Dear Mr. President:

As County and State Central Committeemen in California who are loyal Democrats, pledged by personal commitment and by law to support the Democratic Party and its candidates, we feel compelled to alert you to the serious deterioration of the party in California resulting from widespread dissatisfaction with our continued, increasing military involvement in Vietnam.

In our judgment the only action which can avert major Democratic party losses in this state in 1968 is an immediate all-out effort to secure a non-military settlement of the Vietnam war.

While in the nature of the case this letter may receive public attention, it is not part of our intent to publicize it. Our concern is to acquaint you as leader of our party, as well as our nation, with the facts as we see them. We are aware of the difficulty of your position and hope that you may, by reason of this message, be made more aware of the difficulty of our position.
