# Why Do Those Jets Make So Much Noise?

■ Flying too low, just showing off, or is it something else?

(Note: As a retired tactical jet Naval Aviator who was stationed at NAS Point Mugu, I have flown this pattern over 75 times and am intimately familiar with the processes described.)

Whether it is sitting in your home or attending a meeting in the Recreation Center, the loud noise of one of the military jet aircraft brings the comments "Why is that jet flying so low?" or "Why is that jet going so fast over our community?" and "Is that pilot showing off?" All of these questions pertain to aircraft flying out of the nearby Navy base, Naval Air Station Point Mugu, (AKA Naval Base Ventura County), located nine miles southwest of Leisure



Village, on the Pacific Ocean beach.

The Point Mugu Naval Air Station was established in 1942 and became a premier facility for missile testing because of the large test range located directly to the west of the base. The Air Station has two runways: runway 3/21 which is the primary use runway because of its 11,102 foot length, and runway 9/27, which is much shorter at 5,502 feet long. The actual 3/21 runway is on a compass heading of 030 degrees and the reciprocal heading of 210 degrees, thus the names. Leisure

Village is 9.2 miles on an extended centerline from that runway, which puts us under the flight pattern, given certain flight conditions.

The Navy jets that fly near Leisure Village are under positive radar control in what is known as a GCA (Ground Controlled Approach). As such, the aircraft airspeed (around 200 knots), the altitude (1200 feet) and direction are prescribed and being monitored by controllers located at the base. When the aircraft turn on final approach to runway 21, they



are on a line between Leisure Village and NAS Point Mugu, with the tailpipes pointed directly at LV. It is also at that time the aircraft is transitioning to the landing configuration, which means the landing gear and flaps are being extended to slow for final approach (speed - about 130 knots). When that transition happens, considerable

power must be added to the engines to compensate for the additional aerodynamic drag brought on by the landing configuration. With two powerful jet engines, the F/A -18 Hornet (the principal aircraft flying out of Pt. Mugu) makes the considerable noise our residents hear when the jets are nearby. Thus, the jets are not low, or fast or showing off; they are just performing a prescribed landing approach to the base.

# Residents Can Donate a Green Gift to the Village

# ■ Program to add shrubs and trees to Common Area

"We love trees," says Villager Sharon Marshak. "So when two behind our house died and were removed, we decided to donate a replacement." The Marshaks are among the first to participate in a new LV program that enables residents to buy a tree to be planted in the Village. The Marshaks chose a Jacaranda that is planted in common area beside their home.

They are among the first residents to join the Village's Tree Planting Program, a cooperative venture in which Villagers can purchase a tree that will be planted and cared for by LV's landscape crew. The donated tree can be chosen from a list of 27 different species, compiled by LV's arbor experts. The donor makes the choice of tree and location, and the Village does the rest.

As age, bark beetle disease, and weather conditions continue to batter some of LV's thousands of trees, the donation plan was proposed as a way to ease the high cost of replacement, and the Board of Directors approved it. Residents can choose to buy a replacement tree, a new one, or a celebration tree that could include a small (no more than 3" x 5") plaque to remember or honor someone.

A request form with the list of approved trees – choices range from a mimosa tree to a pink trumpet tree to a Chinese elm – is available in the Association Office and online at leisurevillage.org.


Karen Snethen, LV's Landscape Assistant, says size and spacing requirements matter, "We suggest choosing a tree in at least a 24" box or 15 gallon container and that the planting site be at least 20 feet from buildings and 30 feet from other trees." The cost to a resident is approximately \$300 plus some initial costs. "The best times for tree planting are April and October because of temperature and rain," she adds. "The tree service crews have removed 60 trees so far this year. Maybe that might be an incentive for Villagers."

immediately volunteered." The high cost of LV's workers' compensation insurance and a policy of deferred road maintenance caught his eye, and "I thought I could help," he says. He was hooked; in 2002, he won a seat on the Board of Directors and was elected President of the Board in 2003-04.

Jack was born and raised in Philadelphia, began college just before World War II, volunteered for the military in 1940, and served for three years until he was injured. He married Dori and began his career first as a stockbroker, then in finance. With their two daughters, they moved to Los Angeles in 1961. Because of Jack's financial expertise, he was in demand even before retirement –being invited to give educational financial lectures on Princess Cruises.

The biggest LV project Jack

worked on – and the most controversial - was the effort to change the Village's landscape irrigation from fresh to recycled water. It was controversial because it was expensive, he recalls. "We had to do a lot of convincing." A loan to the Village from the Camrosa Water District was repaid faster than expected thanks to the use of cheaper non-potable water. "We saved a hell of a lot of money with the recycled system," Jack says. In one estimate, LV still saves about \$300,000 per year in water costs.

