Maritime School Gets Model Ship

The California Maritime Academy received a glass encased scale model of a Standard Oil tanker yesterday and staged an impressive ceremony to convey appreciation.

Officials of the Standard Oil Co. of California and the City of Vallejo and the academy comprised the audience. The ceremony, held after the ship model presentation, included drills by the midshipmen and the school's drum and bugle corps.

COMMO. RUSSELL M. Ihrig, USN (ret.), academy superintendent, accepted the model from the Standard Oil officials on behalf of the maritime training school at Morrow Cove.

Before the ceremony, the city and company visitors were guests at a luncheon at the academy.

Representing the City of Vallejo were Mayor George C. Demmon and City Manager Alfred L. Wanger. Standard Oil men present were George C. Gillespie, manager of the Vallejo marketing department; W. R. Paxton, public relations and advertising representatives from Oakland; R. M. Douglas, district manager, Oakland; and J. H. Young, assistant district manager, Oakland.

THE SCALE model, which will be on display at the academy, was specially made for the petroleum firm. It is patterned after one of Standard Oil's six new modern "super tankers," each of which can carry 240,000 barrels—or 10,080,000 gallons—of oil.

In presenting the model for the company, Paxton noted that a number of the academy's graduates presently are serving on Standard Oil tankers or at company power plants. He cited the valuable training as engineers or deck officers received by midshipmen at the school.
