PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Five telephone lines are available -- two at all times and three after the conclusion of radio post-game shows.

PRESS TABLES: Primary beat reporters, scouts and broadcasters will be located on the north side of the playing floor opposite the scorer's table.

GAME SUMMARY PACKETS: Booklets consisting of computer generated halftime and final boxes and manually-typed play-by-play summaries will be collated and distributed in Room 162.

PRESS/PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective "home" SIDs. Photo credentials must be worn in plain sight at all times. Photographers may shoot only from the designated areas behind both baselines.

PARKING: Parking is available by:

a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Blvd. or Lot B off State College Blvd. and paying \$1.50 (Monday thru Thursday only; free on Friday nights and weekends) upon entry for a daily permit, or:

b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the corner of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

BROADCAST SPACE: One" table" is allocated to each team's designated commercial radio station. Each position handles three persons comfortably. Two complimentary lines are available in most cases.

**TELEPHONES:** There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 278-3970 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building. Please call if you have special telephone needs.

LOCKER ROOMS: Are located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. Bob Hawking will conduct his post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is CLOSED to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

# Cal State Fullerton --Where Learning Is Preeminent

California State University, Fullerton plays a major role in the intellectual, cultural and economic lives of Orange County.

Given the charge of teaching as a member of the state's three-tiered system of higher education, Cal State Fullerton does an exceptional job of educating the residents - and future - of Orange County. It prepares highly skilled and well-prepared university graduates.

Now in its 41st year, the university points proudly to its product, approximately 120,000 graduates. With 85 percent of them remaining within a 50-mile radius of campus, they occupy key spots in business, industry, government, the political arena and education.

The university - with its main campus in Fullerton and satellites in Mission Viejo and Santa Ana - is one of the county's largest employers and purchasers. Its presence is a key factor in the prosperity and progress of this area. With more than 25,000 students currently enrolled and more than 3,400 faculty and staff employees, it is estimated that Cal State Fullerton impacts the community by \$489 million annually.

With a mission of making learning preeminent, the university's 700 faculty members combine the best qualities of teaching and research universities to work in close collaboration with students and staff to expand knowledge. The instructional program is offered by seven schools: The Arts; Business Administration and Economics; Communications; Engineering and Computer Science; Human Development and Community Service; Humanities and Social Sciences; and Natural Science and Mathematics.

With full accreditation for its overall program, Cal State Fullerton has national recognition for its programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing, teacher education and theater. In all there are 97 degree programs - with 45 of them at the graduate level - plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Students are provided the best of current practice, theory and research and integrate professional studies with preparation in the arts and sciences. Through experiences in and out of the classroom, students develop the habit of intellectual inquiry, prepare for challenging professions, strengthen

relationships to their communities and contribute productively to society.

Cal State Fullerton is the most affordable and ethnically diverse university in the area. It ranks 12th nationally in the total overall number of minorities who graduated.

An extended education program, with open enrollment, offers individual courses, seminars and workshops, as well as more than 50 certificate programs ranging from entrepreneurship and sales management to creative writing. Classes are held evenings and weekends both on- and off-campus.

Community members also may visit campus for theater, music and dance performances and art exhibits of off-campus artists, plus those of university students and faculty members. While here, both the Fullerton Arboretum and Heritage House are worth touring. And, an extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, also is open to the public.

Volunteer opportunities are open through Cal State Fullerton's many support groups, such as the Art Alliance, Music Associates, Patrons of the Library and President's Associates. One such group, Continuing Learning Experience, holds many of its programs in the Ruby Gerontology Center, for which it spearheaded the fund-raising campaign. The center serves as an educational and research facility for the study of successful aging.

In four decades, Cal State Fullerton has taken its place as a primary force in the growth and prosperity of Southern California.



# Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for

four years, as dean of the College of the Arts and Sciences for Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is the vice chairman of the NCAA Presidents Commission and the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. He also serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.

# CITY OF FULLERTON

The City of Fullerton was born of the railroads, grew because of oil and citrus, reached adulthood after World War II and is now maturing as an educational center of urbanized Orange County. It is located about 30 miles southeast of downtown Los Angeles and about 20 miles inland from the beaches of the Pacific Ocean.

The first settlers were an Indian tribe known as the Gabrielenos, who were on hand when the first Spanish explorers arrived in 1769.



The former Union Pacific train depot, built in 1923, has been converted into a restaurant. It is listed on the National Registry of Historical Places.

By the 1830s, the expanses of mustard fields and cactus became part of a vast 35,000-acre grant of Juan Pacific Ontiveras, who sold off land to newcomers from the eastern United States.

The Amerige brothers, George and Edward, entered the picure in 1887 amid rumors of the coming of the California Central Railroad. They bought up land and offered a free right of way to George H. Fullerton, president of the Pacific Land and Improvement Co., a Santa Fe Railway subsidiary. They laid out the town from a stake at what is now downtown, Commonwealth and Harbor Blvd., and named it in honor of its benefactor.


Charles Chapman, a descendant of legendary "Johnny Appleseed," revolutionized the exploding citrus industry by introducing the Valencia orange. Under the same rich agriculture ground, oil was discovered and by 1912, wells extended for 12 miles along the hills into what is now Brea.

The city was incorporated in 1904 and Chapman elected mayor. An airfield was established in 1927 and the Fullerton Municipal Airport remains a busy general aviation facility.

Another boom began as veterans returned from World War II and demanded homes for their new families. As that growth cycle slowed, the city was able to concentrate on providing the necessary amenities and educational opportunities blossomed. Cal State Fullerton joined Fullerton College, which was established in 1913, and it was followed by Western States College of Law, Southern California College of Optometry and Pacific Christian College, now part of Hope International University. All are within a 2-mile radius in the east part of town.

# ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



## John Easterbrook, Athletics Director

John Easterbrook is in his sixth year in charge of the Cal State Fullerton athletics department, which has seen continued and easily measured success during his first five years of leadership. The Titans have annually come out in the black budgetarily, on-campus facilities have been dramatically improved and the program continues

to lead the way among Big West Conference rivals in post-season success as measured by the annual Sears Cup standings. Four teams have reached NCAA quarterfinals during his tenure topped by the 1995 national championship baseball team.

Easterbrook was appointed on Sept. 1, 1994, by President Milton Gordon. He was chosen from a field of 41 candidates on the strength of his experience at a successful Division I program and his familiarity

with the California State University system as an associate athletic director for nine years at Fresno State. Easterbrook, 60, was involved primarily in compliance, facilities and event management at Fresno State, which annually draws more than 500,000 fans to athletic events.

Easterbrook was hired at Fresno State by Dr. Gary Cunningham. The pair had crossed paths at the University of Wyoming in Laramie where Easterbrook was the president and chief executive officer of American National Bank and Cunningham was the UW athletic director.

