City Council candidates visit Leisure Village

On Sept. 15, the "Mountain came to Muhammad" as three Camarillo City Council incumbents and five challengers came to the AR to convince the approximately 3,000 Leisure Village resident voters to vote for them.

The format allowed opening statements, followed by questions from the audience and finished with closing statements.

In many ways, the opening statements were what was to be expected: The incumbents pointed to a solid history of accomplishments while the challengers questioned the council's ability to move forward.

All eight participants portrayed the Conejo Creek project as the "elephant in the room," the number one concern of our residents. (Subsequent questions from the floor may have dissuaded them from that thought.)

A common theme in the opening statements was that they were against

Famed clarinetist calls LV home

David Singer has played the White House, shared stage with Yo-Yo Ma

The path that brought David Singer to Leisure Village includes Vienna, Canoga Park, New York's Lincoln Center, the White House, Montclair State University and Carnegie Hall. What defined the journey: his clarinet. The New York Times wrote about his 45-year mastery of that instrument. "To describe his playing would

be to enumerate a catalogue of virtues." Now as a Villager, David is still sharing those virtues, but more on his schedule than ever before.

"When I was 12 years old, I had a crush on a girl who wanted to be in the school talent show," David recalls with a laugh. "I didn't have a talent; I asked my dad to help. He was band director at Canoga Park High School, so he brought home instruments for me to try. I chose the clarinet."

David was hooked.

"It wasn't easy. But there was only one other thing I wanted to do with my life

besides music," he says. "Baseball, which I wasn't very good at."

He was a very good clarinetist who studied at the prestigious Curtis School in Philadelphia, performed with the Lincoln Center Chamber Music Society, the Marlboro Music Festivals, and played with virtuosos including Yo-Yo Ma and Yehudi Menuhin.

It was exciting and challenging work, but the pay was not always good. So David also drove a cab in between practice and performance. Once his chamber group was

What keeps the lawns green?

The green lawns and the verdant sweep of the golf course are signatures of Leisure Village and a "welcome home" signal for all who enter. What plays a role in preserving that look is announced several times a year on the hanging signs by the security gates: Lawn Spraying: Tues, Wed., Thurs. Some residents are asking for more information than just the days of the week when the white trucks with chemical tanks and hoses roll around the Village.

At a recent Board meeting, Villager Alan Rosin said, "It would be helpful if we knew - through Village media — not only when and in which specific villages ... but also exactly what specific products and chemicals are used and why."

The answer, says Landscape Superintendent Mike Undem, is that the spraying kills kikuyu grass and weeds and promotes plant health.

"When I came here in 2004, the lawns were brown with kikuyu, which had taken over so intensely that it even clogged sprinklers," he recalls. "Now, by a regular schedule of spraying and seeding, we keep ahead of it."

Currently, 10 herbicides and fertilizer are used in Village spraving applications, ranging from the wellknown product "Roundup" to orange oil to less familiar names like Hydro Prills. Information on each of them is available to residents at the Association Office. Ask for "Material Safety Data Sheets;" they are required by the government and include listings such as chemical contents, health hazard data and suggested first aid for each product.

Lin Grant, President of the Board of Directors, is mindful about what spraying may appear to be to residents. She retired from a career with a chemical company and is familiar with public concerns.

"With the dilutions and conditions we spray, there should be zero toxicity," she explains. "Although

uncommon, sensitivity is something else. I may be sensitive to something that has no effect on you."

The droplets are small; they remain airborne only a few seconds, she adds, and closed windows are an extra precaution.

The lawn spraying is done by Lawnscape Systems, Inc. of Montelair. As residents can see, the employees on the trucks and with the spraying equipment wear minimal protective gear, safety gloves and glasses. Undem

insists he is not cavalier about the sprays. He says all chemicals used in the Village are safe as soon as they are dry.

On Oct. 20, 21, 22 and 23, the Lawnscape team will be seeding the Village lawns.

On Nov. 18, 19 and 20, they will be spraying again.

Specific schedules appear in the Village Voice monthly. And the Safety Data Sheets can be picked up at the Association Office during regular hours.

Dear Christine. I'm getting remarried. How will this affect my Social Security?

Sincerely. Bride to be.

If you're receiving benefits based on your own work record, your benefits will continue. If you're receiving spousal benefits based on your former spouse's work record, those benefits will generally end upon your getting remarried, but you may be able to receive benefits based on your new spouse's work record, or on your own.