Jack and Dori also left their mark on LV's exercise programs. When they realized the Village had no yoga class, they started one and practiced together until Dori died two years ago. The classes continue with nearly 100 participants each week. He no longer does a Downward Dog, but he says his commitment to the Village is as strong as ever, "It's the most fabulous place I've ever lived."

# 2018 Homeowner's Information Packet Shipped

Homeowners should have by now received this year's 40-page document mailed on February 23, as adopted by the LV Board of Directors during the open board meeting, Monday, February 5. And here's hoping everyone held on to it.

Bob Scheaffer, Leisure Village Association General Manager, said the 2018 version of the annual homeowner's information packet contains data of essential, year-long value that includes a Budget Summary that provides in some detail the various aspects of LV costs and income, plus justification for this year's 3.184 percent increase in monthly association fees. Scheaffer said homeowner monthly fee increases range from \$13 - \$18, based upon home model type.

A Reserve Study Summary is also included, outlining the association reserve figures; and the Annual Policy Statement is contained in the packet, complete with the LV insurance disclosure.

Scheaffer said this year's monthly increase, coupled with additional planned income enhancements - consisting primarily of advertising revenue formation - is expected to make up an approximately \$382,000 shortfall to reach a \$13 million budget for the year.

LV homeowners get a bully bang for the buck, Scheaffer said, "If you go online to see what a lot of other communities are getting, it's pretty good. We pay less than what others pay for things like trash pick-up and cable TV."

# **What Goes Down Your Drains?**

When Al Fox, a Village resident and a director of Camrosa Water District, spoke at Leisure Village's February Board Meeting, his message surprised much of the audience. He warned residents that they might be damaging the pipes at home, the sewer system in the Village, and the

environment every day. The culprit: what is flushed down the toilet and put down the kitchen drain. He said, "Everyone should know what is sewer safe and what is not."

Environmental experts warn that people have turned their toilets, kitchen drains, and garbage disposals into

trashcans. From baby and facial wipes to dead pet goldfish to medicines, too many people flush it down the toilet. Sanitation experts advise that things like that can clog pipes, waste water when more than one flush is needed damage sewer lines, and eventually pollute the ocean. Southern California Sanitation Companies have begun a campaign: What 2 Flush: the three P's – pee, poop, and paper.

The kitchen drain can be misused, as well, creating the same dangerous and costly results. Experts warn that no waste should go down the drain, including those with garbage disposals. Al's list of what shouldn't be put down the drain or through the disposal is long: fats and oils, coffee grounds, eggshells, food remnants of any size. # The Cauliflower Casserole from Connecticut (In King Arthur's Court)

During the course of writing this column, I've come across a lot of folks who didn't start cooking till later in life for one reason or another. Marlynn (pronounced like the big fish) certainly fits that mold. She lost her mom early and her dad did some cooking but it was usually meat. She remembers sitting at the table with her sister watching her dad mop up the steak's juice/blood with Wonder bread and feeling a little nauseous. I wouldn't say that's the reason for her current way of eating but it played a part... she leans toward vegetarianism. But from there, the tale takes a meandering turn. Her Granddad Joe owned a luncheonette in Hartford, Connecticut called, of all things, The California Lunch... she still has some of the plates. I was impressed with her energy level: she works, she cooks, she volunteers and has tons of energy. She really learned to cook from her grandparents, as well as friends and husbands. Cauliflower

can even get a cauliflower pizza crust and it just so happens one of Marlynn's favorite dishes is a cauliflower casserole. It has been with her for years and, since I love cauliflower, I coaxed the recipe out of her. By the way, for a terrific roasted whole cauliflower, try The Stonefire Grill in Thousand Oaks.

### Loaded Cauliflower Casserole Aka mac and cheese without the carbs) Ingredients:

- 2 lbs. cauliflower florets (fresh or frozen)
- 8 oz. shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided (6 and 2)
- 8 oz. shredded Monterey Jack cheese, divided (6 and 2)
- 8 oz. block cream cheese, softened
- 4 tablespoons heavy cream
- 2 bunches green onions, sliced (1 1/2 cups)
- (6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled) or Morningstar Farms "Veggie Breakfast Bacon Strips"
- 1 clove garlic, grated
- Salt & pepper to taste

Drain any liquid from steamed Preheat oven to 350 degrees. cauliflower and add to cheese mix-

mixture together. Taste for seasoning. If you want a finer texture, give a few mashes with the potato masher. Pour into a 2-3 quart casserole and sprinkle on remaining cheddar and Monterey Jack cheese. Cover dish with foil and bake for 25 minutes; remove foil and continue to bake until cheese is brown and bubbly.