Easterbrook previously coached college football for 13 seasons at Idaho, Oregon State, Illinois and Wyoming. He was a three-year starter at quarterback and also played two seasons of basketball at Illinois. He was the Most Valuable Player of the Copper Bowl. He earned a bachelor's degree (1962) in commerce and law and attended the University of Illinois Law School.

The Champaign, Illinois, native and his wife, Cynthia, have three adult children, four granddaughters and one grandson. John and his two sons are avid golfers.

# Titans' Elephant Mascot Has Evolved From Wildly Successful Campus Stunt

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit to a campus or city. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends:

"It was the student's decision in a vote," explained the late Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories where named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to

create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the elephant mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a female Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment

manager at the time thought orange was an appropiate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue in uniforms and printing instead of the "reflex" blue of recent years was initiated in 1992 with a deemphasis of the orange, furthered by former athletic director Lynn Eilefson in the mid 1980s.

Finally, there is the matter of the school's name. The name originally for CSUF was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State *College* Boulevard.

To out-of-staters, the school's name causes confusion because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state - the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens or commas, which is what most of the more than 100,000 graduates recognize.

# UPGRADED FACILITIES

Dramatic improvements have been made over the past few years to many of the Cal State Fullerton facilities utilized by the men's basketball program and fans have shared in the benefits in the past two seasons. Titan Gymnasium has undergone its first major renovation since it opened in 1964 and the results are obvious to repeat visitors.

A new paint job from floor to ceiling has been augmented by a giant reproduction on the south wall of the university's recently adopted logo. Complementary touches have been made with the addition of pennants for the 12 members of the Big West Conference on the west wall and fresh, new banners commemorating the Titans' 11 national championship teams are scattered among the four corners of the facility, which now seats about 3,500.

Chairback seats were installed on the south side of the playing floor for the 1997-98 season and added to the north side for the 1998-99 campaign. Bleachers remain only in the "end zones" behind the baskets and in the upper deck on the north side.

Even the baskets were new last season. The basket supports are mounted on the floor, giving the gym more of an arena look and improving sight lines from the seats behind the baskets.

The playing surface was redone three years ago and now features the script "Titans" logo with "Cal State" and "Fullerton" emblazoned along the opposite baselines.

Equally important to the players but out of sight to the fans is the vastly improved weight training facility located on the second floor of Titan Gym. About \$100,000 was appropriated by the Kinesi-

ology and Health Promotion department over the summer of 1998 to bring the facility up to today's high standards. It services majors, community recreation members and Titan athletes with the latter gaining exclusive sessions each day. This facility augments the athletics-only outdoor facility which dates to the days of Titan football prior to 1992. It has been remodeled and recently gained \$40,000 of new equipment and no longer is overused.

The health and welfare of studentathletes is in improved hands, from the enlarged student union dining accommodations to the athletic training room and the on-campus health center, located adjacent to Titan Gym.

Commercial outlets such as Marie Callender's, Carl's Jr., Round Table Pizza, ToGos Sandwiches and Starbuck's provide popular food to the entire campus community. New this Fall was the second Krispy Kreme donut location in Orange County.

The Titans' athletic training program is one of the finest in the nation. An attractive curriculum has produced scores of certified athletic trainers over the years and most of Orange County's high school athletes are being cared for by Cal State Fullerton graduates.

The student health center serves as a primary source of treatment with nearby St. Jude Hospital in Fullerton handy for more serious problems. A City of Fullerton fire station across the street from campus provides almost instant paramedic service.

# ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE

The Athletic Academic Services department was established at Cal State Fullerton to help ensure the academic success of intercollegiate athletes.

The mission of Athletic Academic Services, according to Assistant Athletic Director/Academic Director Christine McCarthy, is to provide effective support services to help each student reach his or her academic goals.

"We want all of our student-athletes to benefit fully from his or her educational experience at Fullerton," said McCarthy.

The department's many programs and services are directly aimed at this goal. The office is responsible for

academic advisement, coordinating study plans, class schedules, study skills workshops, tutoring, study hall, faculty and peer mentoring and referrals to the many campus services available.

The office is staffed by three full-time personnel in McCarthy, Academic Services Coordinator Barbara Kempton and Academic Counselor Mike Miller.


Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department has an "Early Warning" system – periodic grade checks – in place. It encourages faculty members to notify the office if a student is having problems with course work and may require academic support.

Student-athletes at CSF take an average of four and a half years to five years to graduate and some of that success can be credited to Athletic Academic Services. The staff members assist in selecting and registering for classes, referring students to faculty advisors and tracking and evaluating their progress toward graduation. The office's services are available to all past and current student-athletes.

"Not all student-athletes are able to graduate in four years, because of professional opportunities or personal commitments," says McCarthy. "We developed a re-entry program for former student-athletes who wish to complete their studies, offering them the same services which were available to them when they competed for us."

# **Head Coach Bob Hawking**

Three consecutive double-digit victory totals that have been a break or two from becoming winning seasons are the foundation Bob Hawking takes into his sixth season as head men's basketball coach at Cal State Fullerton.

The "break-through" season he has been seeking since stepping up from an assistant's role was derailed in 1996-97 by injury, in 1997-98 by bad luck and last year by a season-ending 3-game skid that left the Titans one game shy of the .500 mark at 13-14. Leading scorer and rebounder John Williams missed February in 1996-97 and the Titans finished 13-14. Two years ago the team was 3-6 in games decided by four points or less and finished 12-16.

"Our staff and student-athletes continue to work very hard to make our program respectable," said Hawking, 50 on Nov. 7, who served as interim head coach in 1994-95 and signed his first contract as head coach on Apr. 19, 1995. "We are committed to making it work.

Our intention is to build from the ground up. With that as the focus, we will not assume anything. We intend to establish goals, work ethic and the intangible qualities needed for any organization to be successful.

"We are looking for good people, good players and young men who want to earn a college degree. We will not recruit anyone who does not fit that mold." -- Bob Hawking

"Our recruiting philosophy is based on three cornerstones. We are looking for good people, good players and young men who want to earn a college degree. We will not recruit anyone who does not fit that mold.

"On the court we want to play up tempo. We have recruited to that style and will continue to do so. Secondly, but just as importantly, we will put a priority on play-

ing and practicing hard on a daily basis."

The Titans began Hawking's first season well, splitting their first six games and jumping off to a 2-0 start in the Big West Conference with wins at UNLV and UC Irvine. But several injuries down the stretch drained the limited depth and the Titans settled for a 7-20 overall mark and a 5-13 Big West log. His second year was almost a carbon copy. Included in marks of 6-20 and 5-13 were a buzzer-beating win at San Diego State, another win over UC Irvine and the first sweep of New Mexico State since 1986-87 despite short seasons from injured guards Chris St. Clair and Brian Thomas and a total of 41 missed games by players.

