

General Information for All Sessions

ADMISSION

The following are eligible to attend summer sessions:

- a. Graduates of high school.
- b. Students at California State University, Fresno or other collegiate institutions.
- c. Other individuals who have met course prerequisites.
- d. Teachers holding credentials valid for teaching in California.

Students are not required to file transcripts or formal applications for admission to summer sessions. However, when selecting courses, students are advised to refer to the course descriptions for prerequisites or special qualifications which may be required for certain courses. In some instances, permission to enroll in a course must be obtained from the instructor.

For students attending summer sessions at California State University, Fresno for the first time, attention is directed to the following:

- a. Registration in the summer session does not insure the privilege of enrolling as a regular student in the fall semester. Students planning to enroll full time or part time for the fall semester should contact the Admissions Office for deadline dates and procedures.
- b. Students holding baccalaureate degrees who are attending California State University, Fresno for the first time and who are planning to complete master's degrees at California State University, Fresno should consult the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies. Students planning to complete credential programs should consult the Dean of the School of Education at their earliest opportunity.
- c. High school graduates planning to enter California State University, Fresno in the fall must file applications for admission and submit copies of their high school transcripts. It would be to the advantage of the entering freshmen to do this prior to the beginning of the summer sessions.
- d. Units earned during the summer sessions may count toward completion of a degree but will not count for registration priority for the following fall regular semester.

MINIMUM CLASS ENROLLMENTS

The Summer Sessions must be financially self-supporting. While it is a desire of the Administration to publish in the schedule accurate faculty assignments, changes are necessary because of late resignations and insufficient class registrations. Therefore, the college reserves the right (1) to cancel a course if not justified by sufficient enrollment; (2) to change the hour at which a class is scheduled; (3) to close class to further enrollment;
