## COURSES

### NURSING (Nurs)

#### 1. Fundamental Nursing Theories and Concepts (3)

Prerequisite: admission to nursing major, Micro 20, 21; Nurs 1L, 105A concurrently; Psych 101 or H Ec 39 prerequisite or concurrent. Socialization to the professional role and introduction to foundational practice.

#### 1L. Foundational Nursing Practice (3)

Prerequisite: Nurs 1 concurrently. Application of basic skills under controlled conditions in a variety of settings to develop a holistic approach to health care. (9 lab hours)

#### 80T. Topics in Nursing (1–3; max total 12 if no topic repeated) (See Nurs 180T)

#### 100. Nursing of Children (3)

Prerequisite: Nurs 1, 1L, 105A; Nurs 100L, 101, 101L, 105B concurrently. Application of nursing theories and concepts to children relative to health maintenance, promotion and restoration and prevention of illness.

#### 100L. Clinical Practice in Nursing of Children (3)

Prerequisite: Nurs 100 concurrently. Application of special knowledge and skills in nursing care of children from birth through adolescence at various stages in the health-illness continuum. (9 lab hours)

#### 101. Nursing the Expanding Family (3)

Prerequisite: Nurs 1, 1L, 105A; Nurs 101L, 100, 100L, 105B concurrently. Application of current theories and concepts to family centered maternity nursing with emphasis on health promotion, maintenance, and restoration related to the neonate and the child-bearing years.

#### 101L. Clinical Practice in Nursing the Expanding Family (3)

Prerequisite: Nurs 101 concurrently. Application of knowledge and special skills in nursing the child-bearing mother and the neonate with emphasis on the family as a unit. (9 lab hours)

#### 102. Nursing of Adults (3) (Initial Offering 1977–78)

Prerequisite: Nurs 100L–101L, 105A, 105B; Nurs 102L, 103, 103L concurrently. Application of theories and concepts related to young adults through middle age relative to health maintenance, promotion and restoration.

#### 102L. Clinical Practice in Nursing of Adults (3) (Initial Offering 1977–78)

Prerequisite: Nurs 102 concurrently. Application of special skills in nursing care of young adults through middle age at various stages in the health-illness continuum. (9 lab hours)

#### 103. Nursing of Adults in Advancing Years (3) (Initial Offering 1977–78)

Prerequisite: Nurs 100L, 101L, 105A, 105B; Nurs 103L, 102, 102L concurrently. Application of concepts and theories in nursing care of persons during the middle and late adult years. Emphasis on maintenance, promotion and restoration of health.

#### 103L. Clinical Practice in Nursing of Adults in Advancing Years (3) (Initial Offering 1977–78)

Prerequisite: Nurs 103 concurrently. Application of knowledge in the nursing care of persons during middle and late adult years at various stages in the health-illness continuum. (9 lab hours)