The 1996-97 team had a 7-3 non-conference record including rare victories at BYU and Montana and a close home loss to Utah. It was 10-6 before Williams missed 11 games.

The Titans went 5-5 in non-conference play in 1997-98 before opening Big West play with four games decided by one basket — winning only once. They swept rivals UC Irvine and Long Beach State, the latter for the first time since 1986-87, and beat Boise State in the Big West Tourney before taking eventual champion Utah State down to the final minute. Last year they again swept UCI and Long Beach and went 3-1 against West Coast Conference schools but lost their final two home games and a tournament game to finalist Boise State.



Hawking was the top assistant under Brad Holland for two years (1992-93 and 1993-94) at Fullerton after two-year stints under Bob Williams at UC Davis and Tom Asbury at Pepperdine.

Hawking's high school coaching career began at Pater Noster High in Los Angeles and he later served as head coach at Simi Valley High School for 14 years and developed a championship program. His teams went to the CIF playoffs nine times and won five Marmonte League championships. His 1987 team was ranked No. 4 in the state and his 1988 team won the CIF title behind the play of Don MacLean, who went on to become the alltime leading scorer in the Pac-10 for UCLA. Hawking was selected the CIF Southern Section 4A Coach of the Year.


The playing career of Hawking began at Alemany High School in Mission Hills and continued at Pierce College, where he played for current Louisville coach Denny Crum. He completed his playing career at Cal State Northridge, where he earned a degree in 1971.

Hawking was born on Nov. 7, 1949, in Chicago. He and his wife, Jeannie, have three children. Son Butch, a graduate of the Air Force Academy, is a second-year assistant coach at Kansas State. Daughter Kristin, 21, is a former cross country and track standout now attending Cal State Fullerton. Son Quinn, 17, is a junior basketball player at El Dorado High School in Placentia.

# The Dean of Metropolitan L.A. Coaches

Although beginning only his sixth season as the head coach at Cal State Fullerton, Bob Hawking can easily be called the "dean" of the eight Div. I men's basketball coaches in the metropolitan Los Angeles area based on continuous service to his campus.

Jan van Breda Kolff is in his first year at Pepperdine. Third-year coaches are on the job at UC Irvine (Pat Douglass) and Loyola Marymount (Charles Bradley). Fourth-year men have the title at UCLA (Steve Lavin), Long Beach State (Wayne Morgan), Cal State Northridge (Bobby Braswell) and USC (Henry Bibby). Of this entire group, only van Breda Kolff (8 years at Cornell and Vanderbilt) previously was a head coach at the Div. I level.

Johnson, 31, played for Hawking at Simi Valley High School and was the point guard on Simi Valley's CIF runnerup team in



In 1993-94 the Panthers won their most games since 1965 at 23-4. His overall record at Orange High was 90-59.

"Rich is recognized as a tremendous defensive coach throughout Southern California," said Hawking. "Our players and staff are very excited about his contributions to our program."

While taking a year's leave of absence from Orange High, Bossenmeyer served one season as an assistant coach for the Rapid City Thrillers of the Continental Basketball Association.

A political science major who did not play intercollegiately at Fullerton, Bossenmeyer earned his master's degree from Azusa Pacific University in 1998. He and his wife, Pilar, live in Orange.



# Strength & Conditioning Coach **Paul Weissenstein**


(Azusa Pacific '89)

Paul Weissenstein joins the Titans' staff for the 1999-2000 season as a strength and conditioning coach.

Weissenstein has been working as a personal trainer in Los Angeles after relocating from Illinois, where he most recently was assistant strength and conditioning coach at Northwestern University in Evanston. He worked with both the football and men's basketball programs during the 1998-99 academic year.

"Paul brings an extensive background in strength training and conditioning to our program," said Head Coach Bob Hawking. "His influence will impact our on-court performance throughout the year. He had great successes at Northwestern with both football and basketball players."

Second-team All-American basketball player Evan Eschmeyer, the 34th man selected in the NBA draft by New Jersey, was his



most prominent success story. He also worked with three NFLbound gridders.

Weissenstein grew up in Mount Prospect, Illinois, where he played high school football before enrolling at Wake Forest University. He transferred to William Rainey Harper Community College in the Chicago suburb of Palatine and completed his football playing career at Azusa Pacific University in California where he obtained his bachelor's degree.

A football coaching career was launched back at Prospect High and he again advanced to Harper CC as defensive back coach (1995), receivers coach (1996), recruiting coordinator (1996) and strength coach (1997).

With six of its top eight players back from a 13-14 squad, the 1999-2000 Cal State Fullerton basketball team is anxiously approaching what it hopes will be an elusive winning season, something that has been tantalizingly close in each of the past three campaigns. The basketball gods seemingly have conspired against the Titans with untimely injuries and last-second losses leaving the last three records just shy of the .500 mark at 13-14, 12-16 and 13-14.

Coach Bob Hawking welcomes back three senior starters in guards **Kenroy Jarrett** (6-0, 29 Palms) and **Mark Murphy** (6-1, Phoenix, AZ) and the only returning first-team All-Big West Conference selection in forward **Ike Harmon** (6-7, Santa Ana). Also back are regulars **Matt Caldwell** (6-8, Jr., Peoria, AZ) and **Josh Fischer** (6-9, Soph., La Habra) on the frontline and swingman **Brandon Campbell** (6-4, Soph, St. Louis, MO).

"We have a solid nucleus to work with," said Hawking. "We've built some continuity by not being so dependent on junior college recruiting. We have great flexibility and will be able to move people around to better attack opponents' weaknesses."


Harmon is a two-year starter who led the team last year by averaging 15.7 points and 6.7 rebounds per game.

"Ike has come a long way from Santa Ana Valley High School and has posted two good years for the Titans," said Hawking. "He needs to continue to develop his overall game."

Jarrett was an iron man at point guard for the Titans a year ago, averaging 37 minutes per game and missing only two contests despite suffering a broken hand. He averaged 9.7 points and 4.0 assists per game.

Murphy was a pleasant surprise after transferring from Glendale CC in Arizona. He made 66 of 180 (.367) 3-point field goal attempts while averaging 11.5 points, second best on the team. He also filled in at point guard those rare minutes when Jarrett was on the bench.

Caldwell started 10 games at center

and averaged 9.8 points and 5.0 rebounds for the season. Fischer came on strong as the season progressed and finished at 3.8 points and 2.6 rebounds per game. He has added considerable size and strength during the off season. Campbell, the Big West Conference long jump champion and a 7-foot-1 high jumper, averaged 3.1 points and 1.7 rebounds and started three times.

The key newcomers to the Titans' roster are freshman guard Rodney Anderson (6-2) from Washington High School in Los Angeles and freshman swingman Dan Thompson (6-6) from Australia. Anderson is the heir apparent to Jarrett at point guard for 2000-01 but is expected to contribute this season as well. Thompson is an excellent allaround athlete who played for some national youth teams.