If you're a widow(er) under age 60, or you're disabled but under 50, remarriage ends any benefits based on the record of your deceased spouse. However, if you remarry after age 60 (or after 50 and are disabled), those benefits remain intact, unless you get spousal benefits through your new spouse (at age 62 or older) if those benefits are higher.

Note: Because the rules surrounding payment of benefits are complicated. and depend on your particular situation, contact the Social Security Administration at (800) 772-1213 for more information.



the Conejo Creek development, for rehabilitation of Old Town (including the old fire station and courthouse), and for preventing Camarillo from becoming another San Fernando Valley. 
He still practices every day, but he now has more freedom.



Did you ever have one of those Walter Mitty moments, a daydream that you were sitting in the flight director's chair at Mission Control, sending commands to a billion-dollar spacecraft speeding through space? Well, if you were a member of our group touring the Jet Propulsion Laboratory on Sept. 4, you could have fulfilled at least part of that dream.

Our adventure started when we boarded our comfortable bus outside the Recreation Center and got quickly under way to Pasadena for our arranged tour. We arrived ahead of schedule, so a serendipitous decision was made: a stop at Galco's Soda Pop Stop, a unique store in Highland Park that specializes in vintage soda pop and classic candy bars. (Huell Howser visited Galco's in one of his "Visiting" television shows.) There were hundreds of brands available, and narrowing the selection was not easy. But soon, soda bottles in hand, we re-boarded our bus and continued on our way.

When we arrived at JPL, we were met by our two tour guides who led us through the maze of buildings to our first stop, Mission Control, where we were allowed to sit at the various stations in the control room; one of our companions did indeed choose the chair marked "Flight Director."

We then continued our tour to the Spacecraft Assembly Room, a "clean room" where numerous satellites, including Voyager, Galileo, Mariner, and Cassini spacecraft, were assembled. Behind glass panels, we watched technicians as they worked on SMAP ("Soil Moisture Active Passive"), a new satellite which, unbelievably, will measure the moisture in Earth's soil from orbit. In an effort to keep the area as clean as possible, the technicians were covered top-to-toe in protective clothing; anyone entering the room from outside had to stand in an intermediate chamber, similar to a small wind tunnel, to blow off any loose dirt or dust which may have settled on their clothing.

Our last stop was the JPL museum, which highlighted various space missions and displayed replicas of three generations of Mars Rovers.

As impressive as all of this technology was, the highlight for some was the resident deer population. which apparently consider the JPL campus to be part of their territory. They freely wandered among the buildings, grazing as they went, and, while certainly not pets, they were used to humans and ignored us.

It was a fabulous outing! Many thanks to our coordinator, Carol, our guides Curt and Chris (who treated us to our Galeo sodas), and to our favorite bus driver, Oscar.

Ground broken on long-awaited Fitness Center in Village

Like kids on Christmas Eve, nearly 100 Villagers gathered excitedly to watch the groundbreaking for the long-promised new Fitness Center to be constructed on the west side of the swimming pool.

"Finally," cheered Bernie Grobisen, a daily 6 a.m. exerciser who said he looks forward to a larger, more modern facility in which "the treadmills all work." He, like most Fitness Center users, has been waiting for nearly two years.

The project finally got the green light after FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) approved plans that satisfied its concerns about the flood plain, which includes about half of Leisure Village. Craig Lopez, the project's architect, said "We had to do four revisions to the plans because of the bureaucracy; that added months to the approval process," changes he described as mostly unnecessary.

General Manager Bob Scheaffer described the groundbreaking as "very exciting," and joined the members of the present and past Boards of Directors with shiny shovels to get things started. He estimates the center should be ready for use in February.

Board President Lin Grant joked, "Finally, it is a cold day in hell," as she hefted a shovelful of groundbreaking dirt.

Resident Wayne King is ready. He described the old gym as "funky. But we intend to use this new one."

Mark Volkov joined a gym outside the Village because he wanted a larger facility with more exercise options. However "I might be back," he said, "When they build it, we will come." Village resident and real estate agent John Baker agreed.

"It makes a difference especially to younger people looking to move in here," he said. "Physical fitness is part of their lives, so they expect a useful gym. Right now, I don't highlight the old center when we tour our facilities. I expect that to change."

The first step in construction will be building a dense soil base that will be 3 feet, 4 inches above the presumed flood plain.

"Then we can erect the Fitness

Center; it is a simple building which should go up in 90 days," says Lopez.

The 2,000-square-foot building will have state-of-the-art equipment selected by experts for the range of Village users — from cross trainers

to cable pulls to stationary bikes without step-over barriers.

The money to cover the nearly \$500,000 price tag has been waiting in a segregated operating fund since
