FOREWORD

The Constitution of the Society for Armenian Studies (SAS) calls for the periodic "publication of a newsletter on the Society's activities and current research on Armenia." The Administrative Council of the Society currently in office deemed it appropriate to prepare and distribute this first issue of the Newsletter prior to the convening of the next meeting in November 1976.

The Administrative Council for 1976 is composed of: Avedis K. Sanjian (UCLA), Chairman; Gerard Libaridian (UCLA), Secretary; Robert W. Thomson (Harvard), Treasurer; Members: Hagop Barsoumian (Columbia); R. Hrair Dekmejian (SUNY-Binghamton); Richard G. Hovannisian (UCLA); and Robert Mirak (Boston Univ.)

As you will note, the Council has scheduled two Armenian panels — comprising eight papers — for this year's meeting to be held in conjunction with the annual MESA meetings in Los Angeles. The panels have already been approved by the MESA Program Committee and have been listed in the MESA Bulletin of May 1, 1976. The panels will be followed by the annual business meeting of the SAS members, and specific information regarding this, including the agenda, will be forwarded to the members in due time.

The Newsletter provides an extensive listing of publications and research activities by SAS members, including personal news of interest to other members. The information was compiled from membership application forms and, more importantly, from the responses to the special questionnaires sent out to the members. Due to limitations of space, and consonant with the specific objectives of the SAS, publications and other activities of members not immediately relevant to Armenian Studies have been omitted.

This issue of the Newsletter also provides a complete list of the SAS membership as of July 1976. Subsequent issues will list only the new members. For the convenience of prospective members, a membership application form is appended.

The first two meetings of the Society — held respectively in Boston and Louisville — were most successful, and we trust that we will have a sizable attendance at our meeting in Los Angeles, as well, to ensure the continued success of our endeavors to promote Armenian Studies by proper utilization of the forum provided by MESA.