Lost to graduation were four-year front-line starter Mark Richardson (7.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg) and two-year forward Jason Cunningham (10.2 ppg, 4.6 rpg).

Possibly still a year away from extensive duty is redshirt freshman center **Mitch Deve'** (7-0, 275).

"We are pleased with Mitch's progress," said Hawking. "He made great improvement during a redshirt year. He lost some weight, gained some strength and improved his mobility."

The Titans have picked up a handful of freshmen walk-on backcourt candidates and several are expected to earn playing time. **Danny Dinh** (5-10, Pacifica HS), **Josh Pierson** (6-0, Laguna Hills HS) and **Jon Stoa** (6-4, Whittier Christian HS) all earned All-CIF honors.

Additional newcomers are Delta Community College transfer James Hackett, a backcourt product of Azusa High School, and freshman Ahmad Shurdim, a forward from Magnolia High School in Anaheim who redshirted with the Titans last year. Available to practice will be 6-foot-8 Daniel Kohn, a transfer who must sit out this year after transferring after two seasons from the University of Massachusetts in Lowell.

This season will be the thirty-first year in which the Big West Conference sponsors the sport of men's basketball. Also this season, the Big West will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Big West Postseason Tournament. During the past thirty years, eight of the 12 current members have claimed or shared a regular season title. Five current members have won the tournament title led by New Mexico State and Long Beach State's three titles apiece.

The Big West has been home to one NCAA National Championship and one NIT crown. The conference has also had a team represented in the NCAA Tournament every year of its' 30-year existence. Nine times the conference has had multiple representatives.

While Big West programs have had team success on a national level, some marquee players in the sport have played in the conference. In 1998, the No. 1 pick in the NBA Draft came out of the Big West in Michael Olowokandi from Pacific. Other current NBA stars that hailed from the Big West are Larry Johnson, Cedric Ceballos, Byron Russell, Stacey Augmon and J.R. Rider.

# BIG WEST SUCCESS CONTINUED IN 1998-99



The Conference also saw its enormous success in other sports continue this past academic year. Throughout its history, the Big West has claimed national team championships in the sports of women's volleyball, men's basketball, baseball, softball and men's water polo and individual national championships in women's swimming and women's track and field. It was no different in 1998-99 as the conference claimed three more national crowns.

Just this past season Long Beach State brought home the Women's Volleyball National Championship along with the National Coach of the Year (Brian Gimmillaro) and National Player of the Year (Misty May) Awards. May was later named the Honda Broderick Cup winner for being the Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year.

The Big West also had a national champion in women's swimming and women's track and field. In March, Nevada's Limin Liu won the 200 butterfly in an NCAA record time. In May, Cal Poly's Paula Serrano won the pole vault competition at the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

Also in 1998-99, the Big West sent 40 teams and 34 individuals to post-season competition and had 26 athletes named to All-America teams.

# IMPORTANT DATES IN BIG WEST HISTORY

July 1, 1969 - The desire to form a Division I football conference sparks the formation of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) with seven charter members: Fresno State, Long Beach State, San Jose State, UC Santa Barbara, Pacific, Cal State Los Angeles and San Diego State. The conference sponsors I1 men's sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, gymnastics, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, water polo and wrestling. J. Kenneth Fagans is named commissioner on a part-time basis

November 25, 1979 - UC Santa Barbara claims the NCAA Water Polo Championship with an 11-3 win over UCLA. It is the first NCAA title won by a PCAA men's member in a PCAA sport.

**December 22, 1985** - Pacific wins the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship - the first national title for a PCAA women's member. The Tigers defeat Stanford in three out of four games to capture the title.

July 1, 1988 - The conference changes its name from "PCAA" to "Big West Conference."

**April 2, 1990** - UNLV wins the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship, defeating Duke by the record-breaking score of 103-73. It is the first men's basketball title for the Big West.

December 19, 1998 - Long Beach State captures the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship with a 3-2 victory over Penn State. The 49ers become the first undefeated team (36-0) in NCAA volleyball history. It is also the sixth women's volleyball title won by a conference member.



BASKETBALL

1998-99 SEASON REVIEW



More steps forward than backward.

That's one way to describe the 1998-99 Cal State Fullerton men's basketball season.

The Titans improved their record from the previous season but just missed their first wining record in six years at 13-14. They incorporated three freshmen and a sophomore into their regular rotation but must replace a pair of senior forwards. They swept both UC Irvine and Long Beach State for the second year in a row but continued to struggle

away from Southern California with an 0-9 record when they had to fly. They doubled their victory total of the previous season against the Eastern Divison with wins over North Texas and Utah State but they lost their last two contests to finish only 5-5 against Western Division foes.

Home fans got their money's worth as the Titans went 10-3 in Titan Gym despite losing the last two home games. Ike Harmon stayed relatively healthy and had an entertaining and productive season to become the only non-senior selected to the All-Big West Conference first team, averaging a team-high 15.7 points and 6.7 rebounds. The last Titan to make the first team was Cedric Ceballos in 1990.

The only major injury was a broken hand suffered by point guard Kenroy Jarrett, who missed two games entirely and then played with a cast on his left (non-shooting) hand for the last five games.

Senior Jason Cunningham emerged as arguably the conference's best defender and Mark Richardson completed a rare four-year career as a starter, playing in his 100th game as a Titan in the home season finale. Guard Mark Murphy was the lone junior college transfer to join the Titans last season and he promptly established himself as one of the best 3-point field goal shooters in Div. I. Sophomore center Matt Caldwell was a fan favorite with his enthusiastic play at both ends of the court and true freshmen Josh Fischer, Brandon Campbell and Josh Helbig (has transferred to Belleville JC in Illinois) all had their moments in the spotlight.

The season began in Manhattan, Kansas, with a family feud of sorts. Head Coach Bob Hawking faced off against his son, Butch, a new Kansas State assistant. With Harmon sidelined by an ankle sprained on the final day of practice, the Titans dropped their opener to the Wildcats after a competitive first half. They came home to edge San Diego State and then upset a 5-0 Pepperdine team despite losing Harmon in the first half with another ankle injury.

A dominant effort on the backboards keyed a road win at Loyola Marymount before the Titans went to 4-0 at home with comfortable victories over Saint Mary's and Montana State. A couple of lopsided losses at Saint Louis and Portland left the record at 5-3 before Fullerton ran

its home-court winning streak over non-conference foes to 14 with a rout of Div. II Quincy of Illinois. It included a scuffle deemed a "fight" by the officials, forcing Caldwell to miss the final non-conference game. The Titans could have used him on the boards at San Jose as the Spartans' frontline dominated in a 25-point victory.

