportunity for membership.

This will allow the club members to occasionally display their work at a place in the gallery designated for that purpose and will also provide a discount for individual members. Club members may be asked to volunteer at the gallery. Membership also affords an opportunity to participate in their web site.

At their next general meeting, the club will vote on the option offered. What a great opportunity for the Village Arts club members to feature their work in a local gallery.

On the first Saturday of each month, artists open their studios to visitors and will meet and talk with them while they practice their craft.

With a broad range of mediums, one might see actor and artist Daniel Stern working on his bronze sculpture, Christine Leong on her Chinese brush painting, another artist sitting at her loom weaving cotton





## Villagers help rescue stranded cormorant



On the way back, Jean asked her friend Ed, "What should we name the cormorant?" Without hesitation, Ed replied, "Arnold." Of course! He was found right off Arnold Road.

What was a casual and almost uneventful stroll on the beach turned out to be an adventure for the three friends.

We are happy to report that Arnold the Cormorant is in Santa Barbara at a sea and shorebird rehabilitation center.





school students from military families. "These kids have challenges that other students don't," she explains.

Their families move a lot, which means they can get behind in schoolwork. And when a parent is deployed, it can be very difficult for the child.

"They sometimes need to talk about not having their parent at home. I remember one student who unexpectedly burst into tears. It was his birthday, and his Mom wasn't there to celebrate with him," Sharon says. "Helping those kids is very rewarding."

Sharon Jones is also part of an award-winning American Legion team of - you'll never guess - coupon clippers.

"This is serious," she says emphatically. "Military families, particularly those in the lower ranks, don't make a lot of money. So we collect coupons and send them to bases all over the world to help those families stretch their food budgets when they shop in the commissaries.'

In 2011, the Camarillo American Legion Auxiliary chapter was honored as the California post that sent the most coupons to military bases. Sharon laughs as she admits that "all that cutting can be tedious. Then we get letters from base commanders thanking us, and it's all worthwhile."

How worthwhile?

Last month alone, the local group sent \$16,000 worth of coupons to a U.S. base in Japan. Sharon reports that some of her LV friends and neighbors add their coupons to the effort. No word on whether they arrive clipped or not.

Sharon's volunteer work also looks to the future. She helps select exemplary girls to attend Girls State, a 60-year-old American Legion program designed to educate and inspire today's young women to become tomorrow's leaders. Girls chosen from 500 California high schools participate in the weeklong course in government held at Claremont McKenna College. "Locally, we interview candidates, then choose one from each of our six high schools," Sharon explains. "The girls are bright, ambitious, and interested in political life. One of them could become the first female president."

Sharon's committee chose Lindsay Schillo from Thousand Oaks High School for this year's Girls State held in June.

"It blew my mind," Lindsay reports. "I learned so much about government. The week was very inspirational. It made me more confident and much more informed about how our political system can and should work."

That enthusiasm makes Sharon smile. Motivated teens, comforted students or mountains of grocery coupons all remind her that she is making a difference.

## Shop Ahoy helps homebound

Shop Ahoy is a shopping and delivery service for homebound seniors and disabled adults. The volunteer-based, non-profit group also serves those people who no longer drive, have difficulty maneuvering through Vons or are unable to carry heavy items.

A volunteer will call the customer

on Sunday or Monday of each week to take their grocery order. Another volunteer shops on Tuesdays at our local Vons, and the order is delivered and paid for, along with a small contribution to help the system stay in operation.
