ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OXNARD PROVIDING FOR SALARIES FOR MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL.

The City Council of the City of Oxnard does ordain as follows:

PART 1. Ordinance No. 986 and Sections 2-2 through 2-2.6 of the Oxnard City Code are repealed.

PART 2. Sections 2-2 through 2-2.6 are reenacted and added to the Oxnard City Code to read as follows:

Sec. 2-2. Salaries of Councilmen.

Sections 2-2 through 2-2.6 are enacted pursuant to Sections 36516 through 36516.5 of the Government Code authorizing the payment of salary to members of the City Council based on the population of the City as determined by estimates made by the State Department of Finance.

Sec. 2-2.1. Same--Population.

For the purpose of establishing salaries pursuant to Section 36516 of the Government Code, the population of the City of Oxnard is estimated to be 92,001.

Sec. 2-2.2. Same--Amount of Base Salary.

Each member of the City Council is entitled to receive as a base salary pursuant to Section 36516 of the Government Code the amount of \$300 per month.

Sec. 2-2.3. Same--Adjustment.

In addition to base salary pursuant to Section 36516.2 of the Government Code, each member of the City Council is entitled to receive \$90,

representing a five percent per year adjustment for the six years since the last salary adjustment which occurred after the councilmanic election in 1972.

Sec. 2-2.4. Same--Additional for Mayor.

In addition to the base salary and adjustment authorized for each councilman, pursuant to Section 36516.1 of the Government Code, the Mayor is entitled to receive \$

Sec. 2-2.5. Same--Separate from Reimbursements.

The salaries prescribed herein are and shall be exclusive of any amounts payable to each member of the council as reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred by him in the performance of official duties for the city.

Sec. 2-2.6. Same--Operative Date.

The compensation authorized by Sections 2-2.2 through 2-2.4 shall be operative and payable on and after the date upon which one or more members of the city council begins a new term of office following the general municipal election on March 7, 1978.

PART 3. That within fifteen days after passage the City

Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City. Ordinance No. _______, was first on _________, 1978, to become effective thirty days thereafter.
