General manager gives latest on FEMA

The new flood plain maps were enacted on Jan. 20, 2010, by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The new flood plain includes Villages 1 through 31, which is approximately 60 percent of the entire project. All federally backed mortgages, such as FHA, Fannie May and Freddie Mac, require flood insurance not to exceed \$250,000.

The U.S. Congress passed a bill in December 2010 to extend the preferred rates on flood insurance as of Jan. 1, 2011, for two more years. If

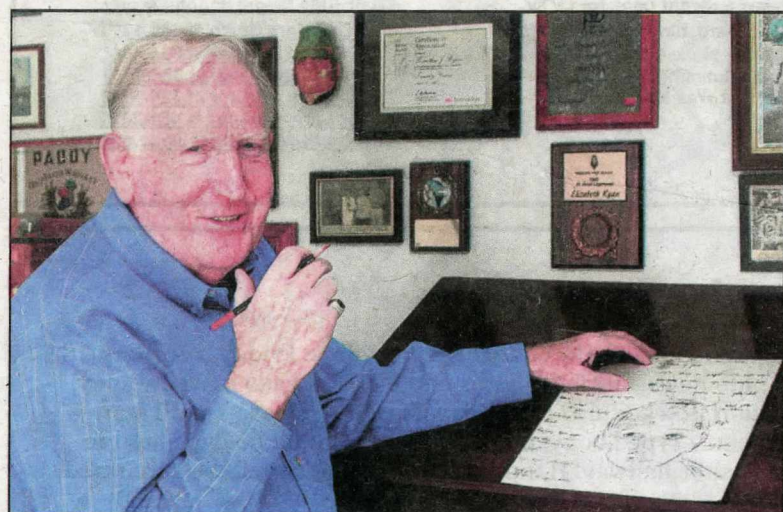

to please. We could play with a ball for hours," he remembers. "But there was no money for education, and there were no jobs."

So, as a teenager, he left home and went to London alone.

"I applied for the first job I saw and got it. The boss apologized that he only paid 10 pounds a week for a warehouseman. I was thrilled, and it changed my life," he remembers.

What followed Ted calls the Luck of the Irish. It also sounds a lot like the American Dream. He worked hard in London, fell in love with an Irish lass named Kathleen, and in 1963, they married and came to the U.S. They settled in Orange County because that's where her sister lived. Ted got a job, earned his high school diploma, a degree from Cal State Fullerton at night, and began a 22-year career with 3M Corporation in product design.

He and Kathleen raised three children in Anaheim.

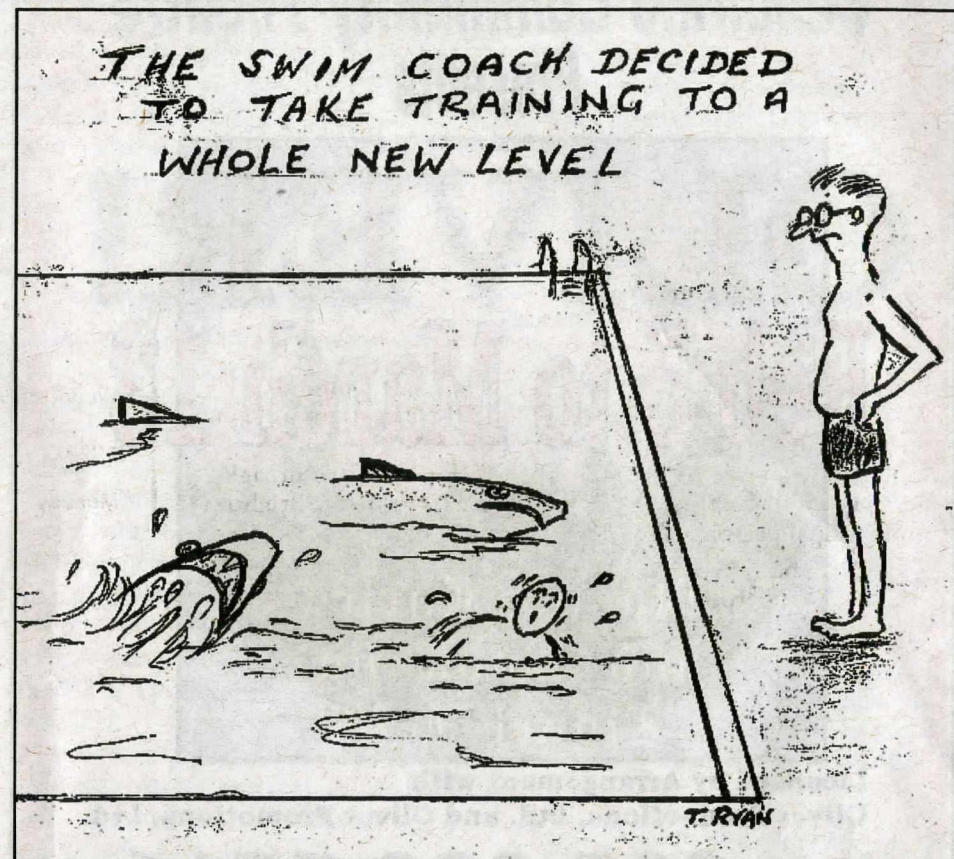
"It was a working-class, diverse neighborhood. All the kids hung out at our house. It was great," Ted recalls. "You don't have to be rich to succeed. The whole group went to college and are now successful professionals. We all stay in touch."

