

#### LEAN BEGINNINGS FOR TITAN POWERHOUSE

Baseball at Cal State Fullerton has turned full circle since its beginnings in 1966. The Titans were far from the national power they are now before one Augie Garrido took charge of the troops for the 1973 season. Dismal is probably the best term to describe those early years. Prior to Garrido's appearance, the Titans were suffering from an eight-year 145-267-2 mark, or a winning percentage of only 35 per cent.

The 1974 Titans, under Garrido's leadership, became the first Cal State Fullerton team to win a conference championship, competing in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (Div. II). That was the first year Cal State Fullerton took part in post-season playoffs, traveling to the NCAA Far West Division II regional. The Titans lost to present day rival UC Irvine, the eventual national champions.

Cal State Fullerton made the jump to NCAA Division I competition, joining the Pacific Coast Athletic Association, in the summer of 1974. The switch didn't affect the Titans, and they won the PCAA title while chalking up a 36-16-1 record. This also marked Cal State Fullerton's first appearance at

the College World Series in Omaha, representing District 8. The next trip would be far more memorable.

In 1976 the Titans improved their mark to 48-15, while winning their second straight Pacific Coast Athletic Association title. Again, Cal State Fullerton competed in the NCAA West Regional.

The Titans moved into the Southern California Baseball Association for the 1977 season. This put Cal State Fullerton into the big time; the SCBA was soon to become one of the most powerful conferences in the nation. The Titans collected 44 wins against 14 losses and picked up another conference title as well as the right to go to the Rocky Mountain Regional.

The 1978 season saw Cal State Fullerton sweep to another SCBA championship (their fifth consecutive) with a 44-13 overall record. In 1978, the Titans made their traditional appearance in the NCAA West Regional to close out the season.

The ultimate triumph came in 1979 when the Titans rolled out a 60-14-1 record, picked up yet another SCBA championship, a second NCAA West


Regional title, and the right to advance to the College World Series in Omaha. The season was closed and the NCAA championship tucked away when Dave Weatherman threw a four-hitter against Arkansas to win the game 2-1.

The difficulty of winning a national championship was apparent during the 1980 season, as Cal State Fullerton had to struggle to win its seventh consecutive SCBA title. UC Irvine battled them right down to the wire before the Titans beat UC Santa Barbara in extra innings in the last game of the regular season to clinch the honors and the trip to Tucson for the NCAA West Regional. However, it was not to be the Titans' year when they ran into a scrappy Gonzaga club to close out the season at 49-18-1.

Last year's team figured to struggle in the SCBA after the massive professional signings from the 1980 club. But relying on unusual power the Titans coasted to their eighth consecutive conference title. They ran afoul of Arizona hospitality again, however, losing to host Arizona State in the Western Regional in Tempe to close out a 47-18 season.

## Coach Augie Garrido

Augie Garrido came to Cal State Fullerton in September of 1972 with a history of turning baseball teams around. Around to winning. For Cal State Fullerton, association with a winner has been a rewarding experience.

Garrido, 43 was born Feb. 6, 1939 in Vacaville, Calif., and is a native of Vallejo, Calif. He received a bachelor's degree from Fresno State in 1961, and enjoyed a stellar career with the Bulldog baseball team. Following his Fresno State experience, he joined the Cleveland Indians organization in '61 and remained there until 1966 when he accepted a coaching position at Sierra High School in Tollhouse, Calif.

In 1969, his collegiate coaching career began at San Francisco State. His one-year coaching record with the Golden Gaters was 25-14. Cal Poly San Luis Obispo was Garrido's next stop, where he compiled a mediocre 15-33 record in his first season. However, the next two years were a turnabout, and he departed from Cal Poly with an 85-62-1 record.

Of course, Garrido then moved on to his present position at Cal State Fullerton. Again, his first season (1973) saw him with a nondescript 19-33-1 record, but his winning ways already had infected the Titan program. In Garrido's second season with the Titans, the first of the conference championships followed him home as Cal State Fullerton won the CCAA championship. His record reversed itself from the previous year to 37-17, and he was named CCAA Coach-of-the-Year.

