

Coach Judi Garman

Cal State Fullerton's ability to gain the national championship tournament in 1980 in its first season of softball is only the latest in a growing line of instant successes during the career of head coach Judi Garman.

Championships have followed her across the continent from Canada to the University of California at Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach and now to Cal State. Here she is aiming for an AIAW national title after winning four national championships in a row on the junior college level to establish herself as one of the most knowledgeable softball coaches in the country.

"Building our own facility and winning a national title are our goals here at Fullerton," said Garman. "Hard work and enthusiasm are the keys, I guess. You've got to be willing to

work harder than anyone else."

At Golden West in 1971 she inherited a team which was winless the previous year, losing 19-0 in its best effort. Her first year the Rustlers went 9-8 and she was on her way to a 211-40 record in eight years featuring national titles in 1975-78 and a total of six conference titles.

"We started out with no facilities but eventually built a beautiful complex with two lighted fields, a snack bar and the whole works," said Garman. "It was difficult to leave that and start all over at Fullerton."

Garman comes from a softball family. Her mother Ruth was a physical education teacher and softball coach at Messiah College in Pennsylvania and her aunt also coached. She grew up in Kindersley, Saskatchewan and by the eighth grade was playing on a senior women's team. She then joined the Saskatoon Imperials. Twice they were Canadian Champions and in 1970 Garman was a member of the National Team at the World Softball Tournament in Osaka, Japan. In 1967 she was an all-star Canadian outfielder.

In 1966 she graduated from the University of Saskatchewan and look-

ed for a warmer climate.

"My sister took a vacation and went through Santa Barbara," Garman recalled. "She said it was about the prettiest place she could imagine going to school and that's how I ended up there."

While working on her master's degree, Garman started club softball and soon had a varsity team (1967-69). Upon completion of her studies she took the women's athletic directorship at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached volleyball, basketball and tennis in addition to softball.

"Then came budget cuts and I moved to Golden West as a P.E. instructor and coach," she said. "I inherited a team which lost one game 21-0 in five innings."

Garman also served as basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79) coach at Golden West, but she always favored softball due to her competitive background in that sport. Twenty-one of her players received scholarships to four-year institutions, against whom she manufactured a 34-11-2 record over the years.

In great demand as a speaker and instructor at clinics, Garman has conducted her own sessions at Golden West and Fullerton, attracting hundreds of coaches and young softball players. She served as a consultant at a camp in Alaska last summer and may return this summer. Also on the agenda is a trip to Sweden with the Titan team for a series of clinics and exhibitions.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has been published in many physical education journals and even was a pioneer in the equality in sports movement.

"I played Little League baseball," Garman recalled. "I was starting second baseman, but when our team got to the regionals the other team objected and I couldn't play any more."



Assistant Coach Jan Dunlap

Jan Dunlap joined the Cal State Fullerton softball coaching staff this year as a full-time assistant.

Dunlap taught physical education and coached softball and basketball for the past five years at Santa Rita High School in Tucson, Arizona. She initiated a new softball program and coached her team to a 38-15 record and the 1980 Class AAA Southern Division Championship and the Arizona State Championship.

Selected to coach the all-city high school team, Dunlap has been recognized by the Arizona Interscholastic Association for her leadership in the promotion of high school athletics.

While coaching at Fullerton, Jan is working towards a master's degree in physical education. She obtained her bachelor's degree from the University of Arizona in 1975, graduating with high distinction. She was a member of the Arete Society, an athletic honorary and was the recipient of the Ina Gettings Scholarship, awarded to an outstanding physical education major.

In 1974, Jan participated in the Softball World Series in Omaha, Nebraska as a member of the Wildcats' team. She also received an athletic scholarship in field hockey and was named outstanding sportswoman in that sport.

Dunlap was born in Munich, Germany. She is an avid jogger.




Pitching Coach John Campbell

Serving as pitching coach for the Titans is John Campbell, who worked with Judi Garman for five years at Golden West College and is recognized as one of the top pitching coaches in the country.

A prominent pitcher in his own right, Campbell's softball career dates back to 1948. At Golden West, every one of his pitchers received a scholarship to a major four-year school. One of his products, Melannie Kyler, was a pitching star on the 1979 Pan Am softball team.

Campbell received his bachelor's degree from San Jose State in 1955 and his master's from Cal State Fullerton in 1970.







Titan Softball Travels the World

Coach Judi Garman is an international influence on women's softball, having played, coached and conducted clinics in countries around the world. This summer, for example, the Cal State Fullerton team will visit Sweden for three weeks to play exhibition games and conduct clinics.

"The trip to Sweden is exciting to me and I know the girls are just thrilled," said Garman. "Several of them are going to take advantage of the opportunity and stay in

Europe after our tour is completed." Players will be housed by Swedish softball players' families. Air fare was raised by the team's efforts in the athletic department's "Runnin' Rally" in November and with a "sucker" sale and numerous clinics.

Last summer Garman served as a consultant at a clinic in Alaska and she may return this summer to conduct her own sessions.

As many as 350 coaches attended Garman's clinics at Golden West College and she has continued the tradition at Cal State Fullerton, hosting several hundred coaches to her seventh annual clinic, a two-day affair in late January. Another clinic aimed at young players also was conducted in late February.

Garman has conducted her own clinics throughout California as well as appearing in numerous clinics from Anaheim (Stovall's All Sports) to San Luis Obispo (Cal Poly Women's Workshop).



Our thanks to Mr. Bob Lenard, sports editor of the Daily News Tribune, for his enthusiastic support of softball and his services as our public address announcer.






