**LOCKER ROOMS:** Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. George McQuarn will conduct post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office.

**CREDENTIALS:** Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, Press Will Call is located at the western entrance to the gymnasium.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance.

PARKING: Except on Monday thru Thursday evenings, ample free parking is available in the lot immediately west of the Gymnasium. On Monday thru Thursday evenings, parking is available only in Lot A at the northwest corner of campus. Requests made at least three days in advance will be granted complimentary passes. Otherwise two quarters are required upon entry for a daily permit.

#### CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS



California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

With the theme "Honoring the Past - Creating the Future," the university is celebrating its 25th anniversary in 1984-85. The community is invited to participate in the observance, which includes a wide range of special events and activities. For information, call (714) 773-FACT.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, nursing, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 85 degree programs — 41 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is one of the largest university level internship and cooperative education programs on the West Coast. The program allows students to

gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open

to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances and the Cabaret Repertory Theater Company, which performs regularly in Brea.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support organizations. The

Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are joint ventures with the City of Fullerton. One resulted in the Fullerton Arboretum, which opened on campus in 1979. Another produced lighting for the baseball field and adjoining soccer fields, while a third yielded two lighted softball fields. The university and city are now moving ahead with plans for an inn/ conference center on campus as well as a sports compex.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.

## Administration



#### Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb. President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

## Titan Athletic Foundation

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization that exists solely to aid the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals with a genuine interest in athletics, the University and the community.

# **Athletic Department**



#### Lynn Eilefson, Athletic Director

While demonstrating the highest level of fiscal and academic responsibility, Lynn Eilefson has maintained the championship calibre of the Cal State Fullerton intercollegiate athletic program and established the foundation for continued growth.

Since his April 1, 1982 appointment, Eilefson has seen the Titans win a baseball national championship and their first conference football title and bowl bid; the men's basketball team gained its first National Invitation Tournament berth; and the gymnastics teams and women's softball squads continue their conference domination and consistently earn national Top Ten rankings.

A two-diamond softball complex has been completed and the baseball field is now lighted for night play. These joint venture

projects with the City of Fullerton are the prelude to the long-awaited "Youth Sports Complex" which will feature football/soccer and baseball stadiums. Long dormant plans have been revitalized and with legal roadblocks recently surmounted, a 1986 completion date is targeted.

While many colleges and universities are dropping sports, Fullerton has maintained a well-rounded program of 20 men's and women's sports despite overburdened facilities and shrinking fiscal allocations.

Eilefson came to Fullerton after serving as senior assistant athletic director at UCLA, where he was responsible for alumni and booster liaison, marketing, promotions and sports information. He previously served for eight and a half years at Fresno State University in a variety of postions including associate athletic director, coordinator of the stadium development fund and six years as executive director of the Bulldog Foundation. Prior to that he held posts at Lawrence University and Montana State University.

At Fresno State, Eilefson drew up a capital fund campaign to build its 30,000-seat on-campus stadium. He raised cash contributions from \$30,000 to more than \$500,000 during his term and also launched the "Red Wave" mania that has captured the San Joaquin Valley.

Eilefson is a 1957 graduate of the University of Montana with a degree in Business Marketing Management. He and wife Bev live in Placentia. His children are all graduates of Fresno State University and make their home in Fresno.

### ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Success in the classroom as well as on the court is the goal of Cal State Fullerton basketball coach George McQuarn and he has responded by establishing an academic enrichment program for his student-athletes.

"While I believe an athlete is responsible for his academic progress, I also believe it is the responsibility of a coach to establish an atmosphere and environment conducive to academic success," says McQuarn.

The program was inaugurated in 1981 at Fullerton but has been expanded rapidly. Last year Alison Cone was hired to fill the new post of Athletic Academic Coordinator, a position created partly at McQuarn's instigation. She assists the student-athletes in reaching their academic goals by organizing a tutorial program, study halls and advisement sessions. Foundation and developmental classes also will be made available to help perfect basic skills.

And this year the program has added an Ácademic counselor for Men's Basketball in the person of Alice Maxwell, who will apply Cone's program directly to the basketball team.

"I will be 'coaching' the players, particularly the incoming freshmen, in the classroom instead of on the playing floor," said Maxwell, a part-time employee in the University's Learning Assistance Center. "I will continue to work in the Learning Center and work with Alison Cone solely for the men's basketball team."

Maxwell is a resident of Fullerton and the mother of two. She received her bachelor's degree in history from Cal State Fullerton in 1983 and currently is pursuing a master's degree. She is a former hospital administrator and has lived in a variety of settings including Singapore, the Marshall Islands and northeastern Arizona.

Another requirement for athletes at Fullerton is enrollment in a Speech Communications class. Coach McQuarn believes this effort will help enhance verbal communication skills necessary in the classroom and future career endeavors.

To assist freshmen and transfer student-athletes in making a successful transition to Cal State Fullerton, a college preparation and career orientation course is offered during the student's first semester on campus. They receive information on and are encouraged to use the many campus support services which will further assist them in achieving their personal, academic and career goals.