Choosing retirement in 1999 was easy for Ted. Selling that home of 40 years and moving was not.

But the Ryans wanted to be closer to their daughter, who lives in Camarillo. So nearly six years ago, they bought their Leisure Village home.

"We haven't regretted it for a minute," they say.

Ted swims an hour a day, bowls weekly, tends his roses, draws in charcoal and paints in oil. Now he will also be watching the Village and us for moments that can make us smile.

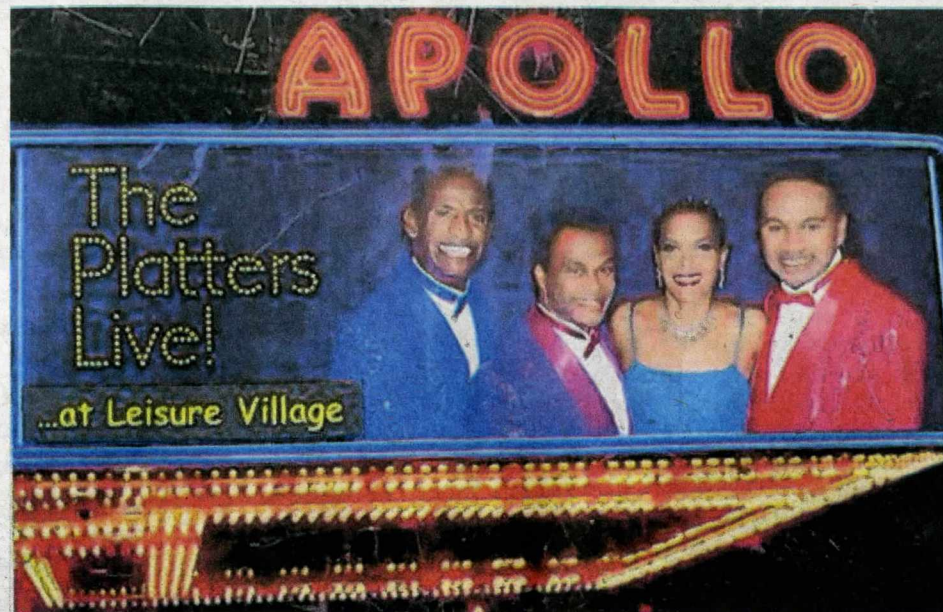
We have completed our 2010 shows very successfully and hope you all enjoyed them as much as we did putting them on for you.