The Titans opened Big West play with New Mexico State for the second year in a row and again suffered a narrow defeat. They came back two nights later to beat North Texas by 27 points after trailing at the half and took a 1-1 record to Idaho, where they almost got another split. A poor effort at the foul line was fatal at Idaho but the Titans deserved a better fate at Boise State. They came back from an 11-point halftime deficit and led by 3 in the final 4 minutes. The lead changed hands four times in the final 20 seconds with the Broncos winning by one, 67-66, on two free throws by Roberto Bergersen.

A come-from-behind overtime win over Long Beach State and a strong finish by Harmon against Pacific got the Titans to the .500 mark at 3-3. But they fell back again after a pair of road losses at UC Santa Barbara and Cal Poly SLO, contests complicated when Richardson and Harmon, respectively, got into serious foul trouble.

The Titans snapped a 10-game losing streak to Utah State with a 10-point home victory and got back even at 5-5 with their seventh win at UC Irvine in eight years, outscoring the Anteaters 17-1 down the stretch but losing Jarrett to a broken hand.


Kenroy's loss was felt immediately in a 12-point loss at Nevada, which was on a 3-game win streak around the announcement of Coach Pat Foster's resignation. Fullerton got back to the .500 mark one more time after a wild 104-97 victory in Titan Gym over UCI, which hit 16 of 25 3-point field goals but couldn't overcome career scoring highs by Harmon (33), Murphy (21) and Campbell (14).

Jarrett made a surprisingly quick return at Pacific but he couldn't help avert the Titans' tenth loss in a row in Spanos Center. Again, the Titans bounced back with a Saturday victory, this time at Long Beach State as the rebounding and interior defense that had disappeared at Pacific made a triumphant return.

Control of their own destiny was in the Titans' hands as they closed out the season at home against Cal Poly and UC Santa Barbara. But an injury-plagued Mustang team shot 11 of 23 from 3-point land in a 10-point win and the Western Division leading Gauchos withstood a furious late Titan rally to hang on for a 5-point victory. It took a Cal

Poly loss a few minutes later at UC Irvine to get the Titans into the Big West Tournament in Reno.

They drew Eastern Division titlist Boise State, a team they had beaten on the same floor a year earlier and one they had played down to the final buzzer this season in Boise. But freshman center Abe Jackson stepped up huge and guard Gerry Washington hit 5 of 7 3-point field goals as the Broncos pulled away in the second half for a 77-60 victory that ended the Titans' season.

Fullerton and San Diego State resumed a long-time series that in the last two meetings produced a pair of overtime games, both CSF victories, and the Titans' home opener went down to the final shot once again.

A not-so-funny thing happened to unbeaten Pepperdine on its way to an Anaheim Pond contest with nationally ranked Kansas. The 5-0 Waves were stung by Fullerton in Titan Gym despite the fact Ike Harmon reinjured his ankle late in the first half and could play less than a minute the rest of the way.

The lead grew to as many as 14 points at 75-61 with only 45 seconds to go and it survived a Gaels' barrage in the final 36 seconds that saw them make three 3-point field goals by three different players.

Fullerton shot 57 per cent from the floor in the second half including hitting 4 of 6 treys.

It was a wire-to-wire win for the Titans, but it was far from easy.

Meeting Montana State for only the second time and the first occasion since 1962, Fullerton jumped to an early 20-10 lead behind the front-line scoring of Ike Harmon (7 points), Mark Richardson (6) and Jason Cunningham (5). But the Bobcats wouldn't fold and they drew within one point at 33-32 with 5:44 to go in the first half on a Justin Brown bucket.

Fullerton stretched the lead to 7 points at halftime and, when the Titans opened the second half with a 7-2 spurt featuring 5 points by Harmon, the lead looked solid at 52-40.

But bulky MSU center Nate Holmstadt, one of the nation's leading scorers in December, got loose a couple of times and the Bobcats rallied again, drawing to within a hoop at 64-62 with 7:11 to go. Neither team could score for almost two minutes until Harmon made a follow shot and it was almost two more minutes before Holmstadt hit one of two free throws to make it 66-63.

Montana State would not get closer but it wasn't until Mark Murphy drilled a 3-pointer, his only one of the game, with 1:20 to play for a 72-65 lead that the Titans could finally relax. The 5game winning streak was Fullerton's longest since an 8-gamer in 1990-91.

All the ingredients were in place for a Titan defeat in their first contest against St. Louis University, an NCAA tournament team in 1998. They had a short night after the Montana State win before an early morning flight to St. Louis, they had an early wakeup on Saturday because of the 1 p.m. tip-off and they had to deal with the distractions of the homecoming for area natives Brandon Campbell and Josh Helbig. Not to mention a quality Billikens' team and their 11,000 supporters in a 20,000-seat Kiel Center that would hold several Titan Gyms.

The teams struggled through a defensive battle for the first 13 minutes with St. Louis managing a precarious 16-14 lead. Then it all fell apart for the Titans. They were outscored the rest of the half, 17-2, by which time they had committed 16 turnovers to compound 29 per cent shooting from the floor and 33 per cent shooting at the foul line. No Titan had more than 3 points at the half.

There would be no second half rally. After Ike Harmon opened the scoring with a jump shot, St. Louis scored 14 of the next 16 points for a 47-20 lead with 14:34 to play and the outcome had been determined.

Most of the problems the Titans faced in St. Louis were absent a week later in Portland but the outcome was even worse. Although they were completing final exam week and had to play without Matt Caldwell, who was nursing a hip flexor injury, Fullerton was well rested when it flew up to Portland.

But the Titans committed a school record 32 turnovers that led to 47 Portland points. The Pilots added 25 second-chance points to 9 for CSF and it all added up to a 43-point loss, one of the most lopsided in recent history.

Fullerton actually got off to a 5-0 lead on a Kenroy Jarrett 3-pointer and an Ike Harmon layup. But the Pilots caught them at 9-9 and then went on a 13-2 run for a 22-11 advantage. Three minutes later it was 31-13 after a 9-2 splurge. Fullerton would get as close as 7 points at 38-31 with 1:11 to go after a 16-5 counter surge, but Portland scored the last 6 points of the half.

It got ugly in the second half. The Pilots went on a 28-4 tear over 7 minutes capped by three successive 3-point field goals by Jimmie Rainwater that made the score 79-40 with 9:34 remaining. The win avenged a Pilot come-from-ahead loss a year earlier in Titan Gym.

With Matt Caldwell forced to sit out the game per NCAA rules after his "fighting" ejection against Quincy, the Titans were outmanned inside and San Jose State took notice. The Spartans' starting frontline of Ben Sanders, Shaun Murray and Will Trawick combined to hit 19 of 31 shots from the floor and all 18 tries at the foul line for 57 points to go with 19 rebounds, numbers that approached the Titans' team total.

It was a close game for the first 18 minutes. The Titans, who jumped to an 8-2 lead early and came from behind to take a 27-22 lead, were ahead 30-29 when the tide turned. Fullerton College transfer Sanders scored the final 7 points of the half for a 36-30 lead at intermission and he had 5 points in a 13-0 Spartan run to open the second half that left the score 49-30 with 16:47 to go and the Titans never seriously threatened.