"We are a goal-oriented program and the graduation of our players is an important goal to me," said McQuarn.

George McQuarn turned a barren program into a winner in 1981-82 and the Titans have continued that success by averaging 19 victories over the last three years. They have played in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association Championship game, been invited to the National Invitational Tournament and earned national rankings and attention while increasing attendance in Titan Gym threefold.

"I think we have established the continuity necessary for a successful program. We've built a solid base. We have had three players drafted by the National Basketball Association and have been able to bring in more players with that potential."

Building a winning intercollegiate basketball program is a major challenge and sustaining it can be an even greater task. As he begins his fifth season at Cal State Fullerton, McQuarn, 43, has demonstrated the ability to do both.

"I said last year that the challenge was to sustain the program at a high level and I think we have done that," says McQuarn. "We were extremely competitive last year and I look for us to be a factor in the conference race this season as well."

Individual honors have come McQuarn's way. In 1982-83, he was selected District 15 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and last spring he coached the West squad to the championship of the annual Aloha Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Team honors have included the designation of the 1981-82 squad as the nation's most improved team and the Titans' 21 wins the following year set a school record for most regular season victories.

The current crop of McQuarn newcomers ranks high in quality and quantity. Among the incoming freshmen are three of the San Francisco Bay area's top performers in Richard Morton, Patrick Clardy and Henry Turner; an All-City player from Los Angeles in Eugene Jackson; an All-Orange County pick in Mark Moses and the CIF 2A Player of the Year in Vincent Blow.

Incoming college transfers include former Big Eight all-freshman selection Kerry Boagni from the University of Kansas and point guard Bryant Standley from Laney College. Eligible next year will be Tee Williamson, a transfer from Arizona State.

While his recruiting and coaching abilities are the more visible of McQuarn's attributes, equally critical to his success at Fullerton have been his attention to discipline and academic success.

"We are a goal-oriented program and the graduation of our players is an important goal to me. While I believe an athlete is responsible for his academic progress, I also believe it is the responsibility of a coach to create an atmosphere and environment conducive to academic success."

He believes in teaching mental toughness and insisting on total concentration. He wants his players to play through outside elements they have no control over, including a coach with an aggressive personality. He seeks players who are willing to accept this concept.

"We have become more aggressive on defense each year and I expect that to continue in 1984-85," says McQuarn. "You have to be flexible and adjust to your personnel. This year's team is very young and inexperienced and we won't try to do too many things right away."

McQuarn graduated from Long Beach State in 1966 with a degree in physical education. He earlier had attended UCLA on a baseball scholarship and earned All-West Coast honors as the Bruins' catcher.

A native of Fresno, McQuarn graduated from Centennial High School in Compton where he earned All-CIF honors in basketball and baseball before attending Compton College, where he was selected to the JC All-American baseball team.

McQuarn's coaching career began with a phenomenal tenure at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles. Between 1969 and 1973 he guided the varsity to four consecutive CIF champion-

ships and had an overall record of 123-8 (.939).

An appointment as the Recreation Superintendent for the City of Compton took McQuarn away from Verbum Dei, but he returned to coaching in 1976 to serve as an assistant to Jerry Tarkanian at Nevada-Las Vegas. The Rebels were 93-28 (.769) during his four-year tenure including trips to the NCAA quarterfinals and NIT semifinals.

At both Verbum Dei and UNLV, McQuarn coached numerous players who went on to play in the National Basketball Association. His Fullerton program has produced three NBA draft picks in Ricky Mixon (Los Angeles-1983), Ozell Jones (San Antonio-1984) and Leon Wood (Philadelphia-1984). Wood also won gold medals with the United States' teams in the 1983 Pan-American Games and 1984 Olympic Games.





### **Assistant Coaches**







Phil Mathews

JOHN SNEED — is in charge of scouting the opposition and coordinating the academic program and services for members of the basketball team. He also has made a major contribution toward the promotion and marketing of Titan basketball, which has more than doubled attendance during his four-year tenure at Fullerton.

Sneed brought experience with winning Division I programs and remarkably successful high school teams to Fullerton when he became a member of head coach George McQuarn's original

staff in 1980.

Sneed was an assistant for one year at the University of Arizona, a 21-6 season (1976-77) which took the Wildcats into the NCAA playoffs. During 1977-78 he was an assistant at San Diego State and the 19-8 Aztecs won the PCAA title before being eliminated in the post-season tournament by Cal State Fullerton. He also was at San Diego in 1978-79.

Sneed succeeded McQuarn at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles in 1974 and won the CIF 4A title and CIF Coach of the Year honors with a 30-2 record. His Eagles won two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons and three times he was league coach of the year. His career prep mark was 81-8 (.910) and the 1974 team was recognized as national champion by the National Sport News Service.

A Long Beach State graduate, Sneed served two years as an assistant to McQuarn at Verbum Dei. He is a native of Gastonia. North Carolina.

PHIL MATHEWS — is in charge of recruiting high school and junior college basketball prospects to Cal State Fullerton and coordinates game scheduling. He also assists with scheduling and monitoring classes and tutorial services.