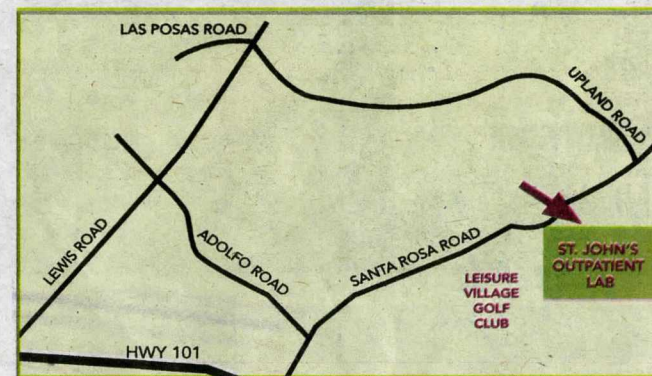

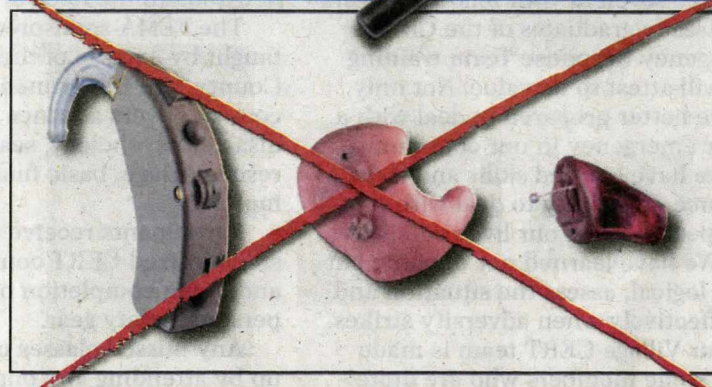

Training will be held Mondays, from March 7 to April 25 with April 4 off, from 6:30 to 9 p.m. in the MPR.

Sixty-seven of your fellow Villagers are already graduates of the Citizen Emergency Response Team training and will attest to its value. Not only are we better prepared to deal with a major emergency in our community, but we have learned skills and hints to enhance our ability to deal with those unexpected turns our lives take as we age. We have learned not to panic but to be logical, assess the situation and act effectively when adversity strikes.

Our Village CERT team is made up of some members who are quite capable physically, others are less so, but all are now better equipped to deal with emergencies as they might happen. We are members of a caring,

supportive family and we would like you to join us.

You are under no obligation to participate in anything CERT even after graduating from the class. It is most important for you to learn how to prepare for emergencies and to care for yourself, your family and your neighbors if the need arises.

The FEMA-sponsored program, taught by experts of the Ventura County Fire Department all over the county, covers advance planning, disaster psychology, search and rescue, triage, basic first aid and more.

Participants receive the standardized CERT course manual and, upon completion of all classes, personal safety gear.

Any missed classes can be made up by attending any ongoing CERT program in Ventura County.

Volunteer committee saves Village thousands of dollars a year

For the past three years, the Purchase Research Committee has put a lot of energy into researching money-saving projects for Leisure Village. This year we really hit the jackpot! PRC was asked by General Manager Bob Scheaffer to look into our annual lawn spraying contract, which is up for renewal in the next couple months. It is the biggest one of the year at \$446,000 and includes herbicides, fertilizers and overseeding for our 186 acres of lawn.

The committee worked closely

with our landscape manager, Mike Udem, to get specifications and then went to work. A PRC subcommittee was formed, and each member brought in their special expertise: Claudia Balke, financial and legal; Anna Harrington, her knowledge from being a sustainable landscape consultant and designer; Melinda Wells, landscape and purchasing; Tim Hughes, the managerial and telephone interviewing skills; and Ivan Bjel, the management and purchasing.

Our goal was to find qualified suppliers who could do a quality job

while saving our homeowners money.

Each vendor spent several hours looking at our property to determine the best way to maintain and improve LV landscape. After thoroughly checking their references from country clubs, resorts, cities, universities and other HOAs, we found four highly qualified vendors to compete for the contract.

The committee collected the data from all the vendors and handed the Board of Directors a 60-page report that recommends and details savings from \$70,000 to \$125,000 per year,

which the Board gladly accepted.

This report not only documents how we can save a substantial amount of money, it also shows ways to keep our lawns beautiful while making the process less polluting, which means it will be safer for people and pets.

For the committee members, it was exciting and rewarding to see that their work could help the Village. The time spent was well worth it, considering the potential savings to Leisure Village.

Share this treat with people you love this Valentine's Day! Technically this makes 12 servings, but I think it depends on how many "cake lovers" are in the house! For me, this makes closer to 8 servings. As I always say, I never met a cake I didn't like.