The 3-point field goal was an overrated feature of this game. The Titans hit a respectable 6 of 16 while the Spartans hit only one of 10. But 26 Titan turnovers and a 13-rebound edge by the Spartans were significant in leaving the Titans 6-4 going into Big West Conference play. It was their second-best nonconference record in the last six seasons.

The Titans drew New Mexico State for the Big West opener for the second year in a row and for the second time, the Aggies won a close game. It wasn't double OT as a year ago in Las Cruces, but it went down to the final minute.

Actually, the pivotal point of the game came with 2:20 to play when Brad Bestor fired in a 25-foot 3-pointer to beat the shot clock to extend the NMSU lead to 56-50. The Titans would get only 4 more points on an Ike Harmon tip-in and two Jason Cunningham free throws while the Aggies were going 3 of 3 at the foul line and getting a last-second dunk from Charles Gosa.

Fullerton had the biggest lead of the first half at 4 points and the halftime score was 27 all. The Aggies took the lead for good at 36-33 on the only 3-pointer on the night by Eric Channing. They stretched it to as many as 8 points twice, the last at 49-41 with 8:31 to go.

But with Kenroy Jarrett hitting 3 of 4 treys in the second half, the Titans stayed close only to fall to the Aggies' inside domination. The Titan staff utilized the fear factor to help motivate the Titans against North Texas, winless at 0-12 against one of the nation's most difficult schedules. "You'll be on ESPN," they predicted, exposure not desired.

The tactic worked but it took an intermission refresher course. The Eagles posted their first halftime lead of the year at 24-22 and the Titans didn't take the lead for good until 16:20 to go when Mark Murphy followed a Mark Richardson basket with a baseline steal and fed Kenroy Jarrett for a layup and a 35-33 advantage.

Richardson hit two free throws and Matt Caldwell had a thundering follow-dunk to make it 39-33 and a 10-4 run highlighted by 5 points from Murphy made it 49-37 with 12:24 to play. North Texas came back with 5 unanswered points but Murphy and Jarrett hit 3-pointers to spark a 12-5 run that boosted the margin back to 12 points and UNT never got closer than 9 the rest of the way.

Jarrett had a career-high 16 points and logged no turnovers for the second game in a row. The win was only the second for Fullerton over an Eastern Division team in the regular season in 14 tries and the first in Titan Gym in 8 tries.

The Titans' first Big West Conference road game took them to distant Moscow, Idaho, where they met the Vandals, a pre-season pick to win the East Division but struggling at 5-7.

A hard-fought game simply boiled down to the foul line. The Titans shot poorly at their end and let the Vandals rebound their own misses at the other end. And probably the biggest play of the game occurred in the paint when the Titans were called for a lane violation with 3:12 to play. Instead of a miss on the front end of a one-andone by Avery Curry and the Titans in possession with a 66-60 deficit, Curry got another chance and made both ends for an 8-point lead. A near miraculous second-half rally by the Titans came up a point shy as Kenroy Jarrett's driving bank shot glanced off the rim at the buzzer. Fullerton had overcome an 11-point halftime deficit and two Boise State leads in the final 20 seconds.

The Titans caught Boise State at 55-55 on Jarrett's basket at 5:12. Ike Harmon's basket at 4:32 and a free throw at 3:50 made it 58-55 and the Titans got the ball back. The momentum of the near-miss in Boise didn't carry over to the Titans' early effort against rival Long Beach State. Fullerton had a miserable first half, scoring only 19 points while hitting only 5 of 19 field goals around 13 turnovers.

But the 49ers weren't much better and could build only a 4-point halftime lead. They shot 43 per cent from the floor but were only 4 of 12 at the foul line.

The surprising Gauchos of UCSB, picked for last in the pre-season Big West polls but sitting atop the Western Division standings, showed the Titans they were for real. Scoring out of their transition game and off the offensive glass and playing tight defense, they led virtually wire to wire.

Two teams who would be in a dogfight to the finish to earn a Big West Tournament berth met head-to-head for the first time in San Luis Obispo on a Saturday afternoon. But the Titans would soon be playing with less than a full deck when Ike Harmon picked up two quick fouls and then a third upon returning to the lineup, playing only 3 minutes in the first half.

The Mustangs broke away from a 12-12 tie and never trailed again. They stretched a narrow 28-27 lead with a 13-2 run and totaled 55 points by halftime as the Titans got caught up in the quick tempo the Mustangs favor. A return to Titan Gym again brought out the best in Fullerton, particularly Jason Cunningham, who got his first start at off guard as the Titans went with a bigger lineup.

After making key plays down the stretch against both Long Beach and UoP and helping shut down Rock Lloyd and Clay McKnight, Cunningham exploded offensively. He scored inside and outside on his way to a career-high 23 points and the Titans snapped a 10-game losing streak to the Ags dating back to 1993.

Possibly the Titans' best first half of the season gave them a 14-point cushion which barely held up. After shooting only 36 per cent in the first half, USU got strong efforts from Troy Rolle (15 points), Pharoah Davis (10) and Donnie Johnson (9) on its way to a 50-point half. Zamiro Bennem countered with a basket at 9:40 but it would be UCI's final field goal. Harmon sparked a 17-1 finish with 10 more points while the Anteaters missed their final 17 shots.

Kenroy Jarrett scored only one point while playing 34 minutes. It wouldn't be learned until Monday that he had suffered a broken right hand late in the first half.

Rumors of the demise of the Wolf Pack proved unfounded when the Titans arrived in Reno. Coming in with a 3-game winning streak, two occurring after Coach Pat Foster announced his resignation, the Pack was fighting to gain a berth in the Big West Tournament they would be hosting.

Derrick Anderson and friends kept those hopes alive for at least one more night. He set a school record by hitting nine 3-point field goals on his way to a career-high 31 points. The Titans' first rematch of the year brought UC Irvine to Titan Gym, trying to avenge a 17-point loss a week earlier and trying to snap a 10-game losing streak. And with Fullerton missing Kenroy Jarrett due to his hand injury and Jason Cunningham benched in a "coach's decision," the Anteaters sensed an opportunity.

Not since Cedric Ceballos was a junior in 1989 had the Titans won a game at the Spanos Center, where it once had a 6-2 mark. But that had fallen to 6-11 after nine losses in a row.

The Tigers seemed ripe for a change in that trend. They were missing injured forward Barry Marvel and they were coming off a dismal game at UCSB in which they scored only 38 points. Conversely, the Titans were buoyed by the unexpected return of Kenroy Jarrett, medically released to play with his broken hand.

But with reserve Mike Preston muscling his way to a career-high 17 points, the Tigers made it 10 in a row at home over the Titans despite hitting only one 3-point field goal in 12 tries. Instead, Pacific powered its way inside and Preston, Tim Johnson and Jason Williams combined for 53 points and 14 rebounds.