Mathews brought PCAA experience as a player and coach to the Titan staff with his appointment in 1981 after a highly successful high school coaching career.

Mathews played two years at Riverside City College under coach Bill Mulligan and then transferred to UC Irvine and played for coach Tim Tift. He was the third guard as a senior as UCI went 16-14 and participated in the Division II regional playoffs. Mathews was an all-league and all-county selection at North High School in Riverside.

After obtaining a bachelor's degree in social science in 1972, Mathews remained at Irvine as an assistant to Tift and during his five-year tenure the Anteaters were 70-65.

After earning a master's degree in education, Mathews moved to Santa Ana Valley in 1977 where he posted three winning seasons. The Falcons were 12-10, 22-5 and 18-7 and won a pair of Century League titles.

Three returning starters and an influx of promising talent from a variety of sources should combine to keep Cal State Fullerton in the national collegiate basketball limelight again in 1984-85.

Coach George McQuarn has established a consistently successful program and this year he will put on the floor a balanced, diversified lineup which is expected to keep the Titans in the upper echelon of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association.

Three-year starters Tony Neal and Gary Davis form the backbone of the squad. Neal has been one of the PCAA's dominant inside players since being selected its Freshman of the Year in 1981-82. Davis has been a double-figures scorer since cracking the starting five as a freshman and he ranks with Neal as an outstanding defender. The pair of 6-foot-6 seniors have celebrated together an average of 19 victories per season as Titans.

Joining Neal, Davis and late-season starter Kevin Henderson will be two veteran reserves, one junior college transfer, one redshirt coming off the disabled list, six freshmen and a major college transfer eligible in mid-December.

"It will take a while for us to develop into a cohesive unit," said McQuarn. "We've also got some decisions to make about what positions some people will play and what combinations we can use.

"We really don't have a true center but I'm comfortable going with two power forwards inside. We have better depth than ever at the wing spots and we have several ways to go at the point guard spot. I'm confident we will continue to be competitive."

Teaming with Neal inside will be DeWayne Shepard, a junior college All-American from West-Ark Community College in Arkansas who has missed virtually two full seasons due to knee injuries.

"We still haven't seen the real DeWayne Shepard," said McQuarn. "He's still kind of like a JC transfer even though he is more mature and developed. But his knee is healthy and he had a fine summer."

Backing up Neal and Shepard will be freshmen Patrick Clardy and Vincent Blow and senior letterman Gary Moeller, who averaged 3.2 points and 3.9 rebounds while playing 17 minutes a game last year.

"Gary knows his role but Clardy and Blow are freshmen and you never know quite how they will adjust," said McQuarn.

Battling for the small forward spot with Henderson will be freshman Henry Turner and University of Kansas transfer Kerry Boagni, who will become eligible in mid-December.

"Henderson really contributed during the last month of last season and he is the man to beat out of the spot," said McQuarn. "Turner is another freshman with potential and Boagni is an outstanding shooter."

Davis will man the "shooting" guard position although he has plenty of experience at the small forward spot. Backing him up will be a freshman — either Mark Moses or versatile Richard

With continued growth every season, the Pacific Coast Athletic Association is generally acknowledged as the top basketball conference in the Western United States. By virtually every yardstick, the PCAA comes out on top.

- Professional draft picks: Only the Southeastern Conference had more players selected than the 15 tabbed from the PCAA last summer by the National Basketball Association.
- Post-season play: Seven PCAA teams have been involved in post-season play the past two years with Fresno State winning the 1983 NIT title and Nevada-Las Vegas losing in the NCAA playoffs only to the eventual national champion each of the past two years.
- Olympic representation: Fullerton's Leon Wood was the only player from West of the Rocky Mountains on the United States' gold-medal winning squad.
- Rankings; UNLV is the only western team in the past two years to achieve No. 1 national ranking, losing its place in 1983 after a loss in Titan Gym.
- State dominance: Utah State has captured the "state championship" in each of the past two
  years over rivals BYU, Utah and Weber State in head-to-head play while UNLV hasn't lost to
  Nevada-Reno. Fresno State has been the most consistent winner among the numerous
  California schools over the past few years.
- And, finally, the PCAA is the only conference in the West with a post-season tournament where
  the winner receives an automatic berth in the NCAA playoffs. All but the ninth and tenth-place
  teams are never more than three victories from the opportunity to win the national title.





Things evened up a little in the second half, both on the score-board and in the foul column. The Titans made little progress until a 14-3 spurt late in the game made it 63-62 Irvine with 3:06 to go. The Anteaters built it back up to 69-63 and Fullerton could get only as close as three at the buzzer. Four of Fullerton's five starters fouled out and Leon Wood ended the game with four personals.

The opening game of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament was a microcosm of the Titans' 1983-84 season. They played a formidable opponent down to the wire but came up short—literally—at the buzzer and the season was over.

After Scott Barnes missed a free throw at the :03 mark, the Titans came flying down the floor. Wood dished left at the top of the key but Henderson's 20-foot jumper was partially blocked and the game and season had ended.
