WOMEN'S STUDIES COURSES (W S)

Although the college does not offer a bachelor's degree program in Women's Studies, it does provide a number of courses in several disciplines. These are designed to develop awareness of the contributions of women throughout history and the roles in which they have been cast as well as to help women discover what is pertinent to themselves and their abilities. Women's Studies courses are listed below. W S 100, the *Second Sex*, is interdisciplinary in nature. It is the core course and can serve as an introduction to the other courses, but it is not prerequisite to them.

50T. Studies in Literature (4) (See Engl 50T)

Women in Novels. Emphasis on the treatment of women by major writers throughout the centuries; emergence of the consciousness of sexual inequality as it appears in literature. Readings and analysis.

100. The Second Sex (3)

Introductory interdisciplinary course to provide a foundation for Women's Studies; focus is on women in the areas of sociology, psychology, history, economics, and the arts.

105. Education and Sexual Mythology (3)

Study of ways in which schools have perpetuated sexual mythology; emphasis on improving attitudes and procedures which will counteract sex role stereotyping.

110. Women in Sports (3)

Historical review of women athletes in their struggle with societal stereotypes.