The first half was tight. Fullerton held its last lead at 29-28 on Jarrett's jumper with 4:24 to go. But the Tigers scored the first 6 points after intermission and Fullerton only briefly got close, at 53-49 with 11:15 to play. Scott Thomason's jumper triggered a 22-10 Tiger run to end the game.

The part of Fullerton's game that was most ineffective at Pacific — interior defense and rebounding — turned it around as the Titans spoiled another Homecoming and beat the 49ers for the fourth time in a row.

Fullerton's big men — Caldwell, Richardson, Fischer and Harmon — totaled 30 rebounds compared to 8 at Pacific. They keyed a zone defense that forced the 49ers to try to shoot over it with minimal success. Both Caldwell (bumped knee) and Harmon (elbow in the ribs) fought through game injuries to return and contribute and Kenroy Jarrett played 40 minutes in his first start since the broken hand.

After Harmon's 3-pointer gave the Titans a 4-2 lead, Fullerton led the rest of the way. The biggest lead in the first half was 31-18 but the 49ers closed to within 7 at the half.

After Jarrett hit a 3-pointer, the 49ers got 3 back on a Fullerton technical for improper halftime substitution and they rode the momentum to close within 41-40 with 14:24 remaining. But first-time starter Fischer scored inside and added a free throw and Harmon scored to make it 46-40 on the way to 58-45 with 6:59 remaining. Long Beach got within 6 points but Cunningham scored all 6 of his points in the final 2:01 and then made a key steal with 0:59 to play and the Titans ahead, 68-60.

The Titans couldn't stand prosperity. In a position to clinch a Big West Tournament bid and their first winning season in six years, they drew a struggling Cal Poly team weakened by the loss of two starters to injuries. And with leading scorer Mike Wozniak relegated to a reserve's role, the table seemed set.

Instead, the Mustangs played more inspired and hit more 3-point field goals from more positions and won almost wire-to-wire.

The Titans went 0-for-8 from treyland in the first half while Cal Poly was 6 of 13 on its way to a 39-32 half-time lead. It seemed like each time the Titans would threaten to take the lead, Ross Ketcham or Jabbar Washington would step outside and rattle the threads.

Fullerton made its move midway through the second half, going from a 60-50 deficit to a 66-66 tie at the 7:51 mark when Mark Murphy made a trey. Ketcham retaliated with a three but Matt Caldwell scored twice inside and Fullerton had a 70-69 lead, its first since 12-10 with five minutes gone.

Center Chris Bjorklund hit a trey for SLO and Jason Cunningham tied the game at 72 with a deuce only for the Mustangs to score the next eight points to pull away to an 80-72 lead that they preserved over the final 3:07 by hitting 7 of 8 free throws.

For the second year in a row, the Titans' participation in the Big West Conference post-season tournament was not cemented until the final minutes of the final game. And this time, it came a few minutes after the game in the form of a telephone call reporting UC Irvine's win over Cal Poly SLO, which left the Mustangs in fifth place, a game behind the Titans, who finished at 7-9 and in fourth place after losing their finale to UCSB.

Just like Thursday against Cal Poly, the Titans fell way behind, made a second-half surge but come up short in the final minutes. The Gauchos led by as many as 18 points in the first half and by 19 with 18:24 to play.

Fullerton cut the gap to 51-46 with 12:20 remaining but Josh Merrill made a 3-point play. The Titans got it down to 5 points again at 68-63 with 3:51 remaining but B. J. Bunton hit a base-line jumper and Merrill scored inside. Not until the final seconds did Fullerton get the margin back to 5 points.

Fullerton shot 30 3-point field goals, only one shy of the school record. Mark Murphy could make only 2 of 14.

Meanwhile, UCSB got 19-for-28 shooting from Merrill and Bunton and committed only 11 fouls -- three in the second half despite its trademark pressure perimeter defense.

The Titans finished with a 10-3 home record despite losing their last two. It's the best mark since the 1992-93 team also went 10-3.

Although drawing the No. 1 seed from the Eastern Division in Boise State, the Titans felt good about their chances in the annual post-season tournament in Reno since they had beaten the Broncos in last year's event and they had played very well in a 1-point loss this season at Boise.

Unfortunately, it would be a different Boise State team than the Titans had taken to the buzzer in January. Center Abe Jackson had moved into the starting lineup and forward KeJuan Woods was healthy after missing the Boise encounter. The Broncos also got a much better effort from reserve Richard Morgan and with stars Roberto Bergersen and Gerry Washington playing well, the Broncos won their first ever BWC Tourney game.

The first half was closely contested. The teams exchanged brief leads and the Titans were up, 30-28, with 1:30 to go before intermission. Boise State scored the final 6 points of the half and then opened the second period with a 17-9 run to build a 12-point lead at 51-39. The Titans never seriously threatened as the Broncos' defense tightened and allowed only 36 per cent shooting in the second half.

#### DIV. I TITANS' HOME-COURT RECORD

The longest home-court winning streak in Titan Gym has been 26 games, stretching from Jan. 23, 1982, through Jan. 21, 1984. A streak of 12 in a row was snapped Feb. 10, 1993, by Houston.



Cal State Fullerton has been well represented at the professional level despite the relative youth of the intercollegiate basketball program. Seven Titans have been drafted in the past 17 years and several more players have signed as free agents with

the National Basketball Association.

The most prominent Titan of late has been forward Cedric Ceballos. He became one of the league's top scorers for the Los Angeles Lakers and made the NBA All-Star team for 1994-95, but was unable to play due to an injury. He twice has been with Phoenix and currently is with the Dallas Mavericks after missing most of the 1998-99 season with two broken wrists.

During four years with the Suns, he was known primarily for

two things: winning the NBA slam-dunk contest in 1992 with his blind-folded "hocus pocus" act and scoring a phenomenal number of points when Charles Barkley was injured. Ceballos' absence due to another injury may have swung the tide toward the Chicago Bulls in the 1994 playoffs.

A Fullerton teammate of Ceballos' -- forward Bruce Bowen -- was a pleasant surprise during the 1997-98 season for Coach Rick Pitino and the Boston Celtics, starting nine times in 61 appearances and averaging 5.6 points and 2.9 rebounds while playing several positions. He had played briefly in 1996-97 with the Miami Heat for Coach Pat Riley after two productive and profitable seasons in France. In Evreux, France, he averaged more than 29 points per game. This Fall he signed with the Philadelphia 76ers.

The Titans hit it big in 1984 when two players made NBA rosters -- guard Leon Wood with Philadelphia and center Ozell Jones with San Antonio. Wood completed a 6-year NBA career with Sacramento on Christmas Eve, 1990. He played last in the CBA and in France and toured with Magic Johnson's All-Stars. He has spent the last three seasons as an NBA referee, only the second former NBA player to make that transition. Wood began his post-Titan career as the point guard on the United States' gold-medal 1984 Olympic team under Coach Bob Knight.