As Cal State Fullerton moved into Division I competition, Garrido piloted his Titans to a 36-16-1 overall record, the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship, the District 8 championship, and the College World Series at Omaha. Quite a debut into the Division I circuit. By now, word was getting around and Garrido was named NCAA Coach-of-the-Year by the **Sporting News**, as well as repeating as PCAA Coach of the Year.


### Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

#### Bill Kernen

Bill Kernen is in his fourth season as a full-time assistant to Augie Garrido. Kernen's coaching career began at San Gorgonio High School in 1974 and he led his team to a 16-9 mark in the two years he piloted them. He then moved on to the role of assistant/pitching coach at Orange Coast College and in 1976 OCC had its first winning campaign and was ranked 10th in the state poll.

Kernen also owns a distinguished career as a player. He played three years of varsity baseball at the University of Redlands, and his team participated in the national playoffs (26-10) his senior year. He set school records in wins and ERA and was the National leader in wins and ERA (0.77). For these accomplishments, he was named Athlete of the Year and Player of the Year.

Kernen graduated with honors (major in psychology) and signed with the Baltimore Orioles, where he stayed for the next three years.

Kernen's responsibilities with the Titans include pitchers, organization of

the recruiting program and counseling student athletes.

William Craig Kernen was born in Boise, Idaho Aug. 1, 1948 and last year married Cal State Fullerton tennis coach Jan Billings. They reside in La Habra.

#### **Rick Oliver**

Former Titan infielder Rick Oliver joins Augie Garrido's staff for the 1982 season with hopes of maintaining a winning habit — every team he has coached has won its league championship.

Oliver earned second-team All-PCAA honors in 1976 before transferring to La Verne College where he was an All-West Coast selection for the Leopards' NAIA third-place finisher. He coached at La Verne the next four years while playing in the California Angels' minor league system. Signed as a free agent in July of 1977, he climbed as high as Salt Lake City and the Triple A level before retiring after the 1980 season.

Oliver, 27, and his wife Marilyn, head trainer at La Verne, reside in Garden Grove.

The 1976 season didn't win Garrido any post season laurels, but the Titans finished 48-15 enroute to their second straight PCAA championship and the finals of the NCAA West Regional.

In '77 Cal State Fullerton became a member of the Southern California Baseball Association and Garrido guided them to another successful debut. His Titans won the SCBA conference championship (44-14 overall) and appeared in the NCAA Rocky Mountain Regional.

Garrido chalked up yet another SCBA crown in 1978 with a 44-13 record, and took his team for its fifth straight outing in the NCAA playoffs (West Regional).

And then there was Garrido's 1979 edition of the Titans. He directed the Titans to a school record 60 wins (with 14 losses and one tie). He led them to a sixth consecutive conference championship, the NCAA West Regional title, and topped off the season with the NCAA national championship as he returned to the College World Series in Omaha. The **Sporting News** honored him for the second time as the NCAA's Coach-of-the-Year.

Garrido's current overall collegiate coaching record is 494-234-5, a winning percentage of .678. At Cal State Fullerton, he owns a nine year mark of 384-159-4, or a percentage of .707.

Garrido formerly coached summer league baseball for the Anchorage, Alaska Glacier Pilots, and last summer took a team on a two-week tour through the Alaska league. He currently serves as a member of the executive committee of the American Baseball Coaches Association and the NCAA Baseball Committee.

He also is a co-director of Angel Country Baseball Camp for boys 9 to 17 years, operated during the summer and at Christmas time in Fullerton.

California State University, Fullerton, is a relatively young institution, having opened only 22 years ago. However, it already has grown to more than 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 81 degree

programs — 39 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A more recent development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music. An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has recently embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make the university the foremost bachelor's-master's degree institution in the nation.