Red Velvet Dream Torte

- 1 package Duncan Hines* Moist Deluxe Red Velvet Cake Mix
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 3 large eggs
- 1 8-oz. container frozen whipped topping, thawed

1 can Duncan Hines* Creamy Home-Style Cream Cheese Frosting

Optional: Small chocolate candy hearts or the other heart-shaped candies

*You can use other brands, but DH is always my first choice.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Prepare, bake and cool cake in round cake pans according to the package directions. To make this into a "torte," split each layer in half. Place one split layer on serving plate. Spread one third of the thawed whipped topping on one layer. Repeat with remaining layers, making sure to place bottoms of each layer together. 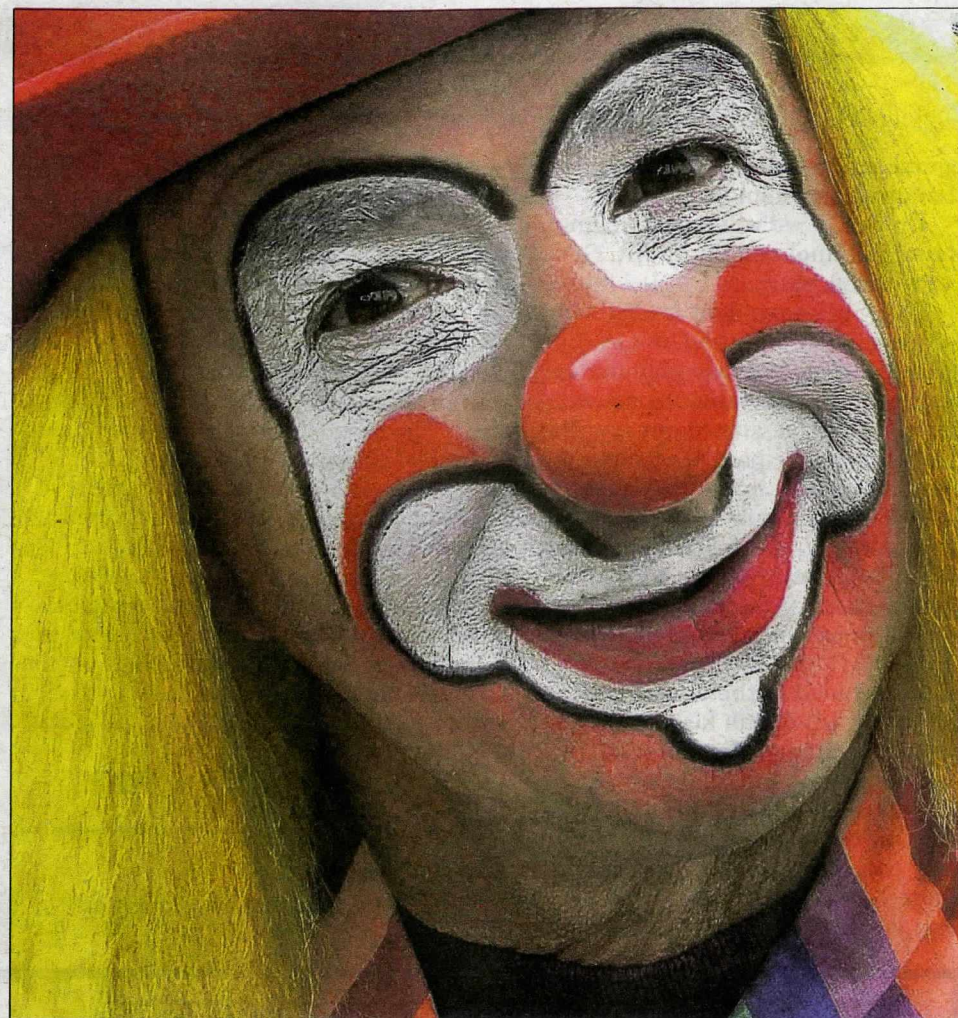

The Assigned subject for February will be Architecture and/or Doors and Windows.