Other former Titans in and out of the NBA and CBA during the past few years were 1988 graduates Richard Morton and Henry Turner. Morton started the 1988-89 season with Indiana

and later played with Golden State. Turner. who was a teammate of Morton's in the CBA, spent much of the 1989-90 season with Sacramento. Morton was one of the top scorers in the CBA the past few seasons and has made the loop's all-star team.

Guard Aaron Sunderland, a 1993 product, has done well in the

CBA and 1994-95 products Winston Peterson and David Frigout are playing in Europe. J. D. Green (1990-92) has become a star in Australia.

Other Titans to play in the NBA include guard Kevin Henderson, who played with Golden State and Cleveland; forward Mike Niles with Phoenix; and forward Greg Bunch with the New York Knicks. Foreign leagues have featured center Herman (Demone) Webster, forward Kerry Boagni and sharpshooter Kevin Heenan to name a few. Other players drafted in the 1980s were Ricky Mixon (Lakers), Tony Neal (Lakers) and Boagni (Utah Jazz).

Sean Williams has gained fame first as an actor ("Blue Chips") and recently as a member of the Harlem Globetrotters, for whom he gained the Guinness Book of World Records by dunking on a basket 11 feet. 8 inches off the floor.





### TITAN ATHLETICS HISTORY

As Cal State Fullerton celebrates its 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this academic year, highlights from the athletics department's accomplishments over nearly four decades command a major share of the spotlight. From modest beginnings and never with abundant resources, the Titans have achieved successes that are the envy of many older and larger institutions across the country.

"Titan Pride" has been the rallying cry for 11 national team championships in seven different sports, hundreds of individual All-Americans, dozens of eventual professional athletes including a perennial All-Star third baseman and two rookies in the Super Bowl, numerous national coach of the year awards, men and

women basketball players in the Olympics, a Miss America candidate and the subject matter of a Walt Disney film.

The tenor was set by the first intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, Alex Omalev coached the Titans five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62. Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "Cinderella" Titan Five advance within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament

and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the NCAA Western Regional.

The basketball tradition began even stronger on the women's side. Recent Naismith and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Billie Moore coached the Titans to the national championship in 1970 and star forward Nancy Dunkle was one of her players on the women's 1976 silver-medal winning Olympic team. The most recent Titan All-American was center Genia Miller in 1991.

The Titans won gold in 1984 when point guard Leon Wood directed the men's Olympic team to victory in Los Angeles. The

first-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers went on to enjoy a 6-year National Basketball Association career and he currently is in his second full season as an NBA referee, only the second former NBA player to make that career switch.

Future NBA performers Richard Morton, Henry Turner, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen were some of the stars of the 1980s and 1990s, when the Titans made NIT appearances on both the men's and women's sides. Ceballos gained notoriety for winning the NBA Slam-Dunk contest one year while the women could point with pride to Autumn Hollyfield, the nation's top 3-point field goal shooter in 1993-94, and Koko Lahanas, the nation's scoring leader in 1994-95. Miller still holds NCAA records and came back from a career in Japan to raise a young family and earn a spot with the Los Angeles Sparks of the WNBA as Eugenia Rycraw.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton considerable fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division NCAA titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had subsequent teams in the Top Ten

at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation led by former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Coach Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation 12 times and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while Tami Elliott (1984-86) won 10 All-American awards before becoming Miss Virginia and competing in the Miss America pageant.

Baseball exploded onto the national scene behind former Coach Augie Garrido by break-

ing the USC monopoly in the NCAA western regionals in 1975. The Titans won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, recently retired from the Los Angeles Dodgers. They won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as CWS Most Valuable Player John Fishel. They were national runnersup in 1992 and a key member of that team, third baseman Phil Nevin, was the first pick in the amateur draft by the Houston Astros.

The Titans placed third in the CWS in 1994 and came back with their best season ever in 1995, posting a 57-9 mark en route to their third national championship. That team was led by Player of the Year Mark Kotsay, now with the Florida Marlins

and one of 28 former Titans to have played in the major leagues. Fullerton made its tenth trip to Omaha in 1999 under third-year Coach George Horton.

Five players have become Olympians with Kotsay and Brian Loyd helping the U.S. win a bronze medal in 1996 in Atlanta. Nevin, Jason Moler and Bob Caffrey are the other Olympians who have gone through the Cal State Fullerton baseball program.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and won more games than any other coach. The Titans have made eight trips to the College World Series and 18 regional appearances. They brought home an NCAA Championship in 1986 and often have been ranked No. 1 in the country. Sluggers Sue Lewis and Stephenie Little play in the Women's Professional Fast-Pitch League.

The now-defunct football program made great strides in Division I-A after its humble Div. II beginnings in 1970. Gene Murphy guided the Titans to two conference championships and four runnerup finishes between 1983 and 1989. Titan products included Super Bowl rookies Bobby Kemp (Cincinnati in 1982) and Mark Collins (New York Giants in 1987). Titans have starred in the Canadian Football League led by single-season receiving record holder Allen Pitts of Calgary, 1995 MVP Mike Pringle of Baltimore and quarterback star Damon Allen, the younger brother of Heisman Trophy winner Marcus Allen.

With the loss of the football program, Head Coach Al Mistri's soccer program has filled the void in Titan Stadium. A new women's program was launched in 1993 and it coincided

with a memorable men's season that saw the Titans climb as high as No. 3 in the national rankings. They were led by All-American forward Eddie Soto and competed at the NCAA Final Four in Davidson, North Carolina, placing third.

There have been three subsequent trips to the men's NCAA playoffs highlighted by a No. 2 national ranking in 1996. The 1994 team advanced to the quarterfinals by hosting and winning the first two rounds. The 1997 squad posted an upset 3-1 victory over eventual national champion UCLA, part of a 3-game win streak over the perennially powerful Bruins.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1974) and individual standouts such as golfer Martha Wilkerson, runner Mark Covert and wrestler Laszlo Molnar, who finished second in the nation in 1994 at 167 pounds. Heather Killeen became the Titans' first Div. I cross country All-American in 1994 and then won three events at the 1995 Big West Conference track championships. She was one of 10 finalists for 1995 NCAA Woman of the Year. The Titans have a rising star in sophomore Brandon Campbell. He became the first Titan to compete in the Pan-Am Junior Games and won a silver medal in 1999 while establishing a school record in the high jump at 7-1. He holds several other school records and also plays on the basketball team.

For the past six years, the Sears Cup has been awarded to the school with the most successful programs in terms of national finishes. The Titans placed as high as No. 46 in 1993-94 and their average place over six years (75th) is better than any of the other 11 institutions in the Big West Conference.