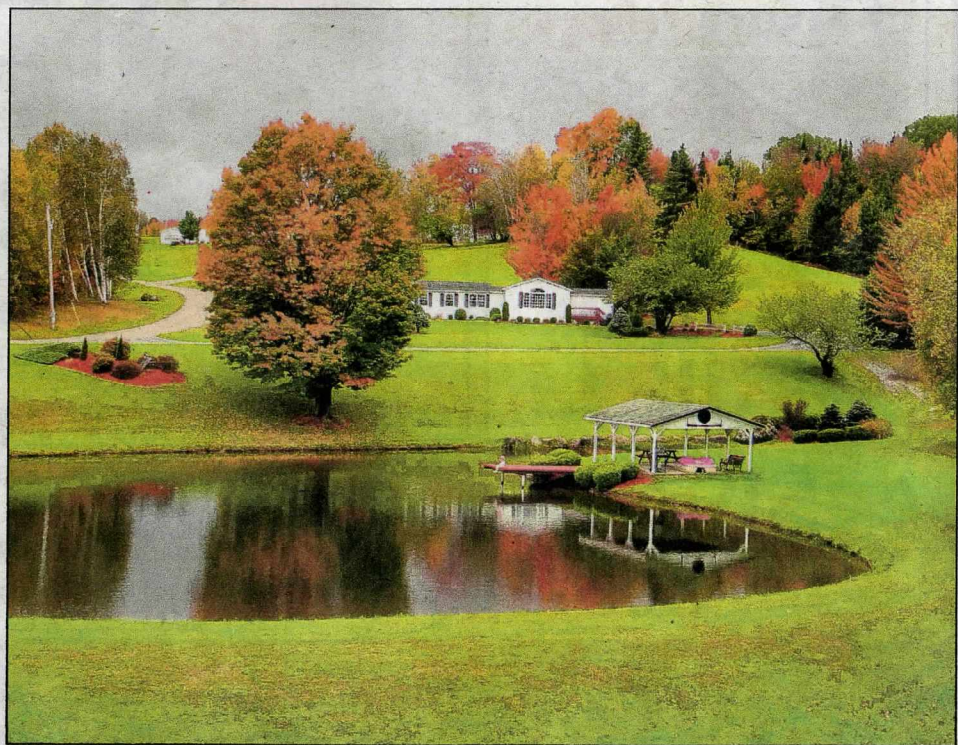

Strolling down Olvera Street

Olvera Street started out as Wine Street. In 1877 it was extended, and a name change was made to its present name. Some say Los Angeles was born here.

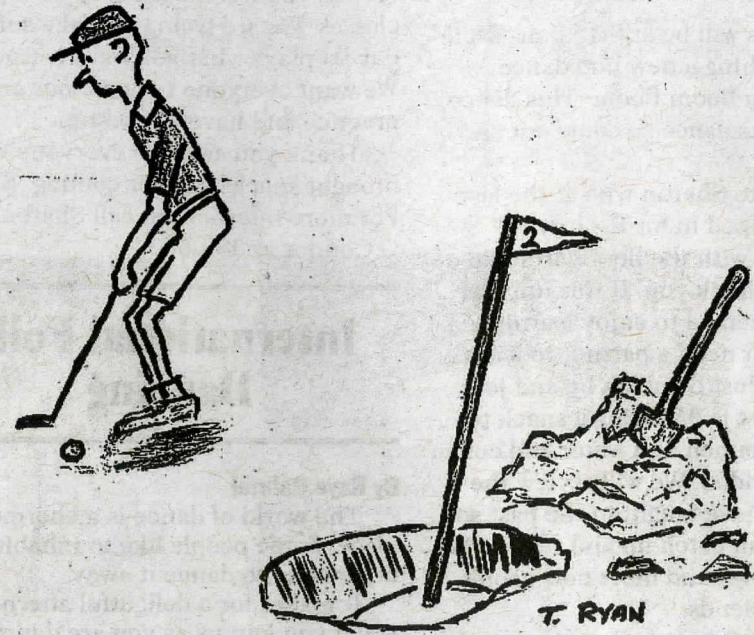
In 1781, 44 settlers of mixed Spanish, Indian and African descent staked out a turf for a pueblo that would become Los Angeles. Today, Olvera Street is an open air market reminiscent of a 19th century Mexican plaza. It is the site of the oldest residence, The Avila Adobe, which is now a museum; the city's first Mexican restaurant, called La Golondrina Café; and many stores are run by descendants of the original owners.

History is everywhere, from wonderful cream-filled pastries at Mr. Churro to wonderful Mexican candy. All manner of goods can be purchased, most very authentic. One whiff of Cielito Lindo's famous taquitos with

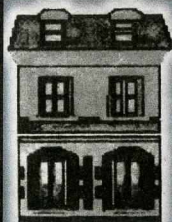

guacamole and you are hooked. They're still made from the 1934 recipe of founder Aurora Guerrero.

The street fell into decline for several years and was restored around 1926. Money was provided by a number of wealthy and influential men interested in keeping its history alive. It was spearheaded by Christine Sterling, a wealthy socialite. It is now a part of El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historical Monument.

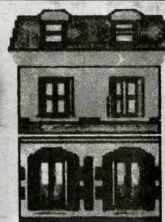
